## **News from the Manor Hall at Coalpit Heath**

#### Worth the wait!

The Grade 2 Listed buildings, formerly known as the Westerleigh Manor Hall, were put in the hands of a Trust in 2002, when the parishioners decided that was the best way to preserve the buildings for the community.

After completing the refurbishment of the main

building, the Trustees turned their attention to the 100 year old red brick outbuilding, which had mainly just been used for storage. for decades. Roof tiles, were missing, plaster and flooring inside were water damaged, but several salvageable features remained.



former pupils of the school had come forward to tell us about the history of the outbuilding. It started life just after World War 1, as a room for cookery, metalwork and woodwork for children across Westerleigh, Coalpit Heath and Frampton Cotterell, After World War 2, cooked lunches were introduced, so former pupils remember

the meals being cooked and served in the building, which became their dining hall. After this moved off site, former pupils recall the building became their classroom and there are still ink stains ingrained in to the wooden floor (much of the original floor was saved).

Every age group we speak to, the oldest being 100 years of age this month, has fond memories of using the

school buildings. We still feel the love for the school and many of our new customers who walk in to the buildings tell us that it has that warm feeling of being a happy place. If only the walls could talk!

We have little information about what happened with the building when the LEA sold the site to the Westerleigh Parish Council in 1975. Thankfully, everything, apart from the stove, was left intact, so we were able to renovate the building and with listed building consent, sub-divided the one room to provide a kitchenette and toilet, to enable the building to be used by the community as a standalone building.

It was decided to renovate the building in keeping with the main site, you can view the results from the photographs on our website, along with the hire charges.

The Manor Hall at Coalpit Heath is a CIO registered charity run by a management committee of Trustees. who look after the site and also maintain the Coalpit Heath Community Garden, which was the former Headmaster's garden. We are always seeking volunteers to help with the garden and Trustees to run the Charity. ## News from Winterbourne Down WI

At our June meeting we invited husbands to join us as we thought the

speaker, Dave Jeals, would be of interest to them, as he gave us a talk on diving and survival.

Dave originally was a diver retrieving cars and debris from the docks in Bristol. One day he was called to retrieve some people who were in danger at sea and because of his bravery was given a highly acclaimed award. Someone who was SAS trained heard of this and approached Dave asking whether he would like to train with them and help run survival weekends for anyone wanting a challenge? This he did, and enjoyed all challenges thrown at him.

He has been to Costa Rica, Sri Lanka, Brazil, into desserts and other remote places in the world, learning jungle survival and how to survive generally in outback conditions. Dave showed us various bits of his survival equipment and showed us how to generate electricity, use a mirror to create a signal which could be seen for some 15 miles away! Take an empty plastic water bottle, make a hole in the side and drop a candle inside to create light which could last up to 8 hours. For food he told us that he had to learn to set traps to catch rabbits and squirrels, skin them and cook them on an open fire. He would make soups from certain hedgerow plants, nettles and

roots. When in the jungle he had to be very aware of where and what he was treading on in case snakes, crocodiles or dangling spiders should attack him! The talk was extremely entertaining and gave an enlightening account of his survival experiences.

Our August meeting will be held in a members garden where hopefully we will enjoy an American supper on a warm summers evening! Our Speaker at our meeting on 5 September is Dave Cheesley, who will be talking about the Return to Severn Beach.

## Focus on - Daniel Cheesman new CEO of Paul's Place, Coalpit Heath

For those people who do not know about Paul's Place, please can you tell us about the organisation?

Paul's Place is a local charity based in Coalpit Heath, supporting adults with physical disabilities. cognitive and sensory impairments. Some of our members have lifelong disabilities they were born with, such as Cerebral Palsy, while about 75% have acquired disabilities as a result of things like road traffic injuries, brain tumours, strokes and workplace injuries. The support we provide is critical, providing a 'Lifeline' to many people overcoming anxiety and isolation that, in many cases, can even be life-threatening. Our approach is tailored to each person, promoting independence and life-enhancing opportunities. It's a very happy, friendly place and you cannot fail to smile spending time with our members.

