

What's in a name?

Names can be misleading. Names whose meaning was obvious when coined half a century or more ago are not so clear now, when society and attitudes have moved on.

One organisation whose name seems to mislead some people is Christian Aid. People who have taken part in the houseto-house collection in May in recent years have found that some people are reluctant or refuse to give because the name has given them a wrong impression of what the charity is about.

So, let me try to explain. The word 'Christian' is in the name because it is an agency of the churches in Britain and Ireland and its work is founded on Christian faith, inspired to show practical love and care for our neighbours.

The word 'Aid' perhaps speaks for itself and yet it is here that the problem arises. Does Christian Aid imply that we are working to give aid only to Christians? The answer is an emphatic NO.

Our neighbours are people of all faiths and no faith, and so, working through partner organisations which know and understand the needs of their own people, Christian Aid provides urgent, practical and effective assistance where need is great, tackling the effects of poverty as well as its root causes.

We now work with more than 650 overseas partners in around 50 countries but 70 years on from our founding, the world isn't getting any fairer. The plight of Syrian refugees is a human crisis on a scale not seen since World War II. 15 million people in East Africa face severe food shortages. People living in Bangladesh live in constant fear of flooding. Over 50,000 people having their homes destroyed and cast into the street from earthquakes in Nepal. The list goes on......

Poverty is an outrage against humanity. It robs people of dignity, freedom and hope, of power over their own lives. So we won't stop now. We'll carry on tackling the causes of poverty. We'll continue to support local organisations to deliver real, practical change.

Christian Aid has a vision - an end to poverty and we believe that vision can become a reality. We believe in life before death



New Local Life Saving Equipment

Several years ago Winterbourne Parish Council was approached by a Parishioner, David Lloyd, who had qualified as a Great Western Ambulance Service Community First Responder for Winterbourne and surrounding area.

A First Responder is an unpaid volunteer living or working in a community who is trained by the Ambulance Service to provide basic emergency care to seriously ill patients until an Ambulance can get to the scene.

After hearing from David about the life saving work that a Community First Responder does, the Parish council agreed to fund a medical kit and defibrillator for David to use. The equipment has been in constant use ever since.

The Parish Council have been inspired by the work David does and decided to invest in a number of Public Access Defibrillators and to promote the importance for all of us to learn how to administer potentially life saving CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation).

CPR is a lifesaving technique that involves giving someone a combination of chest compressions and rescue breaths to keep their heart and circulation going. A defibrillator delivers an electrical current through the chest, which aims to shock the heart back into a normal rhythm allowing it to pump again.

If you come across someone who is not breathing, the most important thing is to call 999 and start CPR. After a cardiac arrest, every minute without CPR and defibrillation reduces someone's chance of survival by 10 per cent.

When you call 999, the operator can tell you if there's a public access defibrillator nearby. Don't delay or interrupt chest compressions to get the defibrillator send someone else or wait until someone else joins you and ask them to call 999

Winterbourne Parish Council has now installed three Public Access Defibrillators.

It is important that these are easily accessible so they have been installed outside Nat West Bank in Winterbourne, outside The Cross Hands in Winterbourne Down and outside The White Lion in Frenchay.

Public Access Defibrillators are very easy to use. Once a 999 operator has directed a caller to a Defibrillator voice commands and screen messages will guide the user step-by-step through the process and its intelligent technology will only allow it to shock a safe shock to be delivered.

As CPR is such an important aspect of treating someone who is not breathing Parish Councillors have undergone CPR training.

Growing Support

Growing Support is a local organisation supporting older people and people living with dementia to enjoy the garden and stay

connected with their community. We deliver 'social and therapeutic' gardening activities which basically means running gardening clubs with fun, engaging activities specially designed to increase opportunities for light exercise, sensory stimulation and social interaction.

Most people recognise that spending time outdoors. connecting with nature or being active in the garden makes us feel better. Studies show that regular gardening as part of a group can help people with dementia feel a renewed sense of purpose and belonging, reduce agitation and improve sleep and appetite. Yet as people grow older, particularly if they have dementia, they are less likely to be active and more likely to lose the confidence to leave the house, spend time outdoors or meet new people.

Growing Support runs thriving gardening groups across Bristol, with many groups being run in Care Homes in the Winterbourne area. Our typical gardener is over 70 and living with day to day challenges such as difficulty following instructions, problems remembering how to do small tasks, limited mobility or issues with sight or hearing. And yet, our gardeners are always working hard completing all kinds of jobs such as growing and harvesting food crops, creating colourful flower displays and fragrant herb gardens or helping attract wildlife by making bug hotels or bird cakes.

