



Winterbourne International Academy students celebrate

a recording breaking leap in results

Winterbourne International Academy is celebrating a fantastic set of GCSE results. The headline figure of 5 passes at A*-C, including Mathematics and English, has jumped up by a massive 9% to 73%. This is a record breaking increase and an astonishing success. In all, 22% of grades were at A* or A; over half of all grades were at A*-B. The new 'Progress 8' measure was positive, showing the strong progress made by Winterbourne students. 76% of students got at least a C grade in both Mathematics and English.

Special congratulations go to the many students who achieved at the very highest level. 11 students attained 5A*s or more. Top of the class was Alex Williams, who achieved 9A* and 3A grades, closely followed by Katie Baker who got 8A* and 4As. Ellie Boyle, Hannah Powell and James Labuschagne all attained 7A* and 4As and Isaac Chilcott got 6A* and 5A grades. Yasmin Dickinson, Callum Fitzgerald, Rafael Obligar, Olivia Sussex and Rebecca Sussex all achieved 5A* grades. Scores of students, too numerous to mention, got 7 or more grades at A*/A.

Many subjects put in stellar performances. The English results were stunning, with English Language and English Literature both achieving A*-C pass rates of 86%. The English Language pass rate increased by 16% this year. Mathematics results also held up well with 78% of grades at A*-C; Science at 79% has confirmed its sustained, high level of performance. Particular congratulations must also go to Art, Drama, Engineering, Further Additional Science, Music, PE, Photography and Religious Studies who all achieved A*-C pass rates in excess of 80%.

The Academy Principal, Mr Richard Haupt, said, "We are incredibly proud of our students; these results are testament to their hard work; their success is well-deserved. Congratulations must also go to our teachers; they have demonstrated unwavering commitment and dedication to getting the best results for their students. These results taken together with our record breaking A Level results, show we have put the past well and truly behind us and taken Winterbourne back to where it belongs among the highest achieving schools in South Gloucestershire and Bristol".

The Federation is looking forward to yet another successful academic year. There are still 5 places available for Year 7; given the outstanding results

this year, competition for these spaces is likely to be fierce. A Fab Family Nature Day at Says Court

Right at the end of August, Avon Wildlife Trust was joined by the Hawk and Owl Trust and six families to eek out the last of the summer holidays with a family nature day and picnic at Says Court Solar Farm.



In the glorious sunshine, armed with digital cameras to record our nature finds we walked across the farmland to the new wildflower meadow, stopping on route to look at the owl box and learn all about the birds of prey who use the farm. We also spied a wheateater in the field stocking up before its long journey to central Africa.



Once in the wildflower meadow, surrounded by bird's foot trefoil, oxeye daisies and red clover, we went on a mini-beast hunt. Grasshoppers were the most impressive find, but we also found butterflies and ladybirds as well as bugs, spiders, flies and much more. Everyone also had the opportunity to make a bird feeder and bug hotel to take home - to encourage wildlife into their gardens. There was even time to do a spot of charcoal drawing, taking inspiration from what we had spotted on our walk and bug hunt. We all then relaxed over a picnic and took time to edit our photos (or take more!) before heading our separate ways again.


Did you know?

- Says Court Farm is a fascinating site with a solar farm at its heart. In addition to 84 acres of solar panels, two new wildlife areas have been created to improve biodiversity and benefit the residents of Westerleigh. As the site develops Avon Wildlife Trust will provide opportunities for people to explore the area and discover more about the nature on their doorstep this event was the first. There is also a 3 mile circular walk which is great to enjoy at autumn time (featured opposite).
- The new eastern habitat consists of a barn owl hunting corridor of tussocky grassland plus a species rich grassland and is crossed by the public footpath, enabling walkers to enjoy this new nature rich landscape alongside the fast flowing stream.
- Over 97% of all flower-rich grasslands have been lost in Britain since the 1930s, reducing pollen and nectar sources and leading to a serious decline in the wildlife depending on wildflower-rich habitat. The creation of new flower rich meadows will provide essential food for pollinators who in turn provide food for us.
- The solar panels on Says Court farm have been generating electricity since April 2014. Avon Wildlife Trust and Westerleigh parish council are working alongside the landowners and AEE Renewables to restore the natural environment and increase biodiversity alongside increased renewable energy capacity.
- The addition of native hedgerow plants such as hazel, hawthorn, blackthorn and field maple will thicken old hedges, create new natural corridors and provide valuable flowers and berries for insects and birds.

