

As of 1st of October monthly meetings and members dinners will be held at the new venue, as always on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays of each month, and new members are always welcome.



Sean Matthews the new Landlord has stated that he and his partner Stephane Chauveau are delighted to welcome the Chepstow and Caldicot Lions Club to their premises. The Lions Club held a successful social afternoon at The Chepstow Castle Inn on the 17th of August enjoying a buffet lunch a raffle and a quiz (above).

The Club's ongoing project in collaboration with The British Heart Foundation is to provide defibrillators for all the surrounding villages, in next month's issue of the Chepstow Community Matters Magazine the Club will publish details of where all the machines have been placed and where to access training to use them.

#### Lions Club 'Message in a Bottle' Scheme

What is 'Message in a Bottle'?
Abbreviated to MIAB, it is a simple piece of paper asking pertinent questions that contains vital information about you, directed at the Emergency Services. This allows them to make quick and accurate decisions on what action to take at the point of contact, which could save your life in an emergency at home.

A white plastic bottle containing a form with vital information about you that could save your life due to the speed with which the Emergency Services could respond to your individual needs. The bottle is placed where the Emergency Services are trained to look, in the refrigerator door. A green cross sticker is placed

on the inside of the main house door, or where it is considered would be most obvious and another sticker on the door of the fridge.

The information provided should include where you keep your medication and latest prescription, contact details, major medical conditions, personal doctor and anything considered necessary that would need attention in those first critical moments.

Bottles can be obtained from most Lions Clubs free of charge, or if distribution has been carried out, from local chemists or primary care trusts in the area.

#### Lions Club Knights of the Blind

Lions Clubs throughout the UK and Ireland collect unwanted spectacles for distribution in underdeveloped countries. The spectacles are then sent to a Lions Refurbishment Centre in



Northern France, where volunteers grade, repair and refurbish thousands of pairs every year, these spectacles are then distributed to countries like Chile, Uraguay, Africa and the Far East, where those people and children who are unable to afford the cost of spectacles are supplied by local Lions Clubs.

This enables children to attend school, for adults it makes a real difference by being able to find employment due to better eye sight.

Chepstow and Caldicot Lions have over the past two years collected in excess of two thousand pairs of old spectacles, contributing to over 50,000 pairs sent from the UK alone.

If you have any old spectacles and would like to put them to good use, Lions collection boxes can be found at your local hospice shops, libraries and surgeries throughout the Chepstow and Caldicot area.

#### Help and Advice for Older People

As we get older, changes to our health and finances can affect the way that we live independently and manage our own affairs.

At Monmouthshire Citizens Advice we regularly see people who want information and advice on matters which will impact on the quality of their lives in the future. Our second article about older people highlights examples relating to health where we can provide information and help. We have given website addresses but you can also drop in to one of our offices in Abergavenny, Caldicot, Chepstow and Monmouth or ring Adviceline on 03444 772020.

#### Help with Managing your Affairs

As we get older our ability to manage our affairs may be affected by failing physical or mental health. A person can be given authority to manage someone else's affairs on a day to day basis, for example:

- looking after their financial affairs
- making decisions about their day-to-day personal or health care.

There are different ways of managing someone's affairs. Choosing the right one depends on circumstances and whether or not the person has mental capacity. Options are:

- with a letter or a third party mandate to deal with financial accounts
- · as an agent or appointee to deal with someone's welfare benefits or tax credits
- using a power of attorney
- as a deputy appointed by the Court of Protection

#### Wills

It is important for you to make a will whether or not you have many possessions or much money because:

 if you die without a will, there are certain rules which dictate how your money, property or possessions should be allocated

- unmarried partners and partners who have not registered a civil partnership cannot inherit from each other unless there is a will
- if your circumstances have changed, it is important that you make a will so that your money and possessions are distributed according to your wishes. For example if you marry or enter into a registered civil partnership, this will make any previous will invalid.

#### Financial Help for those with **Disabilities**

Attendance Allowance is a benefit for people with care needs who are 65 or over, and who do not get Disability Living Allowance (DLA) or Personal Independence Payment (PIP). To get Attendance Allowance you must have had care needs for at least six months (unless you are terminally ill). Care needs include help with, for example, washing, getting dressed, going to the toilet or taking part in social activities. Also if you need supervision to stop you from being a danger to yourself or others. If you are terminally ill, you are automatically treated as having care needs.

#### **Costs of Care and Selecting a Care Home**

Helping elderly people remain independent or finding a care home can be a challenge and the options and rules about financial help are complex. Firstly you should ask your council's Social Services Department to carry out a Needs Assessment. This can be carried out face to face or over the telephone and a family member or



friend can provide support. If you're eligible for help from the council, you'll be given a care plan outlining the help you can receive.

NHS Choices provides more information about how the council decides who's eligible for care and more detailed information can be found at https://www. citizensadvice.org.uk/wales/relationships/lookingafter-people/social-care-and-support/#h-what-toexpect-from-a-needs-assessment.

If an elderly person has been assessed as entitled to community care services there may be the option to receive cash payments (known as Direct Payments) from your council instead of care services. This can give you more flexibility and greater control of your support package.

#### Don't Put Debt On Your Christmas List, Warns Local Charity

THE local arm of a debt charity is calling for people to prepare early for the festive season rather than rely on expensive credit.

Christians Against Poverty (CAP), which specialises in helping people on a low income, says it sees many struggling to cope with the cost of Christmas.

Manager of the Chepstow & District CAP Centre Isobel Mead said: "It probably fills a few people with dread to think that Christmas is less than 90 days away but this is actually a great time to stop and consider how you can help yourself between now and then.

