
Police Matters -

Hello residents, this year, I will be rotating the entries for Chepstow Matters across the Local Policing Team so you can see updates from all your Local officers. I hope that you will find this useful and Informative. This month's Update comes from our Ward Manager PC 1158 Louise Thorpe. Hello All. Lam PC Louise Thorpe, the Neighbourhood Ward Manager for the communities, both in the Town and the rural areas of Chepstow. I have been a Police Officer for nearly 25 years, the last six of which have been in Chepstow. I manage five very competent



These areas continue to be patrolled regularly by CO70 Andy Jones, who has covered the rural part of Chepstow for nearly ten years, but are also jointly patrolled by the other four CSO's when they are on duty. The overall crime in all the mentioned areas is quiet low and to help with this we carried out "Operation Handle" in St Arvans before Christmas. This is where, on our patrols, we check car doors, to see if they are unlocked and if they are, inform the owners and explain the possible consequences of doing so. Thankfully, only a small percentage of the vehicles checked were unlocked, but we would like to get to a point where there are NO vehicles found unlocked!

Over the past 12 months there have been several developments with the introduction of Community Speed Watch (CSW) into the Gwent Police area. This basically is a group of volunteers from the local area wishing to have CSW and with training and equipment, monitor the speed of the drivers passing through their villages. Currently, Tintern, St Arvans and Itton have CSW set up and Tintern has just seen the introduction of the Go Safe Camera Safety van by The Abbey due to the amount of people, travelling over the speed limit. Membership costs just £10 each year, and benefits include discounted meeting entrance fees and a regular newsletter, as well as the chance to join its excursions.


A small committee runs the Society, and again welcomes new members who can contribute actively to its work.

A Tribute to a Respected Figure by Keith Underwood, The Chepstow Society

(originally published 20 December 2015)

Miss Ciceley Shirley

A founder member of the Chepstow Society

Miss Ciceley Shirley died on 29th November 2015 at the age of 103. A service of thanks for her life took place at St Luke's Church, Tutshill on Monday 14th December 2015, attended by such numbers of relations and friends that the church was full to overflowing

Miss Shirley was known and respected throughout the parish of Tidenham as a leading figure in local affairs who was active in many fields.

Her participation in the founding of The Chepstow Society in 1948, and its many activities, gave the Society a special place in the town which is very much to the fore today.

The daughter of the owner of Shirley's Garage, (one of the first of its kind) on the corner of the crossroads at Tutshill, she became a councillor involving herself actively in local affairs.

Some will remember the summer fetes held at Eastcliffe, and the recreation ground and Castleford in aid of the proposed Tidenham War Memorial Hall.

She was intensley interested in the fauna and flora of the parish and, along with Tony James, Hugh Crowther and others, was instrumental in the establishment of the wildlife reserve at Woodcroft and Lancaut, containing the ancient church which also came in her remit.

Shirley Grove, the wooded area between Castleford Hill and Mopla Road which she gave for the use of the people of the parish, is an example of her benevolence.

She was also a very good painter whose landscapes showed both sensitivity and energy, and she was a keen member of Hugh Crowther's art group.

In the early 1990s she encouraged the embryonic Tidenham Historical Group and remained a firm supporter, greatly valuing the parish heritage

She was a rare example of devotion to duty and public service and will be greatly missed by all who knew her.

Knit it for Yourself, with Chepstow Wool Shop

Chepstow Matters was delighted to meet with Sam Taylor from the Chepstow Wool Shop at her relatively new location in Riflemans Way. Having moved from the top end of town back in the summer, Sam has settled in well to her new shop: "I love the new location" Sam told me, "it's a much nicer unit in a great location, we have friendly interaction with the coffee shop opposite and it definitely feels more cosy here!".



