What's Going On at Winterbourne Medieval Barn

The Winterbourne & Medieval Barn trust submitted the final part of their Heritage Lottery Fund Bid details in November 2017. They now have to wait till March to hear whether or not they will we awarded the main part of the funding, they seek (£1 million) – so fingers crossed! Winterbourne Matters will keep you up to date in future issues.

At time of writing, work on converting the cartshed into an education facility is due to be completed. Most of the funding for this work came from the LEADER Fund (www.gov.uk/guidance/rural-development-programme-for-england-leader-funding), which is part of the Government's Rural Development Programme England which in turn is part of an EU-wide support scheme. A total of £138 million is available in England between 2015 and 2020 under the scheme. LEADER is a French acronym (Liaison Entre Actions de Développement de l'Économie Rural).

News from Winterbourne Down WI

Dawn Mahonev. our President. welcomed everyone which included two visitors to our February meeting.

Our Speaker for this month was Jinx

Newly, a historian who spoke with great knowledge about 'Bristol a City of Monks and Bones'. We were shown maps of Bristol going back to medieval times depicting how the original Bristol (Brycgstow) meaning 'The Place at the Bridge' was surrounded by the natural rivers of the Frome and Avon making a moat system around the town. On the maps you could see multiples of housing and roads running to the centre where the famous Bristol High Cross stood. This is now situated in the National Trust location at Stourhead.

We were shown pictures of St James Church where mediaeval fairs and markets took place. The Church owned land where the now Galleries, Cabot Circus and part of Gloucester Road stand. When the Bus Station was built excavations took place and parts of the Cloisters to St James' Church and many skeletons were found to the north end. We were told that after the 2nd World War, when the site of Lewis's was being excavated, layers of skeletons were found which it was believed to be the plague

Jinx told us that St Augustine's Abbey, became the Cathedral in 1542. The monks worshipped together and spent time in religious reading and prayer, whilst in contrast the Canons were priests who went out into the community to help and spread the word. We were shown a sketch of the Roman Arch which is in the Abbey Precinct and the two additional stories built above the arch were of Tudor design. We were also shown illustrations of the Chapter

House and told stories of the life of Monks. Canons and Friars

Jinx mentioned that in the Middle Ages there were two definitions of the word hospital. One being that it was a place where the poor, pilgrims and travellers could go and the other being a place where healthcare and religion took place both at the same time. St Marks Hospital, which is on the opposite side of College Green to the Cathedral, was also known as Gaunt's Hospital founded by the Gaunt's family and currently known as The Lord Mayors Chapel. At the bottom of Christmas Steps there are also the remains of St Bartholomews Hospital. We had a most interesting and informative evening.




As part of the Bradley Stoke Town Festival, this year's 10K race will take part on Sunday 10th June at 9.30am.

Shopmobility South Glos offering 12 years of service



Shopmobility South Gloucestershire is reflecting on 12 years of serving the community, and providing a lifeline to many South Gloucestershire Residents.

In the current tougher economic times, the scheme is concerned about continued and future funding for this vital service, with the result that it could have very limited opening hours or even close. Some of it's South Gloucestershire Council funding is due to end.

The service is based in Yate Library, and attracts users from all over South Gloucestershire, and beyond! The first meeting to discuss setting up a local Shopmobility service was called 15 years ago, in 2003, by Keith Holloway from Thornbury, with the service starting in 2006. Hundreds of people have registered with the scheme over the years.

Vice Chairman David Bell, a founding Trustee since 2004, said, "We hope we can continue this vital much needed service for our users, but that is dependent on continued funding."

Shopmobility South Glos Chair Councillor Janet Biggin said. " People come from all over South Glos and beyond, to use Shopmobility as the Shopping Centre is flat and easily accessible. Yate is the only place in the district, apart from the Mall at Cribbs Causeway, where people can visit a variety of shops and services through scooter hire.

We are really making a difference to those people who use the service to visit the shopping centre allowing independence to our service users, who would be isolated without it."

The service provides mobility scooter and wheelchair hire on a daily and longer term basis. This helps many people with mobility issues to do their shopping and access other services. The scheme does an annual service users survey, and many users tell of how the service also helps them socially by being able to get out and about,

Can You Help Tackle Social Isolation in **Your Community?**

People living in care are twice as likely to experience severe loneliness and isolation as those living in the community. The recent research also shows up to 50% of older people living in care never go outside. A local organisation, Growing Support, is using a

pioneering approach to tackle this isolation. They run gardening clubs for people living in care to help them connect with the outdoors. The clubs use fun, using engaging activities specially designed to increase opportunities for light exercise, sensory stimulation and social interaction.

Growing Support is currently looking for volunteers to support their trained Horticultural Therapists in running the clubs in care homes. You would be helping more people benefit: there is strong evidence that gardening as part of a group can help people feel a renewed sense of purpose, reduce agitation and improve sleep and appetite.

In 2017, 28 new volunteers joined the Growing Support team, helping them to deliver over 1,000 hours of support. Volunteer Karen said "I found that often the sight of the plants or the sensory nature of the activity would spark memories to surface and reminiscences about the gardens the residents had at home. Even participants who had quite advanced dementia and limited verbal communication were clearly getting something from the sessions. I saw one woman who went from being quite distressed at the start of a session to leaving us with a big smile on her face and a calm and relaxed demeanour"

When asked if she would recommend this kind of volunteering, she replied, "I would absolutely recommend volunteering with Growing Support to others, and regularly do! The Growing Support team are a lovely bunch and make it clear that the work we do as volunteers is important and valued."

All volunteers receive an induction, support from a mentor and access to further training. There are regular volunteer meetings and Growing Support covers your travel expenses. Growing Support stressed you don't need to be a gardening expert!


