

Children Helping Children: The Annual Rotary Shoebox Appeal

A lorry containing 14,220 shoeboxes left the UK Rotary warehouse on Thursday 10th December destined for Kiev, from where shoeboxes will be distributed across the government controlled area of Ukraine. It should arrive within a week. The gift of a shoebox that contains toys, toiletries, educational items or household goods is a drop of happiness to the people of Eastern Europe who live in a world of poverty. For many, it will be the first present that they have ever received and it lets them know that somebody, somewhere cares.

The national Rotary Shoebox Scheme provides packages for the unfortunate children and foster parents in Central and Eastern Europe. (see http://www.rotaryshoebox.org/) The local Rotary Club provides empty boxes to the schools and over the term they are invited fill the boxes with articles for the children or their "carers/parents". They include simple items such as a bar of soap, a toothbrush, a soft toy, a notepad and pencil etc and we ask the donor to write their name on the outside and to whom it is intended, such as "Young girl" or "Old lady", since we try not to forget the elderly who care for many of these poor children. The boxes are then collected by Rotarians shipped to the needy by Rotarians and distributed by Rotarians.

The Chepstow & District Rotary Club has collected no less than 1300 filled shoeboxes this year from the following schools: Chepstow School, Magor CiW Primary, Maesteg Primary, Offa's Mead Academy, Pembroke Primary, Shirenewton Primary, St Mary's RC Primary, The Dell Primary, Thornwell Primary, Tutshill C of E Primary, Wyedean School.

Rotary believes that in this way, with the guidance of their parents and teachers, our children gain some appreciation of others who are severely deprived and those who are also mentally ill. As we approach Christmas we are all reminded of those less fortunate than ourselves. (see: www.chepstowotary.org.uk).

Over 500 shoe boxes were delivered to Chepstow School at the start of December for the annual Shoe Box Appeal, in partnership with Chepstow Rotary Club.

Students in years 7,8 and 9 are asked to fill a shoebox with items such as jewellery, stationery, small games and toiletries for either a boy or a girl. The boxes are then delivered to Eastern European orphanages and opened on Xmas day.

Assistant Head Teacher Jamie Goddard, who oversees the project, told us "We believe this sends a powerful message to our students to think about and support young children who are

less fortunate than themselves, and how these children really appreciate items that we often take for granted. It's incredible to see how the students respond every year and fill so many boxes, making a real difference to the orphans."

Pupils Raising Funds for the Syrian Refugee Crisis

At the end of November, pupils from Year 13 Music BTEC class at Chepstow School held a musical event to raise funds for the Syrian Refugee Crisis.

The event was a display of musical talent from the school and the local area, including Running with Scissors and Devan Cassels. The audience was year 7 and 8 pupils who were asked to donate what they could towards the fundraising effort. The pupils did well, earning £200 for a great cause.

Chepstow Matters was delighted to catch up with Claire Day, initiator of the SLS facebook group for helping the homeless, to gain feedback on their campaign for Christmas presents for the homeless. Chepstow Matters was pleased to be able to help promote this fabulous campaign and to also donate some presents too. Initially based in Undy/Magor, the Group started just over a year ago as a pipeline of food and needed items for the Edge Assist Street Life project which feeds the homeless in Bristol every Saturday night. A year on and the Group now supports many more homeless projects this side of the bridge too. Claire gave us the following report:

"WOW! SLS wants to sav a WHOPPING thank you to everyone that has donated to our SLS Christmas present campaign. We aimed to help 8 centres and collect 400 presents. which would double last year's achievement. However, this year a phenonmenal 1,288 presents were collected! As a result of this fantastic response we have been able to help a total of 19 centres/projects!

"Thank you to all the work places, clubs and individuals for getting on board, to our members that make SLS so special and to our fantastic depot organisers across 2 hubs. Together we touch many lives positively. Thank you for making this happen. We do not change a life around but we do make those we help smile. make a difference, boost them to tackle another day and show them they are loved, cared for. We have helped to make it a little brighter for them this Christmas."

Chepstow Matters was also pleased to hear from Richard Townsend who runs the Edge **Assist Street Life project following their Christmas run on Saturday 12th December:**

"Wow, what a fantastic evening. A huge thank you to everyone involved! The Edge Church Young Adults provided the music and carol singing. It was superb. It was so encouraging to see all the Edge Church Pastors on the street with their wives and children. Their support over the years has been central to all we do



for the homeless. We had well over a hundred guests on Saturday night, who came for food and clothing and who also received a Christmas present. 9 year old Faith Mildren had fundraised in order to provide Christmas presents for homeless women. Five of the Bristol Barbarian's rugby team also turned up to help serve. Some of them gave our Christmas presents out, alongside Faith.

