

#### **Rugby Community Supports** Liam's Day

Around 1,200 people packed St Mary's Old Boys' rugby ground in Trench Lane, Winterbourne in May to boost a major fundraising event for Liam O'Keeffe.

The 25-year-old captain of the Saints suffered life-changing injuries in a match before Christmas and Liam, who is now receiving treatment at the Spinal Injury Unit at Salisbury, made an emotional return to the club for the day which featured three special matches, a raffle and an auction, raising a fivefigure sum for a fund set up to assist him.

St Mary's chairman Pete Phelps said: "It's hard to believe the response we've had from the rugby family, it's been overwhelming and very touching. We definitely exceeded all expectations ... the kitchen ran out of food and the bar has been drunk dry, but most importantly people have all been talking about what a great day they've had. "We're very grateful to so many people for all their

hard work and support."

The great majority of clubs in the Bristol area were represented in the three games which began with the Bristol Wanderers facing the Combination Vets, refereed by Bristol Society chairman Steve Leyshon. The under-17 cup final from ten years ago, between St Mary's and Old Reds, was then replayed with Ivor Sobey again the man in the middle. The last match saw a St Mary's President's XV take on the Bristol Combination. a first half squad being selected from clubs in the Gloucestershire and Somerset divisions before clubs from Western Counties North and above took to the field after the break with former international official Tony Spreadbury in charge.





A raffle of a long list of prizes further boosted the fund for Liam before a series of signed shirts, including two England Grand Slam iersevs donated by Billy and Mako Vunipola who played at junior level for Thornbury, went under the

Pete Phelps added: "We've got plenty of adding up to do as money continues to come in from clubs for the sale of programmes, but a significant five-figure sum has already been raised for Liam which is absolutely tremendous."

Fund-raising efforts continue with the Bristol Combination hosting a golf day at Henbury on 3rd June while St Mary's are organising a dinner at the Marriott on 20th August.





At a recent meeting we all had the opportunity to meet with Monica Cave, who came in to give us a talk on Guide Dogs. Monica was accompanied by Jan Peters with her guide dog Celia, and retired guide dog Jangle also came in to meet us all.

None of us had any idea how much hard work goes into training the dogs - most are Labrador/Labrador crosses or German Shepherds, as these breeds are easiest to train. The dogs are bred at the specialist training centre in Leamington, where at 6-7 weeks old they are passed out to puppy walkers for their initial training and familiarization with external and internal environments. At 14 months they then return to Leamington for harness and specific task training. Jan told us that once a guide dog is allocated to its owner (sadly there is a waiting list as you might expect), a trainer then comes in every day for intensive training on routes to local shops. hospitals etc. - amazingly many dogs pick up the route after only one trip! Most dogs work for around seven years before taking a well-earned retirement.

We had a Beetle Drive social evening at Crossbow House earlier in the month, which was great fun as always. Also, the Book Club went on a trip to the Bristol Old Vic to see Jeremy Irons and Lesley Manfield in A Long Days Journey Into Night, which was enjoyed after a lovely lunch on board The Glassboat, And, our Darts team have continued to play a very successful season, at time of writing they are preparing for the semi-finals against Bath.

### Mrs Tiggywinkle needs you!

Most nature lovers and keen gardeners alike are aware that possibly our most quintessentially British of all mammals the humble hedgehog desperately needs our help. Their numbers have drastically declined from approx 30 million in the 1950's to less than 1 million today!

However it's not all doom and gloom, as it seems they are actually doing rather well in some urban and suburban areas, better it seems than the country side. This is perhaps due to greater biodiversity our many and varied gardens and less use of pesticides, as more and more of us like to try to garden with nature in mind.

These are a few very simple things you can do that will make all the difference to our spiky little friends survival. I can confirm the effort is well worth it, as the sight of a mother hedgehog with three little babies in tow is a wonderful sight to behold and a highlight of summer for us! I live right in the middle of Bristol so if I have hedgehogs you can too.



