Floral Friends of Frampton



The church across the road from Whiteshill Common is celebrating its two hundredth anniversary this year with special events to mark the milestone. Much is being planned over the August Bank Holiday weekend, not just for the congregation, but for the whole community.

200 Year Gelebrations at Whiteshill Church

There will be a special service at 11am on the morning of Sunday 28th August - the exact date of the opening of the church two centuries ago! A celebratory Songs of Praise is planned for 4pm in the afternoon. The day before, the church will be open on the Saturday afternoon for viewing a Festival of Flowers. On Bank Holiday Monday from 2pm, there will be a garden party on the lawn next to the church, with a variety of live music, exhibition of local art, plus fun and games for all ages, as well cream teas.

An exhibition covering the history of the church, still known to many as 'the chapel', will be on display and there will be a heritage walk through the village for those who would be interested in hearing a little bit about local events and places that have a special connection with the church's history.

In September the church will be open to welcome visitors on Friday 9th and Saturday 10th for the South Gloucestershire Heritage Days. This year the main chapel area has undergone its most major renovation ever, so this will be another opportunity to see the newly refurbished interior of this Grade Two listed building. It still retains many original features and even has a pulpit that is older than the chapel itself!

The chapel building opened in August 1816 but the history of its congregation goes back to three years before that. In April 1813, 'a place of religious worship by protestant dissenters of the independent denomination' was registered with the bishop of Gloucester. It met in the ground floor of a house in Winterbourne occupied at the time by one Henry

When construction of the chapel at Whiteshill was completed, the Winterbourne congregation transferred into it, as did its Sabbath, or Sunday School which had started in 1814. A 'body of dissenting worshippers' meeting at Pye Corner, Hambrook, joined with the church at Whiteshill just a little later.

The opening on 28th August 1816 was a big local event. Famous Surrey preacher, Rev Rowland Hill, came to preach the opening sermon, and so many people came to hear him it was reported that as many had to stand outside as were inside the chapel. So none of the 450-strong congregation missed the benefit of his words Rowland Hill spoke from the chapel balcony with the windows wide open, his voice carrying clearly to those outside.

Building of the chapel was underwritten by the Bristol Itinerant Society who sent 'travelling' preachers Sunday-by-Sunday to conduct services.

The preachers took no payment and were expected to walk the six miles to and from Bristol, whatever the weather. No wonder they were provided with rum and biscuits before they took to the pulpit. They doubtless welcomed the same refreshment to fortify them for the return journey after the evening service.

The first full-time resident minister, Rev Mr Samuel Weston, came in 1822 and since then twenty-one different ministers have served the church for varying lengths of time - from less than twelve months to over a quarter of a century. Current minister, David Horton has been at the church, with his wife and two children, for three years. Having met while studying at Bible College, David and his wife Hazel did Christian work in Madagascar for ten years before coming to Whiteshill.



London's Burning! At St Michael's Primary School, Winterbourne

Last term in Design and Technology, Year 2 researched, designed and made houses similar to buildings during the Great Fire of London in 1666.

Using plastic binca (which is a plastic sheet covered in square holes), the children were able to sew black cross stitches in lines to look like black timber beams. From the children's research, they learnt that the beams were usually symmetrical and parallel so their stitches reflected

For the thatched roof the children sewed long, straight stitches using brown wool to give a thatched roof appearance.



Finally by attaching the house panels together the children had impressive 3D models of a Tudor style house.

The children decided to fill the model houses with yellow, orange and red tissue paper to look like flames. As you can see from the photos, the children worked really hard and have produced something that they are extremely proud of.



Mrs Tiggywinkle needs you!

Most nature lovers and keen gardeners alike are aware that possibly our most quintessentially British of all mammals the humble hedgehog desperately needs our help. Their numbers have drastically declined from approx 30 million in the 1950's to less than 1 million today!

However it's not all doom and gloom, as it seems they are actually doing rather well in some urban and suburban areas, better it seems than the country side. This is perhaps due to greater biodiversity our many and varied gardens and less use of pesticides, as more and more of us like to try to garden with nature in mind.

These are a few very simple things you can do that will make all the difference to our spiky little friends survival. I can confirm the effort is well worth it, as the sight of a mother hedgehog with three little babies in tow is a wonderful sight to behold and a highlight of summer for us! I live right in the middle of Bristol so if I have hedgehogs you can too.