At our August meeting at the Hilton Hotel, Heather Lamb, an Interstatial Lung Nurse from Southmead Hospital gave us a talk. Heather and her colleagues not only look after patients with lung problems on a daily basis, they also give of their own time to run a Support Group every three months in a church hall in Southmead. This is done on a voluntary basis with no financial support from NHS and the money required to fund the hall and provide tea and biscuits for their members is raised from raffles each meeting. Some of the nurses even cycled to Amsterdam and back to raise sponsorship money to cover these costs. Bradley Stoke Lions President Robin decided to make this Lung Support Group one of his two annual charities this year and has promised Heather and her colleagues £300 to (hopefully) cover their expenses for the year.

Our club is also supporting Noah, a young boy from Patchway who suffered a bleed on his brain whilst still in the womb and who now has multiple problems which inhibit him from supporting himself. The family have already raised some of the funding

required to buy this expensive piece of equipment and BS Lions have pledged £200 towards it.

We support the Julian Trust Homeless Shelter in Little Bishop Street throughout the year and have promised to give Caring at Christmas (C@C), which takes over from the Julian Trust over the Christmas period, £200 to buy fresh food for their "guests". Some of the Lions volunteered to help at C@C last year over the festive period and will volunteer again this year. Once you get involved, you find you want to continue because there is such a great atmosphere as all the guests are so pleased to be there. Ed Reed who runs C@C gave a talk to our Parent Club. Bristol Brunel at the September meeting, hoping to recruit more volunteers.

SMUKEHOUSE SAL

Winterbourne Matters was delighted to be invited along to visit the new and very exciting Smokehouse Saloon at the Swan in Winterbourne.

The venue has undergone a complete transformation since local resident Robyn Maggs and his partner Sandra took over the lease two years ago. As a long time local living right on the pub's doorstep, Robyn was determined not to see the place closed for good, or taken over by a chain offering the same as so many others across the area.

Robyn and Sandra's goal was to maintain the feel of a local pub. as well as offering a brand new themed restaurant with food to match, offering something completely different that would appeal to a wide audience.

With the support of the brewery and extensive self help, the restaurant has been completely refurbished using re-cycled timber wherever possible. The 'rickety' tables and the new bar are made from old scaffold planks while the picture frames and window pelmets are from pallet timber. A range of children's games and play items are available in the 'reservation' area to entertain the 'young guns'.

Growing up enthralled with tales of cowbovs and indians, and after much research across both the UK and the US. Robyn and Sandra have chosen a 'Wild West' theme for the restaurant.

Inspired by Cowboys gathered around the chuck wagon, open fires out on the range and the smokey ranch houses at night. The Smokehouse Saloon will be serving good quality meats smoked low 'n' slow in their own smoker and served in a fun atmosphere in the brand new themed restaurant. Made popular through TV programmes like 'Man v Food' and 'Drive Ins/Diners and Dives', the ethos is very simple; produce good helpings of good quality food in a fun atmosphere and people will visit time after time.

Being the only wild west themed saloon east of the Pecos! (definitely the only one in the county!) The Smokehouse Saloon brings something very different to the local area. Menu options include Saloon ChowdersÓ Rootin' Tootin' Cuts (also Cattleman's Cuts and Homestead Cuts), Pancho's Nachos, Bill's Buffalo Wings, Ribs, Surf & Turf and Build Your Own Meat Plate, Trail Blazing Burgers and Vegetarian options for non-meat-loving diners. Sides include Sweet potato fries (my favourite!) and Blazin saddle beans! You can also order off the menu for takeaway. There is a 'Young Guns' menu too priced at just £4.95 or one child can eat free with two adult main meals. The Smokehouse Saloon is offering a 10% discount off of your food bill with this October edition of Winterbourne Matters be sure to make the most of it and pay a visit!

