# **Chepstow Remembers**

Sunday 4th November, 3.00pm at St Mary's Priory Church, Chepstow



At the beginning people said not to worry since it would all be over by Christmas. Thousands of young men flocked to the recruiting offices to join up and the comrades marched off to the frontline smiling. But as the trenches and barbed wire reached out for mile after mile; after the mud of Flanders fields, after the shells exploding around their ears, the pals realised that this was to be a very different war to any experienced previously.

By the time the fighting ceased at 11 o'clock on 11 November 1918 over 700,000 British soldiers had perished while overall casualties totalled some 37 million. The carnage of this war to end all wars had resulted in families throughout the land losing fathers, sons, relatives, neighbours and

In this centenary year we will all reflect on the end of that terrible war and in Chepstow a special event is to be staged to commemorate this most important occasion. The town has assembled The Chepstow Choral Society, the Buglers of 1 Rifles, a solo violinist, Children of Chepstow School and a number of local personalities who will read previously unseen letters from the front line, poems of the time all interspersed with relevant musical pieces by The Choral Society. Standards will be presented. Medals may be worn. This will be both a reflective and uplifting occasion for everyone present, many of whom will wish to remember those who fell or were injured in that war.

This very special Commemoration will be staged at 3pm on Sunday 4th November 2018 in St Mary's

Church, Chepstow. Entrance is free, although there will be a retiring collection for the Armed Forces charity, SSAFA. We hope that you will be able to join in with this unique event.

# Mud and Glory: The Art of World War One Lecture by Eleanor Bird

Sunday 4th November 2.30pm at The Drill Hall, Lower Church Street, Chepstow NP16 5HJ In association with the exhibition at Chepstow & Abergavenny Museum and the Centenary Commemorations of the Armistice

As soldiers struggled in the trenches and battlefields of the First World War, the British Government decided that a pictorial record must be kept of this 'War to End All Wars' – both as a warning to the future, and as a means of keeping those who remained at home in touch. The artist Paul Nash believed he could be "a messenger who will bring back word from the men who are fighting." It is an art which still speaks to us today and should be a messenger for our own future.

Although photography could capture the hard facts, only art could express the true experience of life on the front line. A group of official War Artists were appointed, many of whom had already fought in the conflict, and sent out to record every aspect of life for 'Our Boys'.

As part of Monmouthshire's events to mark the Centenary of the Armistice, a lecture is being held to explore the art that was produced during and immediately after the War. 'Mud and Glory: The Art of World War One' is on Sunday 4th November at 2.30pm at the Drill Hall, Chepstow. It will tie in with the exhibitions of striking WW1 propaganda prints, 'The Great War: Britain's Efforts and Ideals,' which are currently running at both Chepstow and Abergavenny Museums.

The lecture will look at how this powerful art expressed the bleakness of war through the landscapes left behind as battle wiped out nature and all traces of civilisation. The paintings also show the soldiers as they waited endlessly in the trenches for action, and for the dread order to go 'Over the Top'. It is an art which demonstrates both triumph and tragedy, in a war whose newly powerful weapons created losses on a scale never before experienced.

Lecturer Eleanor Bird MA (Oxon), who runs a series of popular art history classes for Monmouthshire, says: "Because the War happened just as art was exploding into the new style of Modernism, the paintings not only present a record of the conflict, but also demonstrate how painting was changing in response to ideas about abstraction, colour and emotional expression."

# **Tintern Abbey Carols by Torchight**

On Saturday 1st December the Chepstow Rotary Club will stage its annual Torchlight Carol Service at Tintern Abbey.

This most popular family event is always well supported and last year over 400 people attended. Thanks to free publicity such as this in Chepstow Matters, posters, in-programme advertising and flyers handed out on the High Street, the Club enjoys much local support for this wonderful event.

From 6pm families will form a column in front of the Anchor Inn, Tintern holding their flaming torches on high to light their way, while the smaller members carry their glowing light-sticks. They will then walk slowly in a column around the outside of the Abbey while the wonderful singing of the choir radiates from within and adds to the ambience. It is always most satisfying to see the faces of the young, and not so young, reflected in the flames of the torches as they enter the rear of this beautiful and historic building.



Tintern Abbey is certainly an atmospheric location by day. But by night, in floodlight, with hundreds of flaming torches burning brightly and with the sound of carols sung by the choir, it becomes a positively magical place. "Harry Potter has nothing on this", said one visitor. Once all are within the Abbey the congregation sings together the most popular carols lead by the Wyedean School & Gospel Choir. The carols will be interspersed with seasonal Bible readings while prayers will be led by the Reverend Tony Jones.

This Torchlight Carol Service is a very special local event that launches the Chepstow Christmas Season. Every member of the family will remember Tintern for a long time to come and so the date 1st December should be marked in your diary now or visit **www.chepstowrotary.org.uk** for details. As always, entry is by personal programme that may be purchased on the night or, from the end of November, from the Tintern Abbey shop. Do remember that all profits go towards Rotary charities. **See vou there!**

It is so fitting to hold this event in Moot Hall & the Greenman Backpackers, the former Royal British Legion building. We wish her every success'.

