



### Local Community Matters... Liz McBride: 'Tidenham Remembers'

It was a real pleasure to meet up with local resident Liz McBride for this issue at her home in Tutshill, where I was entertained with many local stories and histories.

Liz is a member of the Tidenham Historical group of which she was a co-founder back in c1990 along with Keith Underwood and Lesley Williams. She has a keen interest in family history and has undertaken much research in this area - tracing back to her grandfather's Australian routes and

travelling all over the world to find and meet descendants and new family branches.

Liz's grandmother, May, worked as a Red Cross nurse in the first World War at the Hospital situated in Gwy House (now the Chepstow Museum). It was there that she met Gordon James Edwards, a soldier from the 12th Australian Light Horsemen, who ended up at the hospital after being shot in Gallipoli in 1915. Fortunately his brother, who was with him on the front line, managed to drag him to the first aid tent and from there he was sent first to Malta and then brought to the Red Cross Hospital in Chepstow in 1916. After a very swift romance, May and Gordon married and went on to have just one child (Liz's mother) as very sadly Gordon died whilst still away at war, just after Armistice was announced in 1918. He is buried in Beirut. Liz's grandmother later bought the Three Salmons House on Beachley Green from where she ran a post office. Liz herself was, much later, born in this house which was once the site of the 18th century turnpike.

Liz's dad was in the forces and she therefore spent time abroad as a child - 3 years in Libya and 3 years in Germany. Growing up she left Chepstow for college in Derbyshire, which is where she met her very supportive husband Gerald. They too spent time abroad due to Gerald's work, living for some years in Zambia where their second son was born. Liz enjoyed her teaching

role there to both ex patriots and native children. Liz and Gerald moved back to the local area

in 1978. A dedicated and popular primary school teacher, Liz did a lot of local supply teaching whilst her boys were growing up and latterly completed her teaching career with several years at the Offa's Meade Academy.

Liz was a brownie herself at the Cavill Hall in Chepstow in her younger years, and is now a member of Trefoil having been involved as a leader in Girl Guiding locally for over 35 years. She is the mainstay of the Sedbury Rainbows which she has been leading for over 20 years.

With Liz's deep local family connections and community involvement she is intensely interested in local affairs and local history and Keith Underwood reliably informs me there is very little that escapes her attention. This I can believe as Liz had so many stories to tell and information to share!

Her current all-consuming project is a closely researched study of all the lads in the Parish of Tidenham who fell in the Great War. Her interest in this research started many years ago when she first accompanied her son on a Wyedean school trip to the WW1 battlefields in Belgium. She remembers looking at all the many grave markers and thinking "There must be men on our war memorial at home who are buried here" and thus started her research, really just as a project which interested her.

She found several of the men had emigrated to Canada and Australia prior to the war, but signed up for their homeland as soon as war broke out. She has met so many descendents from this

research, some of them staying with Liz and Gerald whilst Liz has helped them to further trace their own family history in the locality.

The stories are fascinating and also very sad. "One family lost 3 sons in the war, thankfully their fourth son survived. Other families lost pairs of sons and another their only son (Edgar Arnold see photo right). These 'men' were little more than boys really, many signing up at just 17 or 18" Liz told me, "I must admit I have found it quite emotional at times, tracing their stories".

Captain Harold Thorn Edwards lived just down the road in Tutshill. He is the subject of a painting housed in the Newport Museum entitled "Surrender Be Damned!", his last words of defiance against the advancing German army. "I have found out information on every man on the memorial, as well as other locals who don't appear on this memorial - where they served, where they died; there is





just one individual for whom I have struggled to find information - I have traced everywhere but nothing really fits - that man is John King".

It was Liz's early research on both the Chepstow and Tidenham war memorials that led her to the founding of the local history group which started really small in Chepstow Museum. The group has grown considerably over the years and now has about 50 regular members.

With all this research and knowledge, Liz has been encouraged by fellow members Keith Underwood and

also Richard and Carol Clammer who recently published a book on Beachley, to put it all down in a book which she hopes to complete later this summer. Do look out for 'Tideham Remembers' - it promises to be an interesting read!