#### How long has Paul's Place been running and how many people does it serve?

It started in 1985, meeting one evening a week with four founding members: we now have 300 plus members, with a day facility running Mon-Fri. 10am-4pm, as well as additional activities outside these hours, respite breaks and carers support programme.


#### How did you become involved in Paul's Place?

I came to Paul's Place after a 20-year career predominantly in the charity sector working for organisations that have promoted inclusion and challenged inequalities. Paul's Place appealed to me as there is a genuine sense that disabled people are at the heart of the organisation and this was really important to me in making the decision to take up the post and relocate from Brighton to Bristol. It is vital to me that any charity works in partnership with its members to determine what the needs and issues are, and this is something that I got a real sense of from my first interaction with Paul's Place.

#### What are your plans for Paul's Place in the next year?

To spend time putting together a new strategy for the charity. This will include thinking about how we tell our story and the difference that we make to the lives of our members. We have ambitions to grow the charity. Growth in terms of supporting more people and in terms of funding, growing our income streams so that we remain sustainable going forward.

#### What feedback do you get from individuals and families that are involved with Paul's Place?

Members have called it their 'Lifeline' when I have been talking to them. They've never found anything guite like it that supports the whole family: Empowering for members; Gives them hope and a future to look forward to; That it's a positive, vibrant place and helps to change their perspective on life; they can choose what activities they want to get involved in rather than being told; provides friendship circles and support; depression and anxiety is reduced.



## Reminiscences of The Old Hat Factory at Park Lane, Frampton Cotterell also known as Penny Well Lane.

I was born

that was

originally

in the house

undertook carpentry, building, wheelwrighting, painting, decorating and undertaking. My father often said "I'm a Jack of all trades", in fact he and his workmen were masters of many skills.

As children my three brothers and I had the run of the house, garden orchard and workshops. I now realise what a rich environment we grew up in, watching all the various activities and skills that were practised there.

The house had no 'mod cons' until the late 1930s when my father wired it for electric light. We had an Aladdin lamp in the living room and candles to light us to bed. Halfway up the stairs, a stuffed fox lurked in its glass case and we always began whistling bravely when the candlelight caught his gleaming eyes.

One room on the top floor housed racks of apples from the orchard. Early Beauty of Bath, dark red Quarendens, Tom Putts and the enormous Golden Nobles which kept until Easter. From the ceiling hung inverted T-shaped pieces of wood once used for shaping the beaver hats formerly made in the factory, but used by us for gymnastics. In the corner stood Uncle John's old sea-chest. He had been a ship's carpenter and the chest contained relics of his South American travels-flags, ostrich eggs and an old blunderbuss. Some of the windows had bull's eye bottle-glass in them, which gave us an intriguing distorted view of the garden and the creeper-clad workshops.

Much of our furniture had been made in the workshops, including my parent's oak bedstead which had acorns carved in relief on the end boards. Several cupboards and a bureau had custom-made shelving and divisions to house boxes of screws, hinges, special fittings and samples of mourning cards connected with the business. In earlier days there had been time for wood-carving oak blanket boxes, trays, snuff boxes and puzzles. My dolls-house had been made complete with stairs, fireplace and panelled doors. Many of the tools in the workshop had names cut on them.

Water was pumped up, ice cold, from a well under



the kitchen floor and on wash days and bath nights a fire was lit under a large copper beside the sink. My father built a bathroom but we had no piped water until a fractured drain finally polluted the well. The lavatory was across a little backyard behind a screen of jasmine. Pleasant in summer but winter visits were brisk! Cooking was done on a coal fired

range and we sometimes toasted cheese for supper on a trivet in front of the living room fire. George Cole, the eldest of the workmen, always came in to sit by the kitchen range to eat his lunch - half a loaf, with a hole gouged for a knob of butter, a hunk of cheese and a stick of celery. We always hovered near, waiting for a titbit and envying the way he ate with his pocket knife.

