

Wye Valley Challenge 2018

Chepstow Matters was very pleased to hear from local resident Robert Wall for this issue. Robert and his wife Noreen, have been involved with a national dog rescue charity, Houndsfirst Sighthound Rescue since 2013 being a rescuer, foster carer, adopter, transporter and fundraiser for them.

For the past two years in August, Robert and his disabled eldest son, Alistair, have taken on a version of the Welsh three peaks challenge where they have trekked up and down the three highest mountains in Wales, namely Snowden, Cadir Idris and Pen y Fan raising much needed funds for the rescue. It was both a mental and physical challenge for the both of them.



have planned a gruelling multi point challenge. They intend to go to the Source of the River Wye high in the Cambrian Mountains and trek some 30 miles downstream to where it is navigable by canoe. They will then take 4 or 5 days to canoe from Glasbury to Chepstow. The last section of this is tidal and hard work. Finally, they will then walk the final distance to the official end of the Wye Valley outside Chepstow Castle.





This will not just be physically gruelling but a personal challenge for them both. Logan has his

own learning difficulties, with autism and hypermobility, which makes the fact he is willing to push so hard to raise funds for this cause even more amazing.

Hounds First Sighthound Rescue is a small but committed team who work tirelessly to rescue, rehabilitate and rehome Sighthounds of all types. They have rehomed over 450 dogs over the last 4 years. They are passionate about the education and support of dog owners, children and the wider public about the responsibilities of dog ownership and the importance of understanding dog language to reduce bite incidents in the UK

Come to Chepstow Castle on 7th and 14th July, and experience the thrills of the Last Siege of the Castle - 370 years ago, in 1648!

The Sealed Knot – the country's leading re-enactment company - will relive the siege and its fighting.

As well as marches, battles, and cannon fire, there will be musical entertainment and continuous living history displays outside the Castle. Whether you are Royalist or Roundhead, it will be fun for all the family!

The English Civil Wars in the 17th century saw many changes of fortune, and Chepstow Castle changed hands many times between the forces of Parliament and those loyal to King Charles.

By early 1648, the Parliamentarians were in charge, but in May that year it was retaken by Royalist forces led by Sir Nicholas Kemeys. Oliver Cromwell and his troops marched from Monmouth and forced entry to Chepstow through the Town Gate, but failed to take the castle. Cromwell soon marched on to Pembroke, leaving his man, Colonel Ewer, to lay siege to the castle.

Ewer set up cannon on the slopes opposite the castle and, two weeks after the start of the siege, began bombarding it. Though some of Kemeys' men wanted to surrender, Kemeys himself refused.

The bombardment continued, the walls were breached. and Kemeys himself was shot and killed. The Royalist prisoners were taken and kept under guard in St Mary's Church. Thereafter, the castle itself entered the last phase of its active military life as a garrison and arsenal.







This year's re-enactment begins on Saturday 7th July with Sir Nicholas Kemeys and his men marching from the Town Gate down the High Street with drums beating, to gain entry to the castle and raise the flag above its battlements.

The main event is on Saturday 14th July, when Cromwell's men led by Colonel Ewer march through the town to retake the castle.

After being addressed by Cromwell himself, the troops will lay siege to the castle, with guns blazing. When Kemeys refuses to surrender, the attackers will charge in through the castle gate. and the prisoners will be marched out.

The living history displays will start on Saturday morning, 14 July, with the march starting from the Town Gate at 1 pm, and the events concluding at 4 pm.

This event is supported by the Town Council and the Chepstow Society.

How Well Do YOU Know Your Town?

Chepstow's history goes back some 950 years and, this summer, knowledgeable members of the Chepstow Society will be leading walks around its historic town centre and riverside on Monday evenings in July.

The gentle walks, following the town's heritage trail, will be an opportunity to find out more about the town, as part of a small informal group.

They will start from outside the Tourist Information Centre, opposite the castle, at 7pm on Mondays 2nd July, 9th July, 16th July, 23rd July, and 30th July.

Everyone with an interest in Chepstow's history is welcome to come along. The walks will each last about 60-80 minutes, and cost £2 per head. No prior booking is necessary - just turn up.