Thank you to Liz for her time, and to Keith for the introduction.







## Local Dambuster Remembered

2018 sees 100 years of the RAF and the 75th anniversary of the famous Dambuster raid and there are a number of events taking place across the country to mark these milestones. On Thursday 17th May a commemorative blue plaque will be unveiled in Hardwick Avenue, Chepstow at the former home of Dambuster pilot Bill Townsend.

Born on 12th January 1921, Flt Sgt Townsend lived and grew up in Chepstow, and went to Monmouth School. Shortly after the start of the Second World War he joined the army, transferring into the RAF in May 1941, where he qualified as a pilot in 1942 and posted to 49 squadron. By the end of March 1943, Townsend had completed 26 operations and been recommended for his Distinguished Flying Medal

His regular crew in 49 squadron included five of the men who would fly with him on the Dams Raid: flight engineer Dennis Powell, navigator Lance Howard, bomb aimer Charles Franklin, and air gunners Doug Webb and Ray Wilkinson. The pilot led the third and final wave of six Lancasters on the dams on the night of 16th/17th May 1943.

Townsend was awarded the Conspicuous Gallantry Medal for his role in the Dams Raid. Five of his crew were also given medals, making them the second most decorated Dams Raid crew. He flew on just two further operations in 617 Squadron, both in July 1943. He had by then completed a full tour, and in September he was posted to a training role. He remained in the RAF until 1946.

Bill Townsend married his wife Eileen in 1947 and they had three children. Bill died in Bromsgrove on 9 April 1991. He was cremated nearby after a funeral service and honoured with a flypast by 617 Tornadoes. The ashes were later brought back to Chepstow and buried at Saint Arvans Church.

The blue plaque has been designed, made and donated by Councillor Ned Heywood MBE. The event is open to members of the public, starting at approximately 6pm with the last flying Lancaster bomber set to fly over at c6.40pm to mark the occasion, weather permitting.



#### Mathern Mill: Open for National Mills Weekend

National Mills Weekend is the annual festival of the UK's milling heritage, and the chance for everyone to explore their local windmills and watermills. It is organised by the Society for the Protection of Ancient Buildings (SPAB) Mills Section which was founded in 1931 to protect and promote windmills and watermills.

In 2018 it will take place on the 12th and 13th May and the theme will be Mills and Wildlife.

Mathern Mill, near Chepstow (NP16 6LG), will be open to visitors from 2pm to 5pm on Saturday and Sunday. Entry is free.

This watermill, dating back to at least the late 17th century, ground grain for the farmers of Mathern and the surrounding area until the 1960s. It was powered by an overshot water wheel, the skeleton of which can still be seen. In Victorian times an engine house was added to house a steam engine to increase the power and capacity of the mill. Much of the Victorian machinery remains in situ and visitors can get a good idea of what the mill was like and how it worked.

The mill is owned by Dave and Jan Bowen who commented: "We really enjoy showing the mill to people who are often surprised and delighted by what they find inside. We have done a lot of research into the mill's working life over three centuries and there are many stories to tell about the

building and the people who lived and worked here. Because it is unrestored, the mill has an extraordinary atmosphere often commented on by our visitors. For 2018 we will have some new displaysand we always have something to entertain our younger visitors."

#### **Baby Bloodhounds!**

#### Bloodhound supersonic car inspires engineers of the future

Pupils of Ysgol y Ffin, the Welsh medium school in Caldiot were thrilled to appear on ITV Wales 6 o'clock news in March, as they kicked off their week long exploration of all things scientific with an exciting and engaging model rocket car workshop run by the education team of Bloodhound SSC.

