
> will emerge next Spring. They are excellent pollinators and rarely sting, so we welcome them to our wild flower area



New book from local author lan Haddrell

Many of you may remember a feature on the talented Mr Haddrell (pictured right) a couple of years ago in Winterbourne & Frampton Matters. Ian has written several books, including two history books on Coalpit Heath and Frampton Cotterell, where he lives. This month sees the launch of his latest book, 'The History of Dings Crusaders Rugby Club'.

We asked Ian why he had selected this subject matter for his new book, he explained, "When I wrote my second book of old photographs of Lockleaze (where I went to school). I included a chapter on sport in the area – football, basketball, netball and rugby. As well as including photographs of Dings Crusaders Rugby Club, which has been based at Lockleaze since 1948. I wrote a brief history on its origins from 1897 when it was formed as part of the Shaftesbury Crusade in the Dings area of St Philip's, Bristol. Like most rugby clubs, their Landseer Avenue clubhouse is adorned with many team photographs dating back to the club's inauguration to the present day, some of which I used in the book entitled "Lockleaze".

"The chairman of Dings, Steve Lloyd, very kindly loaned me some of these precious photographs and during one of our conversations I suggested that with the wealth of historical photographs available it would be good to produce a book of old photographs of Dings Crusaders RFC. Steve was more than happy for me to write the book and that's how the project started a few years ago."

During the course of researching the history of the club, lan discovered that Dings had a particularly interesting origin, as it was formed as part of The Dings' Club, a section of The Shaftesbury Crusade, a Christian and social mission based in St Philip's - hence the name of the club. Ian said, "What had originally been the intention to simply produce a book of some 200 photographs with captions developed into a more textual publication plotting the origins of the club through to 2017, with approximately 100 pictures. The initial book layout was to have included just black and white photographs but as the format change it was decided to publish in full


The publication date of October 2017 was set to coincide with Dings move from its Lockleaze home of 70 years to a brand ground and facility at Frenchay – 'Shaftesbury Park', so named to recognise the club's origins.

lan has a clear passion for history, if this is an interest you share, he recommends you come along to monthly meetings of the Frampton Cotterell and District Local History Society, of which he is pleased to be a


committee member. The group meet at Zion Church Hall, Frampton Cotterell, for the full programme of forthcoming talks, please see page 36.


relax.



We were pleased to attend the launch of the fantastic new Skate Park in Winterbourne. on Saturday 23 October. The facility was officially opened by The Mayor of the West of England -Tim Bowles (former district councillor for Winterbourne).

We spoke to one local lad in attendance. Josh Pearce (13), a pupil from Winterbourne International Academy.

He shared with us, "My dad told me that he had read on the parish notice board, that there were plans to build a skate ramp in the Rec at Winterbourne. So I decided to email the local parish council to ask what the plans were and to put my ideas across."

Josh told us the skate ramp that was previously on the site was very old, constructed all in metal and had become unusable. A keen skate park user with his

scooter. Josh was excited to attend the official opening and see for himself what had been built. He wasted no time, taking to the new ramps.

The Winterbourne parish council commissioned Bristol based park designers Wheelscape to deliver the project. Mayor Tim said, "It was important to keep it as local as possible and when the council had the old skate ramp on the site tested for metal fatigue, it was found to be dangerous and so was removed straight away. The parish wanted to design something for the vouth of the village to enjoy and so set about have this one created."

It has already proved very popular, as 13 year old Henry Kayes said, "I meet friends here most days after school and its a great way to keep fit."

A Winterbourne resident of 55 years, who was also in attendance at the opening told us, "I used to play on the Rec as a child. In my day it was swings, a very tall slide, a merry go round and climbing bars. There was always loads of kids playing here, so it is great it is still so well used today."

This skate park is very up-to-date and a big hit with the local youth. As well as the skate ramps, there is also a volley ball park, tennis courts, full size football and a cricket pitch for everyone to enjoy.

Local school girl cycles Coast to Coast to feed Ethiopian street children

10 year old local school girl, Sky Silcock, has raised over £1,300 tackling the 74 mile route from Barnstaple to Paignton to raise funds to provide breakfast for destitute street children in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

Sky decided she wanted to raise funds to help feed street children after learning about the charity at her school. Sky said "I decided to raise money for the children in Ethiopia as I know how important a breakfast is to help vou concentrate and start the day right. The street children are really poor and sometimes the breakfast is all they get to eat all day."

Supported by her family Sky spent months preparing for her big ride by training at weekends and eating healthily. The ride took her 2 days and she was met in Paignton by family who cheered and cycled with her for the last few miles.

Sky's dad, Adam, said "Sky decided that she wanted to raise money for Ethiopiaid after hearing about them at school. Our first impression was that it may have been a bit of a flash in the pan idea but, Sky was determined. After several months the determination was still there and we developed the idea of a mini coast to coast bike ride. Sky is very confident on her bike and had completed her bikeability level 2 a year early and was the driving force behind the training for the ride. When we started the sponsorship forms. Sky had set herself a target of raising £100. Due to the generosity and support of all of those who know her, she's raised over £1,300 which also includes £100 collected along the ride, from complete strangers!

On the ride, Sky was faced with several different terrains and around Dartmoor, had some very challenging hills to climb. Although tough and energy zapping, she carried on to ensure she completed her challenge.







We are all very proud of Sky for her determination to help others and to complete what she set out to do. We would like to thank all of those who supported Sky whether that was through route planning, sponsorship, meeting us along the route, and being at the finish line."

