

Looking to the year ahead with Winterbourne Medieval Barn

Winterbourne Medieval Barn Trust (WMBT) is in the process of finalising a varied programme of events for 2017, and a list of events is attached. All details will be shown on the

website - www.winterbournebarn.org.uk

Winterbourne Medieval Barn is currently being supported by the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) and has appointed a team of consultants to manage the development project for the long-term future of the Barn as a community and heritage asset. This requires the Trust to raise £400,000 in the next year to release £1M of funding from the HLF at the end of 2017. The final appointments to the team of consultants have recently been made, with Steve Simkins of West Waddy ADP from Oxford as the Architect, and Interpretation Design provided by Steve Roberts of Footprint Design in Stroud.

This is an exciting time for the Medieval Barn, and the Trust would be delighted to hear from more local people who would like to be involved as volunteers. People can give as much or as little time to the project as suits them, and while certain skills are very useful for some roles, there are plenty of volunteering opportunities for people with no particular experience. Those who enjoy hands-on physical work might like to help with "Barnforce" who meet one Saturday morning a month, or the Gardening Group who meet on a Friday morning (ring 01454 775306). But the Barn would also love to have more people to help out at one of the Events, maybe as a car park attendant, or manning a stall, or standing on the gate, or helping with setting out or clearing up. Many hands make light work as they say! Volunteering can be a very rewarding experience, and can introduce you to new friends and new activities you might never have considered. Apple Grafting Workshop, Saturday 25 February 2017, 10am - 4pm

The workshop, run by Ben Raskin of the Soil Association, will explain why grafting is used and share some of the techniques used. It will involve individual hands-on work in learning to cut the wood, prepare it for grafting, and then make your own graft from start to finish, ending up with a new apple tree. There will be the opportunity to make at least three grafts, and there may be additional root stocks on which to make further grafts at a small cost. Some common varieties will be provided for grafting, but if you have a favourite that you wish to propagate then take your own wood to graft. If you know of a particular variety that you wish to propagate, but do not have wood, please let the organisers know well in advance and they will attempt to procure wood (£1 extra on the day). The only equipment you will need is a very sharp knife, eg. Stanley Knife.

Cost is £35 in advance, plus £7.50 on the day for materials. This workshop is limited to 8 people, but if demand is sufficient, it may be repeated the following weekend. Yarn-bombed Christmas Tree to Double as Blankets for Homeless

Knitters from a local church have not only created their own Christmas tree from yarn but when the decorations come down they're recycling it into blankets for local homeless charities.

Over 800 woolly green squares have been knitted or crocheted and then stacked into a 6 foot tall Christmas tree by the St Michael's Yarn Bombers from Stoke Gifford, Whilst 1000s of real Christmas trees are recycled into compost - the knitted tree will be dismantled and sewn into at least 10 woolly blankets for two Bristol charities supporting homeless people.

The varn bombing group has been delighting local people with surprise displays and decorations at community events in Stoke Gifford since early 2016. But when they launched the Christmas tree project they were joined by around 100 other knitters across Bristol and beyond. Church members, craft groups, family, friends and children produced squares. They were even sent three green squares from a knitter in Washington DC in the United States!

848 different green squares have been stacked into to the woolly Christmas tree. 816 have been knitted or crocheted. 32 are made of felt and were decorated by children at the Messy Church which meets once a month at St Michael's, Stoke Gifford.

Kia Harris, one of the leaders of St Michael's Yarn Bombers, said.

"At St Michael's we strive to be the heart of the community, by living to make a difference. Involving so many people is helping us to celebrate Christmas as a whole community, and very soor our work will

be making a real difference to homele

people in Bristol as well."

The group estimate they have enough knitted squares to make over 10 warm blankets which will be donated to Emmaus Bristol and the Julian Trust Night Shelter – charities which St Michael's Church has supported for many years.

The idea originally came from a craft group in East Anglia, but has exceeded all expectations as it caught the imagination of knitters across the local community and beyond. While the knitted tree is now finished, it's not too late for more squares to be added to the project. Contributions need to be 6 inches (15cm) square, made from any yarn, in any stitch. Donations can be dropped into the St Michael's Church Office on North Road, Stoke Gifford.

Five fresh approaches will be piloted in Bristol to boost older people's mental health and wellbeing

Positive wellbeing and good mental health are key when it comes to stopping older people from being lonely. Studies from similar projects suggest that about 75% of the people identified as isolated and lonely are likely to have some form of mental health problem, mostly depression, which could be the cause or result of their loneliness and isolation.

Funded by Bristol Ageing Better (BAB), 5 new pilot projects providing different approaches to enhancing older people's wellbeing will be rolled out in the coming months. The Bristol Ageing Better Programme aims to fund projects which identify the most isolated older people and that provide

activities and services to empower them and improve their contact with their community.