The Chepstow Society is the town's civic amenity and historical society, and meets regularly every month in the Drill Hall. It is celebrating its 70th anniversary this year. The meeting on 18th July will have a talk on the history of Lundy Island and the Harman family. Everyone is welcome, with discounted entrance fees for members.

Local Community Matters

Eileen Grassby: A Fascinating Life

At the Chepstow School Remembrance Service held at St Mary's Priory last November, Chepstow Matters was delighted to meet and chat to local resident Eileen Grassby. It transpired that Eileen has enjoyed a very interesting life and I was pleased to visit with Eileen recently with a view to sharing her story.

Born in 1930 into an old Earlswood/Shirenewton farming family, she later became a pupil of Larkfield Grammar School and the College of Music and Drama in Cardiff. Eileen tells me her mother had a beautiful singing voice, that was never encouraged by her Grandmother. As a result Eileen's mother was adamant that Eileen should be given every opportunity to sing. When still young, she began to attract the attention of the local Dramatic and Operatic Society, building her reputation and appearing in many local productions. When she was old enough, Eileen's aunt took her up to London to auditions and she was first accepted into the popular Tiller Girls where she danced and sang. She was invited to perform in Manchester and then given the opportunity to travel to America, which she was just about to do when her then beau, proposed marriage. Peter Grassby was an Army Officer and local Chepstow man. He wanted Eileen to accompany him to Nigeria where he promised her a lavish lifestyle with servants. Eileen's mother was not happy that Eileen chose to marry Peter and go to Nigeria, instead of followering her career to America! After two years in Nigeria, Peter became an Officer in the New Malaya Army and after a short visit back home they set off to Malaya for four years, where their son Stephen was born. Not content with staying at home whilst in Nigeria and Malaya, Eileen took to teaching locals.

On the way home from their time in Malaya, Eileen and Peter explored Australia including Perth. Adelaide. Melbourne before picking up a passenger ship in Sydney which took them to New Zealand. Tahiti. Fiji, Panama through the canal to Trinidad and finally back to Britain. They bought a beautiful home in Chepstow, but sadly a slump in the market later meant they lost everything. Eileen used some money left to her by her father to buy Lower Hardwick House in c1962. This big old house opposite Bulwark corner was almost derelict at the time, but she ended up staying there for over 40

years. With Peter working away in London, Eileen worked several jobs in order to raise her children and bring the house back into a good state of repair. She worked in sales for the Coal Board and Adams Biscuits and in the evenings was the 'First Lady' at the Caldicot Castle Medieval Banquets where she would utilise her beautiful voice to entertain the quests.


She also spent time teaching at the Cardiff College of Music and in 1968 was interviewed and invited to participate with the brand new Welsh National Opera, with whom she performed for about 4 years. Sadly the touring with the WNO became too difficult as she had the children at home to care for.

Eileen's marriage to Peter faltered and he stayed in London. Eileen opened her home at Hardwick House as a B&B where she continued to bring up her two children, Stephen and Juliette, and became heavily involved in many local activities including the Cormeilles Twinning Association, and later with U3A where she became the convenor for Art Appreciation. She was also the convenor for her singing group that prospered under her professional guidance, organising charity concerts in Summer and

at Christmas. Eileen kept singing herself and a notable performance was in 1983 at the Chepstow Castle Pageant as Emma, Lady Hamilton playing Britannia.

A member of the Chepstow Society, Eileen worked with Keith Underwood for many years in what eventually became something of a business, arranging very popular monthly excursions. They also set up a regular summer Garden Party, for instance at High Glanau and Wyndcliffe Court, and an annual holiday. These events greatly raised the profile of the Society, but were greatly missed when Eileen and Keith retired.





Through her B&B Eileen met many interesting people, one of whom was a chap from New Zealand who later became a travel companion. They initially travelled around Wales together, before going to Paris for a week, back to visit his home in New Zealand, and then on to Honolulu and Los Angeles.

This was just one of many foreign adventures for Eileen, who just loved to travel. "After the children had left home and I had mostly retired, I used to run the B&B and save up until I could afford to go again! I am perfectly happy travelling on my own, I have met so many people over the years through singing and living abroad that I feel like I have friends wherever I go. I'm also quite a haggler and always travelled in the cheapest way I could, 'playing' on being an older lady travelling on my own to my best advantage. It's amazing what deals you can get!" Eileen told me with a twinkle in her eye.

