Police Matters -**Update from Chepstow Police**

Hello all, I am Community Support Officer Geraint Reynolds the CSO for Chepstow Town (St Mary's and St Kingsmark) area along with CSO Ceri Vaughan. We have both been CSO's for over 8 years.

Illegal Parking is again the "Your Voice" priority within Chepstow town and St Kingsmark. We will continue to look at this problem over the next few months.

We want to remind people about parking within Chepstow:

• Double yellow lines you cannot park at any time (loading/unloading may take place)

Like on Welsh street. Thomas street and

Single yellow line you can park at sometimes check local signs

Like on Upper nelson street, St Kingsmark avenue and others

• Disable bays can only be used by disable badge holders

Bank Street along with other disable bays

- Restricted zones no parking at any time
 - High Street and Bank Street
- Limited waiting areas you can only park for a set time

Welsh street, Nelson Street and others

• Using a vehicle where prohibited you cannot enter the area unless for access.

Deans Hill, Hardwick Avenue and others

People with a disabled badge will be able to park at all of the above except a Restricted Zone and places that cause an obstruction.

Friends of the Dell Park Chepstow

The Dell Park area in Chepstow, is a well loved central play park, used by visitors and local families alike. It is a beautiful spot to let your kids blow off some steam and a place to chill out. What is there is well used, but it is in desperate need of an update, equipment is missing, there's not much scope for imaginative play and whilst the children using it make the best of the space there, it is starting to look tired.

These facts inspired local residents (Clare Adams, Suzanne Moore Osley and Lisa Beard) to each individually try to find out whether funding was available to update the Dell play park. Disappointed, they discovered that there were no current plans to make funds available and started to think

Fast forward a couple of years, and Clare found out about Lisa and Suzanne and asked whether they wanted to form a steering group with the objective to rejuvenate the park, by raising community awareness and seeking funding to get better play facilities.

The Friends of the Dell Park Chepstow (FDPC) was born! Soon they had another local resident on board, Vicky Yates and things were starting to take off. Clare set up a Facebook page to start to scope interest and soon member requests were coming in fast – 269 members and counting. This is very encouraging and the responses from the members on the Facebook page are equally encouraging and exciting.

FDPC aims to bring together those who care about the park, encourage thoughtful consideration of proposals made for the park area and enable as many people as possible to enjoy this valued space.

Advertising the first meeting on Facebook, Clare, Lisa, Suzanne and Vicky were not sure how many people would come, but it drew in 13 people, including local residents, business owners and 3 councillors. All of them have a love of Chepstow and wish to see its continued improvement. These members bring a great set of skills, and we feel very encouraged after our first meeting.

Since that meeting things have been developing at quite a pace, FDPC are setting up as an official community action group, plus a children's



competition has been designed and printed to go out to some local schools. On the back of the children's competition, FDPC are asking parents to fill in a short survey, so they can find out what residents would like to see in the park. The aim is to gather as much information to make informed decisions to try to get the equipment that people like, lots of discussions on Facebook are happening too. They even have their own logo to highlight the group and have set up a funding team who will be looking at grants available.

Its quite a task to take on, the group are looking for anyone else who may want to become a member of the steering group, volunteer time or services, or to help raise money towards the funding of the new equipment and work. They need people at all levels of involvement!

Chepstow and Caldicot Lions Club has presented Wyedean School in Chepstow with a defibrillator. This means that all major schools in Monmouthshire now have these machines in case of emergencies.

For The Lions Club this will be their fourth defibrillator presented in the last two months, having already donated three to the Newport and Chepstow First Responders.

Lion President Ray Nash presented the machine to headmaster Robert Ford at the school on Thursday 5th May, after which the Ambulance Service gave the school staff a training session on how to use the apparatus.

The Headmaster Robert Ford said "this will be a major improvement in emergency care for the school and could possibly save a life".

The weather promised to make it a really great day for the 14th Rotary Club WYE RUN in which Classic Cars followed a series of precise instructions to traverse a 100 mile scenic drive through the glorious Monmouthshire and Herefordshire countryside.

