

# Tell ME Wine

# ... by two French Guys

Having been known to enjoy the odd glass of wine from time to time, Chepstow Matters was delighted to pay a visit to Chepstow's exciting new addition to the town, Tell Me Wine in Rifleman's Way. Tell Me Wine is the new venture by ... you guessed it ...two French Guys, Frederic and Fabien.

The idea for the shop comes from their love of wine, both having lived for many years in the Montpellier region in the South of France and having extensive experience in the local wine producing region. They separately moved to live in England a few years ago and Fabien and his wife Christine settled locally in Beachley. Christine also helps out in the business, as well as coaching Artistic Gymnastics. Frederic fronts the shop during the week and commutes to Chepstow from Newport.

Tell Me Wine offers a large range of fine wines, spirits, beers, olive oils and local produce, and even a selection of non alcoholic drinks, such as perrier and orangina. They are also willing to try and source specific products for you if you have any requests. Something unfamiliar to us which the guys are offering, is the idea of the refillable wine system. It is very simple: you get a bottle from the shop and fill it with white, red or rose and then when it is empty you bring the bottle back and refill it, again and again! Refills make the choice French and Italien wines very affordable at just £6.50 per bottle. There is also a refill service available on cider and authentic extra virgin olive






Specific wine tasting events are also planned to offer locals the possibility of discovering new grape varieties and flavours from across the world. Their first event is planned for Sunday 5th November when they are introducing one of the wines from the Montpellier region: Languedoc Wines. There are just 12 places available at £20 per person for this session. If you don't get in on this one, keep an eye on the Tell Me Wine facebook page for future dates.

As well as specialised wine tasting events, every week Tell Me Wine is offering a new wine to taste so feel free to pop in at anytime to enjoy a new flavour. Frederic and Fabien are very approachable and there to help - so if you have any questions or are looking for a wine for a special event or just to compliment your evening, feel free to pop in and speak to them - they would be delighted to assist you, share their knowledge and offer advice.

Meet the New Vicar of Chepstow -**Rev Philip Averay** 

Chepstow Matters was delighted to meet up with the new Vicar of Chepstow, Rev Philip Averay for this issue of Chepstow Matters. Rev Averay (Philip) took up residence in the Vicarage at the start of September and was ordained as Minister at St Mary's Priory on Monday 25th September.

The 'Vicar of Chepstow' title is a throwback to years gone by and signifies leadership of the Anglican Church in the area. It means that the holder has the duty of care for lives in Chepstow - to pray for all and be there if anyone requires spiritual input, whether they are of Anglican faith or not.

Philip is Australian, making the UK his home since 2003. His first career was in Social Work and it was as a Social Worker that he moved to the UK and started working for Gloucestershire County Council in acute Mental Health and Child Protection, he particularly enjoyed working with Adults with Learning Disabilities. Philip told me that he has always had a strong Christian faith and that he genuinely believes that the only thing that transforms people is a relationship with Christ. Gradually he found his career in Social Work limiting as, whilst he could live out his faith as a Social Worker, he could not profess it.

Philip comes to Chepstow following his 3 year curacy in the Forest of Dean, having previously spent 6 weeks in Chepstow under Father Chris Blanchard as part of his training. It is daunting taking over from Father Chris, who had held his position here for 18 years before moving into semi-retirement earlier this year. He is excited to be part of such a historic, long established Church in Chepstow and looks forward to helping to build upon the Church community, to lower the average age of the current congregation by developing what the Church can offer, to genuinely care for each other and for that love to flow out into the local Chepstow community. Philip told me "My job is to love the Christian community that God has given me here in Chepstow and to make links with the people on the fringe of that community who have no thoughts of 'Church." He loves school ministry and is pleased to have established links with the Dell. Thornwell, and Pembroke Primary Schools. He also plans to take a place on the School Governing Body at Chepstow School. Already a regular of the Queens Head, Philip recognises the civic importance of the town, the Church being one

of the oldest buildings. second only to the Castle itself. It has historic importance and he realises he is custodian of not only the spiritual heritage but the historic building itself, and of the major refurbishment works planned for the inside of the church and its tower so that it will still be

standing in another 950 years!!