Eileen's keen interest in travel and her many and varied experiences across Africa, India, Sri Lanka and Peru would make a book in themselves!

Throughout each of her adventures, Eileen kept a detailed diary of everything she did. They make interesting and enjoyable reading (extract above). The books Eileen showed me (which was not all by any means) detail trips to:

1986 - Los Angeles; 1988 - Toronto - Montreal - Quebec - Ottawa - Niagra - Boston; 1991 - India, New Zealand, Australia; 1992 - Singapore - Malaya; 1993 - Hong Kong; 1996 - Sri Lanka; 1997 - Delhi; 1997 - Seattle - Canadian Rockies 1998 - Mexico; 2000 - India (Southern); 2003 - Dubai - Singapore - Australia; 2009 - Cyprus

Asked what her favourite country of all was, Eileen responded "New Zealand, I truly love it there. It is so beautiful and very varied. You can have sunshine and warm seas, but snow on the mountains." One country Eileen has never visited is Russia. "I'm sorry to have not made it but my philosophy is to regret nothing. Be thankful for everything you have been able to do".





Saddened by the recent news that Herbert Lewis will soon be closing down in the town, Eileen remembered fondly how then directors Herbert, Fred and Blodwyn Griffith always supported her early professional career as a soloist by being present at her many performances. "Chepstow's just not like that any more, it's got so much bigger."

Gardening has been a particular obsession of Eileen's and she has created beautiful gardens, first at Lower Hardwick, then at her current home in Chepstow, which was a particular challenge, providing her with a blank canvas. Many species of trees, shrubs and plants have appeared, gathered from the outlets of the very many gardens she has visited.

Eileen is also an adventurous and gifted painter and is a member of Keith's Thursday art group in Sedbury. Her home is filled with beautiful paintings, both of her own and others, with her travels and her garden being a great inspiration for her art (photos above and below).

It was an absolute delight chatting with Eileen, who tells me that the hardest thing about growing older has been "learning to do nothing - I'm itching to do more than I am currently able".

What a fascinating and inspirational lady.



The Greenman Backpackers, Then and Now

Chepstow Matters was delighted to receive a call from Mick Lewis who owns and runs the Greenman Backpackers in Beaufort Square, inviting us down for a tour of the recently renovated building and the facilities it now offers.

Most people who have lived in the town before 2007 would know this building as "The Legion" or The "Seamstress shop". Indeed, before Mick and Ness bought and renovated it, that is exactly what it was. The then frontage was a small Seamstress shop with a bowed window, a bit like those you see on a Dickensian Christmas card. Above and behind was The Royal British Legion Club, who acquired it in 1957.

The building itself is quite unique, being made up of several individual buildings of different ages, all linked together to form a rather unusual premises. It is Grade 2* listed and has many unusual and fascinating features, which has made the renovations somewhat fun! The Seamstress shop window was replaced with a copy of the original Victorian frontage (there are pictures of the frontage in the museum - Peace Day 1919 - when it was The Post Office). Behind this frontage there is a medieval Moot Hall with a beautiful vaulted stone ceiling dating back to circa 1290, where you can find the 'Green Man' that the building is now named after. This area is still being sympathetically renovated and restored and plans are that it will eventually become a coffee lounge/wine bar.

There is a plaque on the pavement outside detailing some of the long history of the Moot Hall.

Built on top of the Moot Hall is a lovely example of a Georgian town house built around 1760, which was formerly the home of John Bowsher of Bowsher Watkins and Hodges (Timber Merchants and dealers in the town). John Bowsher is the man who met Lord Nelson in The Tree Cranes Inn on Hocker Hill Street in 1802 to sign the deal that sent huge amounts of oak to help build Nelsons fleet for the Napoleonic war. Bowsher left all his money to the town in his will. It has also been the home of The Fydell family. Thomas Fydell was a High Sheriff of Monmouthshire.

