

### Winterbourne's Medieval Barn - News & Events



Winterbourne Medieval Barn Trust (WMBT) is preparing for much of the site to go into hibernation in 2019 to allow major building and refurbishment work on the medieval barn, its two ranges (the South and West Barns), and the outbuildings. But that doesn't mean there are no community events this year! WMBT is making use of the recently renovated Cartshed to keep a programme of workshops, lectures and nature walks alive throughout 2019, and will also be developing their Education offer and expanding the Barn's volunteer team. So, keep an eye on the Events page on the Barn website or their Facebook page.

#### Can You Help Raise the Roof?

Although WMBT has now raised most of the £400,000 funds required to restore the various buildings on the site, they still need a little more money to support this ambitious refurbishment project. They are therefore hoping that local people will come together and help them raise £5000 to 'Raise the Roof' and ensure that the site can be used by the community for generations to come.

The Trust writes: 8.500 pantiles make up the red tiled clay roof of Winterbourne's West Barn, which is currently very dilapidated and needs extensive restoration. Filming at the Barn! The film company (Elephant House Studios) approached WMBT in 2018 asking to film dendrochronologists from Swansea University taking a core sample from the beams in the Barn. They were filming for a new channel 5 series. Each programme is based around an on-going archaeological dig, and they film other things linked to that dig in some way. The episode which involved the Barn focuses on rural life in medieval Britain. A dig in Poulton in Cheshire unearthed hundreds of medieval skeletons, and researchers looked into the life of average Britons in the 14th century, particularly the challenges posed by famine, plague and conflict. They believe the great famine of 1315 may have been caused by exceptionally wet weather, which is recorded in historical documents. Dendrochronology (tree rings) can provide a good record of the weather, and so the timbers used to construct Winterbourne Medieval Barn in 1342 could provide clear evidence of the climate over the previous 100+ years before the trees were cut down.

The TV crew came in November 2018. The TV crew filmed the presenter and the dendrochronogy expert taking a sample from the Barn's roof timbers and then studying the it in the lab. This showed clear evidence of successive unusually wet years in the early 1300s which backs up the written documents recording poor weather and crop failures.

The show 'Digging Up Britain's Past' aired the 'Peasants' episode featuring our local barn at the end of January 2019.



From Menace to Miracle: Prisoner turned prison minister releases book to raise money for NHS that saved daughter's life

A former prisoner now ordained prison minister

has released a book about his life to raise money for Southmead Hospital Charity to thank the NHS who saved his daughter's life.

Reverend Larry Harvey (pictured above), a leading figure in the traveller community, was born into an English Romany Gypsy family but fell into a life of crime from an early age.

He is now full time chaplain at HMP Bristol – where he was once a prisoner – and works closely with offenders to help them build a life without crime.

His remarkable life story has been captured in a new book called from 'Menace to Miracle' and all proceeds of the sale of the book will be donated to Southmead Hospital Charity to support the

neurological department at Southmead Hospital.

Larry, who lives in Coalpit Heath, had 27 crime convictions ranging from thefts to assault.

But in 1999 Larry turned his life around after his 18-year-old daughter Joanne fell seriously ill needing several ground breaking major neurological operations at the former Frenchay Hospital to relieve pressure on her brain.

Larry became a committed Christian and started to work in Ashfield Young Offenders Institution.

Menace to Miracle has been written with Hilary Field, a former BBC Radio 4 producer and volunteer chaplaincy assistant at Southmead Hospital.

The book is available on Amazon as a hard copy or as a download on Kindle and an audio version is planned.

Larry said: "For a long time I have wanted to encourage youngsters and others to know that no matter how awful their lives seem now, they can change it from a life of drugs, violence and crime to a life with a purpose and hope, just as mine was changed.

"So when we wrote the book, I decided I wanted the money from it to go to Southmead Hospital, where my daughter's life was saved and where my life was so dramatically changed."

At St. Michael's, we recognised Children's Mental Health Week with our very first 'REVIVE Week'. We wanted the activities to be an opportunity for staff and children alike, to take a step back from the busyness of daily school life and re-energise.

We focused the week around 5 main areas:

1. Give, 2. Keep Learning, 3. Be Active, 4. Take Notice, 5. Connect.

Give - Both children and staff across the school carried out random acts of kindness for each other. Staff showed their appreciation for each other with cups of tea made; chocolate bars appearing and photocopying piles disappearing. The children made pictures for each other, wrote acrostic poems and even carried each other's bags. It was really lovely to see.

**Keep Learning** – Embracing new experiences. finding new opportunities and learning something new gives us a sense of achievement and confidence. Based on this, the children were given the fantastic opportunity to try archery. Following the 'blood, guts & poo' assembly, which gave the children a little history lesson on archery, the junior children (and staff) all got the chance to fire some arrows! It was fantastic fun and an impressive number of 'goals' (archery lingo!) were scored.