"There's a lot of hype from marketing people about buying the perfect Christmas, which we know in our hearts isn't real life, but we all so easily get swept up in it. Before all that hits our TV screens, now is the time to get together our own personalised plans for an enjoyable, stress free celebration.

"There are loads of ways to get started – the main thing is setting yourself a target and deciding on your tactics. The last thing your family would want is to see you in financial trouble in 2017."

CAP recommends the following to start saving for Christmas:

- Regularly saving supermarket stamps
- Storing supermarket loyalty points from Nectar/Clubcard
- Putting money away each week in a dedicated savings account
- Hiding away a special box for presents and buying something to put in it each week

With 80+ days to go, the charity also suggests using the time to make Christmas craft projects like knitting, making jam, brewing or growing something special.

"My other top tip is to manage expectations early. If you think Christmas will be difficult, talk to family early and decide what you can afford together. They may want to chip in with bigger items or you may decide on a 'presents for children only' rule. Time is on your side to make these arrangements now."

help of local churches. It does this through 306 debt counselling centres; a money education programme called the CAP Money Course; CAP Job Clubs for unemployed people; CAP Release Groups for people struggling with addictions and CAP Life Skills for people living on a low income.

Chepstow under 13's rugby team "swam the channel" last month in order to raise funds for their first rugby tour abroad.

Excited to have booked their tour to Holland in 2017, the team came up with the idea of a sponsored swim, undertaking as a tam to swim the 21 miles from Dover to Calais. The swim took place in the Bathurst outdoor pool and each mile was calculated to be 44 lengths, which meant as a team they had to swim 924 lengths to cover the distance.

In total they collectively managed 1141 lengths, so all the way to Calais and a little bit back as well. Joanne Masser told Chepstow Matters "The boys did an excellent job and I'm so proud of them. The pool was unbelievably cold so we had an authentic experience swimming the channel!"

The team is currently collating the fundraising but so far on just giving they have hit the £1,000 mark, which is 10% of the total funds they are looking to raise for next year.

Other fundraising initiatives include bag packing in Chepstow Tesco later in September, then in October more bag packing at M&S, and a guiz night at the club.






#### Free Concert at St John's on the Hill

complete lack of cynicism towards the character are utterly relatable and totally charming. She gives poignancy to how the real Florence summed up her life: "People may say I can't sing, but no one can say I didn't sing"." Fabulous!

#### Tax returns to become a thing of the past

HMRC has launched its new system of personal online tax accounts amid real scepticism from advisers over the UK tax authority's ability to deliver on its goal of becoming one of the most digitally advanced tax administrations in the world.

The new system which will eventually replace annual tax returns and will be adopted by millions of individuals and businesses is one part of a radical overhaul that will see the taxman slash hundreds of jobs and plough £1.3bn into digitally transforming the way it administers tax.

HMRC is committed to making £717m of sustainable resource savings a year by 2019/20 with the cumulative savings offset, in a sense, by its digital reinvestment. At the same time, the taxman is to close 137 local offices by 2027 which it will replace with regional centres and has earmarked a headline 21% reduction in baseline resource costs through digitisation.

How these changes will affect HMRC's much-maligned levels of 'customer service' so bad that parliament now considers it to have "an adverse impact on the collection of tax revenues" depends on how you define customer service. Most businesses seem to believe that customers want a local presence, something accountants and their clients will have to live without. Judging by HMRC's previous efforts in this area, a smooth transition appears incredibly optimistic. Previous problems associated with HMRC's digital projects have centred on reconciliation between employer and tax collector estimates.

However, HMRC claim this as a big leap in modernising our tax system, putting good customer service at its heart, and making it as easy as possible for individuals and businesses to pay the right tax at the right time. They claim it signals the end of the tax return as we know it.

Today, taxpayers use a range of digital services to manage their tax affairs, and more than 85 per cent of Self-Assessment tax returns are already done online. But it's not always a joined-up process and many people have to provide information that HMRC already holds. That's something that the government is determined to change. It has already delivered digital accounts for small businesses, with more than a million currently using them, as well as a simpler online service for individuals. Feedback from these groups is helping to shape a bold vision for the future of the tax system. Now, HMRC is exploiting new digital technologies to create even better services that are truly built around its customers' needs.

They also claim that in 2016, all of the UK's five million small businesses and the first ten million individuals will have access to their own digital tax account. Over time, these will fundamentally transform the way in which taxpayers interact with the tax system. Everyone can expect a very different experience from the one they receive today it will be simple, personalised and

secure, offering an increasing range of integrated services. The accounts will bring together in one place all the information that taxpayers need to understand their tax position just like an online bank account. They will be able to register, file, pay and update their information, at any time of the year, using

the digital device of their choice.

The idea is to streamline how tax works, automatically targeting help and support to customers when they need it, based on the data in their tax account. This will allow more people to solve their queries easily online, rather than by phone, letter or paper forms. It is envisaged that by the end of the next Parliament, every individual and small business will be able to see and manage their tax affairs through their digital tax account, removing the need for annual tax returns.

Later this year, the government will publish a roadmap and consult on how it will deliver the changes needed some of which will require changes to legislation and investment in new systems. Separate consultations will cover a new payment process to support digital tax accounts and reform of National Insurance contributions for the self-employed. This is a bold vision for a new, modern tax system, which will make it far easier for all taxpayers whether they are individuals or businesses to manage their tax affairs and pay the right tax at the right

The key issue, then, is how can HMRC make such a massive transformation, which involves a 31% reduction in headcount at an administration with the consistently lowest morale among government departments, and deliver a fully digital tax system by 2020?


