### **Chepstow Matters recently had the great** pleasure of meeting with local artist and art historian, Keith Underwood.

Keith, now 83 years young, has lived in the Beachley/ Sedbury area of Chepstow since his parents moved here from Portsmouth following his father's posting to Beachley way back in 1939. Keith is a well-known member of the local community being an active member of several local community and historical groups across the town. Keith is such an interesting chap and very passionate about local history - it was delightful to spend time with him.

For many years Keith guided at Tintern Abbey as the original Brother Thomas and produced a statuette of the Blessed Virgin Mary, together with other artefacts including an illuminated manuscript book of pressed plants which was recently on show at Chepstow Museum. He has also guided at Chepstow Castle, mainly as Edmund, the Seneschal for Richard de Clare, but was sometimes also seen in full Cavalier kit as Thomas Underwood (photo right).

Back in the early 1990s, Keith was commissioned by Monmouthshire County Council to provide the murals at the Drill Hall at a time of major renovation (see bottom photo of one of the murals). He also gave presentations after the murals were completed, the first being in 1992 (photo above far right). Other accomplishments include creating the Earl of Worcester's heraldic achievement for the Town Gate, as well as the Chepstow reproduced with map. He also worked with Ned Heywood on the design for the illustrative ceramic plaques to accompany the Town Trail in the streets of Chepstow.

As a boy, at Monmouth School, he was taught by the late Otto Macaig, the hundredth anniversary of whose birth will be celebrated in Monmouth next year, and Keith hopes to be a contributor.

Keith is currently working on a piece to celebrate the 950th anniversary of William FitzOsbern, Norman builder of Chepstow Castle which was commenced in 1067. FitzOsbern, 1st Earl of Hereford and a relative and close counsellor to William the Conquerer, was known to have fought in The Battle of Hastings 1066 and was one of the great magnates of Early Norman England. He was one of the earliest and most vigorous advocates of the invasion of England.

As part of the assertion of Norman control over England and Wales, FitzOsbern was one of the major Norman castle builders with King William tasking him to build castles as launching points for Norman military expeditions and provide refuge for the King's men. Chepstow Castle, it has been reported, was his greatest achievement and became a springboard for westward Norman expeditions and the focal point of Norman settlement in Wales. FitzOsbern died in February 1071 at the Battle of Cassel in his native Normandy.

Keith's latest commission to celebrate FitzOsbern will take the form of an A5 parchment booklet (which you can see Keith working on in the main photo above) all of which will be hand written, in calligraphy, along with Keith's hand drawings for which he uses acrylic paints. Keith has been working on the booklet for some time and is hopeful that it will be completed in the early part of 2018. Once finished the booklet will be available to purchase at the Chepstow Bookshop.

### **Sedbury Celebrates 100 Years**

Keith Underwood (see previous article) is also Chairman of the Tidenham History Group, a small society dedicated to preserving and recording the history of the parish of Tidenham. The group meets regularly to discuss and research the Tidenham area and between them the members including Richard & Carol Clammer have produced several books such as Beachley & The First World War, The Churches & Chapels of the Parish of Tidenham Their History & Architecture.



The group's latest achievement is to produce an interpretive

information board which is displayed outside the Doctor's surgery in Sedbury. This board commemorates the one hundredth anniversary of the coming of the shipyard and railway network to Sedbury and Beachley. It shows how Sedbury looked before and after the Government's decision to turn the Beachley peninsula into a vast shipbuilding area and what effect this had on the then, very tiny, community who lived here.

The detailed coloured border, painstakingly painted by local artist and historian Keith, depicts events, places and people throughout Sedbury's history. The route of the extensive 1917/18 railway line running through the village is shown and there is also a trail to follow around the area showing which buildings date from the first world war, including those that still survive today. The intricate work follows the pattern of the margins of the maps made for Chepstow, Caldicot and Sudbrook with Portskewett and encapsulates the past history of the Beachley Peninsula.

It is planned for another board to be installed in Beachley later this year and there are more partnership events planned for 2018 such as the 100th anniversary of the building which is now called the Sedbury Village Hall. The 100th anniversary celebrations will then culminate in the whole parish joining together for the Armistice Day service on 11th November, 2018.

### **Matt Strait:** Modern Samurai and a new World Champion!

Chepstow Matters was delighted to hear from Matt Strait who recently became a WKC (World Karate and Kickboxing Council) World Champion.

Matt is based in Bulwark at the Modern Samurai Martial arts academy

which is a full-time martial arts gym that holds regular classes, including ladies-only kickboxing and various kids sessions starting from 4 years of age. He holds multiple black belts and instructor licences, trains security and corporate clients, runs online training courses and teaches self defence programmes to schools across the country.

Chepstow Museum annually hosts Bristol Old Vic Theatre School's Theatre in Education tour.

### **New Member of Staff has Four Legs not Two!**

# Wyedean School has introduced a very important new member of the school community - Moss the dog!

Moss was born on 28th April 2017. He is a 10-month old miniature Schnauzer X Cavalier King Charles Spaniel who is in training to become a school dog and set to become an integral part of the school community. He has completed puppy classes and has begun his first course of Life Skills classes which will enable him to become a fully qualified Pet Therapy Dog.

