News from Winterbourne Medieval Barn

Winterbourne Medieval Barn's **Significant Funding Boost**

One of the country's few surviving medieval barns with a history preceding the great plagues is a step closer to becoming a hub for the local community nearly 700 years after it was originally built.

Local people have been working for 20 years to save the barn, which was on the verge of dereliction. Work funded by English Heritage stabilised the barn structure, and since then volunteers have worked through Winterbourne Medieval Barn Trust (WMBT) to conserve and repair the barn and its surrounding site and bring them into community use. The Trust is delighted to announce that they have been offered funding of up to £19,900 from the Architectural Heritage Fund.

The Grade II* listed Winterbourne Medieval Barn is a building of national importance. It was commissioned in 1342 by Sir Thomas de Bradeston, then Lord of the Manor of Winterbourne, who had played a part in all of Edward III's military campaigns and served in Parliament. The barn is an outstanding example of a raised cruck construction, and its original magnificent roof structure has remained largely intact.

WMBT has exciting plans to conserve the Medieval Barn and refurbish it along with its associated outbuildings, to provide a flexible space for a variety of community, educational and commercial uses based around heritage and rural skills. The project is currently receiving support from the Heritage Lottery Fund (HLF) to finalise plans that will ensure the Barn's long-term sustainability in the local community. As part of this project the Trust has to raise £400,000 in order to release almost £1m of funding from the HLF, and the grant from the Architectural Heritage Fund (AHF) is the first step towards this goal. The grant will go towards



professional fees required for the architect. structural engineer. ecologist, etc.

Sue Parsons, Chairman of the WMBT said. "The Trust is very grateful to the AHF and is excited to know that they are now a step closer to ensuring that the Barn will survive to



be enjoyed by the current community and future generations."

Big Community Project -Your Barn Needs You!

The Trust would be delighted to hear from more local people who would like to get involved as volunteers. People can give as much or as little time to the project as suits them, and while certain skills are very useful for some roles, there are plenty of volunteering opportunities that require no particular experience. Those who enjoy hands-on physical work might like to help with "Barnforce" once a month on a Saturday morning - just turn up (18 Mar, 15 Apr, etc) or tel. 0117 957 4921- or try the Gardening Group who meet on Friday mornings (ring Liz 01454 775306). No gardening experience is necessary. More information is available on the website.

The Barn would also love to have more people to help out at some of its Events, maybe as a car park attendant, or on the gate, or manning a stall. or helping set up or clear up, or lots of other jobs. Many hands make light work as they say!

The Trust is also looking for people to help with little day-to-day jobs, for example managing the membership list (computer skills needed), or managing social media. Volunteering is a very rewarding experience, and can introduce you to new friends and new activities you might never have considered. Potential volunteers can contact the WMBT by emailing volunteerwmbt@gmail.com or by ringing Robert on 0117 957 4921. Everybody is welcome, whatever your age and whatever amount of time you can offer. Just drop us them a line, or have a chat, and see if there's something you might like to do as part of this big community project.

For those unable to aet involved in person, financial help can always be given to this magnificent medieval building by becoming a Barn member for just £5 a year (see WMBT



website). Or if you are a Co-op Member you could nominate WMBT to receive money from the Co-op Local Community Fund. Just log-in to www.coop. co.uk/membership and choose Winterbourne Medieval Barn Trust.

Events in 2017 –

Kicking off with Jazz! This year's summer programme at the Barn kicks off with a new event - a Jazz Evening on Saturday 20 May with the UWE jazz band and singers. Come and enjoy cool relaxing swing and Latin classics with silky smooth vocals and foot-tapping grooves.

To accompany the music, delicious locally-sourced food and drink will be available to purchase from 6.30pm and throughout the evening. Relish Old Sodbury lamb burgers or delicious vegetarian food. with beers from The Bolthole Brewery, and Mad Hatter Cider produced at the Barn itself.

Tickets cost £10 for adults, £5 children under 16. These are already on sale from TicketSource, or from 8 May can be purchased at Daisy's Coffee Shop on Flaxpits Lane. You can also pay on the gate although numbers are limited and availability is not quaranteed.