At 8am the drivers and co-pilots arrived at the Chepstow Garden Centre in Pwllmeyric to enjoy a hearty breakfast to

prepare them for the Run. Oil was checked. Tyre pressures checked. Then, one by one at 30 second intervals, the cars were launched by a wave of the chequered flag.

Off into the windy lanes above Woodcroft they drove only to find themselves at Taurus Crafts for coffee 30 minutes later. Then onwards through St Briavels, Bream, Lydney and Blakeney into the deepest reaches of The Royal Forest of Dean where there were swathes of beautiful bluebells covering the forest floor. A wonderful sight, especially for the visitors some of whom had travelled from as far as Sussex to enter this celebrated annual Rotary event.

Ross Labels was the next stopover where many a credit card received a beating as the ladies enjoyed the discount fashions on offer. Hereford then promised an interesting visit, especially the cathedral that dates from 1079 and has the famous medieval Mapp Mundi. However, it seemed that thousands of others had the same idea and the city was very crowded and every car park was full to the brim.

The drivers escaped into the rolling countryside and on through Pontrilas that lies just half a mile from the border with Wales and then Grosmont that is linked to the Welsh Prince Owain Glyndŵr.

After Monmouth and a drive down the most beautiful stretch of the Wye Valley the cars took the chequered flag in a large field in Tintern next to the Anchor Inn and in the shadow of the dramatic

Tintern Abbey. The ice cream stall did a roaring trade in the bright, hot sunshine and the 45 cars looked most colourful against the green of the hills. Everyone agreed that this had been a really enjoyable day and The Rotary Cub was thanked by the entrants for organising this special annual event. All of the moneys received will be donated to Rotary charities.

Buy A Slate for St Mary's Priory

St Marys Priory Church is a beautiful feature of huge pride and significance to the town of Chepstow and its residents.

Heritage Lottery has awarded St Mary's Priory a £12,000 set up grant with a first round pass for a grant of £146.000 towards essential repairs to the roof and to provide a disabled access. The total cost of the project is nearer £350,000 although it will be completed in phases. There is therefore some fundraising effort still to be done and the first target is to reach £200,000.

It is hoped that the lovely people of Chepstow may be able to help to preserve this historically significant Grade 1 listed building. The Church already boasts over 1000 visitors per year, regularly welcoming local school children and bus tours. It is also a significant Arts venue within the town, and is used by many groups for concerts and events throughout the year. Importantly, this landmark building promotes tourism in Chepstow which has a positive impact upon our local businesses.

Remembering Harrison Marshall and Raising Funds for Dublin

In April Chepstow School's Year 9 football team became Welsh Champions after beating John Bright 2:1 in an action packed final played in Newtown, North Wales. As a result the team headed to Dublin on Friday 20th May to represent Wales and play the winners of England, Scotland, Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland. Per our facebook page and our May issue, several thousand of pounds needed to be raised for the boys to travel and stay in Dublin and also for some new kit to play in

The Chepstow community really responded and within just 3 weeks the total of £8,000 had been raised through a variety of means: sponsorship, donations, £800 from the team bagpacking at Tesco on a Saturday morning, £1,000 presented by Mayor Dale Rooke following a team presentation to the Town Council.

Assistant Head Teacher and Team Coach Jamie Goddard commented: "The team won nine games en route to the final against local, regional and national sides. Their incredible success is a culmination of great team spirit and amazing positive attitude from the whole squad. We are so proud of them, they are an absolute credit to the school. It is such an honour to be representing Wales in the British Finals - the response from the local community has been overwhelming!"

Chepstow Matters was pleased to be invited along to attend a Fundraising night at Chepstow School on 12th May, with Chepstow teacher Mr Mitchell offering the services of his excellent band 'Classic Soul Dogs' to perform on the night. There was a raffle and auction with a fabulous list of prizes and services given by a multitude of businesses from across the local community. The evening was a great success raising over £1,000.

