The Triangle Memorial Garden...

Has suddenly come back to life after the recent rain! Lots of lovely wild flowers and poppies are blooming, the rosemary has revived after the drought, and we shall shortly be planting some bulbs there to flower in the Spring.

It's never too early... to think about Christmas! On Wednesday 28 November we're holding a Christmas Coffee Morning and Gift Sale at the Brockeridge Centre. News from Winterbourne Down WI

We had a most interesting Speaker at our September meeting, when

Christine Coles from Chipping Sodbury gave us an informative talk on Victorian Botanical Adventurers.

She rightly pointed out that people over the centuries have been interested in exploring and finding different plants for their land and gardens. Back in the 18C Joseph Banks went with Captain Cook to Australia to find and return with new plants. David Douglas went to North America and found a fir tree, which was named after him being The Douglas Fir.

In the UK we only had three native conifers being Yew, Juniper and Scotts Pine. Botanical explorers would go off for several months or even years travelling into dangerous countries, territories, land swamps, putting themselves at risk health and safety wise, all to gain the accolade of finding a new tree or plant to take back to their motherland.

In Victorian times the wealthy middle class people would buy and build mansion houses and villas with rolling landscapes and lakes, all to demonstrate their wealth. Waddiscombe Manor, at that time, employed twelve gardeners, who over a two week period were instructed to plant 100,000 bedding plants just to have one of the best gardens!

Sir Joseph Hooker, a scientific plant hunter and known to be one of the greatest botanists of that time, travelled to Nepal and returned with the first Camellias, Azaleas, and Rhododendrons, which were a fashionable plant to have at that time. He suffered with altitude sickness, had leaches clinging to his legs and yet continued through cold, wet winter and hot, sticky summer conditions. On his return he became Director General at Kew Gardens!

Robert Fortune was sent to China and returned with Peonies, Hydrangeas and Chrysanthemums. He found Forsythias, Mahonias and Japanese Anemonies. He caught yellow fever and had to fight off pirates whilst on his return trip home.

Thomas and William Lobb were also plant hunters, and Thomas was sent to the East Indies to find Orchids, Parlour Palms and Fly Catcher plants. William found seeds of the Monkey Puzzle Tree. He sent back 3,000 seeds which were then sold at £10 per seed! He also discovered the Giant Redwood in North America.

All these people experienced very difficult conditions in order to introduce numerous new plants, shrubs and trees to this country. A most interesting speaker.

As the long sultry days of summer come to an end, autumn approaches and our diaries begin to fill with regular activities and new initiatives beginning in the Fromeside Benefice area. The light of day shortens and we are reminded (constantly)

that Christmas is approaching and we need to book early to see Father Christmas – what?! Before you turn to the next page in disgust. I invite you to stop for a moment and question – how easy do you find rest to equip you for the journey of life? I expect many of our readers like to holiday abroad, or nearer home, sunbathing, sightseeing, cruising, walking or activity breaks, especially if you have children! Whatever you choose, getting away from normal routine can help to re-energise and being pampered isn't a bad thing!

Winterbourne Down War **Memorial**

The War Memorial in the **Churchyard at Winterbourne** Down has been leaning at about 11 degrees for as long as anvone can remember. Thanks to a generous grant from the War Memorial Trust, it has now been restored to the vertical and repaired. Thanks also goes to the Parish Council who as well as recommending the application to the trust, have also contributed to the costs.

The War Memorial was erected in 1919 by Mr Hugh Coles, in memory of his two sons. He and his wife kindly allowed the names of sixteen parishioners who fell in the Great War to be inscribed on panels on the base of the memorial. Later, after the Second World War, the name of their grandson D.G.G. Coles was added, with those of his aircrew who died with him in 1942. Again, the family were kind enough to permit the names of two local men to be added, one of whom died shortly after being invalided out of the army, and the other who drowned whilst in the

The Winterbourne Down Burial Trust (TWDBT) made the application for the grant and are overseeing the restoration. Their records say the memorial is a copy of an ancient cross standing in another Gloucestershire Churchvard (but they don't know which?).

The Memorial will now be cleaned which should make the inscriptions more legible. TWDBT would then welcome the help of any volunteer artists to paint in the letters.

husband, Bill, were two of the founder members of the Club, formed in 1991. She is still a regular Scrabble player at the Club and also enjoys the social side of the afternoon



















As well enjoying the varied entertainment, it was great to catch up with some of the local groups and businesses we regularly feature in the community magazine.




