

The new bulbs planted by Floral Friends and Iron Acton volunteers are now also beginning to show along Frampton End Road. We can look forward to lovely Spring displays of wild daffodils, bluebells, snowdrops, cowslips and primroses in years to come once they are established.

New Plans for the Triangle - Floral Friends have new plans for the neglected triangle of land opposite the Rising Sun. What's Going On at Winterbourne Medieval Barn



The Barn is delighted that the long awaited refurbishment of the Cart Shed to provide a Reception and Education Centre has now been completed. They are thankful to all those who have helped to make this possible, particularly LEADER, who

have provided significant funding. They are looking forward to using it for events and activities this year.

The Winterbourne & Medieval Barn trust submitted the final part of their Heritage Lottery Fund Bid details in November 2017. At time of writing they are expecting to hear any day, as to whether or not they will be awarded the main part of the funding, they seek (£1 million) – so fingers crossed! We will keep you up to date in future issues.

There will be some great events taking place at this local, historical venue this year, so please do try and support them.



Summer events start at Winterbourne Barn with a Jazz Night on Saturday 26 May. After last year's wonderful sell-out performance, members of the University of the West of England (UWE) Big Band and singers return again. So enjoy cool relaxing swing and Latin classics with silky smooth vocals and foot-tapping grooves, in the very atmospheric setting of the medieval barn.

Delicious locally-sourced food and drink will be on sale from 6.30pm, with hot and cold food from Old Sodbury Lamb and Harcombe Catering, including vegetarian options, along with Three Engineers beer and Haythorne Cider brewed at the Barn itself. You can't get more local than that! Tickets are available online now from Ticketsource or in person from Daisy's Coffee Shop, Winterbourne, from 12 May. There may be tickets on the gate, but only if the evening is not sold out in advance as it was last year.



The Jazz will be followed on Sunday 10 June with a Medieval Fayre, a really wonderful day out for all ages. Experience vivid displays of daily life in a 14th century encampment as living history group - The Company of Chivalry, portray medieval life. Find out what life was like at the time the Barn was built in 1342, how people dressed, how they cooked, how they made everyday things, and more. There will be a full programme throughout the day of talks, demonstrations and re-enactments of medieval life and military combat, falconry, and medieval music, with lots of children's activities, stalls, and plenty of delicious food and drink on sale. A fantastic day out for the whole family. Stay all day - and bring your camera! Entry is only £4 for adults, while accompanied children under 16yrs are free.

On Saturday 23 June the Barn will host a one day Basket Weaving Workshop from 10am - 4.00pm. It has been a busy year again in the Gambian village of Genieri. Notably the new Women's garden, located closer to the village than the previous site, is beginning to yield crops. With the help of a solar panelled pump, funded by another organisation, they have high hopes that this project will produce a reliable source of income for villagers.

Another of the couples' pet projects, the Child Care Centre, has received a boost with the promise of funding for a toilet block on the site. This comes from a charity in Scotland with which they have close links.

Other projects such as the lighting for each compound and the Healthcare Centre are still flourishing.





The Gambia as a whole has entered a new phase with the election last year of Adama Barrow, who promised, as part of his election campaign, to rejoin the Commonwealth. That was achieved in February 2018. He succeeded Yahya Jammeh who ruled more and more autocratically, for more than two decades. Although the politics of the country do not affect the Yate-Genieri Link, Graham and Margaret feel that this move towards greater freedom and democracy is welcome.



Entrants Welcomed for Charity Bike Ride 26th May

Bradley Stoke Matters was delighted to chat with a courageous and inspiring lady for this issue.

Julie Harvey was diagnosed with an incurable Grade 4 Brain Tumour 15 months ago, having gone into hospital with a bad headache. She had an operation 2 days later to remove a brain tumour and then endured 6 weeks of daily radio- and chemo-therapy followed by a further 6 months of chemotherapy which in her own words "knocks you out for 2 weeks of every month". Inspite of all this, Julie has maintained her determination to fight back "I'm just bloody minded really" she told me "why should I let this cancer define me and stop me doing what I want?".