Medieval Fayre – On Sunday 11 June a Medieval Fayre will be held at Winterbourne Barn from 11am to 4pm. Living history group







The Company of Chivalry will portray life in a 14th century encampment. Come and find out how people lived, worked and fought during the 100 years' war - everything from talks and demonstrations about clothing, cosmetics, cooking and leisure, to re-enactments of medieval military combat. There will be a live firing of medieval canon at 12 noon. Children can join 'Squires School' and train to be a knight, launch a projectile from the trebuchet, enjoy a treasure hunt, try archery, or be transformed into a knight, princess or mythical creature by the Cats Whiskers Face Painting Team.

A full programme of entertainment will fill the day, with falconry, talks on medieval life, live medieval music, dancing, demonstrations, and medieval battles. Hot and cold food and drink is available all day, including Old Sodbury Lamb, Lorraine's famous sweets and savouries, Icicle tricycle ice cream, Beer and Mad Hatters Cider.

Come early and stay all day! Entry costs £3 and children under 16 are free.

Tom Harrison Trumpet Performance –

On Sunday 25 June at 2.30pm, trumpet-player Tom Harrison returns home with two talented friends to give a midsummer concert and talk about music and instruments in medieval times and how they have changed. Tom grew up in Frampton but moved to London for his musical training at The Guildhall, where he met Sophie and Essa. The trio will present an entertaining and light-hearted journey through music from medieval times to modern folk. Bring a picnic and enjoy midsummer in the grounds beforehand the concert. Tickets (£10 adult, £5 under 16s) are available now from TicketSource, and will be on sale in Daisy's Cafe from 12 June.

There is lots more music and drama at the Barn this summer, plus craft and singing workshops, so check the website or facebook page for more details.



Lydney Park, and game from nearby shoots. In addition there is free range pork and chickens from Newent, Mutton, local yeal and goat are also


The business produces its own range of sausages and BBQ products all the year round, many gluten free. Pies, faggots and black pudding are produced at the sister branch in Newport.



The Open Days are in aid of the African village of Genieri and the contributions of people in Sodbury and Yate have always been vital in raising the standard of living in the village. (website; www. yategenierilink.org.uk)

There have been notable developments in Genieri this year. The charity has donated funds for the establishment of new village gardens, including the digging of wells near the centre of Genieri.

There have been two visits from members of the charity in the last twelve months. Their tasks were to oversee the progress of projects and to allot funds where possible.

The solar lights which were installed last year are now functioning well and teething problems have all been overcome. The generator and solar panels used to power the television are a source of income to the village as their greatest use is to show football matches for which a small charge is made. At other times the television is used for educational purposes in the Day Care Centre.

The big news of the year from The Gambia has been the removal from power of its controversial dictator Yahya Jammeh, an act which was greeted with a sigh of relief in Genieri.

Could you make a difference to the life of a Chernobyl Child? Two weeks from you could give two years to these children.



Can you remember the Chernobyl disaster back in April 1986? The population of Belarus can never forget.

Their people will be forever affected by the legacy of the world's worst nuclear disaster – the radioactive fallout was nearly 400 times greater than the bombs dropped in 1945 on Hiroshima and Nagasaki combined. The World Health Organisation has classified 500,000 of the children in Belarus as being "at risk".

The Chernobyl Children's Lifeline charity was founded by Victor Mizzi M.B.E. in 1991. Building on his example, we are bringing a group of 16 children from Belarus this summer - 9 July to 6 August for a

month's respite care. They are chosen on health grounds, and not means-tested.

It is estimated that a month staying with families here, eating nourishing food, away from the relentless radiation and breathing clean air can add up to two years to their life expectancy and reduce the effect of the harsh winter.

Could you share your home with two 11 year old children for two weeks? There is a network of support for host families – you would not be on your own. The children will take part in lots of activities that we have organised on their behalf. These activities range from sports to the arts, from local visits to coach trips to the sea or countryside. There will be two interpreters with the group and they are on hand around the clock should there be any language difficulties or for general advice and assistance.