The Bloodhound project is a British supersonic land vehicle currently in development, which, powered by both a jet and rocket engine aims to exceed the 1,000mph barrier and set a new land speed record. The team ran a full day workshop at Ysgol Gymraeg y Ffin, enabling the children a hands on experience in exploration and discovery of engineering. The children designed and built aerodynamic cars in teams of



3 from mixed year groups, which were then seen tearing across the playground fuelled by rocket power, with the fastest car of the afternoon reaching a whopping 54mph!! If that excitement wasn't enough, the lucky winners will have their team name etched into the tail fin of the actual bloodhound car for all to see.



When asked about their favourite aspect of the day, the older children replied "Designing the car. The anticipation and suspense was killing me" and "Watching the vehicles reach tremendous speed with flames and smoke billowing out the back", whilst a year 2 foundation pupil simply summed the experience up as "Awesome".

Chepstow mum Liz David, the parent with a passion for science in education who is behind the school's participation in National science week says "Whoever you chose to be or whatever you chose to do, I believe being curious and having the ability to

evaluate and challenge information are critical skills - science week is a chance to develop these crucial life skills and have masses of fun along the way."

Ysgol Gymraeg y Ffin has recently been recognised by STEM Ambassadors for encouraging and inspiring children in Science and who knows, STEM ambassadors of the future may well be getting their first tastes of the enormous variety of disciplines, from these annual science concentrated weeks

and the weekly science club that the school has established over the past 3 years.

This truly was an amazing experience for children and staff alike and I would encourage people with an interest in engineering (and super fast cars!) to plan a visit to see the Bloodhound project in Bristol where they are based.

Dozens of pupils at Chepstow's St Mary's RC Primary School have been making a movie in class this year, as one of the Welsh Government's and Arts Council of Wales' Lead Creative Schools (LCS).

The LCS programme - part of Wales'
Creative Learning Through the Arts initiative
- aims to promote new, innovative ways of
working in schools and to make creativity an
integral part of the national curriculum to support
numeracy, literacy and more via a creative
project.

St Mary's was given £10,000 to support two projects over two years, and their Year 5 and 6 pupils are ready to show off the stunning results of year one with a premiere of their film - Chepstow: Bridging Out to Our Future - which showed at the town's comprehensive on March 20th.

"We've been able to work with Owain Hopkins from Tree Top Films (and some of his acting and filmmaking colleagues) and Jenny Hulme, a Monmouth based creative agent for the Arts Council across the whole of the Spring term on this project, which has allowed the children to explore Chepstow and how its history and future will shape their outlook and future life," explains Jo Williams, St Mary's Year 5 teacher.

Owain has worked with Jo and Year 6 teacher Charlotte Smith as he's taken their pupils on a journey through film, with stops along the way to explore script writing, story boarding, sound and music effects, acting and presenting techniques, costume design and finally filming on location across Chepstow.

"The children chose nine locations, and worked together to write the script, research

the locations, and to take on the roles of camera operator, sound engineer, producer, director,

producer, director, interviewer and anchor team," says Jo. "They've also organized the premiere event at Chepstow School (visitors were treated to everything from refreshments to red carpet. as well as displays of the work they've done in the making of the film)."

Jo says staff have seen how, as a result of this project, the children's oracy, research skills, imagination, teamwork, resilience and creative thinking has been pushed to the limit. "They've worked so hard and collaborated so well and are, quite rightly, hugely proud of the result," says Jo.

The nine locations chosen by the children to focus on during the film ranged from the racecourse to the museum, the fire station to the football ground and of course the castle! Children prepared questions for interviewees at each location to glean their thoughts and ideas about the future of Chepstow.

"Although we're at the finish line now, this project will provide a base for future projects and will influence our daily classroom practice to lead a more creative curriculum approach," Jo concluded.



## The Greenman Backpackers, Then and Now

Chepstow Matters was delighted to receive a call from Mick Lewis who owns and runs the Greenman Backpackers in Beaufort Square, inviting us down for a tour of the recently renovated building and the facilities it now offers.

Most people who have lived in the town before 2007 would know this building as "The Legion" or The "Seamstress shop". Indeed, before Mick and Ness bought and renovated it, that is exactly what it was. The then frontage was a small Seamstress shop with a bowed window, a bit like those you see on a Dickensian Christmas card. Above and behind was The Royal British Legion Club, who acquired it in 1957.