Having previously undertaken 'the odd triathlon', inbetween her treatments Julie trained to undertake a power-walk midnight marathon around Edinburgh and a 2-mile sea swim and plans to undertake a 45-mile cycle in April.

She is also organising a bike ride at the end of May to raise awareness and funds for the Brain Tumour Support group, without whom her life would have been so much more difficult since diagnosis. "I would be lost with out their help" Julie told me "I have a wonderful counsellor called Kate and I can totally be myself with her, let all my frustrations out. She enables me to go back out and face

the world and keep being 'me'. The support they have given to me and to others is just so amazing, and I want to give them something back"

The bike ride is for anyone who can get on a bike and pedal! There are 3 routes 33km, 65km, 85km, and the cost is £20.00, £25.00 and £30.00.

Riders can choose between 33km, 65km and 85km rides, costing £20/£25/£30. The rides will start from Thornbury Sailing Club in Oldbury on Severn and before the event Bacon Butties will be available. The entry fee will include Tea, coffee and cake when you finish, pitstop refreshments along the route and a medal for all finishers.

After the event you are welcome to relax at the sailing club. The bar will be open and there will be a BBQ serving hot food.



News from Frampton Cotterell WI

Last month's speaker for our WI group was local history expert Mr Trevor Thompson. As you might expect, the talk was of great interest to our members, and we were fascinated to learn that Frampton Cotterell did appear in the 1086 Domesday Book, when the land was owned by "Walter the Crossbowman" (hence Crossbow House). At the time the total population was thought to be around 100 (not including servants and their families). There was a church registered, thought to have been at the site of St. Peters, however at that time it was no more than 20 years old. The two water mills that we know of now (Mill Lane and Cogmills) were also noted at the time, as were Frampton End Road and Lower Stone Close – it's amazing to think that those places have been around for all that amount of time! We also heard more about the local hatting industry that was highly significant to the Frampton/Winterbourne area in the 19th century, and which leaves several local buildings still standing today (eg: Factory Road, Park Lane, etc.)

The other highlight of the past month was our annual meal out - this year we went for a fine dining experience at Ronnie's of Thornbury, which did not disappoint. Members enjoyed a selection of delicious dishes ranging from slow cooked ox cheek, pan fried cod loin and parmesan gnocchi. to sticky toffee pudding and winter fruit crumble. It was a cold snowy night outside so we all felt very fortunate to be enjoying such comforting food in warm, cosy surroundings!

At time of writing, we are looking forward to another very interesting speaker coming to talk to us at the end of March. We will be delighted to welcome Mr. Tim Bowles, Bristol's Metro Mayor who is going to let us know more about his role and the way in which he works with local councils.



Shopmobility South Glos offering 12 years of service



Shopmobility South Gloucestershire is reflecting on 12 years of serving the community, and providing a lifeline to many South Gloucestershire Residents.

In the current tougher economic times, the scheme is concerned about continued and future funding for this vital service, with the result that it could have very limited opening hours or even close. Some of it's South Gloucestershire Council funding is due to end.

The service is based in Yate Library, and attracts users from all over South Gloucestershire, and beyond! The first meeting to discuss setting up a local Shopmobility service was called 15 years ago, in 2003, by Keith Holloway from Thornbury, with the service starting in 2006. Hundreds of people have registered with the scheme over the years.

Vice Chairman David Bell, a founding Trustee since 2004, said, "We hope we can continue this vital much needed service for our users, but that is dependent on continued funding."

Shopmobility South Glos Chair Councillor Janet Biggin said. " People come from all over South Glos and beyond, to use Shopmobility as the Shopping Centre is flat and easily accessible. Yate is the only place in the district, apart from the Mall at Cribbs Causeway, where people can visit a variety of shops and services through scooter hire.

We are really making a difference to those people who use the service to visit the shopping centre allowing independence to our service users, who would be isolated without it."

The service provides mobility scooter and wheelchair hire on a daily and longer term basis. This helps many people with mobility issues to do their shopping and access other services. The scheme does an annual service users survey, and many users tell of how the service also helps them socially by being able to get out and about,