THANK YOU to everyone who donated Christmas presents and to all those working behind the scenes to provide food and clothing every week. Your great kindness and love is very much appreciated by all".

We were delighted to speak to young Faith and find out more about her generous act:

Having lived close to the city centre for 9 months Faith told us she often spoke to the homeless people she saw, bringing a smile to their faces as she said hello. At just 9 years old Faith decided to do something different this Christmas and help those less fortunate.

With help she set up her GoFundMe page with a £50 target. Proud of her initiative, friends, family and others rallied to support her and she exceeded her goal, raising a staggering £250! With this amount, she was able to purchase and wrap presents intended for women on the streets. When shopping she realised she was slightly short of money so, wanting all the boxes to be the same, Faith donated her own pocket money too to meet the shortfall.

Faith told us: "I was very pleased to make people so happy". She recounted one lady showing her friends and hearing her say "Look how many presents I've got!". Mum Helen told us that Faith's fundraising was completely independent and praised her daughter's initiative and attitude.

SO WHERE DID ALL THOSE PRESENTS GO? Here is a list of the centres/projects supported ..

The Walkabout Project received 20 and the Wallich night shelter and kerbside assistance 20 with a further 65 to the Shri Tiger Bay Social Club. CALDICOT Foodbank - 2. NEWPORT - 60 were delivered to Olive Branch, 17 to Edengate, 35 to the Wallich rough sleepers, 3 to PAC, 123 to Solas Cymru and 115 Lamau. Lions Newport helped provide 50 presents for Newport homeless. BRISTOL - 160 to Street Life via John Berry from SLS Bristol collection, 90 to the churches together Saturday lunch soup run, 13 to the homeless veterans project, a further 100 to Street Life and 100 Wild Goose via John Barnes Bristol barbarians charity rugby club 155 to Care at Christmas.

Plus toys, presents for children for WIN and GEM. 9 present piles for mothers and children in safe houses. 8 presents piles for Cwmbran leisure centre families in need on 25th GEM and given with present piles to individual children.

The work doesn't stop at Christmas however so keep seeking out those blankets, warm footwear, socks/underwear, sleeping bags, roll mats, flasks, torches, waterproof coats, joggers, jeans and rucksacks in the New Year. Wye Valley Music's Spring programme continues in the eclectic style of their Autumn programme on **Saturday 20 February**, in St Briavels Church, with the return of award-winning pianist Mishka Momen, this time accompanied by virtuoso cellist David Waterman.


London born Mishka studied at the Guildhall School of Music with Imogen Cooper and has also received tuition from Alfred Brendel. She has won numerous prizes in the UK and abroad including, in 2013, the Prix Maurice Ravel. David studied at Trinity College Cambridge, where he received his PhD, and in 1979 he became a founder member of the Endellion Quartet, with whom he still plays. He now combines playing with teaching and writing about music. They will be presenting a programme of works ranging from Bach to Dvorak.

On **Saturday 12 March**, also in St Briavels Church, a piano recital will be given by the renowned Israeli pianist Noam Greenberg.

Noam studied at the Rubin Academy in Tel Aviv and at Yale University before moving to London to study with Maria Curcio. In 2001 he attended the world famous International Musicians Seminar at Prussia Cove in Cornwall where he took Master Classes with Andras Schiff. Noam now enjoys a busy international concert schedule as well as teaching and giving Master Classes. He is Artistic Director of the Tresanton Festival, which he founded in 2006. His recital

will be of works by Bach, Brahms, Berg and Schubert.

Michael studied classical guitar performance at the Leeds Conservatoire of Music from which he graduated with first-class honours. He subsequently continued his studies at the Royal College of Music, London, with the world-renowned classical guitarist Carlos Bonell. He has also studied privately with Graham Wade and attended public master-classes with many of the world's most famous classical guitarists, including Craig Ogden. In 2011 he won the prize for best string soloist at the Harrogate music festival. His programme at St Briavels will include works by Bach, Mozart, Rodrigo, Albeniz and Sor.

The final event of the spring season will be given on Saturday 21 May in the Mackenzie Hall, Brockweir, with a tribute to Piaf and the Hot Club de Paris given by Eve Loiseau (vocals), Fiona Barrow (Violin) and Edward Jay (Accordion).

Eve's passion for Piaf developed at a young age. Coming from a French family of singers in South East France, long summer meals around the family dining table were often rounded off with French chansons. Buy To Let Tax Changes will hit Amateur Landlords most

In the July 2015 Budget, Chancellor George Osborne announced that from 2017 he would be clamping down on buy to let landlords by removing the right to claim more than the basic rate tax equivalent in relief for mortgage interest.