A growing number of schools, colleges and universities are now recognising the benefits of introducing a pet into their organisation. Therapy dogs have been in use in the UK for around 5 years, but in the US and Australia they have been commonplace for a lot longer. Studies show that a school dog can have a very positive effect on students and there

are many examples of how they can support a school community, including: helping to reduce anxiety; encouraging students to attend school; helping students to cope with examination stress; helping to foster a sense of responsibility; improving reading confidence by having students read to them and generally bringing a warmth to the school which makes the place feel happier.

We were pleased to liaise with Angharad Churches who is the owner of Moss who told us how the idea for Wyedean's new school dog came about:

"I approached the Principal (Rob Ford) in Autumn 2016 to ask him whether he had ever considered having a school dog. I had seen examples of other schools who were using dogs in different ways in education and thought it might be something we could look into. We always had dogs growing up and I have seen the positive impact that animals can have on children's social and emotional well-being first hand. I was also interested in how dogs were being used to encourage reluctant readers to read aloud and how they had helped school-phobic students to attend school more regularly. The Principal was very enthusiastic and was happy to let me continue to research the idea.

"I decided that the start of the summer holidays 2017 was the best time to get a puppy so that early socialisation and training could take place while I wasn't at work and so I used the research I'd conducted to find a litter of puppies from a breed that would suit

attending school. The Miniature Schnauzer x Cavalier King Charles Spaniel seemed like an ideal combination of breeds: the trustworthy, affectionate, adaptable, social nature of the Cavalier combined with the playful, child-friendly, minimal shedding of the Miniature Schnauzer. Moss has been a fantastic addition to our family, bringing lots of fun and plenty of extra exercise! He has completed two courses of puppy training to date and will undergo more training in the future. He has visited school a number of times and has taken the new environment, noises and people in his stride and I am confident that he will thrive in his new role.

"Some students have already used Moss as the subject of an IT project and I am constantly being approached by students eagerly asking when they will be able to meet



Naturally there might be a few students who are worried or anxious about being near dogs or who have allergies to dogs. Students have been assured that they do not have to have close or direct contact with Moss unless they wish to, and before being introduced to the school parents were encouraged to raise any concerns. A full risk assessment was completed before the decision was taken and staff and students were briefed fully before Moss will start to spend more time at school this month.

Moss will continue to live with Ms Churches and her family and undergo all the usual regular vet check-ups for injections, flea and worming treatments. He will come into school most days and have his own spot in the offices, with access to his own crate to chill-out in. Moss will be assessed by a Pets as Therapy Assessor before working with any children, and then will always be on a leash and accompanied by a fully trained adult whilst on school grounds.



# **WASSAIL!**

Saturday 20th January saw Chepstow's biggest and best Wassail and Mari Lwyd Border Festival to date. Over 20 Maris came from across the UK to take part, with many locals and visitors from afar turning out to watch the spectacle.



Wassailing is a very old, mainly English,

folk tradition designed to wake the orchard up from its winter sleep and to encourage the trees to bear a good crop in the coming year. The ceremony is led by a "Butler" who would blacken his face as a disguise, so that he could poke fun at the farmer.

Mari Lwyd is a Welsh mid-winter tradition dating back many centuries. The Mari is a decorated, shrouded horse skull, led by a group who go door-to-door, singing and challenging the families inside to a battle of rhyming insults in Welsh. At the end of the battle of wits (known as pwnco) they would be invited into the house for refreshments, followed by singing and rowdy banter. They too would blacken their face as a disguise to preserve anonymity.

In the Chepstow Border Festival, these two traditions are combined with a unique and spectacular meeting of the English and Welsh on the border - The river Wye bridge. During the day, there is also Morris dancing and a Country Dance Ceilidh in the evening.

The main organisers of this amazing, community event, Mick Lewis and Tim Ryan said:

"Many thanks to all who keep coming along to support us. This Festival just seems to keep going from strength to strength each year. None of this would be possible without you, the public and the amazing group of volunteers who help us. See you all next vear ..... WASSAIL!

### **Dealing with debt**

At this time of year people can find themselves struggling with financial worries as Christmas spending and paying regular bills places a strain on finances. If you find yourself in this position it is better to seek help as soon as possible. Monmouthshire Citizens Advice can provide

Here are our six top tips to sort out your debts

- Work out how much you owe: make a list of who you owe money to and add up how much you need to pay each month. If you don't have your most recent statements, contact your creditor to find out what you owe.
- Prioritise your debts: your rent or mortgage, energy and council tax are called priority debts as there can be serious consequences if you don't pay them. These should always be paid first. Separate these and work out how much you owe.
- 3. Work out how much you can pay: create a budget by adding up your essential living costs, such as food and housing, and taking away these from your income. Any money you have spare can be put towards your debts. Citizens Advice budgeting tool can help (see website below).
- 4. Paying urgent debts: you may have several priority debts and can't pay them all. Contact all your creditors to find out if you can negotiate on how much you pay, and/or when you pay them. Always try to pay any priority creditors first, especially if they are taking action to recover the debt. Seek help if necessary to negotiate with your creditors.
- 5. Paying non-urgent debts: if you have any money left after paying priority debts, consider getting a free debt-management plan. Organisations such as Stepchange, Payplan, Money Advice Service can help you with a plan. It means you will make one monthly payment to the plan provider, who will handle paying your creditors. Or contact your creditors and offer them what you can afford to pay. Remember to ask the creditor to confirm any agreed repayment arrangement in writing.
- If you can't pay your debts: if you've got little
  or no money spare to pay your priority debts
  seek advice straight away. It is important that
  you do not ignore letters from your creditors
  as the debt may grow because of added debt
  recovery charges.