The day had also been a non-school uniform day not only to raise funds but also in memory of fellow pupil Harrison Marshall, who tragically died in a road accident shortly after starting year 7 at Chepstow School in 2013. Each year the school has held a year 7 inter-form football tournament in his memory, which also took place on 12th May. Harrison loved his football and would likely have been part of this champion team with his peers.





The U14s have chosen to honour Harrison by requesting that his name be included on their new kit for the occasion (kindly sponsored by Keen Attachments). They were also provided with team tracksuits

to travel in, courtesy of Stud Welders Ltd, Polo shirts by K&M taxis, T-shirts by Henry Howard Finance, Training tops by Chepstow Plant Hire, Bags by Total Teamware and their coach transfers were given for free by Edwards Coaches!

Head Teacher Claire Price told us "We are in awe of the community's fantastic response. This evening alone has been pulled together in just two weeks - all the prizes donated from local businesses and the band giving their performance for free. It is simply amazing. We are pleased that Harrison's family are here with us tonight to share this event; the fact that the team will play in Dublin in Harrison's memory is particularly humbling and illustrates our School values of respect and kindness".

The team were heading out to Dublin as we went to print on this edition. We very much look forward to hearing how they got on over the weekend and will update via twitter and our facebook page!


Elderfit was started by Tom and friend Gareth, who have worked together within the fitness industry for the past 15 years. Their aim is to improve the wellbeing of older people by offering fitness sessions which can be carried out by everyone and are specifically designed to increase strength and balance, and reduce the risk of falling. The classes draw on a variety of techniques, including mobility exercises, resistance bands and hand/ leg weights. Exercises are adapted to suit the individual's needs, to ensure that participants feel the full benefits of the classes. Elderfit also aims to strengthen upper body muscles for participants, so if a fall does happen they will be more able to pull themselves back up. Creating independence is a key


The event, which took place on Friday 13 May at St John's on-the-Hill School in Chepstow, showcased the latest Spring and Summer collections from




Frankenstein Fest

Marking the anniversary of a remarkable night 200 years ago ...

With the celebrations of Chepstow's Wye Bridge opening in July 1816, came the idea of marking other events that made 1816 significant. It was known as the 'Year without a Summer' because of the dreadful weather conditions in Northern Europe that resulted from a massive volcanic eruption of Mount Tamboro in Indonesia the year before. Temperatures were low, rainfall was high and the sun was obscured. This was not just miserable, but catastrophic causing harvests to fail and famine and suffering as a result. But the dark and stormy nights would have other consequences that had a lasting impact on English literature and culture.

Percy Shelley, the 18 year old Mary Godwin (not yet Mrs Shelley until Percy's wife committed suicide later that year) their son William, and Mary's stepsister Claire Clairmont, one of Lord Byron's lovers, arrived in Lake Geneva. Lord Byron accompanied by his physician Dr Polidori appeared 10 days later. It was Shelley and Byron's first meeting but soon the company had abandoned the hotel and Byron had taken a large house the Villa Diodati, Shelley and his party a smaller villa nearby. The weather confined them to the house, and long nights were spent talking late, reading poetry, German ghost stories, and discussing the spark of life, animation and galvanism, while lightning flashed across the lake, thunder crashed, and candlelight flickered. It was one such night, the 16th June, that Lord Byron suggested they should all write a ghost story... a challenge that was to lead to the birth of two iconic tales of horror - the best known Mary Shelley's Frankenstein, the other John Polidori's The Vampyre which would influence Bram Stoker's Dracula. For everyone there it was a life changing time.

In a mini Frankenstein Fest organised by Chepstow Museum, there's a chance to discover much more about the poets and their party, the influences and inspirations that gave birth to Frankenstein and its power as a story to endure and take new form in film especially. Five nights of events at the Drill Hall Chepstow begin on the anniversary of the night itself (see event information, right, for details).

The Festival Finale is a Big Bicentenary Bash for the Chepstow Wye Bridge. The clock will be turned back 200 years with a modern and period re-enactment of the original opening ceremony with its procession which took place on 24th July 1816, followed by a fair, music, a vintage vehicle cavalcade, and later the fireworks will make the final flourish to Chepstow's Fifteenth Festival.

