

An Environmentally Friendly Alternative to Cremation

The water cremation procedure is simple, copying what nature does during burial, by using a gentle solution of 95% water and 5% alkaline to enable the body to go through the natural action of breaking down to its constituent parts. At the end of the process, the ashes of the person can be returned to the family in the same way that they can be with a flame cremation. The Water cremation process is not currently available in the UK but Resomation Ltd is working with the funeral industry regulators and local authorities to raise awareness of this technology.

Jo Hume, at Ian Watts & Son who cover South Wales & the South West said, 'When people take out funeral plans with us, they very often say that they don't like the idea of either a burial or a flame cremation so this could be a new alternative. Water cremation is already operating in North America and Canada and is known as 'alkaline hydrolysis.' Wyedean pupils gain great work experience

With social mobility in our local area remaining static compared to other parts of the country, it was inspiring to see students at Wyedean school use their work experience week to boost their future career prospects. The school's priority this year has been to improve students' social capital and employability by connecting them to industry leaders and local professionals.

The students gained some extraordinary experiences. Ben Pisacane worked at BEX Media in Gloucester where he worked with their latest drone filming technology, while Izzie Adams produced illustrations for an app at Sugar Creative (see some of Izzie's excellent creations pictured right). Politics student Alicia Morgan secured a placement in Westminster alongside her local MP and budding corporate accountant, Cameron Williams, worked hard to secure a place Deloittes.





Future medics, Henry Williams and James Philips had a taste of life on the frontline of the NHS. James spent several days with a senior GP who checks everything is in order before a body is cremated, so he spent time in a morgue and crematorium as well as the surgery. Henry spent time with NHS physiotherapists and also sports physiotherapists who were treating Team GB Paralympic athletes. Henry said. 'It was an incredible privilege to work with both teams and it has confirmed that this is the path I want to take in the future.'

It was fantastic to hear that students had made the social connections that will help them progress after their A-levels. Maya Tyrrell joined a networking society for young planning consultants while Ellis Kirton made connections at EFL, an engineering company in South Wales.



The school's reputation as a Cyber Security Hub School was re-inforced by Tom Carter and Shay Wearden's experience at Cyber Security Associates as well as Kara Dummett, Dan Creber and Jake Andrews who worked at Deep 3. None of these students can divulge the nature of their work! Tom (pictured left) said, 'Work experience in this field helps you connect the dots between learning in the classroom and the reality of working in the industry. It's definitely encouraged me to pursue a career in cyber.'

As the county faces the prospect of an aging population, it is heartening to hear that young people in the Forest of Dean and Monmouthshire are developing the skills and social connections to grow a thriving economy in our local community. We look forward to seeing these students' experiences bearing fruit in the future.

Going away this Summer?

Summer is here and with it comes sunshine filled days and weeks away exploring the world. While you are away from your garden, you may be concerned about your plants and keeping them watered. There is nothing worse than coming home to wilted plants and withered crops.

Luckily, there are steps you can take to make sure your garden stays looking fantastic! So when you get back home, you can relax with a cuppa in the garden (and ignore the pile of washing!)

- A day or so before you leave, weed your garden. Weeds compete for water with other plants, removing them will make sure your plants have more.
- Cut the grass instead of putting the cuttings in your green bin, pile them on your beds. Not only will your lawn look neat, the cuttings will create a mulch. Mulched plants lose 25% less water, helping keep them healthy.
- 3. Before you leave, water your plants deeply. This means give the soil a through soaking a quick run around with a watering can will not be enough. If you can leave a sprinkler on for a while this will help when watering large areas.
- 4. If you have areas that dry out quickly because they are in full sun, cover the ground to trap moisture. This can be done with bark or wood chips, mulch or stones. Do not use plastic as you want rain water to still get in to the soil.
- 5. You can also add a shade cloth. Common in greenhouses, shade cloths diffuse the light and help protect plants from direct sunlight. This could even be an old sheet on some poles!
- 6. Use water spikes. These are handy for containers, hanging baskets and houseplants. Using a recycled plastic bottle, fill it with water and screw on the water spike where the lid would be. This will allow the water to slowly drip out, keeping your plants watered. If you are away for two weeks, you can use two or three bottles.
- Create an automated water system. You can add a timer to your garden hose and set up a watering system around your garden. This will make sure your plants are watered as if you were actually there.



- Ask a friend or neighbour! Usually they will be more than happy to pop in to your garden and keep everything watered for you.
- Water butts. These store rain water, so can provide you with lots of free water. You can run soaker hoses from them in to your garden, which will slowly saturate the ground while you are away.

Hopefully these tips will help your garden stay green and fabulous while you are away. TIDENHAM CHURCH FLOWER FESTIVAL -A WONDERFUL WEEK!!

