much further), Chepstow Choral Society is celebrating 40 years of singing and bringing great music to Monmouthshire this year.

During those four decades, it has presented work by most of the leading European classical composers from the past, including Mozart, Schubert, Vivaldi and Haydn, often performing the Chepstow premier of internationally acclaimed choral works, and has also interpreted popular music ranging from Abba to Gilbert & Sullivan.

Every year has seen the choir presenting exciting and ambitious programmes, and 2019 is no exception... This will begin with the Spring Concert in St Mary's Church on 6th April, which will include Beethoven's Mass in C, alongside work by Handel and Vaughan Williams. ## Big Tides (February, March and September 2019) and a new Tides plaque at Chepstow

Local resident John Burrows has provided us with some information on the forthcoming big tides for Chepstow and the Monmouthshire coast starting 22 February 2019.

The largest tides since the peak year of 2015 are due to arrive soon (as we went to print on this March edition) with the first 14.5 metre (46 feet) high tide due at Chepstow at 08.47 am on Thursday 21st February and at 9.30am on Friday 22nd February 2019 followed by an incredible 14.6 metre (48 feet) high tide at 8.28 am on Friday 22 March

The astronomical tides at Chepstow and in the Severn Estuary do not exceed 14.7 metres so 14.6 metres is very rare.

In 2015 we did have three 14.7 metre tides but 2015 was the peak year of a 19 year tide cycle.

The highest tides are impressive to watch from a safe path and will not create damage unless they are accompanied by a storm surge which can result from the wind blowing from the south west directly up the Bristol Channel and Severn Estuary and low atmospheric pressure, or high rainfall, or snow melt.

If these meteorological conditions combine with the high 'astronomical' tides (caused by the Moon and the Sun) then tides could be one metre or 1.5 metres higher than predicted. Hopefully that won't happen!

The highest tide recently at Chepstow was on 3rd January 2014 when there was a 1 metre storm surge on top of a 14.2 metre astronomical tide, creating a 15.2 metre (50 feet) tide at Chepstow Bridge by the Castle.

Chepstow now has a Tides plague (photo below) explaining the world phenomenal tides at Chepstow. John Burrows (top photo) researched, measured and wrote the information for the plague, which was then designed, made up and laid in place by Chepstow potter Ned Hayward (photo).



In 2019 the tide height at Chepstow will be 14.5 metres or 14.6 metres on

# SARA

## Registered Charity number 505504

SARA is an Inshore Rescue Boat and Land Search and Rescue organisation covering the Severn Estuary and the surrounding area, supporting HM Coastguard, Fire & Rescue and Police services 24/7, 365 days of the year. Membership is made up entirely from volunteers, with no paid staff. As a registered charity, all funding is raised by way of donations.

SARA currently operates from five bases, at Chepstow (Beachley), Newport, Sharpness, Tewkesbury and Kidderminster (Wyre Forest). The need for SARA is increasing with more callouts evident year on year, as well as the variety and range of callouts increasing. Typical incidents involve boats or persons in difficulty on one of the rivers SARA covers, but also searches for missing persons, animal rescue and flood relief are also becoming common.

Beachley is the Headquarters Station for SARA and houses the equipment used by both the lifeboat crews and the other search & rescue teams. Crew members are trained in boat, mud, land and swift-water rescue. The Station is ideally located to cover the water from Sharpness in the north, to Avonmouth and Cardiff in the south. The Rivers Avon, Usk, Monnow and Wye are all part of its operational area.

Beachley was SARA's first purpose built lifeboat station and is situated under the M48 (Old) Severn Bridge. The slipway was originally used by the car ferry service between Beachley and Aust, before the opening of the Severn Bridge in 1966.

Beachley has also been a designated Mountain Rescue post since 1985, with specific regard to cliff rescue on the cliffs of the Lower Wye Valley.

#### **Recent Operations**

The weekend before Christmas, the team was called out to Caerleon, to support Gwent Police with a task on the river bank. This required the Newport lifeboat to work together with an SRT

party on the shore, and members of the Ambulance HART Team as well as the

police.

On Christmas Day itself, lifeboat crew were woken at 04.40 by a page from the Coastguard. It turned out that no response was needed - but then around 11pm there was a callout for real. which involved SARA Lifeboat 1 searching the River Avon (again, together with RNLI Portishead and others) before eventually being stood down early on Boxing Day!

### Please Join Us!

SARA is always

looking for new operational crew members, both as Lifeboat Crew and Land Team Members. In addition, Fundraisers are needed to help raise the essential money needed to keep the Station operational. Other Specialist Members have skills such as administration and vehicle mechanics, which are all essential to keep the operation going.