Not wanting to lose what is already popular at The Swan, it will still be offering its more traditional lunch menu through the week, and a traditional Carvery on Sunday. Elm Park's Marvelous Roald Dahl Day

On Tuesday 13 September, children and staff at Elm Park Primary School celebrated 100 years of Roald Dahl. It proved to be a wonderful day with everyone coming to school dressed as one of Dahl's fantastic book characters.



Celebrating 200 years

The church at Whiteshill enjoyed three days of celebration over the August Bank Holiday weekend, marking its 200th anniversary.

A busy Saturday afternoon saw lots of visitors come to view the church decked out with floral decorations, see a local art exhibition and enjoy a display looking back over the chapel's history.

The Sunday of the holiday weekend was the exact date, two centuries ago, when the very first service was held in the chapel building. There was a big turn-out for a celebratory service, with visitors from further afield including the previous two ministers of the church and their wives.

During the service, the Bishop of Bristol – Rt Rev Mike Hill unveiled a commemorative plaque in the church foyer. Joined by the current and previous Whiteshill ministers, this short ceremony was relayed, live, back into the main church for the rest of the congregation to see.

Not far short of one hundred people stayed on for lunch in marquees on the church lawn and at 4pm there was a Songs of Praise service. This was rounded off by the ceremonial cutting of a 200th anniversary cake by current pastor David Horton and his wife Hazel. The cake was one of two, made especially for the occasion by a church member.

Festivities continued on Bank Holiday Monday, with a garden party in the church grounds. There were games for the youngsters, live music, cream teas – and importantly, glorious sunshine all day.

Some visitors took the opportunity to go on a conducted walk through Hambrook that linked local history with the early days and people of the chapel, while others inspected a display of old or unusual motorbikes.



Having this year undergone what is probably its most extensive renovation ever, the church also welcomed visitors on the South Gloucestershire Heritage Open Days this month, when those from beyond the immediate vicinity could take a look inside the newly-renovated Grade II listed building and learn something of its history.

Visitors to Winterbourne Church and the adjacent medieval Barn enjoyed a feast of bellringing during Heritage Open Days weekend, as well as exploring the history and architecture of the two buildings.

In the church, CCTV cameras were installed so that visitors could simultaneously watch the ringers in action in the ringing room and the bells themselves up above, with the heaviest weighing over a ton. The Barn was host to the Lichfield Diocesan Mobile Belfry, a set a small bells (up to 80 pounds in weight), which arrived on a trailer and was set up in the middle of the Barn. Ringers from local towers

were on hand all weekend to demonstrate ringing on both sets of bells, to give visitors the opportunity to have a go, and to talk about what a wonderful hobby they have. The visitors were fascinated to watch the bells rotating in response to the ringers pulling on the ropes below, quite unlike the popular perception of monks flying up and down on the ends of the ropes! And after the visitors had left on the Saturday, the ringers continued to enjoy a social evening with colleagues from the area around Wotton under Edge and from Portishead and Clevedon, ringing the bells and tucking in to a fish and chip supper from the local chippie in Winterbourne.

Visit our wonderful medieval barn dating from 1342. Celebrate and discover the bounty of local orchards, locally-produced food and drink, and local crafts and rural skills. Adults £2, Children under 16yrs FREE.

Watch traditional cider making using a Victorian stone apple mill – and taste the results! There will be apple displays and we will have expertise on hand able to identify varieties of apple – so bring yours along.

Marvel at the work of the medieval craftsmen who built the magnificent Barn and watch a peregrine falcon in action. Find out all there is to know about weaving and basket-making, bees and honey, or try your hand at archery and skittles.

Children will love seeing the pigs, geese, horses and llamas, and can enjoy a variety of games and activities, including the very popular ferret-racing!

Enjoy locally-produced hot food, or cold ice-cream from the lcicle Tricycle, and locally-brewed beer and cider, or tea and cakes. Sing along with the Frampton Shantymen (audience participation is expected!) and cheer the Winterbourne Down Border Morris while you drink your cider. Access dogs and well behaved dogs on a lead are welcome.