St Mary & St Peter Church in Tidenham enjoyed a highly successful Flower Festival week held in glorious weather in July. The Festival not only incorporated nearly twenty floral displays from organisations based throughout the Parish of Tidenham, but also had a special Opening Afternoon Event, with continuous "live" music performed by local musicians, including items by some younger parishioners.

During the afternoon, when the church was buzzing with nearly 100 people who had come to enjoy the flowers and music, afternoon tea was available. The Church's own Bellringing Team opened the events, joined later by a visiting team from Somerset. The Church was also decorated

with many colourful knitted flowers, done by local supporters, which decorated the font, chancel and pulpit areas as well as outside down the pathways and gates.

The Flower arrangements "theme" this year was Book Titles, and a Quiz was available for participation for all who came to view throughout the week. This was also the focus of two evenings of entertainment by the Drama Group Go2Theatre , who provided superb cameos of a whole variety of scenes and extracts of literature ranging from Shakespeare to 20th century novels, interwoven with music background, popular short song items and interludes. It was a fantastic end to a fantastic week for Tidenham Church.







This event, organised by the Friends of St Mary & Tidenham Church, had a major focus, raising £2000 which was continuing the fundraising for the ongoing Church Refurbishment Project, now into its fifth year. Having now established a car park, disabled access, water piped to the church, the tower clock repaired and functioning, and other essential matters, the next crucial phase is new heating, due to be installed before the end of the year. This will be followed, as soon as funds are raised, with 21st century facilities. The 14th century building is important for our local heritage but now must be made "fit for purpose" for a new 21st generation, a place for future community use, as well as a continuing place of worship – and this is what the Friends of Tidenham Church are doing, with the support offered by local people.

Future events in 2019 include a Quiz Night on 19th October and a Christmas Tree Festival, again with an Opening Evening of music and readings on 19th December.








Take the Plunge for The West of **England MS Therapy Centre**

Plastic Free Chepstow Summer Challenge

We've all heard that litter, especially plastic litter, is hurting our environment in terrible ways. From the bottom of the deepest ocean to the top of the tallest mountain, pieces of rubbish have been found. Yet people sometimes still need a reminder not to drop trash - and we at Plastic Free Chepstow (a Transition Chepstow group) need your help to do this.

If you're aged between 11 and 18, we want you to find a new way to spread the 'Don't litter' message. You can do this any way you choose. You could create a poster, a video, a song, sculpture or poem, or any other idea to use in a social media campaign. It could be funny, sad, scary, or a mixture of all three - the choice is yours. All we ask is that it gets the message across effectively, especially to people in your age group.

The winning entries will be judged by a panel, including input from young people. The judges will be looking for something that grabs people's attention, has a clear message, and encourages people to act responsibly.

We are offering 4 prizes of £50 each for individual entries and 2 of £100 each for team entries. The creator of the strongest message will get a chance to work with graphics and video professionals to create a real-life campaign.

Strong campaigns are based on good research. We know that people drop litter for many reasons and different problems need different messages. We also know that positive messages (like 'take it home' or 'bin it') often work best. We hope you will look around you, talk to your friends and family and maybe take a bag and pick up the litter you find. You can also visit the websites of organisations such as Keep Wales Tidy and Keep Britain Tidy, the Marine Conservation Society and Surfers against Sewage.

Playground pals



Paralympian Jack Rutter Inspires Local School Children

In the soaring temperatures of Friday 28th June, the junior school pupils of Ysgol Y Ffin were put through their paces by paralympian Jack Rutter. In teams, each of the pupils aged 7-11 completed circuit style bases which included press-ups, lunges and mountain climbing exercises.

Jack Rutter has joined forces with a great number of other disabled athletes of various disciplines, who aim to inspire children throughout the country through the "Sports for Schools" initiative, which aims to deliver physical education, whilst promoting a positive "I can" attitude. Through child sponsorship for the event, they also help schools to raise much needed funds for sport equipment.

Following the physical activities, Jack then inspired and uplifted both children and staff as he explained his story, which proves just how strong human nature can be when it is put to the test. As an 18 year old, Jack was an up and coming footballer, who was on the verge of signing a professional contract with Birmingham City, when he fell victim to an unprovoked attack, resulting in brain injuries that left his dreams in tatters. In the period that followed, his mother made contact with the East Midlands Cerebral Palsy football team, who accepts players with other neurological

conditions. They quickly saw Jack's skill and potential and he was soon signed up to play for England.

Since then Jack Rutter has made quite a name for himself as one of the country's top disability football players. He has 14 England caps to his name, 9 of those as captain, he has represented England in the European Championships in Portugal, as well as the Cerebral Palsy World Championships. The ultimate honour came in 2016, when he captained the Paralympics GB Seven-a-side football team in the Paralympic Games in Rio.






