

Heritage Open Days celebrates England's fantastic architecture and culture by offering free access to properties across the country that are usually closed to the public or normally charge for admission.

Winterbourne Barn is an outstanding and unique building of national importance. All other surviving medieval great tithe barns were built by the monastic estates, universities, or the Knights

> Hospitallers, but Winterbourne Barn was built by Thomas de Bradeston in 1342, just a few vears before the Black Death first hit in England.

Only three barns of this scale are recorded as built by gentry' families, and Winterbourne is the only survivor. The Barn was built using the green-timber construction methods which were the cutting-edge technology of that period. It is a fine example of a raised-cruck construction and one of the largest and earliest raisedcruck barns.

In addition to touring the Barn and its grounds you will be able

to view the South Gloucestershire First World War Project Exhibitions. The exhibitions concentrate on what happened in the different areas of South Gloucestershire during WW1.

The first exhibition commemorates the First World War by focusing on how the different areas of South Gloucestershire were affected. Whilst the men went off to fight, the factories at home turned their production to vital war work, country houses became convalescent homes and women came into the world of work as never before. The exhibition also connects us to some of the experiences of our twinned towns in France.

This second exhibition focuses on the social impact of the war in South Gloucestershire, displaying photographs and information about the war's effects on local women, scouts and even animals, along with information about some of the entertainment and sport that was enjoyed at the time.

Visitors will learn about the contribution made by the

women left at home in South Gloucestershire, the local animals that were requisitioned and sent in to battle and there are pictures of local people entertaining themselves with theatre productions and concerts.

Celebrating the life of community spirited - Nancy Dunn

This month we are pleased to share with you some of the late Nancy Dunn's achievements and to celebrate the important role she played in our community. Thanks to her son Christopher Dunn for providing this information.

Nancy Dunn nee Simmons, was born Born 08 08 1920, near the docks in Gloucester. She grew up with two older brothers (one a Dunkirk veteran) and one younger sister Mary, who is still alive. Her father owned a garage and used to mend the bishop's car. in which she 'courted' Alfred. Quiet: studious: 'bookish', Nancy was the only one or the four who went to Grammar school and would have gone on to university but was born too soon.

Her first (and last) boyfriend was teacher Alfred Dunn. The couple married in 1942, in Gloucester. Nancy moved as headmaster's wife to Chalford, and then to Winterbourne in September 1945, with son Philip (two), and Christopher (three months). Daughter Katharine was born in 1949.

From 1945 to 1978 her husband Alfred Dunn was headmaster of St Michaels Primary School, Winterbourne, where JK Rowling was a pupil until the age of nine. JK Rowling "remembers him fondly. his shiny bald head and his love of Bristol Rovers."

The Dunn's lived in the school house on the High street until Alfred Dunn's retirement in 1978, and then to a bungalow in Coalpit Heath till 2013.

Nancy was heavily involved in community matters in Winterbourne, being a founder member of the Winterbourne Society, to save



village. Nancy could spot and activate gaps in the community life, setting up groups for the young and old alike. And she played a crucial role in starting the long process to save the Medieval Barn for the community.

"The Winterbourne Medieval Barn Trust is very grateful to Nancy for being one of the people with the determination to rescue this unique historic building. The Medieval Barn is currently planning a major refurbishment project to ensure that it will be available to the community for generations to

Before Nancy died, it was a real pride for her to experience the great success of the Barn as an extra useful cultural facility in the

Nancy was a very keen, prize winning flower arranger and gardener at the school house and member of the Horticulture/flower arranging society.

She was well known in

Winterbourne for her independent artistic spirit and was not perhaps the typical Headmaster's wife! She promoted the Winterbourne Players amateur dramatics group and enjoyed country and ball room dancing.

Her political views were Liberal, like her father, who was a first World War veteran.

Son Christopher told us, she never swore or cried, she was quiet, thoughtful, "keeping her cards close to her chest, so close they were

still in the packet!". She was a great, great grandmother, who the children loved to play with.

Nancy Dunn died 07 07 15 in Kingswood, Gloucester and is now buried with Alfred Dunn at St Michael's Church yard. We can all learn a lot from this wonderful lady's approach to community life and getting things done.






News from Winterbourne Down W.I

The young girl then became little more that a servant to the others. Patricia said that one of her happiest days was when Margaret Thatcher introduced. Law banning this practice resulting in the UK immigration figures falling abruptly. Unfortunately the next Prime Minister promptly repealed it.