Tidenham Parish Remembers

As the Centenary of the Armistice signalling the end of hostilities of the lst World War approaches on Sunday 11th November, Tidenham parish prepares to gather together for a 10.45 start on the Tutshill Recreation Ground to remember those who lost their lives in the war and subsequent conflicts.

This year's Act of Remembrance will be extra special. Young and older people from the parish will join together in a short service

with involvement from across the parish and observe the Two Minutes Silence at 11 o clock led by Rev. David Treharne. Over 1000 poppies made by members of the community will symbolise the flowers of Flanders Fields at the entry gate, with a personalised cross for every WW1 person listed on the parish memorials. This year, too, there will be covered facilities and seating so that people can take part, no matter what the weather brings. It will be followed by refreshments provided by W.I members in the Tutshill Memorial Hall. All are welcome to attend.

In the weeks leading up to the Act of Remembrance at Tutshill, Tidenham Historical Group will be identifying the locations within the parish where the men who lost their lives in WW1, or as a result of it, lived or worked. Wherever possible a plaque will identify the soldier and the link to an existing house, a relative's house or a street in the parish.

This will be the final part of a community project to find out more about our parish's involvement in





the difficult period of the 1914-18 First World War. Tidenham Historical Group has led the project, with considerable assistance from The Parish Council, Churches, Beachley Old Boys Association, the 1st Battalion the Rifles and many individuals, and has produced 2 books plus an information board at Sedbury about the subject.

The first book Beachley and the First World War revealed the devastating effect on the evicted Beachley villagers; on Tidenham and Tutshill farmers who were forced to abandon their land and livelihoods; on

the Tutshill residents who also who had to leave their properties; on Sedbury as the railway and military buildings took over and changed the rural landscape for ever; on the Vicar, Church Wardens and parishioners who had the sudden responsibility of somehow finding homes for over 100 people, including children and babies, as well as providing support for those whose men were serving in the armed forces.

A second book, Tidenham Remembers by Historical Group Member Liz McBride brings a new and greater insight into the 38 men on the local War memorials; their lives, their families and where they lived. It also reveals that a further 17 men died who are not listed on the memorials but who had links to the parish. The detailed research for this book, which has been a labour of love for Liz over many years, shows they came from every area of the parish, ranged in age from 18 to 60 and represented the Army, Navy, Merchant Navy, RAF, and even



the Australian Army. They served all over the globe including China, South America, Gallipoli, Mesopotamia, India, Alexandria, Italy as well as on the Western Front at Ypres, Passchendaele, and the Somme. One lost his life at the battle of Jutland.

There are 3 War Memorials in the parish. One is at at St Luke's church and was made by grateful WW1 Belgian refugees (who were supported by the parish and lived and worshipped in Tutshill). Another is at the Memorial Hall in Tutshill and the third at the parish church of St Mary & St Peter, Tidenham, where the book was launched in July at an event hosted by the Friends of Tidenham Church on the opening day of their WW1 themed Flower Festival.

A profusion of nearly a thousand poppies, hand-made by people in the parish, cascaded from the two lych gates. A line of wooden crosses, each one hand engraved with the name of one of the men on the War Memorial in the church lined the path to the church door. Inside the church the ancient font was decorated with poppies and there was another striking poppy cascade. Over 20 stunning floral displays made by local community groups, shops and individuals and young people's groups depicted differing aspects of World War 1. The clever use of WW1 artefacts and images, combined with beautiful flowers and imaginative presentation resulted in a stunning effect.

During that week two productions of the play "No Young Men" by Go 2 Theatre were performed which evocatively and poignantly explored the impact of WW1 on a small village community and its response to the tragedies.

Since the book launch the Parish Council has erected 2 silent soldier silhouettes as part of a national campaign by the British Legion to



encourage the nation to say "thank you" to a generation who served and sacrificed their lives for their nation.

# **The Tidenham Historical Group:** A Brief History by Keith Underwood

The Group was founded on January 31st 1990 in Sedbury by Liz McBride, Keith Underwood and Lesley Williams and was hosted initially at the Chepstow museum by Annie Rainsbury, where some of the first regular meetings were held. It was always envisaged that it would be a working group of like minded members keen on the Parish of Tidenham's history and heritage.

One of the first projects in living history was to interview the late Mrs Evelyn Kedward (with a reel to reel Grundig) about her Second World Wartime experiences at Chepstow Railway Station and Beachley where she did her war work. With a wealth of knowledge and very voluble she easily filled both sides of a tape, barely stopping for it to be turned over. The invaluable information was used for the Chepstow Society's book, "Wartime Reminiscences".

Many of the early monthly meetings in fact, lasting for several years, took place in the museum, using microfiche readers to scour the pages of the 19th local papers, (Chepstow Weekly Advertiser) sifting through a wealth of material for any reference to activities in the Parish. This led to the initiating of dossiers on houses, their ownership, histories and architecture. This is still ongoing.

