Chepstow Rotary Club held its annual Torchlight Carol Service at Tintern Abbey inearly December. This most popular family event is always well supported and this year over 430 adults attended with their children.

Families started arriving from 4pm and so by 5pm the LIONS Club marshals reported that the car parks were beginning to fill. After lighting their flaming flambes and illuminating their light sticks the people formed a very, very long procession on the road adjacent to the Abbey. At precisely 6pm the assembly, led by the Reverend Andrew Webster of Chepstow Methodist

Church, slowly marched off towards the side of the ruins. Once inside the Abbey grounds the column of people filed down the outside of the south wall on this misty evening as the voices of the choir rose from within the ancient ruins. The noise of the initial crowd had changed entirely into a hushed reverence for the sounds and the sights of beautiful Tintern Abbey. Then, as people entered the main Abbey building in an unfamiliar way through the East door. one could hear the gasps of the children as they saw those ancient walls illuminated from within and the view of the choir assembled on the dais at the far end.

Carols were sung with vigour, lessons read with passion and there was a genuine feeling of goodwill towards one another throughout the service. Rotary President Mac McCarty wished everyone a

very happy Christmas and made an appeal for donations to Rotary charities. The service was close by Reverend Webster after which the assembly exited the Abbey and dispersed into the darkness. The Christmas celebrations had certainly started well.


The event raised over £3,000 and after all expenses were paid, including programme printing, the flambes, light sticks and St John's Ambulance, the club was able to add over £2,100 to its charity fund. Glynn retired when he was 80 and the club carried on under the leadership of Gordon and Marie. When age eventually forced Gordon to retire after 7 years, the leadership was then taken over by present leaders Roger and Rosalind.

Like other clubs the membership has fallen in recent years. It has been a thriving club in the Chepstow Area over the past 50 years but new members are needed to enable the club to continue running. It would be very sad to see it close, leaving Chepstow with no sequence dancing!






Thunderbirds Are Go! Says Air Tattoo

PLANS to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the US Air Force at next summer's Royal International Air Tattoo were given a huge boost this week following the announcement that one of the world's most popular display teams will make a rare trip across the Atlantic to take part.



The Thunderbirds' performance at the Air Tattoo, which takes place on July 14-16, will be the team's only UK appearance next year and will be part of the airshow's official tribute to mark the US Air Force's 70th anniversary. As well as seeing a range of operational and historic US Air Force aircraft in the air and on the ground, Air Tattoo visitors will have the opportunity to learn about the key role the air arm plays in a range of international coalitions and partnerships.

Formed in 1953, the team is renowned as much for its choreographed pre-flight ground routine - performed with pinpoint accuracy - as it is for its stunning aerial displays.

Flying six F-16 Fighting Falcons, elite pilots from the US Air Force will perform a mix of formation flying and solo routines that highlight the maximum capabilities of the USAF's frontline, multi-role fighter jet. The team, which is based at Nellis Air Force Base in Nevada, has only appeared at the Air Tattoo once before – in 2007.

Air Tattoo Chief Executive Andy Armstrong said the announcement of the Thunderbirds' participation demonstrated the incredibly strong bond that exists with the US Air Force.

He said: "The history – and success - of the Air Tattoo is inextricably linked to the US Air Force, on whose base the event takes place each year. I am pleased that we'll have the opportunity next summer to mark their 70th anniversary."



A lesson in saving lives – Helping Wyedean students to make our roads a safer place

Sixth Form students at Wyedean School took a break from their studies last term to learn an even more important lesson and one that could save lives.

Wyedean School and Sixth Form Centre, alongside the Gloucestershire Road Safety Partnership, hosted a day dedicated to helping students stay safe on our roads and encouraging respect for all road users.

The 'Drive for Life – Safe and Social Driving' day was held on Wednesday, October 19th at Wyedean School and Sixth Form Centre with around 230 students taking part in activities and educational workshops.