Sam has been running the business for many years; initially starting from home with an on-line shop, Sam took on a unit in Tintern before moving to central Chepstow three and a half years ago. A knitter from just four years of age, there isn't much Sam doesn't know about the craft! Until recent years though she admits that crochet had always alluded her. This challenge now conquered, Sam showed me a fabulous crocheted wedding dress that she has completed from a vintage crochet pattern.

"Knitting and crochet have made a massive resurgence in recent years" Sam told me "Once thought of as the pastime of the retired, there are young people and adults of all ages taking it up again and enoying making their own items". The Chepstow Wool Shop stocks a wide range of hand-knitting and crochet yarns, from the traditional to the latest fashion trends. She also stocks craft fabric and kits for both children and adults as well as embroidery threads. There are a small number of made-up items, such as baby clothes, available to purchase which Sam has knitted up herself, primarily to show how some of the self-patterning yarns look when made up.

Whilst preferring not to run structured classes herself, Sam is more than happy to help and advise customers with any issues with their knitting that they may be experiencing, and the shop will be hosting Crochet classes run by Jodie, commencing in February with evening and daytime options available. Wyedean School Reaches Out by Jonathan Lane

"One person cannot change the world, but we can change the world for one person."

This is the motto of Care and Share Foundation, and words that I heard uttered by John Whatmore, a local representative of the charity.

For a long time, teachers at Wyedean had sought to change the world for schools less fortunate than our own, and in 2008, Care and Share helped to make this possible by facilitating the link between Wyedean and Orungo High school in Northern Uganda. Our work abroad strives to promote internationalism by developing links with foreign schools, thereby broadening the horizons of all involved.

Since 2008, the partnership between Wyedean and Orungo has gone from strength to strength. Our Sixth Form students visit every year, we've embarked on a teacher exchange programme and we've initiated various curriculum projects.

The students at Wyedean have also helped financially: fundraising for water tanks, solar panels and art equipment. However, on their 2015 visit the Sixth Formers were so touched by the plight of Nancy School for the Deaf that they came back brimming with determination to make a difference. The classrooms were bare and very few students had mosquito nets or even mattresses to sleep on.

Prior to Christmas, our students organised a charity 'Christmas Jumper Day' to raise money for some much needed malaria nets. We raised over £600: enough to buy 60 nets for the school. This term we hope to purchase mattresses for the students. Alongside this, we are looking forward to further developing our relationship with Nancy school and working in conjunction with their teachers to help change the world for *their* students.

If you are driven by the same determination to make a difference and to broaden horizons then why not consider Wyedean as your choice of school for A-level study? Update by Stuart Vigus:

After another busy year and Christmas just gone, the choir looks towards 2016. We started the year on January 8th when rehearsals re-commenced at The Dell School, and it was our pleasure to welcome a new chorister to our ranks and to make a start on a new repertoire. Frank Jones our MD, was very keen (as were the choristers) to make a fresh start and get on with the learning of some new pieces.

Depending on our progress, he hopes to incorporate the new ones in our first concert of 2016, which will be for two charities, "*To Kenya with Love*" and "*Genesis Trust*". Both are new to us so I made contact with one of the organisers, Martyn Enever to ask him to give us some idea of both those charities work.

To Kenya with Love (TKWL) was formed about 25 years ago and as a church (The Bridge Church) they have been actively supporting the charity for 8 years. Both the charities work in the Manyatta area of Kisumu, Kenya.

Manyatta is one of the main slum areas of Kisumu and both aim to provide through-school projects,

welfare and support for pupils and their families, a solid standard of education, academic, religious and relevant PSE. The project reaches between 400-500 of the poorest area in the area. The main way both of the charities are funded is by personal sponsorship, mainly from churches in LIK

"The Genesis Project" is the other primary school which is close to Manyatta, and has sponsored pupils who are being educated, medically cared for, and nurtured out of poverty.

Hearing Matters: What causes hearing problems?

The answers are many and varied! Over the coming months, I shall attempt to address the many problems that can occur with hearing. However, there are four main areas that concern people on a daily basis.