Gradually the membership expanded and we were obliged to find a new home. After using the facilities of the several parish meeting places, we settled at the Sedbury and Beachley village Hall, whose centenary we celebrated this year. Although still a working group, it was now open to all those keen on local history and affairs and we began to engage speakers like Dr Naylor

Firth. Peter Strong and Averil Kear who became loyal supporters. We began to engage with other local history groups in the County and the Forest, but also further afield.

We set up displays at day schools at Cheltenham, Lydney, Speech House and elsewhere, and contributed events for the Chepstow Biennial Festival.

In 2014 we published our first book, on the Churches and Chapels in the parish, a volume that attracted good reviews from influential organisations like the Bristol and Gloucester Archaeological Association. This book was published after many years of intensive research, during which we lost several supporters - Renee Cook, Anthony James, Mervyn Prothero, Joyce Pullinger, Mercedes Waters, Linda Waters. Rose Evans and Eric Wiles, many of whom had been actively involved in the churches book. Their contribution will always be remembered. New members, Carol and Richard Clammer. having retired from their professions, focussed on the publication of the book and went on to produce their own intensive research - on the national Shipvard and its rail work at Beachlev. so following up on earlier research for the local history association display at Lydney. This seemed to be admirably timed to coincide with the commemoration of the Centenary of the Great war.

In 2018 our Treasurer and co-founder Liz McBride published her invaluable research, a record of the lives and deaths of the men from the Parish who fell during the Great War. This was very much a labour of love for Liz, whose skill in researching family history is considerable.

On 29th September, member Dick Finch set up a day school in the Drill Hall on the latest findings

on Offa's Dyke, a substantial length of which lies in the Parish. An ongoing project, this may well result in another publication.

We are also embarking on another long term project in the manner of our first book. The topic will be on Education in the Parish and will cover all the schools that have existed as well as the existing four institutions.

We meet at the Sedbury and Beachley village Hall in the autumn and winter months when there is a programme of speakers and other activities. in the late spring and Summer there are walks and excursions.



This year we paid a splendid visit to Usk, hosted by the Usk Castle friends - and a reciprocal visit to our parish will follow next year. We are also hosting a visit by the Gloucestershire Local History organisation. We have also exchanged visits with Olveston History Group and had guided tours around several local villages.



A regular visit is to Redwick where we are hosted by two of our early members, Chris and Andrew who are now also involved in Redwick History Group.

In the 1980s the Group was active successfully in initiating the protest against the plans build a bypass through the parish, accompanying huge ancillary development of warehousing. The route would have caused considerable and irreparable damage to the landscape, turning a largely rural

environment into a suburban and industrial hell. It would also have risked the considerable section of Offa's Dyke at Buttington.







# The Great War: Britain's Efforts and Ideals

First World War propaganda prints by celebrated artists of the day go on display at both Chepstow Museum & Abergavenny Museum

As soldiers marched to war in summer 1914, most of them expected to be back home within a few weeks and surely by Christmas. But instead, the fighting continued and intensified over years and the First World War was fought not just by soldiers on battlefields, but also by citizens at home.

"The Great War: Britain's Efforts and Ideals" a striking set of prints, being shown now in exhibitions at Chepstow and Abergavenny Museums in Monmouthshire, was commissioned by the British Government in 1917 as propaganda. After three years of hard fighting and unprecedented loss of life, the images were intended to encourage a war-weary public and raise support for the war effort. They show modern political propaganda in its early stages.

Designed in two sets of portfolios, "Ideals" and "Efforts", the "Ideals" addressed the reasons why Britain was at war and what it aimed to achieve. These images are dramatic and symbolic and use historical and mythological figures to express ideas.

The "Efforts" prints illustrate some of the activities of the war effort. Nine artists were commissioned to produce six prints, each taking on a different theme, such as Making Soldiers, Building Aircraft or Work on the Land.

As images of propaganda, they purposely avoided showing the horrors and atrocities of war, as was typical of the work of the official war artists. The works, by some of the most celebrated artists of the day such as Augustus John and Frank Brangwyn, are very different, reflecting the varying trends in British art at the time. The artists did not have full artistic freedom, they were given their subjects and each image had to pass censorship regulations. The prints were produced as a limited edition of 200 and were first exhibited in London in July 1917. This set of prints was donated to Amgueddfa Cymru – National Museum Wales in 1919 by the Ministry of Information.

Now, thanks to partnership with the Amgueddfa Cymru – National Museum Wales, they are being shown in two complementary exhibitions so that the collection of over 60 prints can be seen together. At Chepstow Museum, the 'Efforts' prints shown include 'Building Ships' and 'Transport by Sea' as the town was transformed by the establishment of two National Shipyards during the War; and 'Tending the Wounded' as the Museum's home, Gwy House became a Red Cross Hospital for Wounded Soldiers from 1915. Both Museums share the Efforts, 'Making Soldiers' 'Making Sailors' and 'Women's Works' as well as the large and impressive "Ideals" series of prints.

The exhibitions run until 6th January 2019 so there's plenty of time to see the whole collection. Both museums are open daily 11am-4pm (Abergavenny Museum is closed on Wednesdays) and admission is FREE.




