Chepstow & District Round Table Santa Sleigh Runs 2016

It is that time of year again when Father Christmas pays his annual visit to Chepstow to help the chaps from the Chepstow and District Round Table bring some festive cheer to local children.

Santa will be out on his sleigh throughout December visiting children in the town and local villages. Kids will have the chance to meet the jolly old man and remind him what they would like on the big day.

Santa's big tour starts off with the Chepstow Town lights switch on, on 26 November and he commences his sleigh run on 4 December in Caldicot.

He will be helped by friendly elves from Round Table who will be rattling buckets to help raise money for good causes and keeping the kids safe.

Chepstow and District Round Table Chairman, Robert Phelps, said: "We are delighted that Father Christmas has agreed to help us out again this year. We are dusting off the sleigh and making sure we have enough sweets for all of the children who want to come and say hello. We look forward to seeing you out and about in December."



Tintern Abbey Carols by Torchlight

On Saturday 3rd December the Chepstow Rotary Club will stage its annual Torchlight Carol Service at Tintern Abbey.

This most popular family event is always well supported and last year some 400 people attended. Thanks to Chepstow Matters, posters, in-programme advertising and flyers handed out on the High Street, the Club enjoys much local support for this wonderful event.

From 5.45pm families form the column in front of the Anchor Inn, Tintern holding their flaming torches on high to light their way, while the smaller members carry light-sticks. They then slowly walk in column around the outside of the Abbey to the wonderful sounds of the choir singing carols within. It is always most satisfying to see the faces of the young, and not so young, reflected in the flames of the torches as they enter the rear of this beautiful and historic Abbey.



Tintern Abbey is certainly an atmospheric location by day. But by night, in floodlight, with hundreds of flaming torches burning brightly and with the sound of carols sung by the choir, it becomes a positively magical place. "Harry Potter has nothing on this", said one visitor!

Once all are within the Abbey the congregation sing together the most popular carols lead by The Wyedean School & Gospel Choir. The carols will be interspersed with seasonal Bible readings while prayers will be led by The Reverend Andrew Webster.

This Torchlight Carol Service is a very special local event that launches the Chepstow Christmas Season. Every member of the family will remember Tintern for a long time to come and so the mark the date 3rd December in your diary now or visit www.chepstowrotary.org.uk for details. As always, entry is by personal programme that may be purchased on the night or, from the end of November, from the Tintern Abbey shop. See you there!

So far this year the Chepstow Club raised over £2,000 for Rotary charities. These include global polio eradication, Young Chef, Young Citizen, Young Photographer, Young Writer, Youth Speaks & Young Musician competitions in our local schools and a Life Education bus.

You can't buy the perfect Christmas – that's the message from a debt charity which has released its own top tips of staying in the black over the festive season.

Christians Against Poverty has a local centre in Chepstow covering Chepstow to Magor and is provided by Churches Together in Chepstow & District. This community service sees people through the year who have reached a crisis point in their finances, most commonly through job loss, low income, illness or relationship breakdown.

This year, it has launched a tried-and-tested list of ways to avoid the kind of financial melt down which sees a rush of clients by February.

"We love Christmas," said Chepstow & District centre manager Isobel Mead.

"The problem is we are sold this line that the perfect Christmas is something we should be buying and that causes more stress than celebration.

"Now is the right time for families to talk to each other to create a sensible game-plan to ensure that Christmas is happy for everyone – and so is the New Year."

The top tips have come from both the experience of those within the charity, as well as CAP's own clients who know what it is like to stick to a tight budget as they clear their debts.

- Agree on a game plan to stop all of you overspending: do a 'secret Santa'? Agree on a set amount each? A 'just for the kids' rule? A 'from charity shops only' rule?
- If children have their heart set on something out of your price range, club together with relatives.
- Short of a new Christmas outfit? Get together with mates for a swapping party and you'll all go home with something new, without the cost.
- 4. If you're doing the meal, ask guests to each contribute something: drinks? pudding? cheese? cake? a turkey?! If you're spending time cooking a Christmas feast, you are already giving a lot.



- Aim to only buy the food you will actually eat and decide what you will do with left-overs eg potato cakes from cooked potatoes, make stock from Turkey carcass, soup from uneaten vegetables, freeze un-used gravy for another time.
- Home-made goodies always go down well

 cupcakes, chocolate truffles, shortbread,
 jam all are cheap to make and, wrapped with cellophane and ribbon, make great presents.
- 7. Your time and thoughtfulness are every bit as valuable as your money. Instead of presents, offer vouchers for gardening, washing the car, a few hours cleaning, ironing or making someone's favourite cake or snack.
- So many people live alone a cheery visit from you is worth more than any present.
- Spend time focusing on what you can enjoy at no cost and make Christmas really special: watching your kids in the school nativity; watching the lights get switched on; enjoying Christmas carols in church; dressing the tree; playing family games.
- 10. Never take out credit or be tempted by a Christmas loan – you don't know what the New Year will bring. Your income may change and it could affect your whole family's security. No Christmas is worth that.

A lesson in saving lives – Helping Wyedean students to make our roads a safer place

Sixth Form students at Wyedean School took a break from their studies this autumn to learn an even more important lesson and one that could save lives.

Wyedean School and Sixth Form Centre, alongside the Gloucestershire Road Safety Partnership, hosted a day dedicated to helping students stay safe on our roads and encouraging respect for all road users.

The 'Drive for Life – Safe and Social Driving' day was held on Wednesday, October 19th at Wyedean School and Sixth Form Centre with around 230 students taking part in activities and educational workshops.