Blockages – The inability to hear well is frequently blamed on a person's ears being blocked by wax deposits. Wax is a perfectly natural phenomenon; it is caused by dead skin cells mixing with sebaceous oils in the ear canal. It can be removed – never by poking with cotton buds or other items – but syringing, irrigation or gentle, dry micro-suction.

Noise Damage – This can be caused by a number of factors including exposure to extra loud noise such as shooting or continued exposure as in discos, factories and roadworks. It can be prevented by using custom made active protection.

Tinnitus – The name given to any continual or intermittent noises heard in both or either ears. Caused by a number of factors and, though it can't at present be "cured", its symptoms can be assisted.

Presbyacusis – *Probably the most common form of hearing impairment when the mechanism that allows you to hear starts to deteriorate through wearing out caused by age; this process begins after 40 and can be greatly and discreetly improved with modern technology.*

Wye Valley Music Spring Programme

Wye Valley Music's Spring programme continues in the eclectic style of their Autumn programme on Saturday 20 February, in St Briavels Church, with the return of award-winning pianist Mishka Momen, this time accompanied by virtuoso cellist David Waterman.

London born Mishka studied at the Guildhall School of Music with Imogen Cooper and has also received tuition from Alfred Brendel. She has won numerous prizes in the UK and abroad including, in 2013, the Prix Maurice Ravel. David studied at Trinity College Cambridge, where he received his PhD, and in 1979 he became a founder member of the Endellion Quartet, with whom he still plays. He now combines playing with teaching and writing about music. They will be presenting a programme of works ranging from Bach to Dvorak.

On Saturday 12 March, also in St Briavels Church, a piano recital will be given by the renowned Israeli pianist Noam Greenberg.

Noam studied at the Rubin Academy in Tel Aviv and at Yale University before moving to London to study with Maria Curcio. In 2001 he attended the world famous International Musicians Seminar at Prussia Cove in Cornwall where he took Master Classes with Andras Schiff. Noam now enjoys a busy international concert schedule as well as teaching and giving Master Classes. He is Artistic Director of the Tresanton Festival, which he founded in 2006. His recital

will be of works by Bach, Brahms, Berg and Schubert.

On Saturday 23 April, again in St Briavels Church, Wye

Valley Music will present a recital given by one the most exciting classical guitarists of the younger generation, Michael Christian Durrant.

Michael studied classical quitar performance at the Leeds Conservatoire of Music from which he graduated with firstclass honours. He subsequently continued his studies at the Royal College of Music, London, with the world-renowned classical quitarist Carlos Bonell. He has also studied privately with Graham Wade and attended public master-classes with many of the world's most famous classical quitarists, including Craig Ogden. In 2011 he won the prize for best string soloist at the Harrogate music festival. His programme at St Briavels will include works by Bach, Mozart, Rodrigo, Albeniz and Sor.

The final event of the spring season will be given on Saturday 21 May in the Mackenzie Hall. Brockweir, with a tribute to Piaf and the Hot Club de Paris given by Eve Loiseau (vocals). Fiona Barrow (Violin) and Edward Jay (Accordion).

Eve's passion for Piaf developed at a young age. Coming from a French family of singers in South East France, long summer meals around the family dining table were often rounded off with French chansons. Piaf is inimitable, but Eve's lustrous tone captures the essence of the little sparrow and for this special evening the Mackenzie Hall will take on the atmosphere of a night club, with a cash bar, tables, soft lighting and an included 2-course meal. Advance booking is essential for this event.

ANGELS IN YOUR LIFE

Buy To Let Tax Changes will hit Amateur Landlords most

In the July 2015 Budget, Chancellor George Osborne announced that from 2017 he would be clamping down on buy to let landlords by removing the right to claim more than the basic rate tax equivalent in relief for mortgage interest.