The greenhouse with its vine tomatoes, Marechal Niel rose and fuchsia, (whose buds we secretly popped) was my father's province, but we had a little plot of garden to cultivate as we pleased. There was also the orchard with nut bushes.

apple, pear, plum, greengage and damson trees, an old summer-house and in the spring clumps of daffodils, narcissi and snowdrops under foot.

Here we had an old car to play in and a freestanding swing which had been made in the workshop. My mother kept a few chickens and my father had two hives of bees which we treated with respect, especially after the day my youngest brother tapped the hive and was badly stung. We watched the honey being extracted and stored for winter coughs and colds and we always enjoyed at least one dish-full of it dripping from the comb.

The workshops were a treasure house of different smells, sights and sounds. Fresh sawdust and wood-shavings, hot glue, putty, turpentine, paint, pitch (for treating the inside of coffins), smoke, the sound of bellows and the clash and clang of sizzling hot metal are the memories of days when the blacksmith and wheelwright's shop were in action.

Some days the band saw screamed through pieces of wood, and once a toad or frog was found unharmed in the hole of a tree, the cross saw must have missed it by a fraction of an inch. We saw handles renewed on implements, farm carts and wagons repaired and painted, sometimes with decorative scrolls and the owner's name and address inscribed. Something interesting was always happening and we had our own end of a work bench when we wanted to experiment on our own account.

Sometimes my father would go tree-felling, as far afield as Northwoods or Dodington. and the rough tree trunks would be hauled back to the timber yard on a bogey drawn by hired heavy horses. We enjoyed clambering over the timber as it lay in the yard for seasoning. My brothers built dens and played war games hiding upon the beams and in the saw shed and diving into the enormous box of sawdust. The horizontal saw – later electrified - was originally

powered by an ancient steam engine which was housed in a shed adjoining the blacksmith's shop and bands ran across to the saw shed. Timber was manoeuvred on to the heavy saw bed by means of ratchets and chains and secured by metal dogs, to be cut into planks which were then stored in an open-sided shed. There was the thrill of a slow ride on the saw bed as it moved inexorably towards the sharp saw, a leap to safety, under the watchful eye of an apprentice, before we reached danger point.

There was nothing macabre for us in the

undertaking business, it was just a fact of life and our parents' firm, serene faith in an afterlife was comfortingly reassuring. My father would be sent for, returning with measurements and instructions. Oak or elm boards would be chosen and skilfully cut and bowed to the appropriate shape and size. The wood was sanded smooth and polished with our home-made beeswax polish: wood, chrome or brass handles being attached. My grandmother usually cut the

lining material and sewed a square of muslin for a veil. I often collected spare snippets of trimmings for use in my doll's house.

Sometimes the coffin and its occupant would rest overnight in the little mortuary my father had built, and I would polish the brass candlesticks and arrange a vase of flowers to go in there. In the 1930s some people still preferred a horse drawn procession and we enjoyed the dramatic arrival of the gleaming hearse and coal black horses. My father usually wore a top hat and tails when

conducting a funeral and sometimes the workmen would also don sober clothes to act as bearers. The floral wreaths and crosses would provide the only

splash of colour. Granny Skinner, who was a semiinvalid, lived with us and while my mother was busy with the household tasks.

she taught us the rudiments of knitting and sewing and told us stories of the "olden days". We would watch her flashing shuttle produce yards of tatting to decorate household linen and handkerchiefs. In the dark winter evenings, she taught us whist and cribbage or sometimes we would visit the three old aunts who lived in a cottage nearby and there we learnt to play chess and draughts and halma.

On the back of the settee in the living room hung a set of hand-bells. These came into action at Christmas when my father found time to go out carolling with a few friends, who always returned to our house at the end of the evening for a warming glass of home-made ginger brandy.

There was never much money - my father was too kind-hearted to be a good businessman but we collected a wealth of happy memories and never lacked for friends who were always eager to share and explore our fascinating home.

During the war my father was both a special constable and an air-raid warden, and our house being one of the few with a telephone, was used as an air-raid post. The stone walls of the downstairs passage were considered thick enough to provide a safe retreat during air-raids, so we never had an Anderson shelter.

