### Lest We Forget

Winterbourne & Frampton Matters was pleased to hear from the Frampton Cotterell and Coalpit Heath Branch of the Royal British Legion this month, although it was with the sad news that the last of their branch members to have served in the 1939 - 1945 conflict has now passed away.

Mr Royston Fudge, late President of Frampton Cotterell and Coalpit Heath Branch of the Royal British Legion, passed away on 9th September 2016, aged 90 years. Roy joined the Royal Navy in 1942 and served with distinction till the end in 1945 on HMS Beagle, HMS Formidable and HMS Hogue. He was in the Battle of the Atlantic escorting vessels carrying supplies to Russia for which he was awarded two medals from the Russian Government - one from President Mikhael



Gorbachev and one from President Vladimir Putin. He received an additional medal from the people of the Soviet Union in gratitude for his duties. Roy also served on one of the Ships that liberated the Channel Islands, for which he also received a medal.

Roy was very well known in the village, having lived in Frampton Cotterell for many years. He joined the Frampton Cotterell and Coalpit Heath Branch of the Royal British Legion, (RBL), where he remained a regular for the rest of his life. On speaking to members, Winterbourne Matters has heard that Roy was a young and active man despite his years. Always smiling and fun loving, he particularly loved his dancing; often on the door of the club he loved to get up on the dance floor - and this was still the same right up to just a few weeks before he died. Roy also loved his bingo and was a regular at the Coalpit Heath Miners' Club.



Roy liked to help others and took on the mantle of Branch Welfare Officer for many years, visiting those who were ill or infirm, and he always had a ready smile and a kind word wherever he visited.

Roy served on the Branch Committee and rose to become Branch President. He will always be remembered by the Officers and members of Frampton Cotterell and Coalpit Heath Branch of the Royal British Legion.

Rest in Peace Roy.

### News from Coalpit Heath WI

What a better way to spend an afternoon than being shown around a Gin Distillery. Bramley and Gage Ltd based in South Gloucestershire were our hosts for the afternoon. We were welcomed with a large gin and tonic, from their own range by our tour guides Nick and Sally. After the welcome talk. which included the origins of the distillery, we were given a guided tour. We were shown the preparation room right through to the packing area. Our guides were extremely knowledgeable, about their craft, very approachable and actively encouraged our questions. A number of Christmas purchases were made from the shop at the end of the tour.

Our October meeting saw a revisit from Catherine Dando from C Squared, who gave us first aid training, earlier in 2016. This time we were advised on the best courses of treatment for burns, including chemical and electrical burns. We were shocked to learn that anyone suffering from an allergic reaction could be dead within 3 minutes! These allergies can often be as a result of contact with nuts, shellfish, bees - this can be diagnosed by checking airways (often swollen), fat tongue, difficulty in breathing/wheezing and anxiety. We were then given a demonstration on how to use the pen method of providing relief to sufferers. Catherine was asked to give us a refresher on how to dislodge obstructions from the throat and what to do in the event of someone choking.

Special thanks to Frampton Cotterell WI, who hosted a game of rounders at Crossbow. All in a bid for members to get some exercise and have some fun. We certainly did have fun, despite it being the hottest evening for some time and most of us were not used to running (or hitting the ball) – it was done in good spirit. We will have to think of another event for us to host a re-visit! Maybe something not quite so energetic.



The service is a three year programme and is being delivered in partnership with Curo, a not-for-profit housing and support organisation, and will involve GP surgeries, the Voluntary Sector and local community groups working across the whole of South Gloucestershire.

#### Support available includes:

- Information and guidance over the phone, face-to-face or by email
- Tailored support to help people play a more active role in their communities
- Help to set up groups and activities that benefit their community
- Opportunities to meet new people, learn a new skill or to volunteer
- Sign-posting to local services and agencies.

#### Who would benefit from being referred to Community Connectors?

The service is being targeted at the following groups:

- People regularly presenting at GP practices whose wider needs cannot be supported through traditional medical treatments on their own.
- People at risk from or experiencing social isolation and loneliness who may not be eligible for statutory services.



### **Fab Family Nature Events** at Says Court Farm

Right at the end of August, Avon Wildlife Trust was joined by the Hawk and Owl Trust and six families to eek out the last of the summer holidays with a family nature day and picnic at Says Court Solar Farm.



In the glorious sunshine, armed with digital cameras to record our nature finds we walked across the farmland to the new wildflower meadow, stopping on route to look at the owl box and learn all about the birds of prey who use the farm. We also spied a wheateater in the field stocking up before its long journey to central Africa.



Once in the wildflower meadow, surrounded by bird's foot trefoil, oxeye daisies and red clover, we went on a mini-beast hunt. Grasshoppers were the most impressive find, but we also found butterflies and ladybirds as well as bugs, spiders, flies and much more. Everyone also had the opportunity to make a bird feeder and bug hotel to take home – to encourage wildlife into their gardens. There was even time to do a spot of charcoal drawing, taking inspiration from what we had spotted on our walk and bug hunt. We all then relaxed over a picnic and took time to edit our photos (or take more!) before heading our separate ways again.

