On Sunday 17th September, more than 30 riders from Chepstow Cycling Club launched the modern version of the club annual ride first held in 1888.

The route went from Chepstow along the Wye Valley as far the original "9 mile marker post" between Monmouth and Hereford before returning via St.Briavels to a well earned lunch at Toast in Tutshill.



Club Chair Mike Gorshkov commented "Although the roads would have been much quieter in 1888 goodness knows how they managed nearly fifty miles on rough roads and steep hills with heavy bikes

such as Penny Farthings, Boneshakers and early versions of the Safety Bike, which was a forerunner of our modern bikes"

Riders were kept fuelled with a variety of cakes baked by friends and family of the club and even had donations of apples and pears at the feed points from passing locals on a day when the weather was ideal for a long ride.

Club member Geraint Evans, who was first to complete the course commented, "Absolutely great event, superb organisation, lovely food, Chapeau to everyone who took part in it"

Mike Gorshkov added "The aim of the ride is three-fold, firstly to acknowledge our past heritage by following the route used in 1888 as closely as possible, secondly to become a community event to show-case the fun. benefits and freedom cycling can provide and thirdly in future years, to raise funds for local charities."

The BBC's "Saving Lives at Sea" and how Chepstow helps the RNLI

The second series of the acclaimed BBC programme "Saving Lives at Sea", about the RNLI and its volunteers, the ordinary men and women who heroically save lives at sea, has been running now since August. There are 12 hour-long episodes and it will run weekly until 1 November. Rescues have been filmed for the series with the aid of helmet cameras issued to volunteers at 28 RNLI lifeboat stations and three lifeguarded beaches. The first series, last year, was immensely popular and attracted millions of viewers.

In 2016 the RNLI saved 558 lives, launched its lifeboats nearly 9,000 times, and rescued 23 people everyday. The local fundraising branch, RNLI Chepstow Branch, raised nearly £10,000 towards the £177 million it cost to runs the service in 2016.





"The people and businesses of Chepstow are always very generous towards the RNLI and we are extremely grateful," said Branch chair John Gale. "But we also need some new blood! We would love to hear from anyone who is willing to join our committee and help with events and collections and running the branch. 
As usual there will be a special firework display for very young children who may get scared by the loud bangs of the main display. The main event with will follow shortly after the kids display finishes.

A Man Well-Loved Karl Daymond Tribute

The sudden and tragic passing of Karl Daymond aged just 52 has been covered in many other media outlets. I wanted instead to focus on the way Karl lived. Following on from the incredible tribute day held on 10th September, where hundreds turned out in bright and colourful attire to honour him and celebrate his life, I spoke with some of his friends, Ruth, Kieran, Frances and Suzanne who were instrumental in putting this amazing day together.

Over 800 people took part in the day, with a procession through the town to a marquee in a field next to Karl's house. The day was full of songs, memories and "Karlisms" (a couple of which are highlighted here).

Ruth Holdsworth was the overall coordinator of the day and knew Karl well. She is now looking after Karl's horse Charlie, and learning to ride so that he will always be as loved and cherished as Karl would have wanted. Ruth told me "There are not many people you would contemplate putting on such a day for. In fact I can't think of anyone else. Karl was special. So humble, so warm, open and giving. He did so much for so many people, bringing out the best in everyone he met and making each of them feel they were special to him. He did so much for Chepstow. Organising this colourful, vibrant day was an immediate reaction by so many and reflected what kind of man Karl was. We had over 100 volunteers who wanted to

help make the day possible. A community really coming together to honour a man who meant so much to us."

"That was great. Just need to sort out the timing. And the notes"

Karl's early career, from Allan Watkins: Karl's first 'public' appearance was in 1989 in the Peter Hall production of The Merchant of Venice, which

starred Dustin Hoffman as Shylock. He was just finishing his vocal studies, and made a huge impression as a singer in the Belmont scenes, with a beautiful


voice and that star quality charisma which distinguished all his performances. It was clear that here was a god-given stage animal.