A parking charge of £2 per vehicle will be collected on behalf of Paul's Place; a local charity for disabled people. Please do not impede traffic flows by parking on the narrow lane.

Please Give Blood

Blood donations are vital for helping save and improve lives. Each donation can help up to three people.

Craig Shellard, (pictured right), from Little Stoke, knows just what an amazing gift blood donation is. The 35-year-old received numerous transfusions of blood and platelets after being diagnosed with a type of blood cancer called Follicular Lymphoma. "I took it relatively well, the most difficult part was telling family and friends," said Craig. "At the time it was considered non-curable." After the cancer was diagnosed in 2008 Craig began a treatment journey that took many years. Both cancer and chemotherapy damage the body's bone marrow, which is where blood and platelets are produced. Blood transfusions are a vital part of treatment for many cancer patients. Unfortunately Craig's cancer returned after treatment and he also needed a stem cell transplant - receiving both his own stem cells and stem cells from his brother in 2013. When Craig then developed Graft Versus Host Disease – his immune system started attacking his own body - he was given only a 10 per cent chance of survival. Craig had specialist treatment at NHS Blood and Transplant's Therapeutic Apheresis unit in Bristol, and a further blood transfusion. He recovered gradually and was able to return to work as a

Older people across the city support each other to tackle isolation and loneliness

"When I came out of detox, a peer support worker took me out for coffee, and that changed and saved my life; it took me out of my depression", says one of Bristol Drugs Project's Champions, sharing his experience being supported by a peer during his recovery. Now this group of older people are returning a hand, helping others overcoming similar issues.

The Champions are a group of older people who have been trained to support peers in their journey to recovery. These volunteers have undergone 6 weeks of training that has given them the confidence and tools to make home visits to people facing similar issues who are in earlier stages of recovery. BDP's Champions is one of 17 projects funded by Bristol Ageing Better as part of their group work and peer support stream of funding.

Andy Bowles, BDP's Older People's Service Worker, highlights the need for peer support when addressing this issue among Bristol's older population: "If you are visited by someone of a similar age who has had a similar experience, you'll feel less judged, more comfortable and more able to accept help, hopefully."

Bristol Ageing Better, a partnership of organisations working together to reduce loneliness and isolation among older people in



Bristol, recognises peer support groups as a key element to address social isolation. Peer support provides a safe and understanding helping hand at difficult times in people's lives, and gives hope of a better future.

Following seven pilot contracts awarded in September 2015, BAB commissioned another 10 group work and peer support projects to further support isolated older people in the city. These projects include gardening group activities for people living with dementia and their carers by Growing Support CIC; 'Living together with dementia' counselling for couples by The Harbour; Bristol & Avon Chinese Women's Group multicultural cooking classes; and Wellbeing Champions training for older people by Happy City.

News from the Friends of Brandy Bottom Colliery, Pucklechurch

completed rebuilding the tippler slots and the adjoining top of the north-west wall of the Old Pit heapstead. They have also finished repointing the outside of the octagonal section of the chimney and repositioned displaced

stones around the shoulder. We have started on planning for the next stage of conservation, which will cover work on the Horizontal Engine House and the walls of the New Pit heapstead. We have also had discussions with Ibstock Brick about extendingthe fencing to enclose the Fan Engine House, and about removing some trees along the cycle path to give passers-by a better view of the site. Spoil clearance in the Vertical Engine House restarted after the site clear-up.

During the course of a site visit in early July, Historic England informed us that they could not provide any more grants for conservation work. As a result we are in the process of finding alternative sources of funds. A photographer from Historic England came in mid-July to take a photo of the site for possible use in HE's 2016 Register of Heritage at Risk. We will only know if that is the case when the register is published in November.

