Mathern Mill is a watermill dating back to at least the late 17th century. It was once part of the St. Pierre estate and continued to serve the community of Mathern and surrounding area until the 1960s. It was one of at least eight mills on the Mounton brook but is the only one to have always been a corn mill. It was powered by an overshot water wheel, the skeleton of which can still be seen. Then in Victorian times an engine house was added to house a steam engine to increase the power and capacity of the mill. Much of the Victorian machinery remains in situ and visitors can get a good idea of what the mill was like and how it worked.



From their own research the family have a lot of information about past occupants of the mill who were not only millers, but also farmers and publicans.

There is plenty to see in the mill, with audio and visual displays and lots of information explaining the milling process, the role of the miller and the social history of the time. There are also some activities specially for children. Entrance is FREE.

Biggest Ever Chepstow Big Lunch in the Castle

Report from Transition Chepstow

Hundreds flocked to Chepstow castle on Father's Day Sunday for Chepstow's biggest ever "Big Lunch". One of thousands of such events taking place nationally, it was the first time Chepstow as a whole came together for a Big Lunch. Gifted with glorious weather,

the occasion proved a real joy for locals to get together and offered many exciting activities and entertainment. Highlights included live music ranging from Chepstow Male Voice Choir to Offa's Tykes Ukulele Band, as well as handson activities including crafts for children and fun tennis games organised by Chepstow Tennis Club

Locals were invited to prepare their own picnics to bring along and enjoy together on the grass inside Chepstow Castle. Impressively, half an hour into the big lunch, the lower bailey was bustling with adults, children, dogs, picnic blankets, chairs and of course lots of food! Prizes awarded on the day by Transition Chepstow included Best Historical, Best Green and Best Healthy Picnic, kindly sponsored by Herbert Lewis Department Store, Stone Rock Pizza and Marks & Spencer.

Many interesting local groups participated in the event, including Severn Area Rescue Association (SARA) who brought along some of their brand new rescue equipment, St John's On-the-Hill school who provided two bouncy castles and a re-usable bottle top environmental collage, and Chepstow Fair Trade Forum who provided a "hook your own fair-trade banana" activity.

Transition Chepstow organised this event to bring out a sense of community in a celebration for the 950th birthday of Chepstow, the Castle and Priory,

as well as 10 years since Chepstow became a Transition Town. We were kindly supported by the 950 celebration group, Cadw, and local groups and volunteers who stepped up to help on the day, including Chepstow Society, Chepstow Rotary Club, and Garden City Community Group.

Other groups present: St John Ambulance Caldicot Division, The Drill Hall project, Monmouth and District NCT, CHIP Chepstow, Jez Becker, Gwent Wildlife Trust, Gwent Energy CIC, Chepstow Walkers are Welcome, Youth Coffee Shop at Bulwark Community Centre, Community Connections Befriending Scheme, Chepstow Child and Family Therapy Centre, and 1st Bulwark Scouts.

Other choirs and bands that performed on the day: Chepstow Musical Youth Theatre, Chepstow Choral Society, Chepstow Community Choir and Jig of Slurs (Folk Band).

Happy Birthday Garden City!

One of Chepstow's liveliest communities celebrates its centenary on 1st July.

Hardwick Garden City was begun in 1917, in the dark days of the First World War, to house workers at the National Shipyard Number 1 (which later became the Fairfield Mabey site). It was one of the earliest housing schemes to be built using concrete blocks, which were made using prisoner-of-war labour.

Today Garden City is a thriving community. Garden City Community Group was established in 2011 to improve the area. Entirely run by volunteers, the Group's achievements to date include tree and bulb planting, litter picks, improvements to the play area and a regular programme of activities and fun days. Future plans include development of a sensory garden for residents to enjoy.

Garden City will be celebrating its anniversary on Saturday 1st July with a Family Fun Day on the Playing Field from 11 am to 8 pm.

There is a an action-packed programme of events including music, children's activities, a dog show, stalls, food and drink and a raffle with some fantastic prizes. There will also be an all-day historical display of photos, documents and memories, and the opportunity to contribute to a community time capsule.

The Community Group Chair, Veronika Norman, said, 'Rain or shine, this will be a fantastic day celebrating 100 years of this great community. We're looking forward to welcoming not just past and present residents of Garden City but anyone who wants to come along and help us celebrate'.





