News from Winterbourne Medieval Barn



Winterbourne Medieval Barn's **Significant Funding Boost**

One of the country's few surviving medieval barns with a history preceding the great plagues is a step closer to becoming a hub for the local community nearly 700 years after it was originally built.

Local people have been working for 20 years to save the barn, which was on the verge of dereliction. Work funded by English Heritage stabilised the barn structure, and since then volunteers have worked through Winterbourne Medieval Barn Trust (WMBT) to conserve and repair the barn and its surrounding site and bring them into community use. The Trust is delighted to announce that they have been offered funding of up to £19,900 from the Architectural Heritage Fund.

The Grade II* listed Winterbourne Medieval Barn is a building of national importance. It was commissioned in 1342 by Sir Thomas de Bradeston, then Lord of the Manor of Winterbourne, who had played a part in all of Edward III's military campaigns and served in Parliament. The barn is an outstanding example of a raised cruck construction, and its original magnificent roof structure has remained largely intact.

WMBT has exciting plans to conserve the Medieval Barn and refurbish it along with its associated outbuildings, to provide a flexible space for a variety of community, educational and commercial uses based around heritage and rural skills. The project is currently receiving support from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) to finalise plans that will ensure the Barn's long-term sustainability in the local community. As part of this project the Trust has to raise £400,000 in order to release almost £1m of funding from the HLF, and the grant from the Architectural Heritage Fund (AHF) is the first step towards this goal. The grant will go towards professional fees required for the architect, structural engineer, ecologist, etc.

Sue Parsons, Chairman of the WMBT said, "The Trust is very grateful to the AHF and is excited to know that they are now a step closer to ensuring that the Barn will survive to be enjoyed by the current community and future generations."

Big Community Project – Your Barn Needs You!

The Trust would be delighted to hear from more local people who would like to get involved as volunteers. People can give as much or as little time to the project as suits them, and while certain skills are very useful for some roles, there are plenty of volunteering opportunities that require no particular experience. Those who enjoy hands-on physical work might like to help with "Barnforce" once a month on a Saturday morning - just turn up (18 Mar, 15 Apr, etc) or tel. 0117 957 4921- or try the Gardening Group who meet on Friday mornings (ring Liz 01454 775306). No gardening experience is necessary. More information is available on the website.

The Barn would also love to have more people to help out at some of its Events, maybe as a car park attendant, or on the gate, or manning a stall, or helping set up or clear up, or lots of other jobs. Many hands make light work as they say!

The Trust is also looking for people to help with little day-to-day jobs, for example managing the membership list (computer skills needed), or managing social media. Volunteering is a very rewarding experience, and can introduce you to new friends and new activities you might never have considered. Shopmobility South Gloucestershire – keen to combat Social Isolation

Shopmobility South Glos is based in Yate Library, within Yate Shopping Centre. The service hires out battery powered scooters and wheelchairs, to assist people who have limited mobility in retaining their independence and to use the facilities of the centre. Those with South Glos. Council Diamond cards can use them for this service free of charge. It is also possible to hire scooters and wheelchairs for longer term if required for a small charge..

Shopmobility has proved to be immensely popular and successful, as it has enrolled many active users, who benefit greatly from its service. They had over 1500 hires during 2016.

Given data compiled from their annual survey in October 2016, that roughly half of respondents felt shopmobility had reduced social isolation. The great majority felt that the service had benefited them in the areas of "quality of life"; "feeling more worthwhile", "happiness day to day", and "health and wellbeing".

Data published by the Office for National Statistics. indicates 45% of older people who have a long standing illness report loneliness 'some of the time' or 'often' compared to 27% of those without a long standing illness.

Age UK have found 'around 70% of over 85's report mobility difficulties - 37% of the 85+ feel everything they do is 'an effort' compared to 18% in the 50-64 age group.

The number of people aged 85+ in the UK is predicted to double in the next 20 years and nearly treble in the next 30 years! NHS Primary Care Strategy estimates a 35.8% increase in the over 65's in the next 5 years. A percentage of this number will unfortunately develop a mobility problem and it is envisaged demand on our service is likely to increase.

It is claimed that projects that help to build stronger communities can be regarded to some extent as bringing the added value by addressing the root causes as well of the symptoms of loneliness.

Campaign to End Loneliness has shown through research, that loneliness and social isolation are harmful to our health: lacking social connections is a comparable risk factor for early death as smoking 15 cigarettes a day, and is worse for us than wellknown risk factors such as obesity and physical inactivity. Loneliness increases the likelihood of mortality by 26% (Holt-Lunstad, 2015).

