Hello all, I am Community Support Officer Geraint Reynolds the CSO for Chepstow Town (St Marys and St Kingsmark) area along with CSO Ceri Vaughan. We have both been CSO's for over 8 years. I have working in Chepstow for 5 years and Ceri ioined us in February 2016 from Caldicot. We are joined by 3 other CSO's and 1 Neighbourhood Ward Manager who cover other areas of Chepstow.

Our "Your Voice" priority within Chepstow town and St Kingsmark is illegal parking. We have issued over 96 tickets since December 2015. Tickets range from parking on double yellow lines, single yellow lines, disabled bays, restricted zones, limited waiting areas and using a vehicle where prohibited.

Easter thoughts: Changing Times?

A regular walk into Chepstow takes me across the A48 road bridge. It's a good chance to get a birds' eye view of how things are changing in the area below the bridge. The demolition of various buildings recently reminds us that, regardless of our views on what 'they are going to do', things are changing and there is a desire to have something new in place of something old. Whatever we think about this and no matter how useful (or otherwise) those buildings were, we often have a sense of sadness when we consider the finality of what we know has gone.

This was further impressed upon me when my husband and I recently visited the village where he grew up. Much had changed in the village with shops and factories turned into houses and new houses added. Then we looked at the house where he grew up; completely changed, his childhood home gone for ever!

With Easter fast approaching, it made me wonder how Jesus' disciples felt about that very first Easter? It must have turned their world upside down. Certainly their life with Jesus had been at times comforting, challenging, disturbing and thought provoking. The Good Friday crucifixion scene would have left them feeling empty and hopeless, knowing that life would never be the same again. Jesus had tried to warn them that life would change, but they hadn't understood. How surprised they must have been when the women – considered to be unreliable witnesses in Jewish law courts – came to say that Jesus was alive. Then to have Jesus appear to them as well! At last they knew for sure that that Jesus was someone special.

But the amazing thing here is that Jesus can still be with us today. With us, through all the changing scenes of life. When we feel the world has come to an end, or when we're on cloud nine, and everywhere else in between. So, however, much has changed in our lives recently, let's remember that others have been there too and we can ask Jesus to help us through it all.

Chepstow Matters readers will remember the fundraising efforts last year to secure a piano for the Drill Hall. A 'Celebration of the Piano' concert has now been organised at the Drill Hall, on Saturday 16th April starting at 7.30pm.

Now that there is a grand piano in situ, the evening will celebrate all the myriad ways a piano can be used: playing solos, duets, even trios(!) and also in its role as an accompanying instrument, for example with solo singers, choirs and instrumentalists.

To demonstrate this, the evening will also be an opportunity to celebrate the cream of Chepstow's young musical talent. All of these young musicians go to local schools and they will be performing many different styles of music, so there will be something for everyone to look forward to.

The evening will feature pianists of a high standard, aged 7 to 16 from the Chepstow Piano Academy (director Yvonne Lewis) and will include Joe Rooney who recently reached the regional final of the European Piano Teachers' Association UK Competition which will take place at the Royal Welsh College of Music and Drama.

Olly Jenkins (saxophone) is an up and coming jazz saxophonist and Elliot Kempton a wonderfully gifted viola player. Also on this occasion the versatile and hugely talented young female singer Ceira Moulton will be singing a 'Gospel' solo.

There are a number of interesting singing groups in the Chepstow community and one of those is 'The Chepstow Chatelaines.' Directed by Karl Daymond, this all-female prize-winning chamber choir will be performing a selection of delightfully stylish songs from their repertoire.

As a finale to this eclectic mix of music The Chepstow Singing Club will be singing their own unique tribute to David Bowie. Accompanied by Karl Daymond this local group of enthusiastic male and female voices embraces singers

of all ages and musical backgrounds.

The Mayor of Chepstow, Councillor Dale Rooke will be attending the event along with the Chairman of Monmouthshire County Council Councillor Brian Strong and his lady wife Mary. Councillor Brian Strong has been particularly supportive in the fundraising concerts for the piano and both he and Mary Strong have a keen interest in encouraging young local musicians.

This entertaining and enjoyable concert will be in aid of the Chepstow Piano Fund; the fund is ongoing so as to help keep the piano maintained. Tickets are £8 or £5 for 12s and under and will be available at the door or from the Chepstow Bookshop.











Community Matters: Local Group wins Community Award

Congratulations to local support group for the homeless, SLS, who have won a local Halifax community award for their fantastic work for the homeless and vulnerable over the last 15 months.

