Chepstow Apple Day, 28th October 11.30-4.30 at the Drill Hall

Chepstow's Apple Day will this year be held on Sunday 28th October. This will be the tenth Apple Day event organised by Chepstow Town Council and Transition Chepstow in celebration of all things apple-related.

There will be cider, apples and juice on sale, alongside apple pastries and preserves, as well as light lunches and refreshments. There will be a range of activities for adults and children, including the ever-popular Longest Apple Peel competition, children's craft and art, face painting and more. Have a go at guessing the number of apples in the basket, or the weight of the pumpkin, or writing your very own apple limerick. Entertainment will be provided by local singing groups and the Widders dancers.

One of the highlights of the day is always the Apple Cookery Competition, which this year will be judged by Anthony Barnes, Executive Chef at the Marriott St Pierre. Mr Barnes will be looking for apple dishes, sweet or savoury, which look appealing, have a great flavour and have a distinctive story to tell. There are prizes of up to £50, so get out your favourite recipe! We are also collecting apple recipes with a view to publishing a book next year, so do share yours by emailing it to appleday@transitionchepstow.org.uk.

If you have inherited a mystery apple tree and would like to know what variety it is, Apple Day gives you the chance to find out. The Marcher Apple Identification team will be there, so bring along three apples, if possible with the leaves still attached. And if you would like to make your own juice or cider, bring along your apples for pressing. Don't forget to bring along a container for the juice too! If you fancy having a go at making cider for the first time, there will be experts on hand to talk to.

For the first time this year, the activities will be spilling out into one of the nearby community orchards, with traditional activities such as apple bobbing and a chance to talk about winter pruning. Chepstow has 12 of these community miniorchards, initiated by Chepstow Town Council and maintained by Transition Chepstow.

Anyone is welcome to pick the apples in the community orchards, which also provide a haven for wildlife. They are now linked by the Orchard

and Wildlife Trail

– a walk of up to 6
miles taking in lovely
views and parts of
the Wales Coast
Path. Find out more

It is so fitting to hold this event in Moot Hall & the Greenman Backpackers, the former Royal British Legion building. We wish her every success'.



An Insight into St John's

Summer Success for Tidenham Parish Church

As the summer drew to a close, a unique event took place in Tidenham - the church car park was blessed by Bishop Robert from Tewkesbury. It was a short, but fitting, conclusion to all of the hard work by the Friends and the community in creating a car park. It was followed by a short celebration with Prosecco and light refreshments thanking all involved – not least the workers, builders, volunteers and Friends who have overseen this development. Along with the many volunteers, generous donors and fundraising efforts, the necessary £70,000 was raised to fund this first stage of the planned major refurbishment of the historic Parish Church.



This was an essential first step of a much larger project to make the church fit for the next generation and enable it to be used more widely for community activities. This phase will include roof repairs, improvements to the heating and lighting, providing wheelchair access, and putting in facilities such as a kitchen and toilets. It

will also give space for a parish office. Applications for Grants for this phase could only be submitted following completion of the car park – so the £70,000 aboe was raised entirely by the fundraising activities organised by the Friends of Tidenham Church –Summer Flower and Christmas Tree Festivals, concerts, Art Show, Quiz Nights, drama productions, bequests, donations – a truly magnificent achievement since 2014.

The Summer Flower Festival in July commemorated the conclusion of World War One in 1918. The Church was magnificently decorated inside and out, with 25 floral displays each depicting an aspect of the 1914-1918 period — along with hundreds of knitted and crocheted poppies done by the community which decorated the inside and exterior of the Church at the Lych Gate, lower gate, Porch and pathways. A superb theatre production, "No Young Men" by Go2Theatre was performed for 2 evenings during the Festival, and made deep impressions on everyone who attended. The small group made stunning use of the building and the production was written and produced by group members.

Tidenham Church now looks forward to the Christmas Tree Festival, dates/viewing times will be announced in shortly!





