
A few of our members attended the Russian composes evening at Conygre Hall Timsbury, where they learnt about

Our meetings are held on the first Thursday of each month, at All Saints Church Hall in Winterbourne Down at 7:30pm. Visitors are always welcome.





Emma cuddles up to soap star Adam after losing 11st 10.5lbs!

A 31-year-old, local, super slimmer has reached the finals of a competition to find the UK and Ireland's top female slimmers, where she met top soap star Adam Thomas. "I couldn't believe the

Emma Ogden was one of just 10 women to make the finals of Slimming World's Woman of the Year 2017 competition after losing an impressive 11st 10.5lbs.

Emma, who slimmed from 24st 0.5lbs to 12st 4lbs, made it to the semi-finals after members of her Coalpit Heath group voted for her to be their representitive in the national Woman of the Year competition.

She then went on to triumph at the regional heat, which saw her go through to the Woman of the Year 2017 semi-finals at Slimming World's head office in Derbyshire. It was there that she reached the final 10 of the competition and was congratulated by Adam, who is best known for playing the role of Adam Barton in Britain's longest-running soap, Emmerdale.

She says: "Before I found Slimming World, losing weight always seemed such a struggle. If I wasn't feeling hungry or deprived, it was the mental battles - like feeling as though I was missing out because I couldn't socialise with my friends, go out

for a meal or do things with my family. After I joined Slimming World it was as though my eyes were completely opened and I found a new way of eating that easily fit around my life. The changes I've made were so simple - little things like switching white bread for wholemeal and using low-calorie cooking spray instead of lots of oil. I noticed a change on the scales though - in my first week I lost 9lbs! I couldn't believe it.

Coalpit Heath Village Hall

The Miners 90th Anniversary – 1927 to 2017

Main Road Showing Institute, Goalpit Heath

Opened by H. B. Napier ESQ of Long Ashton Bristol. on 3 December 1927. The miners each paid a penny a week out of their wages for the hall to be built. It was a place for them to socialise after a hard day's work in the mines.

They had a tennis court at the front (now car park) and at the back there were changing rooms, a bathing area to clean themselves off after a game of football and a boiler room which provided the hot



Originally snooker hall was in a shed and the plavers would provide drinks

and snacks to sell to make it a more social event.

When the miners did not want the hall anymore, they gave it to the village of Coalpit Heath. A committee was formed to run the hall and became a registered charity on 16 October 1963.

In the 1960s and 70s, the building was used to cook meals for the schools in Gloucestershire. Meals were cooked and delivered to the schools in vans. The now snooker hall was a freezer and was also used to weigh out ingredients and make the pastry for the following days meals.

My son started gymnastics 3 years ago at Fromeside, and was invited to ioin Bristol Hawks last August. Jack and Fromeside gymnast. George, both ranked in the top 6 at September's annual South West grading competition, held in Barnstaple.

Consequently they were invited to compete at the National Grades Final at the GMAC arena in Birmingham, on 4 November 2017. The boys competed with 66 other boys, all who were ranked in the top 6 of each UK region.

New book from local author lan Haddrell

Many of you may remember a feature on the talented Mr Haddrell (pictured right) a couple of years ago in Winterbourne & Frampton Matters. Ian has written several books, including two history books on Coalpit Heath and Frampton Cotterell, where he lives. This month sees the launch of his latest book, 'The History of Dings Crusaders Rugby Club'.

We asked lan why he had selected this subject matter for his new book, he explained, "When I wrote my second book of old photographs of Lockleaze (where I went to school), I included a chapter on sport in the area — football, basketball, netball and rugby. As well as including photographs of Dings Crusaders Rugby Club, which has been based at Lockleaze since 1948, I wrote a brief history on its origins from 1897 when it was formed as part of the Shaftesbury Crusade in the Dings area of St Philip's, Bristol. Like most rugby clubs, their Landseer Avenue clubhouse is adorned with many team photographs dating back to the club's inauguration to the present day, some of which I used in the book entitled "Lockleaze".

"The chairman of Dings, Steve Lloyd, very kindly loaned me some of these precious photographs and during one of our conversations I suggested that with the wealth of historical photographs available it would be good to produce a book of old photographs of Dings Crusaders RFC. Steve was more than happy for me to write the book and that's how the project started a few years ago."

During the course of researching the history of the club, lan discovered that Dings had a particularly interesting origin, as it was formed as part of The Dings' Club, a section of The Shaftesbury Crusade, a Christian and social mission based in St Philip's – hence the name of the club. Ian said, "What had originally been the intention to simply produce a book of some 200 photographs with captions developed into a more textual publication plotting the origins of the club through to 2017, with approximately 100 pictures. The initial book layout was to have included just black and white photographs but as the format change it was decided to publish in full colour."


The publication date of October 2017 was set to coincide with Dings move from its Lockleaze home of 70 years to a brand ground and facility at Frenchay – 'Shaftesbury Park', so named to recognise the club's origins.






