

## **Wye Valley Challenge 2018**

Robert and his wife Noreen, have been involved with a national dog rescue charity, Houndsfirst Sighthound Rescue since 2013 being a rescuer, foster carer, adopter, transporter and fundraiser for them.





For the past two years, Robert and his disabled,
Alistair, have taken on a version of the Welsh three peaks challenge
where they have trekked up and down the three highest mountains in

Wales, namely Snowden, Cadir Idris and Pen y Fan raising much needed funds for the rescue. It was both a mental and physical challenge for the both of them.

For this year's challenge Robert wanted to do something different, so this August Robert and his youngest son, Logan, have planned a gruelling multi point challenge. They intend to go to the Source of the River Wye high in the Cambrian Mountains and trek some 30 miles downstream to where it is navigable by cance. They will then take 4 or 5 days to cance from Glasbury to Chepstow. The last section of this is tidal and hard work. Finally, they will then walk the final distance to the official end of the Wye Valley outside Chepstow Castle. This will not just be physically gruelling but a personal challenge for them both. Logan has his own learning difficulties, with autism and hypermobility, which makes the fact he is willing to push so hard to raise funds for this cause even more amazing.

## Secret Chepstow, Louise Wyatt

Chepstow's location by a crossing of the River Wye, close to the Severn estuary has meant that the Monmouthshire town has always occupied a strategically important position. A Norman castle still stands above the town and until the 1960s the road bridge across the river was a major routeway between Wales and England, as was Brunel's Chepstow railway bridge across the Wye.

Secret Chepstow explores the history of the town from its early history as an Iron Age and Welsh settlement on the border with the Anglo-Saxon kingdom of Mercia, through the Norman invasion of the Welsh Marches and the construction of the castle, to the present day, revealing unusual stories, tucked away historical buildings and remarkable characters along the way. The castle, with its stone Great Tower still stands, extended in the 12th century by William Marshal, but there is also an abandoned mediaeval village by the town with the ruins of its church, and the town was also linked to nearby Tintern Abbey, which became a popular picturesque tourist destination in the 18th century. Chepstow's location on the River Wye has shaped its history; the Old Wye Bridge was the lowest crossing point of the river until the Severn Bridge was built. Its importance as a port is also revealed, as a centre for the wine and salmon trade as well as shipbuilding, and the author also investigates everyday life in the town, including its workhouse.

Secret Chepstow explores the less well-known episodes and characters in the history of the town through the centuries. With tales of remarkable characters, unusual events and tucked-away buildings, it will appeal to all those with an

interest in local history. The book is due to be released on 15th August and is priced at £14.99

## **Armistice Centenary - Monmouthshire Remembers**

School children across
Monmouthshire who are part of the
world's largest youth organisation,
are embarking on events to
commemorate the centenary of the
end of WW1.

Across the county, 811 youth members of the Scouting association from 6 year old beavers to 18 year old explorers and 206 uniformed adult leaders will take part in various activities throughout the summer months.

A commemorative badge competition is open to all uniformed members of Monmouthshire district scouts, with the inclusion of the words "Monmouthshire Remembers 1918-2018" being the only dictation to an otherwise open space for creativity. All entries were returned by the end of June and shall be judged by members of the Royal British Legion, who will manufacture the winning design onto badges, in time for the armistice centenary in November. The winning designer will also have the opportunity to meet members of the Royal Legion to talk about their art work.

A larger scale event, will see every uniformed member of the Monmouthshire district creating by hand, a ceramic poppy, with each representing a Monmouthshire resident who has lost their life in conflict over the past 100 years. Each poppy will be stamped with the name of a fallen serviceman and the date they fell and will act as a symbolic piece used to demonstrate the human cost of war. Following local Remembrance services, there shall be a district scout event held on 18th November





these poppies shall be a poignant focus. They shall remain in circulation at significant venues throughout the year until Remembrance day next year, when it is hoped they will be on public display somewhere in Cardiff.

Monmouthshire district scouts have secured the support and co-operation of primary and secondary schools across the county, who agreed to release children during the last week of June and beginning of July. Three hour slots were co-ordinated, during which time local comprehensive schools hosted youth members wishing to create and in some cases fire, their ceramic poppy, all whilst being filmed by the BBC and S4C (photos above).

two World Wars are studied in history lessons, yet many have personal family connections with present day service personel, some of whom have lost their lives in conflicts since the Great War.

The Scouting association has a long standing connection to the British services, with their founder Robert Baden-Powell holding the rank of Major-General in the British army. Baden-Powell

connection to the British services, with their founder Robert Baden-Powell holding the rank of Major-General in the British army. Baden-Powell served in Indian and Africa between 1876–1910 and amongst other decorations for service, was invested as a Companion of the Order of the Bath (CB), which is the fourth most senior of the British Orders of Chivalry. At the age of fifty seven, Baden-Powell put himself at the disposal of the war office at the outbreak of WWI in 1914, but he was not given a command. There are thought to be rumours that this was due to Lord Kitchener saying at the time that "he could lay his hand on several competent divisional generals, but could not find anyone who could carry on the invaluable work of the Boy Scouts."

So as members of the scouting association across Monmouthshire embark on these commemorative events, it is hoped that the sacrifice and human cost of conflict and war is made a present and personal reality, which will remain in the hearts of generations to come.

## **Eileen Grassby: A Fascinating Life**

At the Chepstow School Remembrance Service held at St Mary's Priory last November, Chepstow Matters was delighted to meet and chat to local resident Eileen Grassby. It transpired that Eileen has enjoyed a very interesting life and I was pleased to visit with Eileen recently with a view to sharing her story.