Founder Claire Day initated the facebook group as a way of collecting donations for a local team helping the homeless on the streets of Bristol, which she and her family had been part of. Since then the group has grown beyond

Cotton buds; Candles; Paper clips; Water? Keep it out of your ears!

Many people can't have water in their ear canals, yet many also have blockages; what can be done? You should never try to remove earwax by sticking cotton buds or paper clips or hair grips into them. The lining of the canal is very delicate and can be affected easily with infection being introduced and/ or physically damaged. Chepstow Walking Festival has become firmly established on the walker's map and each year brings something new to those who live locally or are visitors to the area.

As the days lengthen the Lower Wye Valley comes into its own and by joining a walk there is no better way to experience its landscape and heritage.

There are 28 walks of various lengths on offer, led by friendly experienced walk leaders. Many are specialists who work in an around the Lower Wye Valley and are happy to share their knowledge and enthusiasm on the walks. As Chepstow Tourist Information Centre is closed until the beginning of April, Chepstow Walkers are unable to offer the full






Noam studied at the

"The economy is in ruins! Bottom line? Good management will defeat a bad economy."

Sir John Harvey-Jones MBE (16 April 1924 – 9 January 2008) was an English businessman best known by the public for his BBC television show, Troubleshooter, in which he advised struggling businesses. Listening to the radio one day whilst travelling in my car to visit a customer, Sir John was asked by an interviewer "did he have any survival tips for business owners?" Sir John replied "Cash Flow - your business will only survive if you can manage it efficiently".

Here we are today, a few recessions later, and his words are just as relevant now as they were then. With this in mind, here are some simple adjustments that all businesses can make, which will deliver noticeable improvements to your bottom line.

Create a cash flow ritual

It's human nature to avoid the less attractive parts of our businesses (ledgers, bank balances, etc.). It allows us to keep 'busy', doing what's easy and comfortable, instead of what we know we need to do. Creating rituals will help you learn to love these financial parts of business.

Start your week by reviewing what you owe, who owes you, how much work is in the pipeline and how much cash you will have for the month ahead as a result. Then list out the outcomes you need to achieve to get you where you need to be and the actions you need to take to make them happen (chasing payments, closing contracts, making more sales, etc.). This will help you focus and work out what to do next.

Make your invoicing and debt management anonymous

Create a separate, generic email address for all billing and debt collection correspondence (e.g. accounts@a2zbusiness.co.uk), even if you're a one or two person business. This helps separate you from the billing process itself, especially if you deal with customers directly or have another prominent role in your business that you don't want to mix up with the painful job of chasing payments.

We've all been in the uncomfortable position of needing a customer to make a payment but not wanting to come across as needy or unprofessional. There is a natural fear that chasing debt will create pressure and strain the customer relationship.

By having a separate billing identity, you can create a virtual department at no cost, which can help bring you the cash you need on time, and give you more peace of mind.

Also use a neutral, business tone on all correspondence regarding billing, separate from your personal relationship with your client. This helps make things easier, should any issues arise later.

Use four elements to get your invoices to the top of your customer's payment list:

- A clear and specific deadline for payment i.e. the actual date instead of generic wording, e.g. 'within 30 days'
- More than one payment option the easier these options are for the customer, the better.
- 3. A clear consequence for late payment this should influence customers to pay on time and create a relationship of trust and respect around billing. Consequences can range between the loss of a specific privilege, a monetary penalty for late payments, or the use of debt collection agencies (whatever makes sense for your business).

To do this effectively, make sure you give your customers plenty of warning, and setup reminders so they don't miss them. Be flexible and fair, but firm and consistent too. The key to getting this right is the wording, process and delivery.

4. A request for immediate contact regarding late payments - by requesting upfront for immediate communication if they are unable to meet the deadline, you will be able to plan for cash flow shortfalls and negotiate new deadlines. Partpayments or other options that will give your client a breather but still keep them accountable for the new commitment they make.

Rob Ford, Headteacher at Wyedean said: "I just want to pass on my thanks and appreciation to the Science Learning Area for the success in raising aspirations of the students in KS3 learning science through our involvement with STEM, FameLab and the Cheltenham Festival. It was impressive to see the confidence of the students deliver their findings in front of outside judges. Wyedean Governor Paul Stephens and their peers yesterday. The more work through STEM we do as a school, to keep stretching and challenging the students, the better."

FameLab Academy is a competition for Year 9 students in Gloucestershire, sponsored by EDF Energy, Students have just three minutes to explain a scientific topic in a dynamic and engaging way to a panel of judges who will adjudicate the presentations based on their content, clarity and charisma.

All 150 students in year 9 prepared talks during their science lessons in December. A small committee runs the Society, and again welcomes new members who can contribute actively to its work.