SUMMER EVENTS AT TIDENHAM CHURCH -A CONTINUING STORY

Situated just over a mile along the A48 from Chepstow, accessed up the lane from the "Tidenham" turn, and with glorious views overlooking the Severn Estuary, stands one of Chepstow's most beautiful and historic churches -St Mary & St Peter, Tidenham. Dating from the 13th century, it remains an active church after various restorations and history over 800 years. Weekly services, weddings and funerals are still conducted there, but 21st century requirements are now very different. In June 2014, a Friends Association was formed, immediately commencing intensive fundraising for major refurbishment projects. These include carpark, indoor facilities, disabled access, kitchen, toilets, new heating, and other aspects to encourage additional wide community usage as well as the continued church services. To date, there have been Quiz Evenings, a Music Sponsorship Festival, Flower and Christmas Tree Festivals, Open Garden Days, Summer Barbeque, Art Competition and various concerts, all highly successful. Much preparatory hard work has been achieved by Trustees and enthusiastic parishioners – but much more voluntary fundraising is required as "evidence of serious intent" for submission to other sources.

This summer will see more activity. There is a Flower Festival planned over the first weekend of July (30th June - 4th July), followed by A **Summer Gala Concert** held at the Church on Saturday 8th July. 7.30pm. This promises to be an outstanding



evening of musical entertainment with refreshments featuring three superb professional singers -Angharad Morgan (Soprano, Welsh National Opera). David Fortey (Tenor) and Stephen Hamnett (Bass) - both from "OnlyMenAloud" - joined by local musicians Ruth Rusling (Trumpet) and Mariorie Duerden & Sophie Adams (Piano). The music will be wide-ranging – from popular well-known items from opera, light opera, musicals, wonderful songs, fun items - from Handel, Mozart, Bizet, Rossini and

Verdi to Lehar, Rogers & Hammerstein, Cole Porter, Ivor Novello - and more!

Wine and refreshments are included in the ticket price (£15), already available via the Friends Trustees, and Chepstow Bookshop. For further information, please phone 01291 623310, or e-mail bduerden@outlook.com and view www. tidenhamparishchurch.co.uk

Alexis Walker, Advice and Information Team Leader for The Royal British Legion in Wales, told us:



They arrived from airports far and wide; from Heathrow, Newquay, Gatwick and Stansted. But in every case their destination was Chepstow Garden Centre where the Chepstow & District Rotary Club welcomed their guests from the German Westerwald Club on Thursday 1st June. The 15 Rotarians and wives had travelled to Chepstow on their biannual visit to their twinned club where they were accommodated with the local club members.



In spite of the rain at Castel Coch, the visitors were amazed at the beautiful fairy tale folly with its delightfully painted interior. Oh to be a rich man, said many. After a pub lunch in Llantrissant the group visited The Royal Mint where many minted their own one Pound coin, although it was pointed out that their new 2017 coins will not be issued to the public until next year.

A celebration dinner at Abbey Mill, Tintern, was on a Welsh theme that included Cawl and Welsh pork with leeks, followed by Caerphilly and Snowdon cheese.

The Chepstow Rotary Club is supporting a water project in Romania and after the dinner the German Club made a generous donation to this project.

Following coffee and Welsh cakes at Abbey Mill the following day, the "Cathedral of the Forest" at Newland was the first stop. Dating back to the 1200s with its celebrated Miners Brass, the German guests were impressed with the amount of history contained within this large building nestled in a quiet Forest village. But then, from the bright skies above, the group descended deep into the caves of Clearwell under the guidance of owner Jonathan Wright. In the gloom they wondered at prehistoric bones, an ochre workshop, the remains of the iron mining industry and a spectacular projected light show of the creatures that had inhabited the waters long, long ago. Following a picnic the group entered the Secret Forest with its Scowles and iron age round houses.

In the evening everyone relaxed at a barbecue when the German visitors exclaimed their great admiration for the diversity of the area and the great hospitality of their Rotary hosts. While many of them had visited the cities of UK they all remarked that this was the real country where they had been able to discuss and better understand the British people and their land; their understanding; their warmth; their welcome. The bonding of people through understanding was clear to see and everyone agreed that this had been a most successful exchange visit.

Things to Do at Thornwell School by Head Teacher Mr T Appleby

As Thornwell Primary School's Head Teacher I was looking to find a way to enrich the curriculum, engage the school community and provide a bespoke curriculum for the pupils. I decided that the best people to do this were the pupils themselves, their parents and grandparents, school governors and staff - so I asked the question, 'What should every child in Thornwell experience before they leave for secondary school?'

Plant a tree? Roll down a grassy bank? Make a cake? Watch tadpoles grow into frogs? Make a paper plane? Plan a party? Visit the beach?

The response was enormous. The most pleasing aspect, when reading the lists that came back from families, was noticing that there was often 3 or 4 different styles of handwriting on the lists. Families had got together and each put down their ideas, depending on what they felt mattered to them.