This beautiful Regency structure is now the longest surviving cast iron arch road bridge in the world that was built during the first 50 years of iron and steel construction. The first iron bridge in the world was opened in 1781 at Ironbridge in Shropshire. Before that bridges had been built from wood or stone. A number of special events are planned to celebrate this special anniversary:

On 16th July there is a one-day workshop with a number of eminent speakers at the Drill Hall organised by Chepstow Museum. On 18th July there will be an evening illustrated talk by John Burrows on the bridge and its hitherto unrecognised importance in engineering history.

As above, on the 200th birthday itself, on 24th July, there will be a modern re-enactment of the 1816 opening ceremony with the procession leaving Beaufort Square at 1pm to a short ceremony on the bridge followed by a cavalcade of old vehicles and a local fair with charity stalls and games on the riverbank, a band on the Bandstand. In the evening more music from 9 pm, and a firework display.



Music in June Returns in Style

Hearing Matters: What causes hearing problems?

The answers are many and varied! Over the coming months, I shall attempt to address the many problems that can occur with hearing. However, there are four main areas that concern people on a daily basis.

Blockages – The inability to hear well is frequently blamed on a person's ears being blocked by wax deposits. Wax is a perfectly natural phenomenon; it is caused by dead skin cells mixing with sebaceous oils in the ear canal. 

Funding your Business

You've had this brilliant idea that solves a problem or adds value for customers.

You've researched the market and found that people are willing to pay for what you have to offer.

Now, finding funding is the next step in turning your idea into reality.

Access to the right kind of funding at the right time plays an important role in growing a successful business.

Funding options:

1. Overdrafts:

An overdraft is a credit facility you agree with your bank and is generally used to cover short-term financing needs. Although an overdraft isn't suitable as a long-term source of finance, it can go a long way towards meeting immediate funding needs. Overdrafts are flexible as you only pay interest on the amount you borrow. They are also easy to arrange but can be recalled by the bank at any time.

"As a business, you'll know that attracting investment is perhaps your biggest challenge. So anything that makes investing more attractive, for you or for other people, has got to be good news."

2. Loans:

The most common sources of loans are friends, family and banks. There are also government initiatives such as Start Up Loans that grant loans to individuals, allowing several founders in the company to apply.

Loans carry interest on the amount borrowed. How much interest you pay depends on factors like how long you need the money for, whether the loan is 'secured' against assets you own, or other broader economic factors, like the Bank of England base rate.

3. Equity Finance:

Simply put, equity finance involves selling part of your company to get the funds you need. This takes different forms at different stages of the company's life:

Seed funding: This is needed for product development, setting up a management structure, market research, etc. You can approach accelerators, angel investors or crowdfunding platforms for seed funding.

Early-stage funding / Series A: This comes into play

once you're close to taking your product to market. It can be broken down into multiple rounds if needed and tends to involve angel investors and perhaps venture capital firms.

Expansion-stage funding: Once you've taken your product to market and validated your business model, the next step is to expand. This is similar to early-stage funding, but tends to come from VCs and private equity firms (PEs) who are usually interested in more established businesses.

Exit-stage funding: This is the capital needed to maintain the momentum you've gained over the years and meet exit costs before you exit the business. This could come from a trade sale or a public listing.

4. Accelerators:

Accelerators are programmes that combine seed capital and mentorship support. The standard model is a structured and intensive programme that runs for about 3-6 months. Programmes generally culminate in a 'demo day' where start-ups pitch to a group of investors to raise the next round of funding. Some accelerators, instead of capital, offer free working space and mentorship support. More often than not, they are backed by

large corporates who are interested in tapping into the innovative ideas from the start-ups they help.

5. Crowdfundina:

Crowdfunding has seen enormous growth in the past few years because it gives businesses the ability to pitch to the masses. If people pledge funds, they will probably buy your product too. However, you do miss out on the mentoring and guidance that you get with accelerators, which can make the difference between making it big or going bust. There are two types of crowdfunding platforms: Equity platforms and rewards-based platforms.