- 1. Make a couple of small holes in or under your garden fence to allow them to roam in and out of your garden freely, the biggest barrier they face is literally a barriers. Fences and walls stop them meeting, mating and gathering enough food to survive and it only needs to be small gap the size of a CD or end of a house brick as they can squeeze through fairly small gaps.
- Create or buy a hedgehog feeding station and place dried cat food and a bowl of water in it (never bread or milk it makes them ill) lots of designs or ready made ones to buy on line.
- Put a ramp in your pond if it has steep sides they can swim but need a gentle slope to get out, also ponds are good for biodiversity and water for them to drink on a hot summer night.
- Create hedgehog hotel/hibernation station, again there are lots of designs to make or buy online.
- 5. Always check before you strim or light bonfires etc, hedgehogs often make rather clumsy day nests so do check.
- Use nature friendly slug pellets or nematoads but once you have happy hedgehogs they will keep the pests down for you, they truly are the gardeners friend.

Finally if you have hedgehogs in your garden sign your street up online as a 'Hedgehog street' with the PTES (People's Trust for Endangered Species) at https://ptes.org/ and get your neighbours involved too as it turns out what's good for hedgehogs is also good for us too, a nice community and a bit of TLC from those around us. Good luck!





#### **New Local Life Saving Equipment**

Several years ago Winterbourne Parish Council was approached by a Parishioner, David Llovd, who had qualified as a Great **Western Ambulance Service Community First** Responder for Winterbourne and surrounding area.

A First Responder is an unpaid volunteer living or working in a community who is trained by the Ambulance Service to provide basic emergency care to seriously ill patients until an Ambulance can get to the scene.

After hearing from David about the life saving work that a Community First Responder does, the Parish council agreed to fund a medical kit and defibrillator for David to use. The equipment has been in constant use ever since.

The Parish Council have been inspired by the work David does and decided to invest in a number of Public Access Defibrillators and to promote the importance for all of us to learn how to administer potentially life saving CPR (cardiopulmonary resuscitation).

CPR is a lifesaving technique that involves giving someone a combination of chest compressions and rescue breaths to keep their heart and circulation going. A defibrillator delivers an electrical current through the chest, which aims to shock the heart back into a normal rhythm allowing it to pump again.

If you come across someone who is not breathing, the most important thing is to call 999 and start CPR. After a cardiac arrest, every minute without CPR and defibrillation reduces someone's chance of survival by 10 per cent.

When you call 999, the operator can tell you if there's a public access defibrillator nearby. Don't delay or interrupt chest compressions to get the defibrillator send someone else or wait until someone else joins you and ask them to call 999

Winterbourne Parish Council has now installed three Public Access Defibrillators.

It is important that these are easily accessible so they have been installed outside Nat West Bank in Winterbourne, outside The Cross Hands in Winterbourne Down and outside The White Lion in Frenchay.

Public Access Defibrillators are very easy to use. Once a 999 operator has directed a caller to a Defibrillator voice commands and screen messages will guide the user step-by-step through the process and its intelligent technology will only allow it to shock a safe shock to be delivered.

As CPR is such an important aspect of treating someone who is not breathing Parish Councillors have undergone CPR training.

#### **Growing Support**

**Growing Support is a local** organisation supporting older people and people living with dementia to enjoy the garden and stay

connected with their community. We deliver 'social and therapeutic' gardening activities which basically means running gardening clubs with fun, engaging activities specially designed to increase opportunities for light exercise, sensory stimulation and social interaction.

Most people recognise that spending time outdoors, connecting with nature or being active in the garden makes us feel better. Studies show that regular gardening as part of a group can help people with dementia feel a renewed sense of purpose and belonging, reduce agitation and improve sleep and appetite. Yet as people grow older, particularly if they have dementia, they are less likely to be active and more likely to lose the confidence to leave the house, spend time outdoors or meet new people.

Growing Support runs thriving gardening groups across Bristol, with many groups being run in Care Homes in the Winterbourne area. Our typical gardener is over 70 and living with day to day challenges such as difficulty following instructions, problems remembering how to do small tasks. limited mobility or issues with sight or hearing. And yet, our gardeners are always working hard completing all kinds of jobs such as growing and harvesting food crops, creating colourful flower displays and fragrant herb gardens or helping attract wildlife by making bug hotels or bird cakes.

