## Police Matters - **Update from Chepstow Police**

This will be my last blog for the Chepstow matters newsletter. A new ward officer for the Larkfield, St Christopher and Thornwell wards will be announced next Month.

Over the past two Months the biggest impact on the community was when 33 vehicles were reported as damaged on Western

We have been concentrating on the 'YOUR VOICE' priorities selected by local residents. We have conducted regular speed checks on Bulwark Road, several warning letters have been sent to those speeding.

Fixed penalty notices have been issued to vehicles parked illegally on Western Avenue and the surrounding area.

Hot spot anti-social behaviour areas have been regularly patrolled, no warning letters have been issued for youth anti-social behaviour this month, and calls have reduced.

The 'Your Voice' questionnaires will now be conducted twice a year instead of every three months, this will give officers more of a chance to act upon issues and resolve them.



## **Chepstow Couple Launch New Venture in Magor**

It was a real pleasure to be invited to the launch of a fabulous new cafe bar and supper club in Magor on the evening of 22nd June.

**Grazia** is the new venture of the lovely Abbie and Gianni Zanotti, whom I first met at the Hedgehogs Nursery launch in May when Abbie was still the Nursery Manager there.

"It was time for a change" Abbie told me, "although it happened quite by accident really as we initially looked at the premises in Magor for my daughter and her fiancé. They decided it wasn't quite right for what they were looking for, but Gianni and I went home, had a coffee and a chat and decided that actually it could be perfect for us!" Abbie and Gianni are no strangers to the catering business having previously ran an Italian restaurant together at The Bridge Inn in Chepstow some 15 years ago.

Abbie and Gianni have refurbished the venue themselves and are very excited to have received such positive remarks and reviews since taking over the premises at the start of June. Always working with an open door,

they have welcomed many members of the local community in already to say hello and give their views whilst preparations to open have been forging ahead. Many of these were also present at the launch party - which was a very popular affair. "Magor is very well provided for with takeaways and food venues, but hopefully we are providing something a bit different. We are not a restaurant, but will be open for breakfast, lunch or an early supper - last orders will be at 7pm" Abbie commented.

Prices are incredibly reasonably, with breakfast starting with 2 rounds of toast, with butter and jam for just 95p to a full English for £5.25. There is a range of paninis on offer at lunchtime, and a selection of antipasto and pasta dishes for supper. Coffee, cake and gelato are also available as is Prosecco (and other items at the bar!).

Grazia has already had interest from groups planning to hold breakfast meetings at the venue, and others interested in the coffee and cakes on offer. (We had an amazing orange cake to try at the launch - yum!)

## **Buy A Slate for St Mary's Priory**

St Marys Priory Church is a beautiful feature of huge pride and significance to the town of Chepstow and its residents.

Heritage Lottery has awarded St Mary's Priory a £12,000 set up grant with a first round pass for a grant of £146,000 towards essential repairs to the roof and to provide a disabled access. The total cost of the project is nearer £350,000 although it will be completed in phases. There is therefore some fundraising effort still to be done and the first target is to reach £200,000.

It is hoped that the lovely people of Chepstow may be able to help to preserve this historically significant Grade 1 listed building. The Church already boasts over 1000 visitors per year, regularly welcoming local school children and bus tours. It is also a significant Arts venue within the town, and is used by many groups for concerts and events throughout the year. Importantly, this landmark building promotes tourism in Chepstow which has a positive impact upon our local businesses.

## **Our South Africa Experience**

The South African exchange has continued for more than 16 years at St-John's-on-the Hill and is a once in a lifetime experience for those Year 7 children who are fortunate enough to go. This year the trip certainly did not disappoint.

As soon as our group touched down in Cape Town, we were greeted by children from Rondebosch Boys and Herschel Girl's Schools, who were excited to be spending the next 10 days with their visitors.

The children were taken on lots of amazing trips. Firstly, they went by cable car to Table Mountain, where the St John's tradition of creating a fun music video continued – this year the children created a dance video to Uptown Funk, which can be found on our school YouTube channel and is really worth a watch!

The pupils also enjoyed Segway tours in the Spier vineyard and visited Eagle Encounters where the children adopted an eagle, which they named Eddie. There was a boat trip to Seal Island, before heading along the most idyllic coastal route to Boulders Beach, to eat lunch with the penguins, and then on to Cape Point, the most southerly point in Africa.

St John's pupils were humbled by their visit to the biggest shanty town in Cape Town during a township tour, where they visited the local school to take them sport equipment, kindly donated by our exchange schools. The children got to take part in school lessons and played a game of football against children their age.

The next stage of the adventure took the group on a two hour plane journey to East London, where they were greeted by Stirling Primary School. Here St John's children were immersed further into the South African culture and school life, learning Afrikaans, and playing the Marimba and games of rugby.

They also had a few days at the beach where they took part in Jonginenge activities, which included surfing, sandboarding, canoeing and rock climbing. All of the children had a fantastic time learning to surf and everyone managed to stand up at least once (even Mr Hancock!).

The pinnacle of the trip was the three-day safari to Inkwenkwezi Game Reserve. We stayed in Areena, a family-friendly holiday park, two minutes from the reserve. Here the children took part in team building activities and made the most of the outdoor pool and play areas. They even had an interaction with Abby, the local, friendly Giraffe.

The safari game drives were an experience like no other and the children managed to spot: giraffes, zebras, lions, springbok, rhinos, wildebeests, blesboks and ostriches. They all appreciated how incredible it was to see these amazing animals in their habitat and









they even got to feed and stroke the elephants at a special interaction.

The children spent their final days with their host parents who were fantastic and looked after each child like their own. It was a truly wonderful experience for the children and staff that went on the trip and we hope that this exchange continues for many years.



