Frampton Rangers FC Seasonal Update

Frampton Rangers Youth FC were formed in 1970 and since then have been developing young footballers

across a wide range of age groups in Winterbourne, Coalpit Heath and Frampton Cotterell. Currently they operate nine teams playing at Crossbow House and Beesmoor park playing fields, in Frampton Cotterell.

A great success story for the club has been local legend (turned WFM correspondent) Nick Tanner who played for the club in the early 80s, before going on to play for Bristol Rovers and then Liverpool FC.

Rich Ware is chairman of the football club and also runs one of the three under 11s teams. He told us. "We are a close knit family oriented club and always look to encourage local children to play football. It's great watching the children develop their team working skills and grow in confidence as well as ability as they progress through the age groups".

Marc Willett, manager for the U11s, commented on how he started as a dad running Soccertots and how the club supported his development in achieving his FA coaching badges. He said, "It becomes addictive - its great fun being involved in coaching sessions and watching the team grow in ability and friendship bonds over time."

The clubs run a Soccertots for children aged 4-7, then an under 7s and under 9s team who play in the Hanham Minor league. Both teams are relatively new but have competed well in their first few seasons of football. There are three under 11s teams who play in the Hanham Minor League and have a wide range of abilities playing across division 1, 4 and 8.

There is also an under 12s and 15s team competing in Avon Youth League and preparing the young players as they look to move into under 18s

Finally, one of their most successful teams of recent times is the Ladies team, who compete in the South West Women's league and have won numerous cups and leagues over recent seasons.

The teams play most Sundays (morning and afternoons) at Crossbow House and Beesmoor Park so please go along to support your local grassroots football teams. 

GEM Boccia Club - friendly, fun and welcoming to all

Who am I?

My name is Georgina (Elizabeth) Moore (GEM: Hence the Club's name). I'm 34 years old and have a neuromuscular condition. It means I'm a permanent wheelchair user and cannot weight bare. I live independently with 24-hour care in my own flat in Chipping Sodbury, South Glos.

My background is I have a degree in Marketing and then I went on to be a Primary School Teacher for a short time, but sadly could not physically continue with it. I'm not the type of person who likes to sit around not doing anything but knew I couldn't commit to working regularly. I like to try and stay as fit and healthy as I can but could only find swimming as a form of exercise.

What is Boccia?

It is not uncommon for people to say to me "What is Boccia?" when I tell them I run a Boccia Club. This highlights the lack of publicity the sport gets, which is a real shame seeing as it's a Paralympic event!

Boccia is very similar to bowls: With the fundamental aim of the game being 'get your balls closest to the jack'. The main difference being that you have to be seated when playing Boccia. This makes the sport inclusive for all. The sport can be played individually or as a team. It is played as red balls VS blue balls, with the jack being white. There is also increasingly new technology that means visually impaired people can also take part in the sport.

After watching Boccia being played at the 2016 Paralympics I decided to try and find a local Boccia Club. Much to my disappointment there wasn't a Club in the South Glos area. The nearest Club was in Henbury and was run by Access Sport. I decided to go along and give it





a try. Immediately I loved playing because it was competitive and I felt that throwing the balls was actually great exercise for me, it meant I was moving in my chair!

I continued to attend the Henbury Club weekly for a few months but the 30-minute journey there and back was tiring and expensive. I kept saying to people maybe I should just set up my own Club. After much encouragement by others and fundamental support from Access Sport, that's exactly what I did. GEM Boccia Club's first session took place in September 2017. I managed to liaise with Yate Leisure Centre to use the badminton courts, which have since been marked out as Boccia courts too. I produced my own leaflets and flyers, set up social media pages and tried to promote the Club as much as I could. My main carer, Tom, completed a Boccia Coaching Course, so he could use the knowledge and skills from that to help me deliver meaningful sessions, where members can progress over time. We were lucky to be loaned sets of Boccia balls initially as each set of 12 balls costs over £200.

The first session saw 11 people turn up and I was overwhelmed. They were a range of ages and abilities and that's the main ethos behind our Club: Inclusive to all. This means you don't have to have a disability to play with us. We have siblings, carers and parents all join in, although to compete in official competitions you must have a disability. The other important part of our Club is we have fun! We split the sessions into playing proper Boccia matches and also playing fun, skills games. We believe this is what keeps people coming back. To this day we are still going strong and numbers are increasing.



Future Goals

We started with no money towards the Club and that's why we charge £2 per person each week, to cover the cost of the courts. Other costs include equipment / resources, admin and training. Fundraising activities and a generous personal donation has allowed us to purchase our own balls, equipment and get t-shirts printed for our regular members. As member numbers grow we will need to purchase more balls etc, so continuous donations are always appreciated.

GEM Boccia Club recently took part in their first competition. Members who want to play competitively can choose whether to be part of the team. So 7 of us went along to Bath Leisure Centre with 4 other teams from the West of England. We all had a really enjoyable day and it was great experience for us. We are looking forward to competing more in the future.