The building itself is quite unique, being made up of several individual buildings of different ages, all linked together to form a rather unusual premises. It is Grade 2\* listed and has many unusual and fascinating features, which has made the renovations somewhat fun! The Seamstress shop window was replaced with a copy of the original Victorian frontage (there are pictures of the frontage in the museum - Peace Day 1919 - when it was The Post Office). Behind this frontage there is a medieval Moot Hall with a beautiful vaulted stone ceiling dating back to circa 1290, where you can find the 'Green Man' that the building is now named after. This area is still being sympathetically renovated and restored and plans are that it will eventually become a coffee lounge/wine bar.

There is a plaque on the pavement outside detailing some of the long history of the Moot Hall.

Built on top of the Moot Hall is a lovely example of a Georgian town house built around 1760, which was formerly the home of John Bowsher of Bowsher Watkins and Hodges (Timber Merchants and dealers in the town). John Bowsher is the man who met Lord Nelson in The Tree Cranes Inn on Hocker Hill Street in 1802 to sign the deal that sent huge amounts of oak to help build Nelsons fleet for the Napoleonic war. Bowsher left all his money to the town in his will. It has also been the home of The Fydell family. Thomas Fydell was a High Sheriff of Monmouthshire.

This part of the building needed a great deal of work to bring it back to a sound condition. The whole roof was renovated and re-tiled. Lath and plaster and ornate plaster mouldings have been repaired and replaced and both large curved





windows were completely dismantled and rebuilt (incidentally, they are made of wood and metal) and had to be soldered back together. Floors and carpentry detail was undertaken by skilled craftsmen too. Today, the second floor room is the hostelry's period lounge and the first floor is "The Widders Bar" named after "The Widders" Morris men, a group initiated by Mick back in 2001 when he moved back to Chepstow. The décor and retained features give the building a wonderful feel. Membership of The Widders Bar is open to all for a lifetime membership fee of just £5. This fee goes into a charity pot that helps raise money for several charities including The Poppy Appeal, SARA and McMillan Nurses.

Behind the Georgian building stands a large Victorian house (all connected) which Mick believes was known as Raglan Lodge This too needed extensive repair and detailed renovation to the roof and all parts of the building including windows, floors and timber features. The new communal kitchen and several bedrooms are housed here now. There is a new build to the side which homes the reception area and two new bedrooms. Behind the Victorian building stands a 1970's house and a walled car park, (the stone wall here was replaced also as most of the original had gone). The house now offers double en suite rooms and an outside kitchenette. There is a traditional Pizza oven in the garden and Mick and Ness host pizza evenings for Widders Bar members on dates throughout the

Restoring the building to such a high standard has not been an overnight job. Work on the project commenced in 2009 and the main work was completed by 2016, that is 7 years of dedicated and continuous attention to detail! Mick's vision for restoring the building was to offer a decent standard of accommodation at an affordable price. The accommodation offered comprises of double en suite rooms, en suite family rooms, en suite

family suite, twin rooms with private bathrooms and 5 dormitory rooms for backpackers, hikers and groups. The rooms are modern, comfortable and finished to a high standard whilst still maintaining an



historic feel to the premises with the walls adorned with many photos and paintings of historical figures and scenes reflecting this building's history, as well as showing Ness and Mick's love of local nature. As well as the large modern communal kitchen, there is a large luxurious television lounge, The Widders feature bar and a patio area with the BBQ and pizza oven. There is onsite parking, free WIFI in all rooms and a secure lock up for cycles. The Greenman welcomes all visitors, whether travelling solo, couples, families, groups, walkers and cyclists. Also a great place for visiting family so stay when you can't accommodate them in your own home and at a reasonable price!

"We love this building and feel it has been a great privilege to be able to restore it and bring it back to become an important addition to our town. We get people here from all over the world, all kinds of people doing all manner of things in our beautiful area.