- 1. Make a couple of small holes in or under your garden fence to allow them to roam in and out of your garden freely, the biggest barrier they face is literally a barriers. Fences and walls stop them meeting, mating and gathering enough food to survive and it only needs to be small gap the size of a CD or end of a house brick as they can squeeze through fairly small gaps.
- Create or buy a hedgehog feeding station and place dried cat food and a bowl of water in it (never bread or milk it makes them ill) lots of designs or ready made ones to buy on line.
- 3. Put a ramp in your pond if it has steep sides they can swim but need a gentle slope to get out. also ponds are good for biodiversity and water for them to drink on a hot summer night.
- Create hedgehog hotel/hibernation station, again there are lots of designs to make or buy online.
- Always check before you strim or light bonfires etc. hedgehogs often make rather clumsy day nests so do check.
- Use nature friendly slug pellets or nematoads but once you have happy hedgehogs they will keep the pests down for you, they truly are the gardeners friend.

Finally if you have hedgehogs in your garden sign your street up online as a 'Hedgehog street' with the PTES (People's Trust for Endangered Species) at https://ptes.org/ and get your neighbours involved too as it turns out what's good for hedgehogs is also good for us too, a nice community and a bit of TLC from those around us. Good luck!

The Fromeside Churches The Parishes of Frampton Cotterell, Iron Acton, Winterbourne and Winterbourne Down, in The Diocese Of Bristol

Some years ago now I was an original member of a book group in Rangeworthy and although the membership has changed over the years it is still thriving. The greatest benefit of it for me is that it has encouraged me to read all manner of books mainly novels but not exclusively so, that I wouldn't have dreamt of picking up off the library shelf. Our group works by each member choosing a book, and then we meet once a month to discuss it. Our most recent book was about a young Muslim from Sheffield who travelled to Pakistan where he became radicalised. It was a very challenging and difficult subject and it led to a lively discussion about 'extreme religious views'.

Recently I read a library book with the intriguing title 'The Fifth Gospel'. The subject made a perfect book for me for I found it gripping, fascinating and challenging. It's a modern thriller set in the Vatican City but it concerns the relationship between the Catholic and Orthodox Church, the Turin Shroud and something known as the fifth gospel or the Diatessaron. Apart from being a fabulous read it made me reflect on my own perceptions of the Gospels and the Church in its widest context. I was prompted to sit down and read straight off the first six chapters of St Mark's Gospel, generally regarded as the oldest gospel and I felt reinvigorated by the sense of urgency in Mark's style of writing as he related the beginnings of Jesus' ministry.

The novel 'The Fifth Gospel' also reminded me of the fact that we all know: the Christian Church was founded by the apostles, filled with the Holy Spirit at Pentecost and evolved and grew from that point in history. Although some of the oldest parts of the Old Testament are dated roughly 3500 years ago the Bible we know was not finally collated until several hundred years after the birth of Jesus. That collection of many different types of writing that we know as our Bible, was created by a church inspired by the

Holy Spirit. Whilst the Church has developed, split, reformed, divided in a multitude of different ways throughout the centuries, the Bible, translated, interpreted and studied as it has been, remains basically the same.

In my theological training as an Anglican priest we were taught that we understand our faith in three basic ways: through Scripture, through the teachings, beliefs and practices of the Church and through our own spirituality experienced within our personal social context.

As I write this at the beginning of June my faith in our Creator God is renewed by the extraordinary beauty of our countryside and gardens at this time of year. Simultaneously as I see pictures of desperate refugees and starving children, I am reminded of the need for justice, compassion, healing, forgiveness and love in our fractured world.

However we have come to our faith in the Living Christ let us continue to give thanks and share the abundance of his love with others

News from the Friends of Brandy Bottom Colliery, Pucklechurch

It has been a busy quarter at Brandy **Bottom: The masons** have been working on the Old Pit and the fan ducts: There have been 18 planned or impromptu work parties and site liaison visits since the last report, compared with 29 during the

whole of 2015; And three experienced industrial archaeology visitors came in April, bringing a fresh perspective to bear on interpreting the layout of the place.

Rebuilding in the Old Pit area is almost complete. It has strengthened the fabric of the walls and will hopefully prevent any further deterioration for years to come.

The work parties have been clearing areas before the masons started to work on them, investigating some of the items they uncovered, and looking at new parts of the site.


The AIBT leases the land on which the buildings at Brandy Bottom are located from Ibstock Brick. We would like to thank them for producing bricks for use in the restoration, as they used their expertise to match the colour of the new bricks to the existing ones.

Outline of Work for the Remainder of 2016

Now that the masons have almost completed the current programme agreed with Historic England, thoughts are turning to the needs of the New Pit enclosure. The tops of the walls of the heapstead need to be rebuilt and capped. parts of the north-west wall need patching, and the brick window and door surrounds need to be rebuilt. This work will probably take place in late 2016/early 2017.

Several relatively small areas of walls in the Old Pit area will be rebuilt by volunteers in 2016. The exploration of the Old Pit heapstead will continue, and the next area to be looked at will be the New Boiler Area.