#### Did you know?

- Says Court Farm is a fascinating site with a solar farm at its heart. In addition to 84 acres of solar panels, two new wildlife areas have been created to improve biodiversity and benefit the residents of Westerleigh. As the site develops Avon Wildlife Trust will provide opportunities for people to explore the area and discover more about the nature on their doorstep this event was the first. There is also a 3 mile circular walk which is great to enjoy at autumn time (featured opposite).
- The new eastern habitat consists of a barn owl hunting corridor of tussocky grassland plus a species rich grassland and is crossed by the public footpath, enabling walkers to enjoy this new nature rich landscape alongside the fast flowing stream.
- Over 97% of all flower-rich grasslands have been lost in Britain since the 1930s, reducing pollen and nectar sources and leading to a serious decline in the wildlife depending on wildflower-rich habitat. The creation of new flower rich meadows will provide essential food for pollinators who in turn provide food for us.
- The solar panels on Says Court farm have been generating electricity since April 2014. Avon Wildlife Trust and Westerleigh parish council are working alongside the landowners and AEE Renewables to restore the natural environment and increase biodiversity alongside increased renewable energy capacity.
- The addition of native hedgerow plants such as hazel, hawthorn, blackthorn and field maple will thicken old hedges, create new natural corridors and provide valuable flowers and berries for insects and birds.







After the success of the family nature day, the Avon Wildlife Trust and Hawk and Owl Trust came together again at Says Court Solar Farm for an Owl and Bat evening.

People and Wildlife Officer, Nicole Daw shared with us the below account.

At the end of September, we were joined by

26 people from the local area which was fantastic. We started by dissecting owl pellets and had some fascinating finds. They could tell all the owls had a taste for voles (including one of the largest vole skulls I have ever

seen) but there was also some shrews too!

As dusk settled we started on our walk around the farm. Though we didn't see any owls in flight we were treated to lots of interesting owl and general nature information including what makes a good nest site and how owls fly silently. As darkness descended the bats came out and we


could pick them up on the bat detectors as they swooped overhead. At the end of the evening we were all treated to saying hello to a native tawny owl and a native barn owl that Dave and Paul from the Hawk and Owl Trust had bought along. Both owls were beautiful and very happy to pose for photos.

### Emma and Jo have lost 4 stone 3 pounds together!



#### **Have Your Say!**

Phase 2 of the consultation of the future of library services in South Gloucestershire:

Following the successful consultation process in the Spring, the council has adopted a new preferred position with the aim to future-proof South Gloucestershire's libraries for the long term and ensure that no library buildings should need to close. A new three month consultation is now running until January 2nd 2017 to hear what the public has to say about the new proposals and information is available online at www. southglos.gov.uk/librarychanges and in your local library and council offices.

The new preferred option is to reduce the library service savings target from £650,000 to £500,000. This would mean a smaller reduction in staff hours required to meet that target. The council will consult with library users and non-users alike on how best to deploy staff among local libraries. It is proposed that the mobile library service be replaced with community centre based libraries across South Gloucestershire and run by volunteer groups. The Council would also fund the building costs of Chipping Sodbury Library with the service being delivered by volunteers. These plans would mean that no library building would have to close as a result of the savings.

The council has also agreed to continue to develop plans to use technology that would allow registered members to use library facilities for 11 hours a-day, seven days a-week, between 8.30am and 7.30pm. This technological approach to delivering library services would build on existing self-service kiosks by providing access to library buildings for registered users out of staff hours, it would be a new approach for South Gloucestershire. The council wants to hear from existing library users as well as those who perhaps cannot currently use these facilities during current opening hours, about how they feel about this option.

After the new consultation process, a final decision on how to proceed will be made in the New Year. Changes in public-facing library services would not take place until October 2017.







### Celebrating 200 years

A busy Saturday afternoon saw lots of visitors come to view the church decked out with floral decorations, see a local art exhibition and enjoy a display looking back over the chapel's history.


The Sunday of the holiday weekend was the exact date, two centuries ago, when the very first service was held in the chapel building. There was a big turn-out for a celebratory service, with visitors from further afield including the previous two ministers of the church and their wives.

During the service, the Bishop of Bristol – Rt Rev Mike Hill unveiled a commemorative plague in the church fover. Joined by the current and previous Whiteshill ministers, this short ceremony was relayed. live, back into the main church for the rest of the congregation to see.

This was rounded off by the ceremonial cutting of a 200th anniversary cake by current pastor David Horton and his wife Hazel. ### **News from the Friends of Brandy Bottom** Colliery, Pucklechurch

The masons have completed rebuilding the tippler slots and the adjoining top of the north-west wall of the Old Pit heapstead. They have also finished repointing the outside of the octagonal section of the chimney and repositioned displaced


stones around the shoulder. We have started on planning for the next stage of conservation, which will cover work on the Horizontal Engine House and the walls of the New Pit heapstead. We have also had discussions with Ibstock Brick about extendingthe fencing to enclose the Fan Engine House, and about removing some trees along the cycle path to give passers-by a better view of the site. Spoil clearance in the Vertical Engine House restarted after the site clear-up.

During the course of a site visit in early July, Historic England informed us that they could not provide any more grants for conservation work. As a result we are in the process of finding alternative sources of funds. A photographer from Historic England came in mid-July to take a photo of the site for possible use in HE's 2016 Register of Heritage at Risk. We will only know if that is the case when the register is published in November.

The AIBT had a stand at the 2016 South Gloucestershire show adjacent to that of the South Gloucestershire Mines Research Group (SGMRG). Several visitors told us about playing in the buildings as kids, and one said that many objects had been thrown into the pond in the 1950s. Another talked about some of the people living in the cottages. We have invited these visitors to come to Brandy Bottom during a work party and point out features they remember. None of them appear to have photos from that date. Sadly Brandy Bottom appears several times in the new book1 published by the SGMRG on accidents, mainly fatalities, in



coal mines. This is an update of the author's 1980s book. and the reports