We were also nominated for Club of the Year award as part of Boccia England's National awards. Apparently 4 different individuals nominated us, and Tom also got nominated for Coach of the Year. We were all so touched and overwhelmed by this. I personally feel honoured to be appreciated and know I'm having a positive impact on my local community.

We always encourage new members and anyone is welcome along. We are currently also looking for volunteers who could help run the Club because at the moment it is just run by my carer and myself. My family help out most weeks but we want to be able to give some responsibility to people outside the family. If you, or anyone you know, would like to join the Club as a player or volunteer then please do contact us on the details below.

South Gloucestershire
Council (SGC) and the
Winterbourne Medieval
Barn Trust (WMBT) are
pleased to announce
that work to conserve,
redevelop and find new
uses for the magnificent
Grade II* listed 14th century
Winterbourne Medieval
Barn began on Monday 18
March.

Keys were handed over by SGC to the main appointed contractor Corbel

Conservation Ltd at the start of March and company representatives met with WMBT volunteers to introduce themselves and answer questions. The year-long project will see the South and West barns, which are attached to the Medieval Barn, restored and converted to flexible community spaces with modern facilities for meetings and events. The outbuildings will be converted into units for rent by small local businesses, particularly those with links to heritage crafts and skills.

It is hoped that members of the public will have an opportunity to look around the site and see progress in the autumn.

The work has been enabled by an award of over £1M from the National Lottery Heritage Fund (until recently known as the Heritage Lottery Fund). The WMBT also has to raise £400,000 itself as part of this project, and while most of this money has now been secured, the Trust is still fundraising for the last bit of this. They have been running a £5000 'Raise the Roof' campaign online at LocalGiving. org and are still looking for donations to help with dismantling, cleaning and remounting the old clay pantiles on the West Barn roof. 

News from Winterbourne Down WI

Members of our WI spent a relaxing evening watching and being entertained by Patricia Downs, who told us about

her 'Life in Flowers and Floristry'. She learnt her trade in a florist shop in Staple Hill, Downend, Bath and ended up owning her own business in Chipping Sodbury. Patricia had a lovely relaxed way about her and showed us three very easy ways to make a bunch of flowers look super in different containers.

The first being an ordinary empty can of beans which had sellotape wound round it then twisted and round wound again to make it sticky and double sided. Laurel leaves were stuck round the tin, trimmed at the bottom and a bit of raffia tied around the middle. Three bunches of daffodils whose stems were slightly twisted and held with an elastic band underneath the flower heads were placed in the tin with water. So simple but most effective.

The next arrangement was using red tulips which were held individually and rotated in hand, whilst adding a small amount of greenery and more tulips. The flowers seemed to tie themselves in to make a 'spiral bouquet'. Patricia surprised us all by saying

when we next had some tulips, measure the stems and a few days later measure them again and we would find they had grown! We were also told to cut the stem at an angle so the water could be taken up more easily. To make an arrangement look balanced measure the length of the flowers against the vase. It should be 1.5 x the height of the vase.

The third arrangement was using a basket with foliage and flowers on one side, and stems cut and arranged on the other side which made one think that the flowers were just laid across the basket. How clever!

Patricia was asked why she used a knife to cut the stems compared to scissors or secateurs and she replied by saying that the cells in the stems weren't damaged so much when using a knife and it was auicker.

Dear Friends

When I was teaching Religious Studies a popular question at GCSE was this, 'Which is the more important Christian Festival, Christmas or Easter?' Now if we put this to a 'people's vote' I have no doubt that Christmas would top the poll! In the Fromeside during Christmas 2018 over 3,000 people came to Church, which out of a population of some 12,000 people is a tremendous number. Whilst I am encouraged by the numbers of people who attend worship in our four churches during 'Holy Week and Easter', I know that even with the school services the number attending will be around 1,400. less than half that of Christmas.

I often wonder how this has evolved and it is not just here, because throughout the UK attendance at Easter is never as high as at Christmas. A strange development, given that in the Christian tradition Easter is clearly considered to be the major festival of the Christian year and in truth whilst always a major festival, it is only in the past 200 years that Christmas has risen to the prominent position it now holds for Christians and others alike. Why has Easter lost ground I wonder? Surely there is more to it than the potential ahh factor of Christmas — a baby in a stable and the prezzie fest which has managed to attach itself to the celebration, thanks St Nick!



At our March meeting, which was extremely well attended, our speaker was Ashley Jones, from the Senior Citizen Liaison Team which aims to protect and enable older members in our community. He moved around from Russia to Sweden and worked with his father on developing Nitroglycerin and Dynamite which was a much safer explosive.

In 1895 Alfred Nobel wrote his last will and testament in which he set out the groundwork for the Nobel Prizes and bequeathed most of his wealth to fund it in perpetuity. The prizes were first awarded in 1901 for Literature, Medicine, Physics, Peace and Economics and have continued ever since. The prize consists of a diploma, a gold medal and a cash sum of one million dollars. It is presented on 10 December every year by the King of Sweden in Stockholm and so far there have been less than 1,000 Laureates. We all agreed what a wonderful man Alfred Nobel was and how much his legacy has enriched our world. Thanks to Ashley for giving us all this information in such an interesting way.