Rather than being able to deduct mortgage interest paid from rental income received, thus reducing the property income subject to tax, a maximum of 20% of the mortgage interest will be allowed as an income tax deduction. This will be implemented on a sliding scale over 3 years as follows:

2017/18 - 75% of mortgage interest allowed as deduction, with the remaining 25% as a basic rate reduction

2018/19 - 50% of mortgage interest allowed as deduction, with the remaining 50% as a basic rate reduction

2019/20 - 25% of mortgage interest allowed as deduction, with the remaining 75% as a basic rate reduction

2020/21 onwards - 100% of mortgage interest as a basic rate reduction only

Not only will these changes impact all higher rate tax payers, but they could also mean that those who are currently basic rate tax payers end up paying higher rate tax, even though their income remains the same.

It could also mean that those making losses on their buy to lets could end up paying income tax, or that child benefit is lost for many people.

Companies with rental income will be exempt from the changes, and those who are able to buy properties without a mortgage will also be unaffected, meaning that it is the amateur landlords who will be hit the most.

Example:

You have employment income of £38,000 a year, and 2 rental properties, with combined income of £15,000 a year and mortgage interest of £10,000 a year, giving you property income profits of

£5,000 a year. You also claim child benefit.

Currently, you pay basic rental profits.

rate tax of £1,000 on the

Fast forward to 2020/21 - your taxable

profits will be £15,000, which when added to your salary, means your total income is above £50,000 and so you have to start repaying your child benefit. You pay higher rate tax on most of your property income, giving you a tax liability of around £5,000, but can claim a 20% deduction of £2.000, giving you a net tax liability of £3.000

This means that in the space of a few years, your tax bill will have tripled, and you also have to repay child benefit, even though your circumstances have not changed!

The rules about claiming for wear and tear from April 2016 are also meant to be tightened, by only allowing claims for money spent, rather than the annual 10 per cent of rental that's currently allowed automatically. This has been under consultation recently and we let you know the outcome shortly.

Chepstow Matters was delighted to be invited to Chepstow School in November for a presentation of three defibrillators, one each to three local schools: Chepstow, Mounton House and Caldicot.

The defibrillators were donated by June and Grant Thomas from fundraising carried out in the memory of their 15 year old son Jack, who died suddenly whilst sat on the sofa watching rugby in 2012.

"Jack was a fit and active boy" June told me, "He played football, rugby and cricket and was a 2nd Dan at Taekwondo where he was the Welsh Champion, British Champion and Scottish Champion and represented Wales in competitions across Europe! We had no idea that there was any problem with his heart, and to this day do not understand why it stopped working that day."

June was put in touch with an organisation called Cardiac Risk in the Young (CRY) and about a month after Jack's funeral June started up a memorial fund called CRY in the Valleys - Remembering

Jack Thomas, raising money to bring a heart screening programme into the South Wales area.

The first of these took place in Oakdale Comprehensive on what would have been Jack's 18th birthday on 6th June 2014. That first screening picked up two young people who needed further follow up, one of whom had a serious issue of which they were previously unaware.

Having raised around £35,000 towards this screening programme, June thought further about what would happen if another attack did affect a young person and there being no equipment on hand to help. Thus began Jack's Appeal - additional fundraising for the provision of defibrillators. June's goal was to place a defibrillator in every comprehensive school in Wales, starting with Gwent and the Rymney Valley. The presentation to Chepstow, **Mounton House and Caldicot means that** this has now been achieved in Gwent, with 26 schools which did not previously have a

> defibrillator being provided with one, along with the training in how to use it, all due to Jack's Appeal.

> June told me: "In May 2014 we provided a defibrillator to Blackwood Comprehensive School. A year later, in April of this year, that defibrillator was used on a 44 year old mother who was attending parents evening. This action saved her life."

"This is a fantastic resource, not just for our school but for also the wider community. As a school we were aware that a defibrillator would be of benefit in school and had been having conversations about how to fundraise for one. This donation is a godsend."

Both the Welsh Hearts and the South Wales Argus have supported and backed Jack's Appeal. We also spoke with Phil Hill, a Registered Nurse for Welsh Hearts from Newport who saw Jack's Appeal in the paper and contacted June with regards to a petition Fifteen year old Jack Thomas was sat watching his beloved Wales play Rugby in 2012 when he suddenly died on the sofa.

His Family and local Health professionals have since worked tirelessly to provide Heart screening for School children and to provide Automated External Defibrillators (AED) to schools.