Born in 1930 into an old Earlswood/Shirenewton farming family, she later became a pupil of Larkfield Grammar School and the College of Music and Drama in Cardiff. Eileen tells me her mother had a beautiful singing voice, that was never encouraged by her Grandmother. As a result Eileen's mother was adamant that Eileen should be given every opportunity to sing. When still young, she began to attract the attention of the local Dramatic and Operatic Society, building her reputation and appearing in many local productions. When she was old enough, Eileen's aunt took her up to London to auditions and she was first accepted into the popular Tiller Girls where she danced and sang. She was invited to perform in Manchester and then given the opportunity to travel to America, which she was just about to do when her then beau, proposed marriage. Peter Grassby was an Army Officer and local Chepstow man. He wanted Eileen to accompany him to Nigeria where he promised her a lavish lifestyle with servants. Eileen's mother was not happy that Eileen chose to marry Peter and go to Nigeria, instead of followering her career to America! After two years in Nigeria, Peter became an Officer in the New Malaya Army and after a short visit back home they set off to Malaya for four years, where their son Stephen was born. Not content with staying at home whilst in Nigeria and Malaya, Eileen took to teaching locals.

On the way home from their time in Malaya, Eileen and Peter explored Australia including Perth. Adelaide. Melbourne before picking up a passenger ship in Sydney which took them to New Zealand. Tahiti. Fiji, Panama through the canal to Trinidad and finally back to Britain. They bought a beautiful home in Chepstow, but sadly a slump in the market later meant they lost everything. Eileen used some money left to her by her father to buy Lower Hardwick House in c1962. This big old house opposite Bulwark corner was almost derelict at the time, but she ended up staying there for over 40

years. With Peter working away in London, Eileen worked several jobs in order to raise her children and bring the house back into a good state of repair. She worked in sales for the Coal Board and Adams Biscuits and in the evenings was the 'First Lady' at the Caldicot Castle Medieval Banquets where she would utilise her beautiful voice to entertain the quests.


She also spent time teaching at the Cardiff College of Music and in 1968 was interviewed and invited to participate with the brand new Welsh National Opera, with whom she performed for about 4 years. Sadly the touring with the WNO became too difficult as she had the children at home to care for.

Eileen's marriage to Peter faltered and he stayed in London. Eileen opened her home at Hardwick House as a B&B where she continued to bring up her two children, Stephen and Juliette, and became heavily involved in many local activities including the Cormeilles Twinning Association, and later with U3A where she became the convenor for Art Appreciation. She was also the convenor for her singing group that prospered under her professional guidance, organising charity concerts in Summer and

at Christmas. Eileen kept singing herself and a notable performance was in 1983 at the Chepstow Castle Pageant as Emma, Lady Hamilton playing Britannia.

A member of the Chepstow Society, Eileen worked with Keith Underwood for many years in what eventually became something of a business, arranging very popular monthly excursions. They also set up a regular summer Garden Party, for instance at High Glanau and Wyndcliffe Court, and an annual holiday. These events greatly raised the profile of the Society, but were greatly missed when Eileen and Keith retired.





Through her B&B Eileen met many interesting people, one of whom was a chap from New Zealand who later became a travel companion. They initially travelled around Wales together, before going to Paris for a week, back to visit his home in New Zealand, and then on to Honolulu and Los Angeles.

This was just one of many foreign adventures for Eileen, who just loved to travel. "After the children had left home and I had mostly retired, I used to run the B&B and save up until I could afford to go again! I am perfectly happy travelling on my own, I have met so many people over the years through singing and living abroad that I feel like I have friends wherever I go. I'm also quite a haggler and always travelled in the cheapest way I could, 'playing' on being an older lady travelling on my own to my best advantage. It's amazing what deals you can get!" Eileen told me with a twinkle in her eye.

Eileen's keen interest in travel and her many and varied experiences across Africa, India, Sri Lanka and Peru would make a book in themselves!

Throughout each of her adventures, Eileen kept a detailed diary of everything she did. They make interesting and enjoyable reading (extract above). The books Eileen showed me (which was not all by any means) detail trips to:

1986 - Los Angeles; 1988 - Toronto - Montreal - Quebec - Ottawa - Niagra - Boston; 1991 - India, New Zealand, Australia; 1992 - Singapore - Malaya; 1993 - Hong Kong; 1996 - Sri Lanka; 1997 - Delhi; 1997 - Seattle - Canadian Rockies 1998 - Mexico; 2000 - India (Southern); 2003 - Dubai - Singapore - Australia; 2009 - Cyprus

Asked what her favourite country of all was, Eileen responded "New Zealand, I truly love it there. It is so beautiful and very varied. You can have sunshine and warm seas, but snow on the mountains." One country Eileen has never visited is Russia. "I'm sorry to have not made it but my philosophy is to regret nothing. Be thankful for everything you have been able to do".

Throughout all her varied and extensive travels, Eileen has always kept a home in Chepstow.



Saddened by the recent news that Herbert Lewis will soon be closing down in the town, Eileen remembered fondly how then directors Herbert, Fred and Blodwyn Griffith always supported her early professional career as a soloist by being present at her many performances. "Chepstow's just not like that any more, it's got so much bigger."

Gardening has been a particular obsession of Eileen's and she has created beautiful gardens, first at Lower Hardwick, then at her current home in Chepstow, which was a particular challenge, providing her with a blank canvas. Many species of trees, shrubs and plants have appeared, gathered from the outlets of the very many gardens she has visited.



Both Finley and Joseph should be very proud of themselves having qualified through the Welsh Championships and British Semi-Finals to then be ranked in the top six at the British Finals.