Be Active - Exercising can have a positive effect on mood and self-esteem. Unfortunately, for many of us. it can be something that slips off the daily routine due to other more pressing matters. However, in Revive week, we made time for it. Daily, the children took part in a wake and shake activity, giving them an extra boost for the afternoon's learning. Joe Wicks helped ensure the staff weren't left out, with staff having a go at one of his DVDs after school in the hall.

Take Notice - Paying attention to yourself and the things going on around you can help you to enjoy life more and understand yourself better. So, we decluttered our desks and put daffodils around the school to encourage ourselves to stop and



appreciate our space. Mindfulness colouring activities. which both the children and staff took part in, gave us time to develop an



awareness of ourselves and the world around us.

Connect - Spending time with others, talking. listening and making connections can help us to feel happier and build a sense of belonging. To help us connect in class, we engaged in team building activities and group work to encourage discussion and listening. The staff shared some quality time over a few board games! I'm not sure what the children made of the whoops and booming laughter coming from the staffroom.

It was a wonderful week and although, inevitably. there were still 'stressful' things which cropped up, taking a step back and finding perspective can be worthwhile at any time of year.

#### **Community Help Design an Exciting New** Play Area at Beesmoor Road Playing Field

Speaking about the project, Kate Colechin, Member of the Beesmoor Road Playing Field Management Committee said. "The community is extremely excited about the plans for the new play area. TouchWood's fabulous design really reflects the views of local people and is in line with our original Play Strategy of 2014. The team at Touchwood have been incredibly supportive throughout the process. in particular with providing help with gaining additional grants for the project."

If you are interested in coming along we meet in St Saviours church hall on the first Wednesday of every month at 7.45pm. New members always welcome.










### A Word From... Associate Minister Bob Conway

Dear Friends.

Whenever I contemplate the coming of March, my thoughts often begin with our weather and Masefield's: "Dirty British coaster with a salt-caked smoke stack. Butting through the Channel in the mad March days..." Likewise the old proverb "In like a lion, out like a lamb" implying that: when March starts, it's still winter, but by the end of the month spring has begun.

More important than 'whimsey on the weather', is the fact that Wednesday 6 March marks Ash Wednesday and the beginning of the season of Lent, as we approach the wonderful festival of Christ's resurrection on Easter Day, Sunday 21 April.

In Lent, many Christians commit to fasting, as well as giving up certain luxuries. This is meant to replicate the sacrifice of Jesus Christ's journey into the desert for 40 days. During this time as Jesus fasted and prayed, Satan tempted him: to turn stones into bread and relieve his own hunger; to jump from a high place relying on angels to catch him as a test of God's love: and for Jesus to worship

Satan in return for rule over all the kingdoms of the world. These are the same three temptations one renounces at baptism: The World, the Flesh and the Devil.

Many Christians also add a Lenten spiritual discipline, such as reading a daily devotional or praying through a Lenten calendar, to draw themselves near to God. Services such as 'Stations of the Cross', which commemorate Christ's carrying of the Cross and of his execution, are often observed. While many churches remove flowers, and crucifixes, religious statues, and other religious symbols are often veiled in solemn observance of the event.

Lent is a very special time, and a great opportunity for self-assessment, personal reflection and renewal of both spirit and purpose. Its observance is something that everyone of us, as individuals, families, communities and nations can benefit from, especially in current circumstances within our own "less than United Kingdom".

So, I would like to encourage everyone of us, whatever our backgrounds, whether we are church goers or not, whether we even espouse to be Christian or not, to take some personal time this March to reflect on our world, our communities, our families and our own lives in order to try and identify ways in which we might change our attitudes and behaviours in our own individual attempts to better our world and our environment for ourselves and for others.

Jesus told his followers that they should love one another as he had loved them. Let us each consider the implications of his words across the full spectrum of our lives and our society, and perhaps the small changes we can each accomplish might emulate the spirit of that old proverb such that the lion of winter in our hearts may go out like a lamb of love, as a newer brighter spring emerges in our lives.

He brought along extremely old glass beads, dishes, jugs, goblets, decanters and vases. Glass making is a highly skilled process and if the glass is not at a high enough temperature bubbles and streaks will appear which is not acceptable. Venetian glass of course is very well known and Venice became extremely popular for trading, as it was the cross roads of the Silk Road and Spice Road trading routes, hence a lot of business took

Today we have the famous Bristol Blue Glass. We were shown three Bristol Blue decanters which had decorative silver work round the neck and a Graal glass bowl which had an incredible pattern blown all the way through it. We were told it would have taken 40-50 hours to engrave! We were shown a piece of Cranberry glass which is coloured with gold oxide and barium salt. Apparently it is better to look at and admire these pieces of red glass under gas light conditions.