Local volunteers are key to a great gardening group. They provide individual support for the more difficult tasks so that everyone can take part and feel a sense of achievement at the end of the session. An important part of their role is to create a cheerful

social atmosphere, chatting with the gardeners and encouraging reminiscence and story telling.

Perhaps the best way to describe what we do is through the experience of one of our gardeners: Doreen was very agitated and upset when she arrived at the gardening club. Care staff commented that she was 'inconsolable, no matter what we try'. A Growing Support volunteer walked around the garden with her and they chatted until she became calmer. The group leader then supported her to plant flowers using accessible tools. After an hour Doreen was much calmer and interacting with the rest of the group, laughing when they laughed, and contributing to group activity. Care staff were amazed at the change in her!

It is this kind of positive impact on behaviour and mood that Growing Support wants to share with more people across Bristol.

New volunteers are always made very welcome by the friendly team. Full training is provided along with regular social events to help get to know fellow volunteers and share ideas and experiences.

Workdays continue at the site on Wednesdays. Over the winter some fallen trees were cleared, along with leaves and twigs to enable the ground to dry up. This is is important especially in the dramway as it sits on a bed of clay.

#### Work Days: April to October - Wednesdays and the 2nd Sunday of the month 10 am - 4.30 pm.

At the end of last year there were a lot of trees that were hanging over the boundary fence going towards the railway. Some of these have been removed as well as the ivy that was smothering the roots etc. This has made a tremendous difference to the amount of light that the area receives and should encourage a wider amount of fauna to the site.

It was very pleasing to see the growth of the primroses and the spring flowers – daffodils etc.

We get a number of casual visitors and I always gives them a short tour of the site.

We open the site twice a year - May and September giving detailed tours of the site and serving refreshments. These 'open days' give visitors the chance to hear the history of the site.

Projects - The lime mortar repairs to the top of the engine house walls are due to start again when the weather is warmer. This is to stabilize the walls as under the earth capping most of the top stones are loose. The path that leads into the woodland needs a little more attention and also more ivy clearance is needed.

I heard an interesting suggestion on Radio 2 driving to school this morning – apparently once we have past the age of fifty we feel that time goes much faster! I have to say in my case that is definitely true. To me 2016 is still a very New Year and vet as you read this we are already in June, almost half way through the New Year! Whether or not this has anything to do with age I don't know but I am quite sure it is related to the frenetic pace at which we have a tendency to live our



If we are not careful, life can end up being a constant rushing from one thing to another, endeavouring to meet often unrealistic targets and deadlines and in the midst of all this rush often feeling there is not enough time to (a) appreciate all those good things in our lives - our loved ones, brilliant friends and colleagues, the beautiful world God has given us and (b) just to 'be' rather than 'driven'.

One of the subjects I found fascinating during my lay minister's training was that of 'thin spaces'. My simplistic understanding of these are those places, situations, sometimes even activities where we feel particularly close to God (hence the 'thin space' phrase – a 'place' where the space between God and us is 'paper thin'. I personally have one particularly special thin space - it is on a beach in Spain where we go on holiday each year. Mal enjoys 'lying in' each day whilst we are there but I get up every morning as the sun rises, go down to the beach which is very quiet at that time and sit on a wall looking out over the sea and watch the sunrise. On that wall I feel very close to God and am able to really enter into that prayerful reflective time of just soaking up His love and care. There have been moments in my 'thin space' where I have felt that I could almost reach out and touch God. These moments are not just special whilst being experienced, but leave me feeling refreshed, re-energised and reassured of all that our faith means to us. They can often lead to a greater understanding; a revealing of what it is that God wants us to do next in our lives. But most of all they leave us with a deep sense of God's peace and his unconditional acceptance of us 'warts and all'.

In the 31st chapter of the gospel of St Mark, our Lord says to his friends "Come with me by yourselves to a quiet place and get some rest." As we continue to hurtle through 2016 my prayer for us all is that we find our own 'thin space' and step into it away from the frenetic pace of life and allow God to come close and refresh us - as the old advert for Heineken lager says, 'refreshes the parts other lagers cannot reach!' Find your thin space and allow God to refresh you!