Despite the difficult and sometimes dangerous situations in which Patricia and her husband found themselves it seems that the Embassy Staff managed to have a good social scene in their compound. Amateur Dramatics played a big part in their lives and very professional productions were enjoyed. Their costumes outdoors be made very cheaply and so could be very elaborate. In 1977 in Islamabad they produced "Oh What a Lovely War" which was thoroughly enjoyed by all, including the German Ambassador who shed tears of laughter on Patricia's shoulder!

Patricia regaled us with many more stories of her life in the Diplomatic Service and finished by saying that if anyone had a child or grandchild with a flair for languages she would thoroughly recommend it as a career.

FFP now on board with the Great Western Air Ambulance

Since August 2015 Great Western Air Ambulance Charity (GWAAC) have delivered nearly 100 blood transfusions and they are now hoping to save even more lives with the addition of plasma (formally known as fresh frozen plasma [FFP]) which contains the vital clotting factors to slow or stop ongoing bleeding. The GWAAC Critical Care Team will continue to carry 2 units of O negative blood but in addition they will now carry 2 units of plasma onboard both the helicopter and the critical care cars. Any transfusion henceforth will be more balanced in replacing what the patient has lost. We hope that this addition to the service will help to save more

In collaboration with The Freewheelers EVS and North Bristol Trust Transfusion Laboratory at Southmead Hospital, plasma will be delivered to the base at Filton airfield alongside the existing units of blood.

This has been made possible thanks to a generous donation from the Henry Surtees Foundation; the foundation founded by the late motorsports legend John Surtees CBE in memory of his son Henry. Leonora Surtees-Martell, daughter of the late John Surtees said, "The Henry Surtees Foundation is

delighted to support the Great Western Air Ambulance Charity with a grant of £15.000 to



enable them to introduce plasma to the pre-hospital blood transfusion service. The service that they provide is vital and something which is continuously developing. The swift medical intervention provided by the Air Ambulance crews gives patients a far greater chance of survival and subsequent improved quality of life."

GWAAC Chief Executive John Christensen said "This is yet another example of GWAAC taking forward innovative developments of pre-hospital treatment Having plasma on board will enable us to deliver the best care possible to every patient. I am really pleased that we are able to offer this and we are incredibly grateful to the Henry Surtees Foundation for their generosity."

Dear Friends

On Sunday 9th July, the congregation at St Peter's Frampton Cotterell celebrated 'Sea Sunday', the day when the Mission to Seafarers, the Flying Angel, asks churches to remember the 1.5 million seafarers around the world, who transport almost everything the rest of humanity uses or eats as we live our daily

Crews on modern ships are often very small, even on some of the larger container ships. Ships such as the Madrid Maersk and the OOCL Hong Kong. The largest of these ships carries 21,413 containers, which if parked end to end down the M5 would stretch roughly from Bristol to Exeter, just over 81 miles, not including the lengths of the truck cabs!. With such few crew, this can make these mammoth ships quite lonely places to



Further to this, even in our modern health and safety regulated, times life at sea can still be very dangerous. In the first six months of 2017 world-wide figures to end June show that: 41 vessels have sunk, 27 ran aground and numerous others have been involved with collisions and fires. From a human perspective, these incidents have resulted in 102 known fatalities, 33 missing persons and 989 evacuations or rescues.

While 'The Mission to Seafarers' is an international Christian organization, it works around the world to help all who go to sea regardless of race, religion or indeed rank, in whatever way they can.

So, why might you wonder is The Mission so important that I wanted us both to celebrate and to support the work they do. It is because I have personally experienced the Mission's work in many places around the world. My first real job after leaving college was in the merchant navy. A job where I had a whale of a time, worked on friendly ships with relatively large crews and never had the upset of a sinking or a collision. But from South Shields to Singapore, Bombay to Houston Texas, the Mission to Seafarers was always an open, helpful and above all friendly place, whether someone was in serious need or just wanted a chat and maybe a cold drink, and it was very instrumental in my own journey towards ordination.

For me 'The Mission to Seafarers' truly represents Christ's message to humanity – that simple humane. but God inspired message, that we should love our neighbours as ourselves, and as a relatively newcomer to the Fromeside Benefice. I feel that my wife and I have been welcomed into the community and particularly into the churches, in a way that very much reminds me of all that is excellent in the 'Mission to Seafarers. What's more, I know that the welcome I have received isn't anything to do with being a priest – it's the way we seek to welcome everyone and anyone into our local churches and our worshiping community. So, perhaps you might like to try us sometime? Oh, and by the way, the international code flags in the accompanying photograph of our Sea Sunday service spell out the eternal message; "God is with us", but more importantly – he is with you too!