Shopmobility recognises that social isolation is a wider issue not just effecting those with a physical problem. They are in a position to signpost or provide direct support to people, including carers to access other services that may be of help.

Could you make a difference to the life of a Chernobyl Child? Two weeks from you could give two years to these children.



Can you remember the Chernobyl disaster back in April 1986? The population of Belarus can never forget.

Their people will be forever affected by the legacy of the world's worst nuclear disaster – the radioactive fallout was nearly 400 times greater than the bombs dropped in 1945 on Hiroshima and Nagasaki combined. The World Health Organisation has classified 500,000 of the children in Belarus as being "at risk".

The Chernobyl Children's Lifeline charity was founded by Victor Mizzi M.B.E. in 1991. Building on his example, we are bringing a group of 16 children from Belarus this summer - 9 July to 6 August for a

month's respite care. They are chosen on health grounds, and not means-tested.

It is estimated that a month staying with families here, eating nourishing food, away from the relentless radiation and breathing clean air can add up to two years to their life expectancy and reduce the effect of the harsh winter.

Could you share your home with two 11 year old children for two weeks? There is a network of support for host families - you would not be on your own. The children will take part in lots of activities that we have organised on their behalf. These activities range from sports to the arts, from local visits to coach trips to the sea or countryside. There will be two interpreters with the group and they are on hand around the clock should there be any language difficulties or for general advice and assistance.



The plant works 12 hour shifts day and night and all electricity is produced on site, 80% wind turbine and 20% solar panels. Everyone thoroughly enjoyed their 90 minute tour and left clutching a goody bag of Warburton products. Thanks to Susan for organising yet another excellent outing for us.

Our speaker for the evening was Jim Elsworth who regaled us with slides and tales of Pubs Past and Present in Chipping Sodbury. He started by explaining why there were so many Pubs in such a small area, this was partly because it was on the old Drover's route through to London and also because it is a natural crossroads, north, south, east and west of the country and passengers on coaches made good use of the coaching Pubs which provided accommodation, stabling and often a blacksmith for shoeing the horses. Some of the other pubs were very small, really just cider or beer drinking bars for local people to meet.

800 years ago Chipping Sodbury was granted a Market Charter which resulted in all the small shops putting up stalls outside their shops on the "Chippings" which is an ancient name for markets, hence "Chipping" Sodbury. At some time there



have been well over twenty pubs, large and small. in Chipping Sodbury but we now have only about a dozen, most of which are still thriving. There is even one which has been re-opened, the Horseshoe Inn, which is now well used by local people and has now started serving food. Mr Emsworth gave us much interesting information about the pubs, along with old pictures of them, and we thoroughly enjoyed his talk and no doubt some of us will be sampling them in the near future.

Our next meeting will be on Thursday 9 March, when our speaker will be Martin Horler on the Role of the Royal Mail Guard. Visitors are very welcome to our meeting at 7.30pm on the second Thursday of every month (except August), at the St Michaels Rooms, High Street Winterbourne.



On Valentine's Day several hardy families joined Avon Wildlife Trust to celebrate local wildlife.





Thunderbirds Are Go! Says Air Tattoo

PLANS to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the US Air Force at next summer's Royal International Air Tattoo were given a huge boost this week following the announcement that one of the world's most popular display teams will make a rare trip across the Atlantic to take part.



The Thunderbirds' performance at the Air Tattoo, which takes place on July 14-16, will be the team's only UK appearance next year and will be part of the airshow's official tribute to mark the US Air Force's 70th anniversary. As well as seeing a range of operational and historic US Air Force aircraft in the air and on the ground, Air Tattoo visitors will have the opportunity to learn about the key role the air arm plays in a range of international coalitions and partnerships.

Formed in 1953, the team is renowned as much for its choreographed pre-flight ground routine - performed with pinpoint accuracy - as it is for its stunning aerial displays.

Flying six F-16 Fighting Falcons, elite pilots from the US Air Force will perform a mix of formation flying and solo routines that highlight the maximum capabilities of the USAF's frontline, multi-role fighter jet. The team, which is based at Nellis Air Force Base in Nevada, has only appeared at the Air Tattoo once before – in 2007.

Air Tattoo Chief Executive Andy Armstrong said the announcement of the Thunderbirds' participation demonstrated the incredibly strong bond that exists with the US Air Force.

He said: Òthe history Đand success - of the Air Tattoo is inextricably linked to the US Air Force, on whose base the event takes place each year. I am pleased that we'll have the opportunity next summer to mark their 70th anniversary.Ó