They witnessed a hard-hitting road traffic collision (RTC) scene and investigation and saw first-hand the actions of the emergency services and the impact on them, as well as the people involved in the collision.

They also experienced the 'ripple effect' as the Family Liaison Officer breaks the news to the victim's family and heard the real-life stories of two mothers who have each lost a child in a RTC.

Wyedean School's Headteacher, Robert Ford, said: "This is an incredibly important aspect of a wider education needed increasingly in schools for students in post 16 in particular. My thanks to Sam Bishop, assistant director of Sixth Form, the Sixth Form team and all our visitors for their hard work in organising this event for Wyedean Sixth Form students".

All students were able to 'get behind the wheel' on a driving simulator that enabled them to experience different braking distances and sit on a seatbelt sled, where they felt the impact of hitting a vehicle at seven miles per hour.

They also learned about how different types of music and other distractions can affect their driving and wore 'beer goggles' that mimic the effects of alcohol on their driving performance.



Head of Gloucestershire Road Safety Partnership, Maria Boon, said "we are fortunate to live in a beautiful rural area but this can mean we are dependent on our cars. This Drive4Life event has been designed to safeguard the driving futures of students in our country. It aims to prevent the harm and heartache caused by road traffic collisions."

"Driving isn't all about your skill behind the wheel. Skills and knowledge can produce a good driver but it's the right attitude and behaviour that will make a great one."

Becky Pain, the mother of Oliver, who tragically died in an RTC gave an emotional speech to students in the opening ceremony, she said "Sadly it can happen to any of us... like Oliver's collision you don't have to be driving excessively fast, under the influence of drugs or alcohol or on your mobile phone...fatal or serious injuries from a road collision can happen at any time."

Rhiannon Gillard a Year 13 student, said "the whole day was an eye opening experience, you don't understand the seriousness of distractions when driving with friends in a car. I found the variety of guest speakers and interactive workshops really engaging."

A number of outside organisations also supported the day, including Kwikfit, The AA and the Institute of Advanced Motoring.













Gains and Losses on Employment Allowance

The employment allowance was set at £2,000 for the first two years of its existence. For 2016-17, the allowance has been increased to £3,000. So you can reduce the amount of your employer class 1 national insurance contributions (NICs) payable to HMRC by this amount throughout the year.

The employment allowance is targeted at businesses that support employment, and for 2016-17 will cover your NIC cost of employing four adult full-time workers earning the national living wage for those aged 25 or over. However, the allowance has never been available for employing someone for personal, household or domestic work, such as a cleaner, nanny or gardener. However, it can be claimed by employers of care and support workers. What's more, from 6 April this year, you no longer qualify if you are the director and only paid employee of your company.

Qualifying Employment

This will not make too much difference if only a low level of remuneration is taken, with profits mainly withdrawn as dividends. However, the situation may be more serious for contractors who, regardless of whether or not the IR35 rules apply, often take a much higher level of remuneration. The after-tax cost of losing the full allowance for 2016-17 is £2.400.

Just having employees or another director is, in itself, insufficient to continue qualifying for the allowance. You will only qualify if your earnings from the company are high enough to be subject to employer NICs. This means that an employee's weekly earnings have to be at least £156 (£676 monthly), while a director needs annual earnings of £8,112.

The full allowance of £3,000 will be available provided you qualify at some point during 2016-17. But a word of warning if you think that simply employing your spouse or partner for one week is good enough: you cannot qualify for the employment allowance as a consequence of avoidance arrangements. By contrast, employing a seasonal worker for one or more weeks would be fine, provided their earnings are high enough. HMRC also gives the example of a person who is the only UK-based employee of an international company. When it comes to the employment of a spouse, partner or family member, the employment needs to be genuine; in particular, HMRC will be less likely to query long-term arrangements.

Lower Exemption for Employee Shareholders

The take up of employee-shareholder status has been somewhat less than the government hoped for, the recently introduced restriction to the amount of capital

gains tax (CGT) exemption is certainly not going to help. The basic idea is that an employee-shareholder receives tax-advantaged shares in exchange for giving up certain employment rights.

The employee shareholder must receive shares in their employing company with a minimum value of £2,000, with these shares free of tax and national insurance contributions. There is no upper value for the shares which can be acquired, but the excess value over the £2,000 limit is taxed as earnings. The employee-shareholder then benefits from a CGT exemption on the disposal of up to £50,000 worth of shares. The shares are valued at the time they are received by the employee, and the exemption would previously have applied regardless of their increase in value – even if sold for millions of pounds.

However, the amount of exemption is now subject to a £100,000 lifetime limit where shares are acquired under an employee shareholder agreement entered into on or after 17 March 2016. Any past or future gains arising from prior shareholder agreements do not count towards the £100,000 limit. For example, an employee sells £50,000 worth of these employee shareholder shares with a gain of £250,000. If the employee-shareholder agreement was entered into before 17 March 2016, the £250,000 gain would be exempt from CGT. If the agreement was later, £150,000 of the gain would be taxed. Although employee shareholder style contracts have not been widely used by rank and file employees, they have been more popular for start-ups with high growth potential. The CGT exemption has been particularly attractive to key employees and directors because they could enjoy the growth in share value in a tax-efficient manner. Such employees would probably not be worried about the loss of some employment rights. Unfortunately, the lifetime limit now reduces the attractiveness of the employee-shareholder regime, even taking into account the reduction in the higher rate of CGT from 28% to 20%. Arrangements may no longer be cost-effective where they involve complex share structures.


