

Winterbourne **Down War Memorial**

The War Memorial in the **Churchyard at Winterbourne** Down has been leaning at about 11 degrees for as long as anyone can remember. Thanks to a generous grant from the War Memorial Trust, it has now been restored to the vertical and repaired. Thanks also goes to the Parish Council who as

well as recommending the application to the trust, have also contributed to the costs.

The War Memorial was erected in 1919 by Mr Hugh Coles, in memory of his two sons. He and his wife kindly allowed the names of sixteen parishioners who fell in the Great War to be inscribed on panels on the base of the memorial. Later, after the Second World War, the name of their grandson D.G.G. Coles was added, with those of his aircrew who died with him in 1942.

The Memorial will now be cleaned which should make the inscriptions more legible. TWDBT would then welcome the help of any volunteer artists to paint in the letters.

On Tuesday mornings a small team from the trust do their best to keep the Churchyard tidy, any extra help with this or the painting would be much appreciated.





Winterbourne Barn is an outstanding and unique building of national importance. All other surviving medieval great tithe barns were built by the monastic estates, universities, or the Knights Hospitaliers, but Winterbourne Barn was built by Thomas de Bradeston in 1342, just a few years before the Black Death first hit in England. Only three barns of this scale are recorded as built by gentry' families, and Winterbourne is the only survivor. The Barn was built using the green-timber construction methods which were the cutting-edge technology of that period. It is a fine example of a raised-cruck construction and one of the largest and earliest raised-cruck barns.

The current conservation programme on the New Pit was completed in February, leaving just a few finishing touches on the tipplers. This has been partly funded by a £20,000 grant from the Ibstock Enovert Environmental Trust, with the balance coming from our own resources. The Avon Industrial Buildings Trust (AIBT) would like to thank the trust for their financial assistance, and also Ibstock, the landowners, for delivering some more special bricks for use in the rebuilding. The brickwork around all of the windows and the door of the Horizontal Engine House has been rebuilt, and the photograph on the right shows the completed entrance to the building.

Historic England gave us a grant to produce four interpretation boards for the site. These have been delivered and are in the process of being erected. One board has been placed beside the eastern half mine wheel (photo below). It has brief descriptions of some of the mining practises of the 1800s. A second, covering the AIBT and its current and past projects, has been fixed to the outside of the storage container, together with a board from the Ibstock Enovert Trust. The other two boards will be placed against the boundary fences of the Old and

> New Pits and will describe their layouts.

> We have to say a thank you to the drone enthusiast who took some photos of the site at the beginning of April. He has very kindly given



us copies, and they help to put the site in perspective. The one featured above. shows the Old Pit on the right and the New

Pit on the left. The eag-ended boiler is the object at the centre of the bottom edge. The meandering grey of the cycle path can be seen above the New Pit. The line of the old railway tracks can be seen at the top of the photo, marking the limit of the Lyde Green development. Between the two are the pond area, and the location of two cottages that appear on the Ordnance Survey maps from 1881. The 1911 census records one of the inhabitants as a general smith and another as a coal miner.