Visit Ram Hill Colliery

Situated appropriately in Coalpit Heath lie the remains of Ram Hill Colliery. On an open site by the Dramway walkway, this is a time capsule of local mining history.

The site is owned by South Gloucestershire Council and is a scheduled ancient monument, registered with Historic England. The Friends of Ram Hill Colliery manage the site under the Council's

Coal was mined here for about 40 years up until the 1860's, and the site houses the remains of the shaft, horse gin and engine house. The lower part of the site features the Dramway, a precursor of the railway. Coal was loaded into tubs, which were pulled by horses to the river Avon at Keynsham.

In recent years, with the help of volunteers, notably Green Gym, the woodland area by the railway boundary has been developed as an attractive woodland walk. There is wheelchair access to most of the site but visitors are advised to wear sensible. footwear and keep a careful eve on children and dogs.

The Friends are holding an Open Day on Bank Holiday Monday 30 May between 10am-4.30pm with refreshments provided. The site is located across from the Railway Cottages. Broad Lane, Coalpit Heath, BS36 2TY. There is limited car parking at the side of Christmas Cottage on the approach to site. This Charity relies totally on fundraising and has also extended its service to transport mothers to the Neonatal Intensive Care Units at St Michaels, Southmead in Bristol and the RUH in Bath.

We heard how milk banks provide safe donated breast milk to babies who have no access to their mother's own milk. These children are usually born prematurely. Premature babies are born with immature intestines and immune systems so they rely upon this kind of help. News from Winterbourne Evening WI

At our last Meeting we had the great pleasure of listening to a fascinating talk by Martin Horler on the subject of the Role of a Guard on the Royal Mail.

As we were expecting a guard on the

modern railways we were very surprised when a gentleman dressed in a red Frock coat and a Beaver Top Hat and carrying a Post Horn walked in!

Mr Horler and his wife have spent the last 30 years researching their subject and there is not much they don't know about it.

The first Royal Mail was commissioned by Charles 1st in 1635 but as he was then beheaded it was in 1637 that an Act of Parliament formed The Post Office, headed by Ralph Allen. This comprised of Post boys on horseback with the letters locked in their Post bags which was very slow, inefficient and prone to the mail being stolen as it was unguarded. In fact anyone sending money by Post boy was advised to cut the notes in half and send them by different routes. How they eventually got back together was not clear!

Eventually John Palmer and his father, who owned the Theatre Royal in Bath and Bristol, decided that a more secure method was needed as he had to get contracts and scripts and letters to performers, mainly in London, in order to put on his plays. There was usually only one copy made so he couldn't afford for it to get lost or stolen. His coaches ran daily from Bath and Bristol to London with mail and also paying passengers to help with the cost and eventually in 1780 the Post Office started running a very comprehensive service all over the British Isles and the present day system of arterial roads spreading out from London was formed.

There was always an armed guard on the coach who sat up front with the driver leaving room for three passengers on top and usually four inside. It was not a comfortable journey but the numerous coaching in stops along the way provided a welcome break and the chance of some food.

In 1820 the Turnpike Trust was formed by Act of Parliament to improve the appalling state of the roads. This required them to maintain 20 miles of road between their Turnpike Toll Houses in exchange for the right to charge tolls although the mail coaches were exempt.

The armed guard was entitled to shoot Highwaymen on sight without being charged as the mail was so important. The first mail coach in 1780 from the Nails in Bristol took 16 hours and by 1820 this was reduced to 11 hours from Bristol to the Main Post Office at "The Swan With the Two Necks" Pub in London.

In 1820 the cost for a passenger from London to Bath was 24 shillings one way. As a guard earned Half a sovereign a week (10 shillings) coach travel was very expensive.

The Guard was a very important person and the job was highly sought after, especially as he was provided with a new Red Coat every year and of course his beaver hat. Many ex-army men were employed as they were able to use guns. By this time there were 259 Mail Coaches with their guards leaving London every night at 8.00pm and the same number returning overnight.