Rather than being able to deduct mortgage interest paid from rental income received, thus reducing the property income subject to tax, a maximum of 20% of the mortgage interest will be allowed as an income tax deduction. This will be implemented on a sliding scale over 3 years as follows:

2017/18 - 75% of mortgage interest allowed as deduction, with the remaining 25% as a basic rate reduction

2018/19 - 50% of mortgage interest allowed as deduction, with the remaining 50% as a basic rate reduction

2019/20 - 25% of mortgage interest allowed as deduction, with the remaining 75% as a basic rate reduction

2020/21 onwards - 100% of mortgage interest as a basic rate reduction only

Not only will these changes impact all higher rate tax payers, but they could also mean that those who are currently basic rate tax payers end up paying higher rate tax, even though their income remains the same.

It could also mean that those making losses on their buy to lets could end up paying income tax, or that child benefit is lost for many people.

Companies with rental income will be exempt from the changes, and those who are able to buy properties without a mortgage will also be unaffected, meaning that it is the amateur landlords who will be hit the most.

Example:

You have employment income of £38,000 a year, and 2 rental properties, with combined income of £15,000 a year and mortgage interest of £10,000 a year, giving you property income profits of

£5,000 a year. You also claim child benefit.

Currently, you pay basic rate tax of £1,000 on the rental profits.

Fast forward to 2020/21 - your taxable

profits will be £15,000, which when added to your salary, means your total income is above £50,000 and so you have to start repaying your child benefit. You pay higher rate tax on most of your property income, giving you a tax liability of around £5,000, but can claim a 20% deduction of £2.000, giving you a net tax liability of £3.000

This means that in the space of a few years, your tax bill will have tripled, and you also have to repay child benefit, even though your circumstances have not changed!

The rules about claiming for wear and tear from April 2016 are also meant to be tightened, by only allowing claims for money spent, rather than the annual 10 per cent of rental that's currently allowed automatically. This has been under consultation recently and we let you know the outcome shortly.



Finalists Selected for FameLab Academy 2016

Just prior to Christmas Wyedean School launched its FameLab Academy 2016, with the winning student destined to compete in the countywide final organised by The Times Cheltenham Science Festival.

FameLab Academy is a competition for Year 9 students in Gloucestershire, sponsored by EDF Energy. Students have just three minutes to explain a scientific topic in a dynamic and engaging way to a panel of judges who will adjudicate the presentations based on their content, clarity and charisma.

Each FameLab Academy school is matched with a STEM Mentor from either a local supporting business or a previous competitor from the FameLab UL competition who will visit the school and work with students. The winner from each school receives a Master Class in communication training at the University of Gloucester, a work placement in a local STEM company and entry into the county final at EDF Barnwood, Gloucester.

Every participating student has the opportunity to achieve a British Science Association CREST Bronze Award and will learn about potential

careers in the STEM industry. The FameLab Academy heats are judged by one member of Cheltenham Festival staff and two professional scientists.

Instead of starting with the curriculum, FameLab Academy starts with the student; they decide what to research and what to talk about."

Charity Urges Couples to Start the Year Talking Money

Money and relationships are famed for starting rows but a local debt counselling agency is recommending Chepstow residents get talking about finances early in 2016.

Christians Against Poverty says having "the money conversation" with a partner can be one of the hardest things to do but it is a move that can really change your year ahead.

Isobel Mead, Centre Manager of the Chepstow & District CAP branch said: "I see people who have fallen into crisis debt every week and I can tell you it is crucial for your health and happiness in 2016 that you have a reality check of your finances as soon as you can in this New Year.

"It might be nerve wracking to bring those bank statements out into the open but until you both know what's happening, you can't start to tackle it. Working at your finances together, setting goals together and resolving to sort things can be an amazing step forward for the whole family."

The Money Advice Service found in a poll of more than 2,000 UK adults that nearly half (45%) weren't always honest with their partner about finances while a quarter were lying about spending.