Local volunteers are key to a great gardening group. They provide individual support for the more difficult tasks so that everyone can take part and feel a sense of achievement at the end of the session. An important part of their role is to create a cheerful

social atmosphere, chatting with the gardeners and encouraging reminiscence and story telling.

Perhaps the best way to describe what we do is through the experience of one of our gardeners: Doreen was very agitated and upset when she arrived at the gardening club. Care staff commented that she was 'inconsolable, no matter what we try'. A Growing Support volunteer walked around the garden with her and they chatted until she became calmer. The group leader then supported her to plant flowers using accessible tools. After an hour Doreen was much calmer and interacting with the rest of the group, laughing when they laughed, and contributing to group activity. Care staff were amazed at the change in her!

It is this kind of positive impact on behaviour and mood that Growing Support wants to share with more people across Bristol.

New volunteers are always made very welcome by the friendly team. Full training is provided along with regular social events to help get to know fellow volunteers and share ideas and experiences.

Winterbourne's Woman of the Year 2015 & Greatest Loser 2016 reaches 5 Stone target weight loss

Liz Heath (pictured left), explains her Slimming World journey.

My story goes back as long as I can remember. I have alwavs been a 'big girl'

and just tried to put it to the back of my head. Each time I looked in the mirror I felt depressed and was walking around in size 22 clothes, weighing over 16 stone.

I had a stroke at a very young age, just after my son was born and I knew I had to be careful and was being monitored by the doctors. Each time I would go there for a check up, they would mention my weight and I knew that something had to change. My daughter, Steph joined Slimming World and I found that she would eat lots of nice food and still lose weight. I decided I would go along with her but felt nervous about going to a group like Slimming World because of what people might think.

At first. I didn't see how it was possible to eat the amount you could eat and still lose weight but after trying it for a week. I stood on the scales with a loss of 4.5lb. I went back the second week and lost some more, which gave me the motivation to carry on. However, some weeks I would gain weight and became frustrated but it made me more determined to keep going. My consultant. Frankie and the other Slimming World members at the Winterbourne group became my friends and having their support along my journey has helped with the weight loss.

I joined Slimming World in September 2014 and reached my target weight loss of 5 stone in April 2016. I can now wear size 12 clothes and feel great about myself when I look in the mirror. I can also now visit 'normal' shops and buy the clothes that I previously couldn't. Hearing people saying nice comments like "you've lost lots of weight or you look great" and being asked how? I just respond with Slimming World and smile.

My life has changed for the better and I feel great about the way I look. It's the little things that mean the most, the comments, the pictures and the fact I can run without feeling out of breath all the time. So I just want to say a massive thank you to Slimming World for changing my life and to the people I have met on my journey.

The group usually plays on the outdoor courts at Fromeside Community Centre, next door to the gymnastics club on a Tuesday evening (7 – 8pm) and also on Saturday mornings (9.30 – 10.30am). However the Tuesday session has currently moved to the Jubilee Centre in Bradley Stoke



to take advantage of the floodlights - it will be back in Winterbourne from the beginning of April.

Understanding that everyone has lots of work and life commitments, the club goes the extra mile to make it as flexible as possible. Some ladies are able to train regularly whilst others only train when they can, and this is completely fine. A regular weekly commitment is not expected but obviously it is lovely to see ladies returning week on week and really enjoying having fun whilst having a workout! Fired Up Netball play friendlies with local teams and have also taken part in a few Back to Netball tournaments. There are also regular social events.

You don't need to have any previous experience of playing netball as all the rules are explained. Most of the current group hadn't played since school (which for some was a very long time ago!) The club is open to ladies over 30 of any level of fitness and ability. They have just run some Back to Netball sessions through Avon Netball and have welcomed more new players back to the court, which is great. Hopefully some of our readers will be encouraged to go along and try out your netball skills (good or bad!).

Sporting News from The Ridings' Federation of Academies



WIA student represents Republic of Ireland women's team

Last week, Winterbourne International Academy student Harriet Lambe (14 years old) represented the Republic of Ireland Women's under 16s football team, in two International friendlies against Wales U17s.

Harriet, also a talented cricketer, had trained with the squad during the Easter holidays before playing in the 2-0 and 4-0 victories against Wales within the space of a few days.