Philip is looking forward to 'creating a buzz' about the place, he strongly believes in prayer and the power of people praying together and there are already several weekly sessions in place where people are welcome to join in, with meditative prayer where you can be still in the presence of God to more sociable praying together at Coffee #1 in town. He is enthusiastic for the vision of the Cavill Hall (see page 27) to be a Community Hub and supportive of its potential future use with the homeless, subject to consultation with the PCC and local groups. Philip is looking at bringing in some more contemporary style music at some of the services, and is excited that Brian Ellam has been appointed Musical Director. One of the first things Brian is introducing is 'St Mary's Singers', starting the first Tuesday in November, a new choir for St Mary's (there has not been a choir in the Church for a long time). Open to people of all ages and abilities, the repertoire will be mainly Sacred music and also include contemporary Christian music. For more information on this email brian.ellam@ btinternet.com.

# Help shape the Future of Monmouthshire

Monmouthshire is facing some pretty big challenges, demographic shifts, climate change and adapting to the potential of new technology. Our current way of delivering public services will need to change if we are to address these issues head-on and maximise well-being for current and future generations.

The Well-being of Future Generations Act is about improving social, economic, environmental and cultural well-being. It requires public organisations like councils, The NHS, Police and Fire and Rescue Service to think more about the long-term, work better with people and communities and each other, look to prevent problems and take a more joined-up approach.

These organisations have come together with others like social landlords and the voluntary sector to form public service boards or PSBs. During 2017 Monmouthshire PSB published a Well-being Assessment highlighting the biggest challenges facing the county and also some of the opportunities. You can see a copy of it at www.monmouthshire.gov.uk/our-monmouthshire. The Board subsequently agreed their purpose – building sustainable and resilient communities – and four draft well-being objectives:

- Providing Children and Young People with the best possible start in life
- Addressing the challenges associated with demographic change
- Protect and enhance the resilience of our natural environment whilst mitigating and adapting to the impact of climate change
- Develop opportunities for communities and businesses to be part of an economically thriving and well-connected county

The objectives will be included in a draft well-being plan that will form the basis of a twelve week public consultation from mid-November. In the meantime the PSB is exploring some of the ideas that could help to deliver the objectives and address these big challenges. Publics services don't have all the answers, we need to harness the knowledge and creativity of people and communities. This is likely to be a mix of

The wonderful woven textile from North East India created in the 17th century which was used for the lining of the magnificent gentleman's gown spectacularly displayed at Chepstow Museum, shows images that tell stories from the life of Krishna and other incarnations of Vishnu. The complicated weaving technique has long died out in Assam, but what does still survive there, is the telling of those same tales through dance dramas. The dances practised by the monks have been recognised as a distinct artform known as Sattriva dance. Georgie Pope has studied literally at the feet of the monks at Majuli Island in Assam for her PhD research at King's College, London and she will be giving two introductory workshops on Saturday 18 November, one for beginners, the other for those with some experience of dance (of any kind!). The workshops, open to all ages, give a very special opportunity to learn some positions which form the basic grammar of this unique dance form and put together a short dance.





Georgie Pope says "Sattriya dance is an energetic and joyous dance in praise of Lord Krishna, the mischievous flute-playing Hindu God. The soft, flowing gestures of this little-known artform reflect the grace and poise of the monks from northeast India who have cultivated it since the 15th century. In this introductory workshop, we will learn some Mati Akhara positions, which form part of the basic grammar of Sattriya dance. Then we will piece together a short group dance, with light footsteps and delicate hand gestures. The dance shares some vocabulary with other Indian dance forms, but retains a strong, uniquely Assamese character, which you will only taste once you've tried it!"