Carers Support Centre are delighted to have received funding from BAB and to be working in partnership with Dhek Bhal to pilot a telephone counselling service for older carers. Keith Sinclair, CEO of Carers Support Centre, said: "We know that older carers face a range of issues including grief, loss, isolation and loneliness. The pilot aims to help older carers manage their own health and wellbeing better. Providing counselling by phone means that carers do not have to go out to an appointment, as leaving the person they care for on their own can be very difficult."

Second Step, a mental health charity based in Bristol, has also welcomed the announcement: "Second Step are very excited to be launching a pilot project in partnership with Brunelcare which will offer solutionsfocused psychological interventions and holistic support to older people. Our aim is to provide support today to develop skills and improved resilience and connectedness for the long term", said Bryony Campbell. Operations Delivery Manager.

These pilot projects will run for 9 months, after which a larger service will be commissioned in Summer 2017.

It has proved immensely popular and successful as it has enrolled many active users, who benefit greatly from its service.



Project Worker Sheridan Crew said: "Shopmobility is being used by more people from throughout South Gloucestershire and we are seeing a growing need to support people with mobility problems with all aspects of their disability".

"We recognise the support needs of carers and how socially isolating lack of mobility and being a carer can be. We directly support or signpost people to other agencies as and when required in seeking to improve quality of life or overcome difficulties being faced. People recognise the value of the service and for some using a scooter on a regular basis is an important part of their life."

"Our longer-term hire of scooters and wheelchairs enables people to use on holiday or if having relatives to stay".

"Physical disability, particularly when due to sudden ill health or accident can have a very debilitating effect. The use of a scooter can act as a conduit by enabling people contact with others and in help find further support required".

"With the exception of the Mall at Cribbs causeway Yate is the only place in South Gloucestershire where people can visit a variety of shops and services through scooter hire."

"The centre is also ideally suited to scooters as all shops are accessible and the surface is flat and even. This may explain why people come from all parts of South Gloucesterhire and beyond to regularly visit us at our office base at Yate library."

"We can meet people at the car or taxi with a scooter for those who are unable to walk to us."

Thunderbirds Are Go! **Says Air Tattoo**

PLANS to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the US Air Force at next summer's Royal International Air Tattoo were given a huge boost this week following the announcement that one of the world's most popular display teams will make a rare trip across the Atlantic to take part.



The Thunderbirds' performance at the Air Tattoo, which takes place on July 14-16, will be the team's only UK appearance next year and will be part of the airshow's official tribute to mark the US Air Force's 70th anniversary. As well as seeing a range of operational and historic US Air Force aircraft in the air and on the ground, Air Tattoo visitors will have the opportunity to learn about the key role the air arm plays in a range of international coalitions and partnerships.

Formed in 1953, the team is renowned as much for its choreographed pre-flight ground routine performed with pinpoint accuracy - as it is for its stunning aerial displays.

Air Tattoo Chief Executive Andy Armstrong said the announcement of the Thunderbirds' participation demonstrated the incredibly strong bond that exists with the US Air Force.

He said: "The history - and success - of the Air Tattoo is inextricably linked to the US Air Force, on whose base the event takes place each year. I am pleased that we'll have the opportunity next summer to mark their 70th anniversary."

Care and support through terminal illness



News from the Friends of Brandy Bottom Colliery, Pucklechurch

The Brandy Bottom Colliery is located on the South Gloucestershire coalfield in the parish of Pucklechurch, and is the site of a 19th century steam-powered colliery. It lay on the line of the Dramway, the horsedrawn railway that was used to haul coal from

the Coalpit Heath area either to the River Avon near Keynsham or to Bristol, and which ran until 1850.

A very busy year on the site has come to an end. There were around 50 work parties in 2016, compared to a total of 29 in 2015.

During August to November 2016, work was concentrated on the Vertical Engine House, where the spoil has been removed down to the working surfaces of the remaining three sub-divisions. (This level was reached in the fourth, the winding drum pit, some time ago.) Hidden among the spoil were a number of metal artefacts (such as the spanner below). A new structure was found outside the south-east wall of the Cornish Engine House, and a general tidy-up of the site is in progress.

Brandy Bottom featured on the front cover of the South-west section of Historic England's 2016 Register of Heritage at Risk. It has been used as an example of a successful partnership between Historic England and other organisations, which could lead to the site being removed from the register in the future. Its inclusion is recognition of the conservation work we are doing.

A SGMRG member unearthed some photos he took of Brandy Bottom in 1985, and has allowed us to use them - Thank you. They show: the Horizontal Engine House from the top of the Old Pit heapstead (photo below, © T Rendall); the Old Pit heapstead from a position to the west of the present cycle track (photo 1): and the now-ruined plate-lavers hut to the north





on the right. (© T Rendall, 1985)

of the site (photo 2). What is evident is how much the vegetation has grown in the 30-odd years since they were taken. In bottom left, there is no sign of the willow that now stands near the northern corner of the Horizontal Engine House, or of the trees around the edge of the pond on the right of the photo. Photo 1 shows that the stone facing of the Old Pit heapstead had started to collapse before 1985, while photo 2 is of interest as it shows the chimneys of the Shortwood brickworks in the distance.