#JacksLaw will hopefully continue Jack's legacy to push for legislation to provide an AED in every public building in Wales, via the Welsh **Assembly Government Petitions Committee.**

he was preparing to take to the Welsh Assembly, for Mandatory Welsh legislation to ensure Defibrillators in all public places. He has called this Jack's Law.

Both Phil and June presented the petition before the Council in July of this year and have recevied a positive response from the Chair. William Powell:

"Cardiovascular disease accounts for a third of all deaths in Wales, where the death rate is higher than in the majority of countries in Western Europe." Welsh Hearts

"What we heard as a Committee convinced us that there is a need to install more AEDs in public places and to ensure that those already available are made more accessible. We have made five recommendations for the Welsh Government to consider, geared toward this general aim. We therefore, intend that the report should be debated in by the Assembly in due course. I have written to the Minister for Health and Social Services today asking that he formally responds to these recommendations so that his response, as well as the report, can be considered when the petition is debated by the Assembly."

"The general public in this country have a reluctance to administer CPR when needed. More, accessible defibrillators would save lives. Jack's Appeal

Every week in the UK 12 young people die suddenly from an undiagnosed heart condition. On 12th February 2012 our 15-year-old son Jack Thomas became one of those 12 young people.

Jack was a fit and healthy boy who had represented Wales all across Europe on a number of occasions in Taekwondo.

Jack was an A* student and had been successful in gaining a scholarship at Cardiff Sixth Form College. His death came as a complete shock to us, as Jack had never been ill. To this day we still have had no answers to why our precious boy fell asleep.

Since Jack's death we have set up a memorial fund in his name within C.R.Y. All money raised in Jack's memory will go towards paying for a heart-screening programme in the South Wales Valleys. This project is very successful and the first screening programme took place at Oakdale Comprehensive on 6th June 2014, which would have been Jack's 18th Birthday.

All our local leisure centres have been provided with a defibrillator, but not our local schools. It is because of this I have set up Jack's Appeal, which has been backed by The South Wales Argus and Welsh Hearts.

The aim of Jack's Appeal is to provide all Comprehensive Schools, starting with those in Gwent and the Rhymney Valley, with defibrillators.

More Welsh Records Broken by our Welsh Champion at his 2nd Competition

Chepstow Matters was delighted to catch up with 16 year old Michael Johnson again this month following his second competition at the start of December.

We were first invited down to **Derek's Gym & Fitness Centre** at the start of October. Mike had just achieved fabulous success at his first competition with the British Drug Free Powerlifting Association (BDFPA) at Tonypandy Community College, where he won in all three of his competitions for his weight category (90k), and broke the Welsh record in two! He achieved Welsh Champion status in the Squat (155.5 kilos) and also in the Deadlift (195 kilos). He also won in the Bench Press with a lift of 120 kilos: the current welsh record at this weight stands at 122.5 kilos.

His second competition on 6th December saw Mike go up a weight category to the 100k. There was stiff competition at the event, all looking to qualify for a place in the British Championships to be held in the New Year. Mike did fantastically well at this new weight, beating the Welsh records in all three disciplines! He is now therefore the Welsh Champion at 100k in the Squat (160 kilos), the Deadlift (200 kilos) and the Bench Press (130 kilos).

Mike has lived in Tutshill and Sedbury all his life, attending Wyedean Comprehensive before starting at SGS College in Filton, Bristol this autumn. He has been training at Derek's Gym for over a year. "I heard about the gym through a friend whose dad trains here" Mike told me, "I wanted training to keep fit and increase my strength - it turned out I was good at lifting, so with Derek's guidance I started bodybuilding".

Gym owner and trainer Derek Platt (pictured with Mike right), who has a wealth of experience having competed himself and successfully trained many bodybuilders over his 45 years in Chepstow, told me:

"I am so proud of Mike, only his second competition and he has gone up a weight category already and set more new Welsh records at this weight too. He has such a fantastic attitude to his training and is really dedicated. He joined the gym for better health and fitness and

Financial Matters: Pensions and the self-employed

The UK labour market is one of the most diverse in the world with self-employment accounting for over a quarter of the rise in working numbers since 2010. According to Office for National Statistics figures, one in seven people in work choose to work for themselves, making a total of 4.5 million people. 1

However, those choosing to 'go it alone' often have tough decisions to make about juggling self-employment with having a family, buying a home, or providing for their financial future, especially in the early stages of setting up their business.

A recent survey from IPSE, the Association of Independent Professionals and the Self Employed, has shown well over a third of freelancers are unable to contribute towards a pension fund and that one in ten are unsure of how to save for retirement. 2

Whereas most employed individuals are automatically enrolled into a workplace pension, no such scheme exists for the self-employed. Yet, as the IPSE survey shows, this significant minority are in need of most help and deserve the same policy consideration as employees.