They witnessed a hard-hitting road traffic collision (RTC) scene and investigation and saw first-hand the actions of the emergency services and the impact on them, as well as the people involved in the collision.

They also experienced the 'ripple effect' as the Family Liaison Officer breaks the news to the victim's family and heard the real-life stories of two mothers who have each lost a child in a RTC.

Wyedean School's Headteacher, Robert Ford, said: "This is an incredibly important aspect of a wider education needed increasingly in schools for students in post 16 in particular. My thanks to Sam Bishop, assistant director of Sixth Form, the Sixth Form team and all our visitors for their hard work in organising this event for Wyedean Sixth Form students".

All students were able to 'get behind the wheel' on a driving simulator that enabled them to experience different braking distances and sit on a seatbelt sled, where they felt the impact of hitting a vehicle at seven miles per hour.

They also learned about how different types of music and other distractions can affect their driving and wore 'beer goggles' that mimic the effects of alcohol on their driving performance.



Head of Gloucestershire Road Safety Partnership, Maria Boon, said "we are fortunate to live in a beautiful rural area but this can mean we are dependent on our cars. This Drive4Life event has been designed to safeguard the driving futures of students in our country. It aims to prevent the harm and heartache caused by road traffic collisions."

"Driving isn't all about your skill behind the wheel. Skills and knowledge can produce a good driver but it's the right attitude and behaviour that will make a great one."

Becky Pain, the mother of Oliver, who tragically died in an RTC gave an emotional speech to students in the opening ceremony, she said "Sadly it can happen to any of us... like Oliver's collision you don't have to be driving excessively fast, under the influence of drugs or alcohol or on your mobile phone...fatal or serious injuries from a road collision can happen at any time."

Rhiannon Gillard a Year 13 student, said "the whole day was an eye opening experience, you don't understand the seriousness of distractions when driving with friends in a car. I found the variety of guest speakers and interactive workshops really engaging."

A number of outside organisations also supported the day, including Kwikfit, The AA and the Institute of Advanced Motoring.

The Art of Landscape: Arcadia to Abstraction

Chepstow Museum presents a course of 10 lectures exploring how the depiction of landscape

has changed over the centuries

At the Drill Hall, Lower Church St Chepstow beginning Mondays 2-4pm beginning 23 January 2017

A series of art appreciation classes in Chepstow will explore some of the most beautiful and memorable images in art history.

At first, landscapes were a mere setting for the saints, but gradually emerged from the background to become celebrated in their own right. This ten week course will look at how the art of landscape reflected fashion, politics and painting techniques, from the 15th to the 20th centuries. The great Renaissance painters such as Titian and Giorgione created visions of a rural Arcadia, peopled with musicians and goddesses, but the artists of 17th century Holland marked the country's new-found independence by turning to the rolling skies and windmills of their everyday world.

In the 18th century, Britain began, for once, to lead the field in painting by focusing artistic energy on the landscape, culminating in the glorious, romantic images of Constable and Turner. But as Europe became increasingly industrialised, it was the French Impressionists and Post-Impressionists who brought innovative ways of seeing the city and the countryside to the fore, laying the groundwork for the abstract artists of the 20th century to create a radical and challenging new art.

Join us at the Drill Hall, Chepstow on Monday afternoons (2-4pm from 23rd January 2017) with popular Monmouthshire lecturer, Eleanor Bird, to examine 600 years of representations of the landscape.

Gains and Losses on Employment Allowance

The employment allowance was set at £2,000 for the first two years of its existence. For 2016-17, the allowance has been increased to £3,000. So you can reduce the amount of your employer class 1 national insurance contributions (NICs) payable to HMRC by this amount throughout the year.