Stay Well This Winter

A national campaign to help people prepare for winter weather has been launched across the country by NHS England and Public Health England. The message is to Stay Well This Winter and to encourage people most at risk from cold weather, including those with long-term health conditions and the over 65s, to prepare for the lower temperatures.

More people die over the course of each winter compared to other times of the year and there are a range of conditions worsened by the cold weather - 80 per cent of these deaths are accounted for by people with circulatory diseases (such as heart disease, lung illnesses and stroke), dementia and respiratory diseases (such as asthma).

Exposure to cold indoor or outdoor temperatures increases blood pressure, thereby increasing the risk of heart failure, kidney disease, stroke or dementia, Cold temperatures can also make blood more likely to clot, which can lead to heart attacks and stroke. In addition, cold can also affect the respiratory system, which reduces the lung's ability to fight off infection explaining why lower temperatures are linked with bronchitis and pneumonia.

Colder weather is not only associated with an increase in deaths but also has a significant impact on the number of people becoming ill, increasing the winter pressures felt by the health care services. Research shows that for every one degree centigrade drop below five degrees in outdoor average temperatures, there is more than a 10 per cent increase in older people consulting their GP for breathing problems, a 0.8 per cent increase in emergency hospital admissions and a 3.4 per increase in deaths.

The campaign messages, which includes TV, radio and social media, urge people to be ready for the colder season and to seek immediate advice and help from a pharmacist as soon as they feel unwell, before their condition gets more serious.

Professor Keith Willett, Medical Director for Acute Care at NHS England said: "The NHS is here to help but there are important things we can all do to take care of ourselves during the winter months. It is vital that the most vulnerable people take preventative steps to keep healthy and stay well. We have a high number of A&E attendances over this time that are due to issues which could have been avoided had people asked for medical advice at the first sign of illness.



Professor Paul Cosford, Director for Health Protection and Medical Director at Public Health England said:

"Throughout the cold weather, looking out for yourself and others is essential to keeping healthy. With winter on the way, now is a good time to make sure you, and those you know who may be particularly at risk from the cold, are as prepared as possible. If you qualify for the free flu jab, get it now. Also remember that eating a healthy, balanced diet and that staying physically active can keep you healthy.

"There are a variety of ways you can apply for help to keep your house warm, such as Winter Fuel Payments, Warm Home Discounts and Cold Weather Payments. If you meet the criteria, register for priority service with your energy and water suppliers.

"Try to maintain indoor temperatures to at least 18°C (65°F), particularly if you find it hard to get around, have a long-term illness or are 65 or over. You may prefer your living room to be slightly warmer. Make sure your gas, solid fuel and oil burning appliances are serviced by a registered engineer so that they are working effectively and safely before the winter sets in. If we all look out for each other this winter we can really make a difference."

Meteorologist and weather presenter Lucy Verasamy is also supporting the campaign. Lucy said:

"Cold weather narrows the blood vessels. This is why we see an increase in things like heart attacks over winter months. There are also other practical dangers when the weather gets cold such as icy pavements, which lead to an increase in slips and falls, particularly amongst the elderly. I'm supporting the Stay Well This Winter campaign because I really believe in raising awareness of the small steps we can take to look after ourselves and others when the mercury drops."



Firefighters urge families to **#PressToTest their smoke alarm**

Avon Fire & Rescue Service (AF&RS), is urging families to join an online campaign encouraging people to test their smoke alarm.

Smoke alarms provide vital early

warning of a fire but research shows that only 28% of all households which own one test it on a regular

AF&RS is asking families to show their support for the #PressToTest campaign by posting images online of themselves checking their detectors. Families who post an image will have one of four chances to win a visit to a fire station.

AF&RS is supporting a national campaign, following 229 fire-related deaths in the home last year. The Fire Kills campaign hopes that by encouraging everyone to test their smoke alarms more deaths could be prevented.

Group Manager for Risk Reduction at AF&RS, Matt Peskett, said: "You're at least seven times more likely to die in a fire if you don't have any working smoke alarms. However, only 28% of the people who own an alarm say they take the time to test it at least monthly.

"We would like everyone to take just a few minutes to test their alarms. As well as keeping yourself safe. families who engage in the online campaign will also have the chance to win a visit to a working fire station as a thank you for supporting our campaign."

"I'd encourage everyone to make sure they test their smoke alarms today and get into the habit of testing them each month as they can save you and your family's life. In the event of a fire, working smoke alarms will give you the valuable time to get out, stay out and call 999."

To help keep you and your loved ones safe, follow these simple steps:

- Test your smoke alarms now or when you get home
- Make sure you fit smoke alarms on every level of your home and test them monthly, even if they're wired into the mains.
- Whatever happens, never remove the batteries in your smoke alarms unless you are replacing them. Some require new batteries every year.
- Plan and practise an escape route and make sure that everyone in your home knows it.
- In the event of a fire, get out, stay out and call 999.