The AIBT had a stand at the 2016 South Gloucestershire show adjacent to that of the South Gloucestershire Mines Research Group (SGMRG). Several visitors told us about playing in the buildings as kids, and one said that many objects had been thrown into the pond in the 1950s. Another talked about some of the people living in the cottages. We have invited these visitors to come to Brandy Bottom during a work party and point out features they remember. None of them appear to have photos from that date. Sadly Brandy Bottom appears several times in the new book1 published by the SGMRG on accidents, mainly fatalities, in



the area's coal mines. This is an update of the author's 1980s book. and the reports

give some idea of where the **Brandy Bottom** miners lived. Bearing in mind that the information comes from a small number of reports, we can say that Brandy Bottom's miners lived in Mangotsfield, Pucklechurch. Siston, and Soundwell. They had a fair distance to walk to aet to work. and get home afterwards in their grubby clothes. There were no such luxuries as pithead baths in

To mark the new status of the Benefice, there will be a special evening Eucharist service on Sunday 9th October, 6.00pm at St James, Iron Acton and this will be attended by Archdeacon Christine Froude.

New Rector Appointed - Revd Malcolm Strange - The Benefice is delighted to announce the appointment of a new full time priest from December. Malcolm (pictured below) is already well known in the Frampton Cotterell area and has been part of the team of Ministers who have worked part time in the four Churches over the past few years. The article below gives insight into his life so far and the influences on it. Malcolm will continue in his post at St Bede's for the next few months and we look forward to a new phase of Benefice life under Malcolm's leadership. Malcolm's induction service will take place at St Peter's on Thursday 8th December at 7.30pm. Learn more about Malcom in his own words below.



Childhood – I was born in Swindon and after school, in common with other local lads, I joined British Rail Engineering. I was brought up in an Ecumenical Parish - a good thing perhaps as my father was a Methodist and my mother an Anglican. The parish also included Roman Catholics so I had a good introduction to the breadth of the church in this country.

Career – I trained for the ministry at Salisbury and Wells Theological College and was ordained Deacon at Newcastle Cathedral in 1985 and Priest in Hexham Abbey the following year. Weddings and funerals featured large in my curacy in Ashington, the largest pit village in Northumberland with a population of 36000. For the team of three of us, there were 300 funerals in my 3 years and it was nothing for there to be 6 weddings on a

summer Saturday - the bride couldn't afford to be late on those days. The church featured large in the life of the village whose greatest claim to fame was as the birthplace of the footballers Bobby and Jackie Charlton.

Following this experience, my first role as vicar was in a totally different part of the country, at Ogbourne St George & Ogbourne St Andrew in Wiltshire. In the Ogbournes I used to hold a weekly "surgery" in the local pub, a place which along with the church is usually one of the most important buildings in a small village. Life in the Church of England is never simple and I had to juggle my role as vicar of the two parishes with responsibility for the area youth work and chaplaincy of the local psychiatric hospital. Then as team vicar of St George's, Wash Common, Newbury, I continued my work with youth but now in the education sphere as chaplain to St Gabriel's Independent C of E school.

A spell in Devon as Rector of Torridge Estuary Team Ministry was followed by a complete change of direction with a Post Graduate Certificate in Education at Bristol University and a full-time move into the teaching profession. For the past 10 years, I have been Assistant Principal of St Bede's Catholic College in Bristol and since 2008, a self-supporting priest at St Peter's, Frampton Cotterell. At St Bede's, as well as my management responsibilities, I teach Religious Studies and Ethics to GCSE and A level students. I'm passionate about teaching and especially encouraging kids who otherwise struggle to really get involved in their studies. It will be a real wrench to move away from education but after much thought and prayer decided I should return to the full-time ministry.

Family and interests – I'm married to Jo and between us we have four children. We enjoy walking and through our holidays have developed a love of Spain. I've always been keen on sport of all kinds but my Swindon roots have led to a passion for Speedway and Swindon Town football club – the club frequently gets a mention in my sermons! On a quieter note, I enjoy fly fishing. Music is important in my life - I've played the guitar since I was 14, playing with folk bands both here and on the continent. "The vicar busks" at the Globe in Frampton Cotterell seems to have become a tradition over the past few years.

To sum up... Perhaps I'll use a quotation from a friend who said that I celebrate the Eucharist like a Roman Catholic, preach with the zeal of a Methodist and minister to my flock with the openness of a liberal.