The employment allowance is targeted at businesses that support employment, and for 2016-17 will cover your NIC cost of employing four adult full-time workers earning the national living wage for those aged 25 or over. However, the allowance has never been available for employing someone for personal, household or domestic work, such as a cleaner, nanny or gardener. However, it can be claimed by employers of care and support workers. What's more, from 6 April this year, you no longer qualify if you are the director and only paid employee of your company.

Qualifying Employment

This will not make too much difference if only a low level of remuneration is taken, with profits mainly withdrawn as dividends. However, the situation may be more serious for contractors who, regardless of whether or not the IR35 rules apply, often take a much higher level of remuneration. The after-tax cost of losing the full allowance for 2016-17 is £2.400.

Just having employees or another director is, in itself, insufficient to continue qualifying for the allowance. You will only qualify if your earnings from the company are high enough to be subject to employer NICs. This means that an employee's weekly earnings have to be at least £156 (£676 monthly), while a director needs annual earnings of £8,112.

The full allowance of £3,000 will be available provided you qualify at some point during 2016-17. But a word of warning if you think that simply employing your spouse or partner for one week is good enough: you cannot qualify for the employment allowance as a consequence of avoidance arrangements. By contrast, employing a seasonal worker for one or more weeks would be fine, provided their earnings are high enough. HMRC also gives the example of a person who is the only UK-based employee of an international company. When it comes to the employment of a spouse, partner or family member, the employment needs to be genuine; in particular, HMRC will be less likely to query long-term arrangements.

Lower Exemption for Employee Shareholders

The take up of employee-shareholder status has been somewhat less than the government hoped for, the recently introduced restriction to the amount of capital

gains tax (CGT) exemption is certainly not going to help. The basic idea is that an employee-shareholder receives tax-advantaged shares in exchange for giving up certain employment rights.

The employee shareholder must receive shares in their employing company with a minimum value of £2,000, with these shares free of tax and national insurance contributions. There is no upper value for the shares which can be acquired, but the excess value over the £2,000 limit is taxed as earnings. The employee-shareholder then benefits from a CGT exemption on the disposal of up to £50,000 worth of shares. The shares are valued at the time they are received by the employee, and the exemption would previously have applied regardless of their increase in value — even if sold for millions of pounds.

However, the amount of exemption is now subject to a £100,000 lifetime limit where shares are acquired under an employee shareholder agreement entered into on or after 17 March 2016. Any past or future gains arising from prior shareholder agreements do not count towards the £100,000 limit. For example, an employee sells £50,000 worth of these employee shareholder shares with a gain of £250,000. If the employee-shareholder agreement was entered into before 17 March 2016, the £250,000 gain would be exempt from CGT. If the agreement was later, £150,000 of the gain would be taxed. Although employee shareholder style contracts have not been widely used by rank and file employees, they have been more popular for start-ups with high growth potential. The CGT exemption has been particularly attractive to key employees and directors because they could enjoy the growth in share value in a tax-efficient manner. Such employees would probably not be worried about the loss of some employment rights. Unfortunately, the lifetime limit now reduces the attractiveness of the employee-shareholder regime, even taking into account the reduction in the higher rate of CGT from 28% to 20%. Arrangements may no longer be cost-effective where they involve complex share structures.

Border Country by Raymond Williams is one of the great Welsh novels. Published in 1960 this influential autobiographical novel explored the changing lives of people on the Welsh borders, in town, village, farm and industrial valley, from the 1920s to the 1950s.

In this exhibition, originally created for the 2016 National Eisteddfod, works by four Welsh artists, Joan Baker, Charles Burton, John Elwyn and Bert Isaac, all contemporaries of Raymond Williams, have been brought together. They represent a fascinating period in South Wales in the 1930s, 40s and 50s when artists wanted to record ordinary life around them in direct and truthful ways.

Border Country, which was set in and around Abergavenny (fictionalised as the town of 'Gwenton') told the story of a young lecturer who comes home from London to help look after his dying father and in the process remakes connections with the life of his working-class community. It was set on the border of Wales and England, but Williams was interested in other kinds of borders too – between town and village, vale and coalfield, generations, classes, men and women.