Christians Against Poverty's latest research shows three in four debt clients said their situation had caused arguments while nearly a quarter (23%) said debt directly led to their relationship breaking down – so the stakes are high.

CAP's top tips for having "the money conversation" are:

- Pick your time when things are quiet at home and no one is dealing with any immediate stresses.
- Avoid the conversation when the children are around, your mum-in-law is visiting or a big bill has just landed.
- Agree that you want to make it a year when you get on top of finances together and that the money conversation isn't about blaming anyone.

- Acknowledge that money management can be hard, especially when stressed, or if you're on a low income. Mistakes may have been made but this is about looking forward.

- Decide on a shared goal you want to aim for, like a day out, a holiday or a new car or just a "getting back in the black" celebration. This will happen twice as fast if you're in it together.
- Use one of the many online tools or book into one of the hundreds of free CAP Money Courses – to begin to build your budget.
- If you have debts, don't delay in getting help from a free debt counselling agency like Christians Against Poverty, Stepchange, National Debtline, Citizens Advice, Payplan, the Money Advice Service or, if you're self employed, Business Debtline.
- Make payday the day you review how it's all going and make adjustments to the budget where necessary.
- Avoid credit wherever possible and begin to save as soon as you can, even if it is a small regular amount.

Gardening Matters:

Brought to you by Chepstow Garden Centre

It may be chilly outside – but that's all the more reason to wrap up warm and enjoy a bright, crisp winter's day in the garden. Here are some of the jobs you can be getting on with...

Ornamental garden: Plant low box hedging for an elegant formal edging to parterres and knot gardens, spacing plants about 20cm apart.

Buy in summer bulbs such as cannas and gladioli to grow on indoors for now - they're a highlight of the summer garden.

Fill gaps in your spring display with ready-potted snowdrops, daffodils and muscari from the garden centre

Remove old leaves from hellebores to make the flowers more visible as they emerge and prevent disease.

Kitchen garden: Stock up on seed potatoes from our garden centre here in Chepstow, then 'chit' them in egg trays till it's time to plant. Place somewhere bright and frost-free to sprout.

Pot up onion sets in roomy modules to grow on under cover until March when you can plant them out as sturdy seedlings.

Grow microgreens on your windowsills: sow radishes, peas, chard or kale thickly on damp kitchen paper and snip into salads at 5cm high.

Prune grape vines while they're still dormant, cutting back the side shoots to within one or two buds of the main stem.

Force rhubarb by covering the crowns with an upside down black dustbin or large plant pot with the holes blocked for long, slender, sweet stems within about eight weeks.

Add lime your soil if it's a little too acidic:

This will help keep your crops healthy and avoid disease. You can find out how acidic your soil is using an inexpensive soil testing kit. Your soil can change from year to year, so test regularly.

Acidic soil is a particular problem as brassicas hate it and sulk, or worse, develop clubroot. So if your soil's pH is less than 7, tip the balance back in favour of your cabbages by liming. This is best done as early as possible, as it takes up to six months to have an effect.



You can find testing kits and treatments at the garden centre, including dolomitic limestone, calcified seaweed and garden lime which will all raise the pH of your soil. Follow the instructions on the packet: you shouldn't increase your soil pH by more than 0.5 each year, so don't add too much!

Build a composting area in a corner of your garden and you'll never regret it. In goes kitchen peelings, garden prunings and autumn leaves; out comes lovely, crumbly black gold, rich and ready to spread on the garden to feed your plants.

Once you get into composting, one bin just isn't enough: three is the ideal (one to fill, one to rot and one to use), then there's leafmould to make, and a green cone and wormery for kitchen scraps. You'll find a fantastic range of composting equipment in our garden centre here in Chepstow, so come in and have a browse.

Setting aside part of your garden as a purposebuilt compost area makes it easy to screen off with trellis, and very efficient: keeping everything in a simple square means you have plenty of room for wheelbarrows and, if you pave it, it's much easier to keep clean.