This part of the building needed a great deal of work to bring it back to a sound condition. The whole roof was renovated and re-tiled. Lath and plaster and ornate plaster mouldings have been repaired and replaced and both large curved





windows were completely dismantled and rebuilt (incidentally, they are made of wood and metal) and had to be soldered back together. Floors and carpentry detail was undertaken by skilled craftsmen too. Today, the second floor room is the hostelry's period lounge and the first floor is "The Widders Bar" named after "The Widders" Morris men, a group initiated by Mick back in 2001 when he moved back to Chepstow. The décor and retained features give the building a wonderful feel. Membership of The Widders Bar is open to all for a lifetime membership fee of just £5. This fee goes into a charity pot that helps raise money for several charities including The Poppy Appeal, SARA and McMillan Nurses.

Behind the Georgian building stands a large Victorian house (all connected) which Mick believes was known as Raglan Lodge This too needed extensive repair and detailed renovation to the roof and all parts of the building including windows, floors and timber features. The new communal kitchen and several bedrooms are housed here now. There is a new build to the side which homes the reception area and two new bedrooms. Behind the Victorian building stands a 1970's house and a walled car park, (the stone wall here was replaced also as most of the original had gone). The house now offers double en suite rooms and an outside kitchenette. There is a traditional Pizza oven in the garden and Mick and Ness host pizza evenings for Widders Bar members on dates throughout the

Restoring the building to such a high standard has not been an overnight job. Work on the project commenced in 2009 and the main work was completed by 2016, that is 7 years of dedicated and continuous attention to detail! Mick's vision for restoring the building was to offer a decent standard of accommodation at an affordable price. The accommodation offered comprises of double en suite rooms, en suite family rooms, en suite

family suite, twin rooms with private bathrooms and 5 dormitory rooms for backpackers, hikers and groups. The rooms are modern, comfortable and finished to a high standard whilst still maintaining an



historic feel to the premises with the walls adorned with many photos and paintings of historical figures and scenes reflecting this building's history, as well as showing Ness and Mick's love of local nature. As well as the large modern communal kitchen, there is a large luxurious television lounge, The Widders feature bar and a patio area with the BBQ and pizza oven. There is onsite parking, free WIFI in all rooms and a secure lock up for cycles. The Greenman welcomes all visitors, whether travelling solo, couples, families, groups, walkers and cyclists. Also a great place for visiting family so stay when you can't accommodate them in your own home and at a reasonable price!

"We love this building and feel it has been a great privilege to be able to restore it and bring it back to become an important addition to our town. We get people here from all over the world, all kinds of people doing all manner of things in our beautiful area.

South African school children received some life-changing news, thanks to the incredibly generous pupils of St John's onthe-Hill School in Chepstow.

A huge total of a £3,500 has been raised for the Isikhokelo Primary School in the Khayelitsha township, in Cape Town.

The St John's children worked incredibly hard to raise money for the school, which they visited on a recent three-week exchange trip to South Africa. They raised the money through a range of initiatives in the run up to the trip, including a sponsored read-a-thon, triathlons and car boot sales. They also organised a dedicated charity day at school, where the children experienced a traditional African dance and drum workshop.

Miss Stephanie George, the St John's teacher who organised the trip, said: "We have been visiting the school for a number of years and have built a close relationship with the wonderful teachers and children there. It is an underprivileged school and so we just wanted to help them. With the funds, we bought computers, printers, a year's supply of ink, laminators and projectors, writing books, pens and reading books. Visiting the school was an incredible experience for all of our children – we joined their lessons, sang and danced together and played football."

Anna Boyle, a Year 7 pupil at St John's, said: "This was such an amazing trip which I will never forget. I have made friends for life on this exchange and I will be forever grateful for this experience. I had the best time ever!"

The South African Exchange has run for more than 14 years and is a once-in-a-lifetime experience for Year 7 children at St John's. The children were taken on lots of amazing trips in Cape Town, including: a trip to Table Mountain by cable car, visits to the Cool-Runnings Toboggan Park, A Segway

tour in Stellenbosch, a trip to Cape Point, Ostrich Encounters and an educational visit to Robben Island, where Nelson Mandela was infamously held prisoner.

They then travelled by plane to East London where they had a few days at the Stirling Primary School, learning the Afrikaans and Xhosa languages and playing the Marimbas. They also took part in Jonginenge activities, which included surfing, sandboarding, canoeing and rock climbing. However, the pinnacle of the trip was surely the three-day safari - the children spotted four out of the big five animals (rhinoceros, lion, elephant and buffalo); indeed, they were fortunate enough to have a VERY close encounter with the lions!
