Chepstow 950 years: 1067 - 2017

Thank you to Chepstow Chamber of Commerce & Tourism for sharing their photos with us of the procession and Norman fair which took place on Saturday 15th July.

The local community was encouraged to join with Norman re-enactors as "William FitzOsbern" lead a procession of his Norman "Conquerors" from the High Street (the Norman market-place) down through the town to the Castle green. William FitzOsbern was a close support to King William and fought with him at the Battle of Hastings. He became the King's chief military strategist and castle builder and established castles and garrisons at Monmouth, Clifford and Wigmore, but his greatest work was our magnificent castle at Chepstow, on the mouth of the river Wye. Chepstow became a springboard for westward Norman expeditions and the focal point of Norman settlement in Wales. Construction of Chepstow's "Great Hall," was begun by FitzOsbern 950 years ago, in 1067, and still stands today, the oldest surviving stone castle of its type in Britain.

In celebration of 150 years, there was the Norman re-enactors camp at the green in front of the Castle, living history displays and demonstrations of Norman combat. It was a great afternoon with musical entertainment from the The Singing Club and South Monmouthshire Celtic folk band as well as Chepstow Festival's popular 'medieval' style games.





Rotary at the Dell School





In the words of one of the songs that drifted over this corner of Chepstow on July 1st: 'just a perfect day'. The sun shone and young and old, as well as a fair few four-legged friends, came out to celebrate the centenary of the building of Garden City in a day of music, fun and community.

Garden City (originally known as Hardwick Garden City) was built during the First World War to house workers at Chepstow's National Shipyard no. 1, which later became the Fairfield Mabey site. Following the principles of the Garden City movement, the suburb was built with lots of open spaces, each house fitting into the contours of the site, with generous gardens and many individual features. The development pioneered the use of concrete blocks, which were made on site using prisoner-of-war labour. Workers came from all over the United Kingdom, and many of their grandchildren and great-grandchildren still live there, although the area is also popular with families moving in.

The Centenary Fun Day was organised by the Garden City Community Group, which was set up by local residents in 2011. Since then the Group has organised activities such as Christmas, Halloween and Easter celebrations; tree and bulb planting and regular litter picks. A corner of the playing field has been developed as a natural play area and another area contains a barbecue and seating area for community use. Future plans for the improvement of the playing field area – based on ongoing consultation with residents - include a sensory garden (for which funding has already been secured) as well as dedicated play areas for younger children and teenagers. Longer term, it is hoped to install exercise equipment, a well-being track for running and cycling and a community hub including public toilets, making the area an accessible and inclusive resource for all the people of Garden City.

On July 1st, a trail of balloons ran from the town centre to the playing field. Music for all tastes was provided by the Chepstow Singing Club, Chepstow Musical Youth Theatre, Oceans, NightJar, Giles Norman & Dave Harranty and John Mcconnachie. Other events included a dog show, a martial arts demonstration, defibrillator demonstrations, puppet entertainment and a bouncy



A particular draw, especially for older residents, was the history display, which brought together photographs, newspaper cuttings and memories from the last hundred years – many enjoyed spotting

themselves and their friends in photos from the old Portwall School, a long-ago football team or a costumed silver jubilee parade.

Last but not least, the day raised over £1,400 towards the Garden City Community Group's future projects. The Group would like to thank everybody who contributed their time and energy, including Chepstow & Caldicot Lions, the British Legion, the Round Table, the Welsh Ambulance Service, the Chepstow Fire Service. Transition Chepstow and many, many more.

KS3 Maths & Science trip the Big Bang Fair, Bristol

At Wyedean School and Sixth Form Centre we try our very best to give students of all ability a wide range of Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematical opportunities. There have been many occasions this year where we have taken learning outside the classroom or arranged inspirational speakers to come to us to help broaden the horizons of our students.

For example, back in October Year 10 girls enjoyed presentations from WISE (Women in Science and Engineering) to help them recognise their own skills and what sort of Science careers are open to all.

In March, Wyedean students were wowed watching the Prof. Robert Winston and Prof. Alice Roberts perform live at the Bristol Colston Hall at GCSE Science Live! Three other top academics lectured to a packed audience and students received exam coaching from a Chief Examiner to boost grades.

In the spring Year 9 students competed in The Times Fame Lab Academy public speaking competition (where Josh Thomas came a brilliant second in the regional final). In addition, in June Mr Gibson and intrepid technologists went to Reid Lifting, Chepstow to see a prototype of Bloodhound SSC (the British car that aims to break the world land speed later this year). Also in June, more students enjoyed the glorious weather at The Cheltenham Science Festival and soaked up more inspirational science ideas and STEM career information.

Most recently on 7th July, students enjoyed an inspirational afternoon at the Big Bang Fair, Bristol. Twenty-eight budding student Scientists, Mathematicians, Engineers and Technologists explored two floors of interactive exhibits and chatted to employers and graduates from a range of local Universities. Students really benefitted from discussing university courses, qualifications, aspirations and local career opportunities on our doorstep that many had no idea existed.

In the Research Zone scientists from local Universities gave hands on demonstrations, letting students do real experiments to show them what research is really like, and what it takes to be a researcher. In the Enterprise Zone a wide range of local companies delivered great demonstrations about the STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) that goes on in their companies. Lots of Universities and Colleges also gave advice and information about degrees and apprenticeship opportunities.

Students aged between 11 and 14 enjoyed the amazing demonstrations of liquid nitrogen and dry ice to explore changes of state. Many tried using virtual reality goggles to practice assembling the components of a nuclear reactor. Hydrogen and oxygen was exploded (safely!). The

Towers of Hanoi were resolved. Servers were disassembled and reconstructed. Remotely operated robots were used to simulate decommissioning of a nuclear power station. Students transferred chemical energy from themselves into electricity via a pedal bike dynamo. Towers were designed and constructed (winning a remote control drone for two lucky Wyedean students). Robotics, microscopy, genetic engineering and many more STEM areas were explored.

The Wyedean Year 11 Prom was held at the end of June (after all exams had finished!) at Coldra Court, Newport. The evening was fabulous in every way and the students and staff all joined together in an evening of celebration. The girls looked beautiful and displayed excellent taste and style in their choices of dress. The boys had equally gone to a lot of trouble to look smart. Everyone did themselves proud.

There was an Awards Ceremony and all winners wore their sashes for the rest of the evening with pride. The winners were voted for by the students and included Carlie and Bryce as Prom Queen and King; Beth for Best Smile; and Arion for Best Banter.

The school was complimented by the Coldra Court staff for such polite and pleasant students and there was, indeed, a lovely positive atmosphere all evening. The Prom Committee did a marvellous job of designing and sourcing the table decorations and their decision to have a photo booth proved a very popular one. Well done to all of you!

Goodbye and good luck to this excellent year group – it is the end of an era but everyone surely has a great future ahead of them.