## **Cavill Hall Given New Lease of Life by Volunteers**

Chepstow Matters was delighted to pay another visit to the Cavill Hall this month to follow up with local resident Steve O'Sullivan who, as reported in Chepstow Matters back in April 2016, has voluntarily made it his mission to reinstate the Hall which is situated behind the St Mary's Priory in the centre of the town. The Hall is named after George I H Cavill who was the Church Warden at St Mary's from 1960-1977.

Sadly, the once well-used hall had fallen into a terrible state of disrepair, which was the reason for its discontinued use over six years ago. The brambles had done a good job of disguising the building and inside the spiders had done a redecoration job too, creating a black mesh of web that completely covered the kitchen ceiling!

With a background in building but now having retired due to a variety of health problems which prevent him from working, Steve was offered the 'opportunity' to voluntarily try and bring the hall back into a state of use. The Hall is unrecognisable today to how it looked back at the start of 2016! A stunning new kitchen has been installed, courtesy of support and funding from the local Chepstow & Caldicot Lions, and the male and female toilets have been renewed with the addition of a separate disabled toilet also - which Steve was proud to remind me used to be the Scouts storage cupboard in previous years! New windows and blinds have been provided throughout and heaters also installed. The wooden sprung floor still needs an industrial sanding down and varnishing but Steve is confident it will come up good as new.

The Hall is already being used by a select number of community groups. It's central location in Chepstow makes it attractive to all areas as it is easily accessible from the Sedbury side of Chepstow as well as Bulwark and Thornwell too. It also benefits from limited free parking behind the church.

Back at the start of the project in 2016, Steve was passionate about his vision to use the hall as a temporary night shelter, giving food and warmth during the winter months for a small number of homeless men and women. There is nowhere in Monmouthshire offering this at present and he



would love to see it set up in Chepstow. This was proposed to the local PCC last year but progress is currently slower than Steve would like. Liaison is taking place with others working with homeless projects in the area and the new Vicar of Chepstow Philip Averay is also keen to advance this in time.

Steve would also like so see the hall become a community hub offering counselling/comfort or just somewhere to bring your young children to a playgroup for an hour or two which doesn't have a huge price tag. Interest from local groups in using the hall is welcomed or private hire for parties, along with any entrepreneurial ideas for use of the space - ie if anyone is looking to set up a new business locally which needs a space like the hall to start up in, the Church would be pleased to hear from you.

# "Like to Get to Know You Well ..." 80s Music Fans: "You Can Dance if You want to"

## Who else was a fan of Howard Jones

in the 80s!! It was in 1983 that multi-instrumentalist Howard Jones first burst onto the contemporary music scene with his very British songwriting, pioneering synthesizers and thought provoking lyrics. He set out his manifesto in his very first single 'New Song' where the lyrics called on the listener to challenge their preconceived ideas, to see both sides and "throw off your mental chains".

Along with 'New Song', his first two albums, the twice Platinum, Number 1 selling Human's Lib (1984) and Dream into Action, the Gold selling record that peaked at Number 2 in 1985, brought Howard a host of Top 10 hits including 'Things Can Only Get Better', 'What Is Love?', 'Pearl in the Shell', 'Like to Get to Know You Well', 'Hide and Seek', 'Look Mama' and 'No One Is To Blame', which reached Number 1 in the USA. He also performed at Live Aid (Wembley Stadium) in 1985.

Howard Jones returns for a UK tour in November, his first since 2014, with his new and extended Electric Band; following a 24 date Headline tour of the USA. The closest venue will be in Cardiff Tramshed on 29th (see below).

The tour will also coincide with a brand new 'Best Of' Howard Jones release Entitled 'BEST (1983-2017)'. Audiences can expect to hear many of Howard's chart topping singles as well as new songs that featured in the recent Eddie the Eagle film (2016) and his 2015 multi-media 'ENGAGE' project.