Fluctuating Fortunes

Fluctuations in income mean pension provision can sometimes get pushed to one side. It's hard to put anything into a pension if you're not sure what your income is from one month to the next. So the self-employed are often reluctant to lock money away for longer periods.



A culture of entrepreneurship is something the government is keen to foster, and in recognition that self-employed people are sometimes unfairly penalised, it has commissioned a review to look into the issues surrounding how they save for their retirement. Results are expected to be published in early 2016.

Regardless of any future policy, I would urge anyone not already saving into a pension to seriously look at doing something about it. Pensions benefit from initial tax relief, and contributions can also bring people under certain tax thresholds. They're not as inflexible as they used to be, so if anyone had concerns about lack of access to their own money, it's no longer an issue. It's just a case of getting some simple advice first.

If this is of concern to you or someone you know please consider visiting the Monmouthshire County Citizens Advice office for help in exploring what options may be available to assist you with heating related issues such as: fuel payment arrears, switching to a better tariff for your fuel needs; financial assistance for the replacement of condemned or unrepairable boilers; and possible grants for the improvement of building insulation. As part of this work Citizens Advice are researching those in Wales who are not on mains gas and the issues this may cause. If this is you please contact your local office for information and to help with our investigations.

Christmas is also a time when we can spend more freely than we normally do and if you would like help with dealing with debt, again please do contact Citizens Advice for assistance. Their website can offer information on this as well, visit Adviceguide, which can be found at https://www. citizensadvice.org.uk/wales. The site gives a wide range of information and links to other sites and organisations where you can find information and options to deal with the issues you may have.

In addition if you would like to speak to someone then you can ring their national Advice Line Service on 03444 772020. If as a result of your conversation with the Adviser it is agreed that you need further help from a local Bureau, your details would be passed to the local office so that an appointment can be made for you.

Gardening Matters:

Brought to you by Chepstow Garden Centre

The start of the New Year marks your last few weeks on easy street before seed-sowing starts in earnest. Make the most of it by finishing off the winter jobs and getting ready for the new season.

Keep an eye out for overwintering weeds as some, like chickweed, can still set seed and spread in milder spells. Check any trees and shrubs you planted in autumn to make sure the frost hasn't lifted the roots out of the ground.

Ornamental garden: Plant low box hedging for an elegant formal edging to parterres and knot gardens, spacing plants about 20cm apart.

Prune wisteria back to two or three buds from the main stems to tidy it up and show off flowers at their best. Sow sweet peas in root trainer modules under cover for a scented display this summer.

Kitchen garden: Chit seed potatoes by setting them out in egg boxes. Place somewhere bright and frost-free to sprout.

Prune grape vines while they're still dormant, cutting back the side shoots to within one or two buds of the main stem.

Force rhubarb by covering the crowns with an upside down black dustbin or large plant pot with the holes blocked for long, slender, sweet stems within about eight weeks.

Time to Clean Tools! It's also a good idea to give your tools some TLC while the garden is quiet, as it won't be long before you're calling on them to work hard for you again - and you'll want them in tip-top condition when you do!

Start by cleaning your tools, brushing off any dirt and oiling wooden handles with teak oil. Next, turn your attention to sharpening blades.

It's not only cutting blades such as secateurs, loppers, garden knives and shears which need sharpening; hoes are most effective with a keen edge, and spades also cut through the ground more cleanly when kept sharp.

Invest in a traditional sharpening stone or custom-made sharpening tool - you'll find a good selection in our garden centre here in



Chepstow. Aim to create a bevelled edge on the cutting blade of your tool, sharpening one side only. Hold larger tools securely and skim the stone in sweeping strokes across the blade, pressing down firmly. For smaller tools, hold the stone, skimming the cutting edge of the tool evenly across.

Finish by carefully wiping over the blade with an oily rag to keep the edge keen until you need it. You may need to repeat the process during the season, especially if you garden on stony or heavy soils.

Plan your Crops! If you enjoy growing your own veg, you could also plan your crop rotation for this year, working out where you'll be growing what and at the same time avoiding the worst of the pests and diseases.

If you grow the same thing in the same place year after year colonies of pests simply increase from one season to the next, feeding on each successive generation until they reach plague proportions. Group the same types of veg together (legumes, for example, or brassicas) and then move them around the plot to interrupt the cycle, keeping all those nasties at bay.

Sit down now with a pencil and sketch what you grew where this year while it's all fresh in your mind. Then move each group of crops around clockwise by one bed, and draw a new plan for the coming season.