"We were really delighted that Sky was inspired to help the children we support in Ethiopia. I have visited the street children's breakfast project myself and have seen firsthand how important it is for the 850 children who turn up every morning for their milk, roll and banana. These children, some as voung as 3 or 4 years old. live in abject poverty on the streets or in slums in the city. They arrive at the project for their free breakfast every day before they head off to school. It costs around 25p to 30p to provide a breakfast for one child so Sky's fundraising will help provide over 4,000 breakfasts." - Lisa Cousins, Ethiopiaid's Executive Director.

There are approximately 150,000 children living on the streets in Ethiopia and 60,000 of those are in Addis Ababa. More than half of those children do not have access to adequate shelter, food or education.

Ethiopiaid provides funding to 'Hope Enterprises' to help feed and school thousands of street children who are living in doorways, bus stations and makeshift shelters. The street children's breakfast provides 850 homeless children with two bread rolls, milk and a banana six days a week. The breakfast is an incentive to attend the informal literacy and numeracy classes that are held afterwards. By removing the constant pressure of finding money for food, the children are given time to learn so that they can progress to primary and secondary education. The Ladders of Hope programme helps children and youths in Addis Ababa work themselves out of poverty.

Winterbourne Matters was pleased to hear from one of the fathers of a small group of teens across the who got involved in the National Citizenship Service project this summer.

NCS is a chance for 15 to 17 years-old to embark on exhilarating challenges outside of term time, helping the local community whilst building skills for work and

16 year old Team Leader Lucy, who lives locally in Winterbourne, told us about her experience:

"My name is Lucy Serjent, and this summer I participated with a group of friends to complete a government funded project called NCS (National Citizenship Service).



In my group, we all decided to have our main focus to be the wellbeing of others, and the awareness of mental health issues. Therefore, to help the community also, we decided to volunteer at the Frenchay Feed Bristol Farm for our one week of social action. We decided to do this because Feed Bristol's 6 acre garden area is based to help promote wellbeing, both mentally and physically. So, this fitted in perfectly with our aim.

Over the week, we were put on the project of helping create and finish a wheelchair accessible entrance, which involved a lot of shovelling dirt and placing it carefully next to a pathway so that flowers can be planted. We also cleared a stage which was overgrown with weeds and nettles, for their harvest festival event on the 5th. Then, once cleared, we all added some wood chippings on the floor so as to give it a little cleaner look.

With the weather, half the time my experience (as well as everyone else's I'm sure) was shrouded with heat waves - and the other half dampened with rain... but I quess that just added to the challenge!

With our other 3 weeks, we went on an action camp, lived at UWE for a week and planned what we would do with our social action week. Within the final week, we also decided to fundraise. We managed to raise just over £200 pounds for Feed Bristol by doing a cake sale, nail painting and henna art - which I feel is an amazing accomplishment!

Overall I feel like NCS was definitely a worthwhile experience."

Frampton Cotterell Village Action

Throughout the summer months, Frampton Cotterell Village Action have been continuing their efforts to reduce the amount of Himalayan Balsam along the River Frome. This invasive, non-native plant has no natural checks to its growth so it out competes native wildflowers and forms dense clumps which reduce biodiversity on the riverbank. It also increases the risk of riverbank erosion as it leaves large areas of bare soil when it dies back in the autumn. It is an annual plant which grows from seed every year so the key to getting it under control is to prevent it from setting seed.

Since late May, a group of volunteers have been going out to clear patches of balsam along the Frome from Cogmill down to Nightingale Bridge. Phil Handy, who coordinates the group, says "We've seen a marked improvement in areas we've tackled in previous years, and as we get areas under control, we've been able to spend more time reaching places which are less easily accessible. Reinfestation is always possible but, by regular clearing, we can stop it forming dense clumps."



Nancy could spot and activate gaps in the community life, setting up groups for the young and old alike. And she played a crucial role in starting the long process to save the Medieval Barn for the community.

Before Nancy died, it was a real pride for her to experience the great success of the Barn as an extra useful cultural facility in the village.

Nancy was a very keen, prize winning flower arranger and gardener at the school house and member of the Horticulture/flower arranging society.

She was well known in Winterbourne for her independent artistic spirit and was not perhaps the typical Headmaster's wife! She promoted the Winterbourne Players amateur dramatics group and enjoyed country and ball room dancing.

Her political views were Liberal, like her father, who was a first World War veteran.

Son Christopher told us, she never swore or cried, she was guiet, thoughtful, "keeping her cards close to her chest, so close they were still in the packet!". She was a great, great grandmother, who the children loved to play with.

Nancy Dunn died 07 07 15 in Kingswood, Gloucester and is now buried with Alfred Dunn at St Michael's Church yard. We can all learn a lot from this wonderful lady's approach to community life and getting things done.

FRIENDS OF BRANDY BOTTOM COLLIERY, PUCKLECHURCH



There have been 16 work parties since the last newsletter, bringing the total for the year to date to 42. Information has been found about possible changes to winding operations in the New Pit, a stone floor was uncovered in the Old Boiler House. and a new structure found outside the southwest wall of the Cornish Engine House. There has been no progress on the ground of the rebuilding of the New Pit structures, as the exact scope, and hence the cost, of the contract is still under discussion. It is hoped that work will start next month.

A paper on the conservation of Brandy Bottom was presented to the 2017 conference of the National Association of Mining History Organisations.

The AIBT had a stand at the 2017 South Gloucestershire show. It was located alongside that of the SGMRG, and showcased the work being done at Brandy Bottom. As well as the AIBT banner seen in the photo above ((photo right © M Fletcher), a second banner inside the tent carried the logos of Historic England, Ibstock, and the Ibstock Cory Environmental Trust as acknowledgment of their financial and/or material assistance to the project.

There was a visit on a rainy evening in July by the Friends of Yate Heritage Centre, another in August by members of the Bristol Industrial Archaeological Society, and Brandy Bottom was open over the 'Doors Open Day' weekend in September. Many passers-by have been given tours during recent work parties.