Irish coach, Sharon Boyle said "We did very well. Every player did their job and we were delighted with them.... The girls stood up really well against a strong side and particularly when you consider that they were giving away a year."

These International friendlies were arranged in order to challenge the girls, before a squad is chosen to travel to Hungary in May for an International tournament between the hosts, Hungary, The Republic of Ireland, Czech Republic and Poland.

Mrs Tiggywinkle needs you!

Most nature lovers and keen gardeners alike are aware that possibly our most quintessentially British of all mammals the humble hedgehog desperately needs our help. Their numbers have drastically declined from approx 30 million in the 1950's to less than 1 million today!

However it's not all doom and gloom, as it seems they are actually doing rather well in some urban and suburban areas, better it seems than the country side. This is perhaps due to greater biodiversity our many and varied gardens and less use of pesticides, as more and more of us like to try to garden with nature in mind.

These are a few very simple things you can do that will make all the difference to our spiky little friends survival. I can confirm the effort is well worth it, as the sight of a mother hedgehog with three little babies in tow is a wonderful sight to behold and a highlight of summer for us! I live right in the middle of Bristol so if I have hedgehogs you can too.



- 1. Make a couple of small holes in or under your garden fence to allow them to roam in and out of your garden freely, the biggest barrier they face is literally a barriers. Fences and walls stop them meeting, mating and gathering enough food to survive and it only needs to be small gap the size of a CD or end of a house brick as they can squeeze through fairly small gaps.
- 2. Create or buy a hedgehog feeding station and place dried cat food and a bowl of water in it (never bread or milk it makes them ill) lots of designs or ready made ones to buy on line.
- Put a ramp in your pond if it has steep sides they can swim but need a gentle slope to get out, also ponds are good for biodiversity and water for them to drink on a hot summer night.
- Create hedgehog hotel/hibernation station. again there are lots of designs to make or buy online.
- 5. Always check before you strim or light bonfires etc. hedgehogs often make rather clumsy day nests so do check.
- Use nature friendly slug pellets or nematoads but once you have happy hedgehogs they will keep the pests down for you, they truly are the gardeners friend.

Finally if you have hedgehogs in your garden sign your street up online as a 'Hedgehog street' with the PTES (People's Trust for Endangered Species) at https://ptes.org/ and get your neighbours involved too as it turns out what's good for hedgehogs is also good for us too, a nice community and a bit of TLC from those around us. Good luck!



Why do Libraries Matter?

As a resident of South Gloucestershire who also works for the library service, this year's budget cuts and possible closures come as sad, but unsurprising news.

For many residents the library is a space they no longer occupy. With e-readers in many homes and Internet retailers offering myriad books at discount prices, it is understandable how the traditional role of libraries has been challenged.

However 'books', although intrinsically woven into the fabric of libraries, are in reality a tiny part of the work we do. We are a non-judgemental inclusive community space offering a safe haven, advice, shelter. Internet access, activities, a smile and a friend. Our outreach work with local nurseries and schools is pivotal to engaging the next generation of happy learners. If we close, who fills the gap for those who need any of, or indeed all the above?

I recently attended a service planning meeting where we were asked to share anecdotal evidence of how libraries change lives. The list is diverse and limitless:

- The shy child whose confidence has grown exponentially. The mother attributes this to the half hour Rhymetime sessions held at all South Gloucestershire libraries.
- The first time I.T. user in tears during a 1:1 computer session now accessing our Wifi from her own laptop and able to Skype her grandchildren in the US.
- The recovering alcoholic reconnecting with his passion for sci-fi, delighted to learn of our reservation system accessing over 2 million books.
- The adult with learning difficulties who came accompanied with a carer. She was





withdrawn, unable to communicate or make eye contact with staff or other users. After observing our successful book folding group she returned encouraged to give

it a try. Now a regular craft group member she attends unaccompanied and engages with other members of the group.

These are but a few examples of real people. real lives who cross our thresholds everyday. finding opportunity and potential within the library. Without libraries there is a significant chance that this potential will remain unrealised resulting in marginalised lives unable to connect. This is a space which can never be filled by Internet retailers or e-readers.

Raising Awareness of Baby Hip Health

A local family's story

This month we were pleased to be contacted by a Frampton Cotterell family with a request to help raise awareness of the organisation STEPS - a national charity supporting children and adults affected by a lower limb condition such as clubfoot or a hip condition. This is a charity particularly close to their heart after calling on their support when their eldest daughter was just a few weeks old.