Once all of the contributions were gathered in we had a very long list indeed, having omitted any duplication there were still over 700 ideas on this long list! Stakeholders were invited to attend a series of meetings to whittle down the long list into a manageable number, and as the National Trust had published a list of 50 things to do before you are twelve we decided we should do 51, called the T51.

Following some lively debate we arrived at our shortlist. What became clear, when seeing the shortlist for the first time was that stakeholders clearly value natural and wild experiences very highly. None of the experiences involved using mobile devices or computers – the list provided us with a focus to 'get back to basics'.

The T51 was then handed back to staff who matched each of the experiences to the year group that best suited each one and began to incorporate them into our programme of study wherever possible. Some of the experiences sit outside our current National Curriculum and are just for fun. However, following Professor Donaldson's Successful Futures document and subsequent reforms, these will be valued by Welsh Government as part of the new curriculum for Wales.

The list has led us to widen the opportunities we present to pupils – for example through engaging with our partners in Hilston Outdoor Education Centre - our Year 5 are about to embark on an overnight kayaking adventure on the River Wye and in so doing they will enjoy seven experiences from our list: Learn bush craft; Jump into water (shallow!); Stargaze; Go on a boat trip; Skim stones; Cook on an open fire; Camping with classmates.

Now completed, the list sits above the entrance to our school as our promise to the pupils - and it's a promise that the whole school community has contributed to creating.

Pupils Race for Life at Pembroke Primary School's New All-Weather Running Track!

Chepstow Matters was delighted to be invited along to the official opening of the new running track at Pembroke Primary School on Friday 9th June.

This amazing all-weather track has been funded by local businesses and community organisations as a result of an initiative introduced by Deputy Head Teacher, Jade Wakeley, herself a keen runner. When we spoke to Jade earlier in the year she told us about the school children completing the

Daily Mile by running around the playing field every day. Unfortunately due to inclement weather over the winter months, the initiative had had to cease, which is what gave Mrs Wakeley the idea of fundraising for an all-weather track around the perimeter of the field.

Children have to complete just over 4 laps of the track to make up their mile. Mrs Wakeley hopes that the wider community will also be able to make use of the running track, including local running group the Chepstow Harriers, who helped measure the track during construction.





July is Scam Awareness Month: PLAY YOUR PART, ACT ON SCAMS



Each year millions of people in the UK fall prey to scams. Reports of scams are up this year and people in the UK lose an estimated £10 billion a year to scams and fraud.

At Monmouthshire Citizens Advice we see many people where the impact of scams has led to loss of money in the space of a telephone conversation, the click of a mouse or the stroke of a pen. Apart from financial loss, scams cause distress and misery. They can happen to anyone.

July is Scams Awareness month and the message this year is to play your part to help tackle these crimes. Many scams are not reported. Reporting can help the authorities stop scams and prevent others becoming a victim. If you suspect you are the target of a scam:

- Get advice from the Citizens Advice
 Consumer Helpline 03454 04 05 06 who can
 provide advice and pass details on to trading
 standards
- Always report scams to Action Fraud 0300 123 2040, www.actionfraud.police.uk
- Tell others so they can avoid scams; particularly older neighbours who often fall victim again and again to scams.

Scams come in a variety of guises and affect people in different ways. Social media is a common way that young people experience a scam, with subscription traps, job scams and general online fraud. A third of all victims of scams are 41-60 year olds, mainly banking, property and pension scams. Over 70s are the highest reported victims of scams and fraud, often phone and mail scams.

Here are some email/phone scams that Citizens Advice has seen locally this year

Person A received what looked like a genuine email from Paypal saying that Paypal owed her money. She was asked to confirm her account details by clicking on a link and entering these details.

Person B received an email from 'HMRC' tax office saying that he was due a payment because of a PPI refund. The email asked for account details by clicking on a link.

Person C had a phone call about unclaimed postcode lottery funds. He gave personal and account details to receive his share of the money.

All these people had money taken from their bank accounts!

Ten tips to keep you safe:

- · too good to be true offers usually are
- never send money to claim a prize
- don't feel pressurised to make a decision put down the phone or shut the door
- be suspicious if you are contacted out of the blue
- keep personal details safe scammers use the phone or internet to get personal details and pretend to be your bank or other organisation
- make sure payments online are secure look for the padlock symbol
- scammers try to make emails look genuine check that the email address looks right and that the way you are addressed is right.
- never respond or click on any links in an email if you are not sure of the sender, they will take you to a bogus website
- · say no to unwanted callers
- · and always think before you act