Peter Wakelin who curated the exhibition, chose four artists who examined their own surroundings in South Wales as Raymond Williams looked at his — without 'a false or sentimental note anywhere'. They were all born within a few years of Williams. They came out of the same culture and environment. They lived similar experiences, they saw what he saw, and they too explored boundaries between places, people and communities in south Wales.

In the sixty years that have passed Wales and Welsh lives have changed dramatically. So it is rewarding to see an earlier time and place, vividly conjured up, as these four artists and this writer saw it.



Farm Entrance by John Elwyn, 1955 (Aberystwyth University)

Stay Well This Winter

A national campaign to help people prepare for winter weather has been launched across the country by the NHS. The message is to Stay Well This Winter and to encourage people most at risk from cold weather, including those with long-term health conditions and the over 65s, to prepare for the lower temperatures.

More people die over the course of each winter compared to other times of the year and there are a range of conditions worsened by the cold weather - 80 per cent of these deaths are accounted for by people with circulatory diseases (such as heart disease, lung illnesses and stroke), dementia and respiratory diseases (such as asthma).

Exposure to cold indoor or outdoor temperatures increases blood pressure, thereby increasing the risk of heart failure, kidney disease, stroke or dementia. Cold temperatures can also make blood more likely to clot, which can lead to heart attacks and stroke. In addition, cold can also affect the respiratory system, which reduces the lung's ability to fight off infection explaining why lower temperatures are linked with bronchitis and pneumonia.

Colder weather is not only associated with an increase in deaths but also has a significant impact on the number of people becoming ill, increasing the winter pressures felt by the health care services. Research shows that for every one degree centigrade drop below five degrees in outdoor average temperatures, there is more than a 10 per cent increase in older people consulting their GP for breathing problems, a 0.8 per cent increase in emergency hospital admissions and a 3.4 per increase in deaths.

The campaign messages, which includes TV, radio and social media, urge people to be ready for the colder season and to seek immediate advice and help from a pharmacist as soon as they feel unwell, before their condition gets more serious.

Professor Keith Willett, Medical Director for Acute Care at NHS England said: "The NHS is here to help but there are important things we can all do to take care of ourselves during the winter months. It is vital that the most vulnerable people take preventative steps to keep healthy and stay well. We have a high number of A&E attendances over this time that are due to issues which could have been avoided had people asked for medical advice at the first sign of illness.



Professor Paul Cosford, Director for Health Protection and Medical Director at Public Health England said:

"Throughout the cold weather, looking out for yourself and others is essential to keeping healthy. With winter on the way, now is a good time to make sure you, and those you know who may be particularly at risk from the cold, are as prepared as possible. If you qualify for the free flu jab, get it now. Also remember that eating a healthy, balanced diet and that staying physically active can keep you healthy.

"There are a variety of ways you can apply for help to keep your house warm, such as Winter Fuel Payments, Warm Home Discounts and Cold Weather Payments. If you meet the criteria, register for priority service with your energy and water suppliers.

"Try to maintain indoor temperatures to at least 18°C (65°F), particularly if you find it hard to get around, have a long-term illness or are 65 or over. You may prefer your living room to be slightly warmer. Make sure your gas, solid fuel and oil burning appliances are serviced by a registered engineer so that they are working effectively and safely before the winter sets in. If we all look out for each other this winter we can really make a difference."

Meteorologist and weather presenter Lucy Verasamy is also supporting the campaign. Lucy said:

"Cold weather narrows the blood vessels. This is why we see an increase in things like heart attacks over winter months. There are also other practical dangers when the weather gets cold such as icy pavements, which lead to an increase in slips and falls, particularly amongst the elderly. I'm supporting the Stay Well This Winter campaign because I really believe in raising awareness of the small steps we can take to look after ourselves and others when the mercury drops."