Remembrance Commemoration Sunday 4th November, 3.00pm at St Mary's Priory Church, Chepstow



Chepstow Choral Society is now rehearsing for its autumn season, and a full programme of great music beckons! In addition to our regular 3-concerts per year programme, we are privileged and proud this year to be organising Chepstow's special Remembrance commemorating the centenary of the end of the Great War, World War I, which will take place on Sunday 4th November, 3,00pm at St Mary's Priory Church, Chepstow.

At the beginning people said not to worry since it would all be over by Christmas. Thousands of young men flocked to the recruiting offices to join up and the comrades marched off to the front-line smiling. But as the trenches and barbed wire reached out for mile after mile; after the mud of Flanders fields, after the shells exploding around their ears, the pals realised that this was to be a very different war to any experienced previously.

By the time the fighting ceased at 11 o'clock on 11 November 1918 over 700,000 British soldiers had perished while overall casualties totalled some 37 million. The carnage of this war to end all wars had resulted in families throughout the land losing fathers, sons, relatives, neighbours and friends.

For this special commemorative event, the town has assembled the Chepstow Choral Society, the Buglers of 1 Rifles, a solo violinist, Children of Chepstow School and a number of local personalities who will read previously unseen letters from the front line, poems of the time all interspersed with relevant musical pieces by The Choral Society. Standards will be presented. Medals may be worn. This will be both a reflective and uplifting occasion for everyone present, many of whom will wish to remember those who fell or were injured in that war.

Entrance is free, although there will be a retiring collection for voluntary donations to the Armed Forces charity, SSAFA. We hope that you will be able to join in with this unique event.



The Great War: Britain's Efforts and Ideals

First World War propaganda prints by celebrated artists of the day go on display at both Chepstow Museum & Abergavenny Museum

As soldiers marched to war in summer 1914, most of them expected to be back home within a few weeks and surely by Christmas. But instead, the fighting continued and intensified over years and the First World War was fought not just by soldiers on battlefields, but also by citizens at home.

"The Great War: Britain's Efforts and Ideals" a striking set of prints, being shown now in exhibitions at Chepstow and Abergavenny Museums in Monmouthshire, was commissioned by the British Government in 1917 as propaganda. After three years of hard fighting and unprecedented loss of life, the images were intended to encourage a war-weary public and raise support for the war effort. They show modern political propaganda in its early stages.

Designed in two sets of portfolios, "Ideals" and "Efforts", the "Ideals" addressed the reasons why Britain was at war and what it aimed to achieve. These images are dramatic and symbolic and use historical and mythological figures to express ideas.

The "Efforts" prints illustrate some of the activities of the war effort. Nine artists were commissioned to produce six prints, each taking on a different theme, such as Making Soldiers, Building Aircraft or Work on the Land.


As images of propaganda, they purposely avoided showing the horrors and atrocities of war, as was typical of the work of the official war artists. The works, by some of the most celebrated artists of the day such as Augustus John and Frank Brangwyn, are very different, reflecting the varying trends in British art at the time. The artists did not have full artistic freedom, they were given their subjects and each image had to pass censorship regulations. The prints were produced as a limited edition of 200 and were first exhibited in London in July 1917. This set of prints was donated to Amgueddfa Cymru – National Museum Wales in 1919 by the Ministry of Information.

Now, thanks to partnership with the Amgueddfa Cymru – National Museum Wales, they are being shown in two complementary exhibitions so that the collection of over 60 prints can be seen together. At Chepstow Museum, the 'Efforts' prints shown include 'Building Ships' and 'Transport by Sea' as the town was transformed by the establishment of two National Shipyards during the War; and 'Tending the Wounded' as the Museum's home, Gwy House became a Red Cross Hospital for Wounded Soldiers from 1915. Both Museums share the Efforts, 'Making Soldiers' 'Making Sailors' and 'Women's Works' as well as the large and impressive "Ideals" series of prints.

The exhibitions run until 6th January 2019 so there's plenty of time to see the whole collection. Both museums are open daily 11am-4pm (Abergavenny Museum is closed on Wednesdays) and admission is FREE.