Mum Mady explained to me it was during her baby Beatriz's eight week check that the doctor suspected she may have Hip Dysplasia, a scan confirmed this. At ten weeks young Beatriz was put into a harness, the family were told she would have to wear this for sometime between two months to two years and surgery may be necessary.

Recalling the events Mady told me it was an extremely traumatic time both emotionally and on a practical level. The brace that pins the legs into a frog like position could not be removed at all, so there was no bathing, no swimming and clothes had to be adapted to fit dear Beatriz. It was at this frightening time that the family discovered STEPS. The charity's website filled with practical information was a life saver, the family were also able to read about several success stories on the site and were given hope. "They made the condition seem ok and we could see there was light at the end of the tunnel" said Madv.

Amazingly at twenty weeks Beatriz was able to be released from her harness. The physio the family saw, told them in twenty five years she had never

seen such a bad case. So it is remarkable what a great recovery she made in that time. Beatriz was signed off with the consultant at twenty months and has never looked back.



Now four years old, she is extremely active and loves swimming and gymnastics.

When I spoke with Mady, Beatriz was tearing around in the garden with little sister Lorena. It was expected that Lorena would be born with the same condition but thankfully this was not the case.

The local family would like to encourage people to support STEPS in anyway that they can, perhaps by hosting a 'Put the Kettle on' coffee morning at home or work to spread the word about baby hip health and help raise vital funds at the same time. Progress: December 2015 -February 2016

Clearance work in the northern corner of the Vertical Engine House in December uncovered a channel in the south-east wall. The opening leads to a vertical

channel on the outside of the wall. The top of the latter channel is located below ground level and is sealed, so the direction of the channel will have to be investigated at a later date when specialist equipment is available.

In January 2016 Historic England agreed to fund restoration work, mainly in the Old Pit area, and CWS Landscaping returned to site. The southern corner of the Cornish Engine House had been rebuilt by the end of January and work on this building was largely completed by the middle of February. A buttress is being built at the southern end of the bob (north-west) wall to support the arch in the wall. The area around the alcove in the southeast wall has also been patched.

The masons are also working in the Vertical Engine House, where the south-east wall is currently being partly rebuilt. This includes the reinstatement of the fireplace, dated 1982. The position of the holding down bolt in front of the fireplace suggests that the latter may have been a later addition.

A buttress is being built against the south-west wall between the winding drum pit and the adjacent engine bay to support an overhanging section of wall that is currently held up by ivy roots.

Clearance work by the volunteers at the heapstead end of the southern fan duct uncovered the bottom of one of the dampers still in place. It is still sitting against a cement seat in that (southern) wall, and there is a mark on the opposite wall where it must have hit when closing the northern duct. The northern duct has been cleared of spoil, revealing a sloped bottom. Spoil clearance outside and to the north of the ducts, has uncovered two square engine beds. Adjacent to them is a length of armoured power cable. An 85%" long glass bottle, marked 'Holbrook & Co' was found in this area. Spoil clearance outside the fence has uncovered what may be the position of the fan. A curved brick built structure has been found under the ground level, aligned with the engine bed found in 2013.

The masons stripped back the ivy and other shrubs growing along the top of the Old Pit heapstead walls so that the tops of the walls could be capped at a later date. This uncovered two structures that were probably tippler slots for loading railway wagons and these were investigated by the volunteers. One artefact found here was part of a spoken wheel, probably from a coal tub. Cleaning off-site separated it into two pieces, the remains of the wheel and an unrelated piece of bent pipe. This area is still being investigated.

Outline of Work for 2016

Following discussions with Historic England about a grant, it was decided to use professional masons to rebuild/patch/repoint/cap various walls in 2016. This will stop further deterioration of the structures by sealing surfaces against the ingress of rain. As well as the work on the Cornish Engine House, Vertical Engine House and Old Pit heapstead ramp wall that has already been described, the contract includes capping of the tops of the Old Pit heapstead walls and repointing the brickwork on the outside of the top of the chimney. Other work that will hopefully be completed this year is the capping of the top of the New Pit heapstead walls, rebuilding the edges of the doors and windows in the Horizontal Engine House, and repairs to both the brickwork of the passage under the Pumping Shaft crossover and the fan ducts.

There is still plenty for the volunteers to do. As well as continuing their work in the Fan Engine house area, there are a number of features elsewhere that have been uncovered by the masons and which need investigating. There are some walls that need rebuilding and repointing. And by the time they finish that lot, Brandy Bottom is bound to have pulled something else out of the hat!