Frampton Cotterell was in the flight path between Bristol, Filton and Yate – all enemy targets, and we sometimes watched dogfights in the sky as enemy planes were intercepted. Occasionally bombs would be iettisoned, but comparatively few fell on Frampton, but I remember the night a land-mine was dropped in the field beyond our orchard, its impact was cushioned by landing on a haystack, but it left quite a deep crater and next morning we found our trees festively decked with hay covered by a

light sprinkling of snow.

I remember one occasion when my brother automatically got out of bed on hearing the warning siren, and rolled from top to bottom of the stairs without waking or hurting himself. As children we often slept through all but the noisiest raids.

My mother referred to those days in a letter written in 1940 which I still possess:-

August 11th 1940, Sunday night 11, Woodend, Frampton Cotterell, Bristol Dearest Chum.

I feel so guilty, as I believe I owe you for two letters, but my days are so full I can't seem to fit it in - I'm writing to you at 10.30pm during an air raid, as Arthur is on duty and I have to listen for the phone in any case. We get so many raids now that we don't take much notice of them! Except when they drop bombs, and we've had a rest from them this week. their planes have been dropping leaflets instead. but I saw A.A. shells bursting in the distance last night, above the balloon barrage. I counted eighty balloons up tonight!

Guns are booming outside and Jerry is mooching round like an old bumble Bee! I wish he'd get off home and let me go to bed! Gran is sleeping down stairs now and C.J. and Micky in the drawing room and they are all sleeping peacefully at the moment, and I wander round like an old hen with her chickens, peeping in to see if they are all asleep!

My father died on 27th December 1942, after a tree felling accident at Dodington the previous day. He had been helping a friend, and was badly injured when the tree fell.

My mother carried on the business, with the help of a manager until early 1945, when she married a widower and moved away from the area.

This initiative helps the children here at St Michael's to recognise the importance of a good education for all children, especially in helping to break the cycle of poverty, and it enables them to develop a greater global perspective.

## Take time to listen

Has the text message replaced the art of sending postcards on holiday? I recall as a teenager

spending the first few days

searching for the right postcard to send to friends at home and hoping to receive one in return — sharing the holiday experience. Sorting through my paperwork recently, I found a postcard sent to my daughter from her Nan back in 1996. The caption underneath two colourful parrots — 'If there is one thing I can't stand is someone who talks when I am interrupting!' Was there a hidden meaning in those words — we'll never know, but I smile when reading it!

Well, listening figured highly in my younger days through various family ups and downs and is an important practice in my journey of faith, by listening to God through prayer and meditation in my calling to minister to others.

We have recently experienced during recent TV political debates the practice of 'interrupting', which stifles 'real' sharing from the person trying to express an opinion. Where is the understanding that love is patient, kind, not arrogant or rude, insisting on its own way? (1 Corinthians 13). Good listening can be powerful, healing and transformational. This is how Jesus shared his ministry amongst his disciples and the people he met on his travels, not always trying to fix things for them but encouraging

prayer and discerning the way forward in God's strength. It cost him, as many people preferred the aggressive approach rather than seeking good communication skills to build people up.

One of our recent mission area initiatives has been to organise two local training modules on good listening skills led by Acorn Christian Trust. These two days have proved successful, insightful and revealing as to how we develop unhelpful listening habits — wanting to interrupt that tends to steer any deep sharing into a different and sometimes unhelpful direction. Silence is the key to good listening and can be a gift to those on the receiving end, leading to prayer that is our means of communication with God in times of joy as well as sadness.

During the sultry days of summer, why not sit and relax and check your listening skills in this little exercise:

Question 1. When I am not listened to I feel...? (write all the words down on left side of sheet of paper.)

Question 2. Think of a time when you were listened to, and complete the sentence with one word – When I am listened to I feel...? (write these words on right side of paper).

To finish: Read out the two columns of words and consider the effectiveness of good listening.

Every blessing to you as we look forward to many more good conversations and perhaps the renewed interest in sending postcards!