All operational team members need to be physically fit; lifeboat crew should ideally live within 15 minutes of Beachley or Malpas, and must be able to swim. Full training is provided, regular attendance during the training course is needed to become operational, and then continuation and progression training can follow.

# **Ann Llewellin**

an obituary by Keith Underwood

The sad news of Ann Llewellin's death at very nearly 89 has caused shock waves amongst her family and the very many friends she has made over the years. The term 'icon' is much overused, but in many senses of the word Ann was very much an iconic figure, known, respected and loved by many.

Ann had strong connections to Itton where she lived for many years, but she had brought up her family at Black Rock where she lived in the old house with the

steps. Her great love for the river was deep and she often sailed from Mathern Pill and had a fund of anecdotes about her many, sometimes close experiences.

She graduated from Cambridge at a time when women were in the minority, but she was never deterred by supposed male dominance and often entered the lists in defence of a project dear to her heart. Once focused there was nothing that was going to stop her. However, she was well aware of the needs of others, self-effacing, she came to the aid of many.

Ann taught at the old Boys' School in Chepstow and taught French and Drama at St John's-on-the-Hill for many years. She also organised eisteddfodau in Chepstow. In 1983 she was drawn into the great community event celebrating the year of Welsh castles, called 'The Pageant'. This was to reveal her talent for mustering local people, often at her

own expense, travelling great distances to ensure that actors and participants arrived on time to rehearsals and performances.

When the old tradition of castle pageant was revived as son et lumière productions at Chepstow Castle and Tintern Abbey, she was fearless and totally committed to them. One of her best sequences was the 1918 fete in 'Echoes of the Stones' at Tintern.

Ann was in total control however at Usk in 2005 where she masterminded the whole pageant to commemorate the Battle of Pwll Melyn in 1405. Ann also worked tirelessly for the cause to save Ruperra Castle, researching, script writing and work in the production of books and videos.

Music was a great passion and Ann played a number of instruments, including the organ at St Deiniols in Itton. But it was the recorder that was dear to her heart and she played at Treowen with Emma Wheelock and at many other venues. She was a keen member of Chepstow's U3A recorder group. Ann was an active member of the Monmouthshire Antiquarian Association, Usk Castle Friends and was also a member of the Chepstow Society.

Ann will be greatly missed by her many friends and by her children, Charlie, Mary and Thomas and by her grandchildren.





# **EASTER**

Easter is a crucial time of year for the Christian faith as it celebrates two essential events in the life of Jesus - the cross (crucifixion) and the empty tomb (resurrection).

From a historical point of view there is considerable evidence that a man called Jesus from Nazareth was executed on a cross by the Romans as a political criminal. What people believe about that death is to move from fact to faith. For Christians the meanings of the cross include seeing it as the ultimate demonstration of God's love for the world, including an expression of God in solidarity with all those who suffer as well as offering Himself as the means for forgiveness.

The historical evidence for the empty tomb is a bit different. The Romans kept records of those they executed but not of those who rose, nor was there any CCTV in the first century Palestinian graveyards. Some evidence has been found and of course Christians tryst the witness of the Gospels to believe in the resurrection. That life has triumphed over death, that light has overcome darkness, that Love Wins, is an act of faith - but not just a conviction in the head but of trust of the heart.

Some people see something compelling in the years after the death of Jesus. Many would be messiahs came and went during the time of the Romans, all executed and soon forgotten and the movements they started petered out. Not so with Jesus of Nazareth. Something so significant and spectacular happened that first Easter. The first Christians were transformed from a tiny defeated group into a movement that changed the world. Within a few years, so convinced were they that Jesus had risen they were prepared to face the gladiators in the colosseum for His cause. Within generations the church had spread like wild fire. Ironically the all powerful Roman Empire that sought to crush the Jesus Movement has disappeared whilst there are Christians in the millions and millions

The very existence of millions of people who to this day worship and follow Jesus Christ is perhaps the most challenging piece of evidence fro the resurrection that first Easter.

Whatever the Easter season means to you personally - may you know the blessings of peace and Joy.

# Wyedean School and Sixth Form Centre gears up for

FameLab Academy 2019

Eight Year 9 students from Wyedean School and Sixth Form have recently competed in FameLab Academy organised by Cheltenham Science Festival, to find the best young science communicator in the county.

The Wyedean School final was won by Maya Hall who spoke articulately in front of 160 Year 8 students and staff on Tuesday 12 February.