Soon after that Adam Pollock cast him in the title role of the Italian premiere on Leonard Bernstein's Candide. He proved the Candide of one's dreams and consequently Pollack cast Karl in the title role of Don Giovanni, as the young sexy protagonist.

By now Karl's career in the UK had taken off with leading roles for Opera North, including wonderful Papageno in The Magic Flute (in which he sang standing on his head), Marcello in La Boheme, Valentin in Faust, Mountjoy in Gloriana, and the title role in Thomas's Hamlet. He also sang for the Welsh and English National Opera Companies, the Royal Opera Covent Garden. He appeared in several other operas at Batignano, arriving on horseback in Rupert Goold's production of II Pomo d'Oro.

When Karl moved to Chepstow circa 17 years ago, he left behind his previous career, for a quieter life where he could be closer to community and to nature. He had a real

appreciation for his quiet time in the woods, and in later years riding his horse. His love of music and community lead him to set up first one and then multiple local singing clubs (Duke's Yard, Usk, Lydney and the biggest Chepstow Castle) where he encouraged everyone who had a voice to be the best they could be "If you can speak you can sing!".



It became important to him to develop a community around song - "Everybody has a voice" he used to say. Karl was everything, a brilliant actor, singer, entertainer, wickedly funny. He took no prisoners and had a driving desire that everyone should do their best - but beware the Karl glare!

He would teach all four singing groups the same songs, in theory so that we could all come together to sing - but not always taught the same way! "Sing what you know - if you make a mistake do it confidently!" He inspired us all to punch above our weight, taking us to the National Eisteddfod when none of us spoke Welsh and taking the theme of entertainment quite literally - 180 of us rocked up on to the stage complete with Samba band. We created "Choral Chaos" and although "We didn't Win!" we had a huge response from the audience! Karl was a great friend.

Suzanne Moore Osley: My first memories of Karl were in 2001 I think... of a red cheeked face peering one winter night through a window of The Three Tuns pub. He had an accordion strapped to his chest, and I was playing in an Irish music session and I waved him in to join us. Karl had just moved to Chepstow. We chatted and he asked if he could join in, he was ever so nervous that he was playing it right. I laughed and said, it's folk music, just do your own thing. Looking back, it's hard to ever imagine now, knowing him as well as I do, Karl being unsure about anything musical. He always said I was the first person he spoke to in

The day itself was beautiful, There were so many magical moments, so much beautiful music and words. It was a big top full of love and the day truly honoured our beautiful Karl Daymond, husband, brother, son, uncle, godfather and friend, he meant so much to so many, he was one of a kind.



Chepstow and for me I blessed fate that night as it brought our paths together."

One thing I learned from Karl was to be generous in kindness and love to people, be as kind as you can. If that day can carry that forward and show that community spirit can make a change, then I'm sure Karl would be absolutely beaming, wherever he is.

Frances Phillips: Karl was so generous with his talent. His uncontainable inventive genius resulted in many memorable, often brilliantly bonkers, public musical ventures. But actually the moments to be truly treasured were our weekly practices, where we had Karl just being his beautiful self, with his unabashed passion for music and his mission to impart this 'birthright' to everybody. Every session was a ball. He was hilarious - whether playing some complete musical non-sequitur in response to a random remark, or lapsing into his Les Dawson impression when our harmonies weren't quite what they should be, or coming up with daft sign language to remind us of lines. And of course the famous glares....

Karl was the most inspiring gifted teacher you could ever have but more importantly the most beautiful, kind-hearted, generous-spirited person. He came from a rarified musical world, and yet genuinely saw the beauty in ordinary far less musical people discovering the joy of singing. He led the busiest life and yet always had the time to give equal attention to everyone and make each individual feel valued. He was a true, caring friend; and hilariously funny.

Thank you to everyone who has contributed on behalf of Karl, to the 100+volunteers and the half a dozen people involved in this article. Our deep condolences go to Karl's husband lan and his family and friends. Karl had such an affect on so many here in Chepstow. Quite simply, I wish I'd known him. meet choir members informally afterwards, with some light refreshments, to learn more about us.