Mr Horler ended his talk by playing all the calls used on the Post horn, such as "The Mail is coming, make way", I am going to pass you on the left or right", "The Mail Coach is coming in for fresh horses, so get the Ostlers ready", nothing was allowed to get in the way of the mail. In fact the Mail Guard was fined if he didn't keep to schedule. A very responsible job indeed and thanks were given by Sue Wilkins to Mr and Mrs Horler for such an informative talk.

News from the Friends of Brandy Bottom Colliery, Pucklechurch

2016 was a very busy year and considerable progress was made on the conservation of the site. The AIBT would like to thank all those who helped make it so successful, not just by working on site, but by bringing their equipment to the mine

to make certain tasks easier. Others have donated materials for specific tasks, or given their time to negotiate with Historic England, Ibstock Brick, our contractors, or to raise funds for restoration work. Not to forget the backroom tasks of recording what has happened, and the cleaning, cataloguing and storage of the artefacts.

In the last letter the partnership between the AIBT and Historic England was highlighted. However it must be pointed out that it is in fact a three-way partnership between the AIBT, Historic England and Ibstock Brick. Ibstock own the land and have leased part of it to the AIBT at a peppercorn rent, allowing us to work on the conservation of the site. They have agreed to extend the leased area to enclose features, such as the fan engine house, that we have discovered since the fence was put up, and have also provided material assistance to the project, such as the recent tree felling. The AIBT would like to thank Ibstock for their assistance to the project.

There were 55 work parties in 2016, compared to 29 in 2015. While the main emphasis in 2016 was on the Old Pit, in 2017 it should be the turn of the New Pit. The intention is to give the tops of the heapstead walls the same treatment as those of the Old Pit heapstead, to rebuild the windows and doors of the Horizontal Engine House, and to extend the fenced area to enclose the Fan Engine House. We have applied to a new funding body for

a grant to pay for the cost of employing masons, though we are still waiting for the outcome of the application. Historic England has agreed to pay for a set of interpretation boards, which are currently being designed.

The outlet to the pond was cleared of rubbish in November, and the resulting drop in water level has uncovered another culvert feeding water into the area.

The top of the Old Pit heapstead was tidied up in December and early January. The ground was levelled off and the remains of some bushes removed and the stumps of two oak trees were uprooted.

The bushes have been cleared from along the fence running between the New Pit enclosure and the cycle path. While this will allow passers-by to get a better view of the buildings, the main intention was to give us room to erect scaffolding along the side of the heapstead for the repair of the walls.

On the assumption that the conservation work will go ahead, a start was made on the archaeological investigations along the tops of the New Pit heapstead walls. This will allow us to finish the task before the arrival of contractors, and the information gained on the state of the walls also helps to fine tune the tender specifications. After scaffolding had been erected at the north-eastern end of the heapstead, the ivy was removed from the face and top of the wall. Given that old maps show there were railway lines running alongside, it is thought that this wall will contain some tippler slots similar to those found on the Old Pit.

There have been sufficient volunteers at recent work parties to split into several groups. As a result investigations have resumed in the area outside the south-east wall of the Cornish Engine House, where it is thought that the settings for an egg-ended boiler had been found in October 2016. A test pit dug at the southern corner contains some brickwork, but it







is not possible at this point in time to say whether this is the other end of the settings. The curved brickwork has not yet been found. However it may have been damaged when the boiler was removed for scrap. Work in this area continues.

Ibstock's tree surgeons cut down a number of trees and large bushes in early February. This included the large spreading willow at the northern corner of the New Pit heapstead, plus many of the bushes along the fences on the cycle path side of both enclosures. As a result passers-by on the cycle path now have a better view of both the Old and New Pit heapsteads and the Horizontal Engine House. The contractors have also cut down two trees near the Fan Engine House, as they would have interfered with the new alignment of the boundary fence. The AIBT would like to thank lbstock for this contribution to the conservation plan.