Maya's three minute talk on the science of VTOL (vertical take-off and landing) engines linked neatly to the drawbacks of traditional transport solutions. Head judge Dr. Elspeth Kenny from Cheltenham Festivals, praised Maya's confident and eloquent style, married with clear technical understanding of the scientific challenges involved. Dr. Kenny, fellow judge Angus Bloomfield (Environmental Officer with EDF Energy) and Miss Sarah McDermott (former Home Office Forensic Scientist and Wyedean School Governor) deliberated for over 20 minutes to choose two runner's up from a very strong field of eight contestants. Runnerup Lauren Bennett delivered an intriguing mini lecture on Benign Masochism (enjoying initially negative experiences that the brain falsely interprets as threatening). Rebecca Inglis-Hole gave an entertaining and informative talk on ecdysis (the scientific term for the shedding of the skin e.g. snakes). The competition was fierce and the decision to determine the winner "very tight indeed".

Well done to all the other Year 9 participants who each showed tremendous commitment and courage to perform without notes in public: Rhianna Parry, Micah Durbin, Jenny Crompton,

Freya Tyldesley and Caitlin Dixon. All the Year 9 students performed assuredly and answered questions from the judges on the spot without prior preparation. In particular, Micah bravely came into school despite illness, to perform his speech on Evolution.

Fourteen schools from across Gloucestershire are taking part in FameLab Academy. Each school is matched with a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics) Mentor trained in public engagement who visits the school and works with students. The finalist from each school receives a two-day Communication Masterclass, a work placement in a local STEM company and

entry into the Gloucestershire final (21st March 2019 at EDF Barnwood, Gloucester).

FameLab Academy is a competition for Year 9 students in Gloucestershire, sponsored by EDF Energy. Supported by their teachers and STEM mentors, students have just three minutes to explain a scientific topic of their choice to a panel of judges who will adjudicate their presentations based on their content, clarity and charisma.

Ali Mawle, Director of Education at Cheltenham Festivals said: "FameLab Academy is tackling head-on the shortage of young people studying STEM subjects in schools. By targeting Year 9 pupils in 14 schools across Gloucestershire we are changing students' perceptions of science and nurturing the next generation of scientists."

Stuart Motson at Wyedean School and Sixth Form Centre said: 'We're delighted to take part in FameLab Academy for the fourth year running because the competition gives all students of all academic abilities a chance to shine. It is not just about what you say, but also how you say it. We are always striving for accuracy across all STEM (Science Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) subjects, but scientists must be able to communicate to an audience clearly and with verve. We are conscious that all students will probably need to give a job presentation, formal speech or talk in public at some point in their life time and the FameLab Academy gives every student in Year 9 training in how to deliver a talk with confidence.

## Stuffed, Pickled & Pinned

Wonders of nature discovered in Welsh Museums in an exhibition just opened at Chepstow Museum - Last chance to see this special exhibition on its tour around Wales

Chepstow Museum, Bridge Street, NP16 5EZ Open daily 11am-4pm FREE ENTRY - Exhibition runs until July

Museums across Wales house some amazing natural treasures. Stuffed, Pickled and Pinned is a special exhibition which draws on just a tiny fraction of the rich natural science collections in 18 of those museums. The unusual and extraordinary come together in this 'cabinet of curiosities' which has just opened at Chepstow Museum, the final venue of this touring exhibition which has been travelling around Welsh Museums over the last few years.

The exhibition is the culmination of three years' work behind the scenes at local museums across Wales to find rare, beautiful and often unexpected natural history objects, some of which have never been seen before. The aim of the Linking Natural Science Collections in Wales project was to find about these collections and share information about them with the public. To do this, staff and volunteers in the museums worked with experts at Amgueddfa Cymru – National Museum Wales to examine and identify specimens and learn more about over 70,000 natural history objects in the regional museums across Wales.

Minerals, fossils, insects, taxidermy, bones, shells, plants and preserved animals - these amazing natural treasures help us to understand the world around us and our place within it. The exhibition explores the collections and how these specimens can still help to answer vital questions in modern research. It also challenges us to consider our relationship with nature and to consider humanity's impact on the natural world.

A delicate watercolour by Ladybird book illustrator Charles Tunnicliffe, a seaweed 'book' created inside a scallop shell, a fossil seashell found at the summit of Snowdon, a rare auroch's bone from the Severn estuary and a mummified cat, rub shoulders with rare curiosities from all four corners of the globe such as a stuffed platypus from Australia and a dessicated poisonous porcupine fish.

From our own collections at Chepstow Museum is a watercolour showing the stages of development in the life cycle of a Turnip moth drawn by Georgiana Ormerod to illustrate her more famous sister Eleanor Ormerod's work as an authority on insects that were harmful to agricultural crops. The sisters grew up at Sedbury Park, Chepstow, but Eleanor's career only began once her authoritarian father the antiguarian George Ormerod had died.

Visitors of all ages will be intrigued and amazed by the array of exhibits, and there is a special table with extra things to explore and activities specially designed for younger visitors. Don't miss this last chance to see this fantastic exhibition at its last stop on its tour around Wales.