Friday 26th August, the world famous 'Blues Band'

In the decade before the far reaching telephone call that started the Blues Band, frontman Paul Jones had been a hard working actor in London's West end and on Broadway, but at heart, he was a bluesman. Having declined an offer by Brian Jones to join the fledgling 'Rolling Stones' in 1962, Paul accepted the next offer to join a group which soon became 'Manfred Mann', who after a glittering career and countless world wide hits disbanded in 1969. In 1979 Paul formed The 'Blues Band', which consists of: Dave Kelly, Tom McGuinness, Rob Townsend and Gary Fletcher.

If there is such a thing as a British 'Blues Pedigree', then Dave Kelly sets the standard. Kelly is a blues craftsman who has served his time with the best. In the very early 1960s, long before the big 'Blues Boom', Tom McGuiness shared the stage in a band called 'The Roosters' with none other than an 18 year old prodigy, 'Eric

Clapton'. Nowadays, Tom's fiery stratocaster is another integral element in the sound of The 'Blues Band'. In the early 60s Rob Townsend played with Roger Chapman and Charlie Whitely with the much loved band 'Family'. After 7 great albums and 4 hit singles they disbanded. In 1982, he was invited to join the Blues Band and has been there ever since. Gary Fletcher met Dave Kelly when they both played in a band put together by Wilgar Campbell, the ex Rory Gallagher drummer called The Wildcats. He then went on to play with a string of top musicians until he was suggested by Dave to play Bass for The Blues Band.

The Festival Finale is a Big Bicentenary Bash for the Chepstow Bridge. The clock will be turned back 200 years with a modern and period re-enactment of the original opening ceremony with its procession which took place on 24th July 1816, followed by a fair, music, a vintage vehicle cavalcade, and later the fireworks will make the final flourish to Chepstow's Fifteenth Festival.

This beautiful Regency structure is now the longest surviving cast iron arch road bridge in the world that was built during the first 50 years of iron and steel construction. The first iron bridge in the world was opened in 1781 at Ironbridge in Shropshire. Before that bridges had been built from wood or stone. A number of special events are planned to celebrate this special anniversary:

On 16th July there is a one-day workshop with a number of eminent speakers at the Drill Hall organised by Chepstow Museum. On 18th July there will be an evening illustrated talk by John Burrows on the bridge and its hitherto unrecognised importance in engineering history.

## Be Scam Aware - July 2016

Each year millions of people in UK fall prey to scams. At Monmouthshire Citizens Advice we see many people where the impact of a scam has led to loss of money in the space of a telephone conversation; the click of a mouse or the stroke of a pen. Cold calls, high-pressure sales tactics and automated voicemails asking for people's details are just some of the tricks used by scammers. Scams targeting people by phone or post alone cost people in the UK an estimated £5 billion each year.

## July is Scams Awareness month and the message this year is:

- · Listen to your gut feeling
- Any concerns do not act immediately, ger advice, report it, tell others about it
- Get help from Citizens Advice Consumer Helpline 03454 04 05 06. They will give advice and pass details onto Trading Standards
- Report scams to Action Fraud 0300 123 2040 or www.actionfraud.police.uk
- Tell family, friends and neighbours about any scams

Scams come in a variety of guises and new ones are happening all the time. Some scams are one-offs which aim to persuade you to part with a sum of money, while others target your personal details so they can access your accounts or copy your identity. All scams cause distress and worry whatever the amount of money involved.

#### Examples of recent scams we have seen:

**Person A** received a phone call claiming to be from Trading Standards who said she was owed money by her bank, but in order to receive it she had to make an upfront payment. She sent the requested money to an address claiming to be a bank in India, but was then asked for a further series of payments to cover administration costs. If you are asked for money upfront, pause and verify independently with your Bank/Building Society before considering making any payment.

**Person B** received a 'cold call' from a telecom protection service, selling a device for £19.99 which would stop nuisance calls. Thinking the



company was BT she gave her card details for the payment but £99.99 was taken for the device. Having considered her action, she returned the device to the company but didn't receive a refund - but did receive a further telephone call asking for £85. The genuine Telephone Preference Service is free, they do not call potential users and can be contacted on 0345 070 0707.

Person C was booking train tickets online and entered his account details when asked for payment. Several pop-ups had appeared as part of this process and he subsequently discovered that money had been taken from his account by companies not related to the train ticket transaction. Always check when making payments that you are using a secure online link – usually indicated by a closed lock symbol next to the web address at the top of the screen.

Reporting suspicious offers, requests for payments and incidents of fraud is vital to helping to get scams closed down and the scammers



identified. Do not be hesitant about letting the appropriate organisations know if you have experienced a problem.

#### **TOP TIPS**

- Don't be rushed into taking action resist pressure to make a decision – if necessary put the phone down
- If it sounds too good to be true it probably is!
- If contacted out of the blue be suspicious take your time and check with a friend or relative if necessary.
- Reject cold calls offering investments, pensions advice or good deals on holiday properties
- If someone knocks on your door, you don't have to talk to them without being able to independently verify their story
- Banks and/or Building Societies do not phone account holders asking for account information or account actions over the phone. If you get such a call, give no details, hang up and do not use the phone for at least 5 minutes or use another phone to report it to Trading Standards and your bank or building society.

## Hearing Matters: What causes hearing problems?

The answers are many and varied! Over the coming months, I shall attempt to address the many problems that can occur with hearing. However, there are four main areas that concern people on a daily basis.

Blockages - The inability to hear well is frequently blamed on a person's ears being blocked by wax deposits. Wax is a perfectly natural phenomenon; it is caused by dead skin cells mixing with sebaceous oils in the ear canal. It can be removed - never by poking with cotton buds or other items - but syringing, irrigation or gentle, dry micro-suction.


