Chepstow School: 'Outstanding GCSE Results'

Chepstow School Ysgol Cas~gwent

Press Release: We are thrilled that our students have achieved outstanding GCSE results once again this year. Students have made tremendous progress in the first year of the new challenging GCSE exams in Wales, in qualifications that have been designed to be more rigorous and robust.

Students excelled in particular in Science and STEM qualifications. 84% of the cohort achieved A*-C in combined Science GCSE. Single Sciences saw exceptional performance in Physics where 61% achieved an A* or A at GCSE; 45% achieved an A* or A in Chemistry; and 41% achieved an A* or A in Biology. 29% of students achieved an A* or A in ICT, with 85% achieving A*-C. 67% of students achieved the core qualifications of A*-C grades in English, Maths and Science qualifications.

Students sat the Welsh Baccalaureate Skills Challenge for the first time this year, and 100% of the cohort achieved A*-C, and 19% achieved A* or A grades in this subject.

Performance at the top grades has continued to be exceptional this year. Nearly a quarter of the cohort achieved 5 or more A*-A grades, and 10% achieved A* - A grades in 8 or more GCSE subjects. 100% of students have achieved qualifications, and all have a chosen progression route.

There are plenty of ways to get involved in the event between now and November, from crocheting or knitting poppies for our 'Curtain of Remembrance' to painting a pebble for the huge community piece of art we are creating – there's something for everyone!'

Ken Davies, Chairman of The Royal British Legion adds, 'We are delighted that Claire is doing this and we are pleased to be supporting her in her efforts. It is so fitting to hold this event in Moot Hall & the Greenman Backpackers, the former Royal British Legion building. We wish her every success'.

Secret Chepstow, Louise Wyatt

Chepstow's location by a crossing of the River Wye, close to the Severn estuary has meant that the Monmouthshire town has always occupied a strategically important position. A Norman castle still stands above the town and until the 1960s the road bridge across the river was a major routeway between Wales and England, as was Brunel's Chepstow railway bridge across the Wye.


Secret Chepstow explores the history of the town from its early history as an Iron Age and Welsh settlement on the border with the Anglo-Saxon kingdom of Mercia, through the Norman invasion of the Welsh Marches and the construction of the castle, to the present day, revealing unusual stories, tucked away historical buildings and remarkable characters along the way. The castle, with its stone Great Tower still stands, extended in the 12th century by William Marshal, but there is also an abandoned mediaeval village by the town with the ruins of its church, and the town was also linked to nearby Tintern Abbey, which became a popular picturesque tourist destination in the 18th century. Chepstow's location on the River Wye has shaped its history; the Old Wye Bridge was the lowest crossing point of the river until the Severn Bridge was built. Its importance as a port is also revealed, as a centre for the wine and salmon trade as well as shipbuilding, and the author also investigates everyday life in the town, including its workhouse.

Secret Chepstow explores the less well-known episodes and characters in the history of the town through the centuries. With tales of remarkable characters, unusual events and tucked-away buildings, it will appeal to all those with an interest in local history. The book is priced at £14.99

Ways to Peace Festival

Fri 21st- Sat 22nd September, 2018 at Tintern Abbey

The Ways to Peace: inner peace, peace with nature and peace amongst peoples – these themes will be explored through music, speech (words) and the moving body, throughout a two-day festival, set in the sublime Tintern Abbey.

Ways to Peace is being produced by Tintern Festivals Association as a contribution to the United Nations' International Day of Peace. The aim is of the festival to encourage ideals of peace within and amongst all nations and peoples.

The festival will coincide with Cadw's Heritage Open Doors weekend, so visitors will have the opportunity to connect with peace in a variety of talks, dance, poetry, drumming, and meditation workshops. Dance workshops on the Saturday will be lead by Cardiff's own Rubicon dance company, and they will be performing two unique dance pieces – all for free!

The opening concert, The Spirit of Peace, on Friday, September 21st, will feature keynote speakers of outstanding international repute: Indian activist and former Jain monk Satish Kumar and peace builder and Nicaraguan advocate of human rights, Bianca Jagger.

The talks will be followed by Eisteddfod winners, Côr Caerdydd, singing excerpts from Sir Karl Jenkins' The Peacemakers and Armed Man, a Mass for Peace. A torch-lit Buddhist meditation led by Andy Wistreich in the nave of the Abbey will conclude the evening. Ticketed event. (Ticketed event £12, £10 concs.)

Connecting with Peace on Saturday, September 22nd 11am-4pm, there will be a rich variety of activites & events including 'Peace as a Way of Life' with Satish Kumar, 'Harmony in the Wheel of Time' with Andy Wistreich, Djabot African drumming group, Buddhist meditation led by Ven. Chjoe Lama Rabsang, Japanese tea ceremony and flower arranging, Tales of the World with Cardiff storyteller Richard Berry, Earth mandala creation with Fiona Frank, Parva Strings Quartet, young and old Poets and Philosophers for Peace, to experience and celebrate the many ways to inner and outer peace, and harmony with Nature, in a world of continuing conflict.

The Saturday night concert, Working for Peace, features Renewal Gospel Choir, the UK's leading Green poet Martin Kiszko, and kora player Mamadou Cissokho. 

School children across Monmouthshire who are part of the world's largest youth organisation, are commemorating the centenary of the end of WW1.

Across the county, 811 youth members of the Scouting association from 6 year old beavers to 18 year old explorers and 206 uniformed adult leaders have taken part in various activities throughout the summer months.

Every uniformed member of the Monmouthshire district has created by hand, a ceramic poppy, with each representing a Monmouthshire resident who has lost their life in conflict over the past 100 years. Each poppy is stamped with the name of a fallen serviceman and the date they fell and will act as a symbolic piece used to demonstrate the human cost of war.

Following local Remembrance services, there shall be a district scout event held on 18th November at Raglan Castle, where these poppies shall be a poignant focus. They shall remain in circulation at significant venues throughout the year until Remembrance day next year, when it is hoped they will be on public display somewhere in Cardiff.

A chance encounter with HRH the Prince of Wales and HRH the Dutchess of Cornwall at the start of July, gave members of Monmouthshire Scouting the opportunity to showcase their proposal to create 1200 ceramic poppies. The Royal couple were so impressed with the scale of the project that they too insisted in getting their hands dirty and moulded the clay to perfection, even endorsing the base of their poppy with an HRH approval. The Royal poppy shall be included in those placed at Raglan Castle on 18th November.

For the younger members of the association the two World Wars are studied in history lessons. yet many have personal family connections with present day service personel, some of whom have

conflicts since the Great War. The Scouting association has

lost their lives in

a long standing connection to the British services. with their founder

Robert Baden-Powell holding the rank of Major-General in the British army.

Baden-Powell served in Indian and Africa between 1876–1910 and amongst other decorations for service, was invested as a Companion of the Order of the Bath (CB), which is the fourth most senior of the British Orders of Chivalry.

At the age of fifty seven, Baden-Powell put himself at the disposal of the war office at the outbreak of WWI in 1914, but he was not given a command. There are thought to be rumours that this was due to Lord Kitchener saying at the time that "he could lay his hand on several competent divisional generals, but could not find anyone who could carry on the invaluable work of the Bov Scouts."

It is hoped that the sacrifice and human cost of conflict and war is made a present and personal reality by undertaking these commemorative events, which will remain in the hearts of generations to come.




