





# Fabulous FREE family day out

Home made go karts will tear around a figure of eight race track at Goodwood on Sunday 29th September, in the 12th annual Supreme Box Kart Championships, organised by the Scouting Association.

Cub Scouts aged between 8-10.5 years old from the world's largest youth organisation, have spent months designing and building their karts, as they eagerly anticipate the navigation of such a prominent race track.



Forty-two teams, from three home countries will race around the 120m track, with some expected to fly round it in just 25 seconds! A total of 252 heats will take place before the final knock out stage, which sees the champions taking home a trophy. It truly is an exhilarating experience.

This incredible opportunity was the brain child of Stephen and Amanda Bell, who introduced their own Cub pack to the engineering behind building such karts, followed by a small scale event joined by a few other local Cub packs. Over the past 12 years the annual event has grown considerably and now has entries from all over England, Wales and Northern Ireland. It was hoped that a team from Spain would be joining the jamboree this year, but sadly places are limited and very much works on a first come first served basis with entries selling out within weeks.

When asked why 'The Supreme' as it has become known was so popular, Stephen Bell replied "Box karts are old school and although they are raced in a more controlled manor than when we were children, the adrenalin rush is still there. It ticks all the boxes from creativity, engineering, team work, fitness and above all, fun!"

One of the Welsh teams who were fortunate to be allocated a space are the Cubs of 1st Shirenewton. A spokesperson for the group said "This type of adventurous activity demonstrates the diversity of opportunities afforded to young people through the Scouting programme and let's face it, who wouldn't be a tad excited to be able to say they had actually raced at Goodwood?!"

The Scouting Association has thirty seven million members spanning across the globe to 162 different countries. Fifty years ago it even reached the moon, when Neil Armstrong, himself a Scout, took his own Scout membership badge with him on the Apollo 11 mission, proving to generations of young people that with hard work and determination the possibilities are endless. Interestingly twenty of the twenty four men who travelled to the moon on Apollo missions were Scouts and eleven of the twelve men who walked on the moon were again Scouts.



Who knows how many youngsters will be inspired to fulfill their dreams in car design, engineering or motor racing, thanks to this tremendous opportunity that the Supreme Box Kart annual event gives? But if nothing else it teaches team work, leadership, sportsmanship and endurance, all of which are vital skills in life.

Spectators are very welcome to join the festivities at Goodwood motor circuit on 29th September with the first race setting of sharply at 10am. Thanks to sponsorship from local businesses, there is no charge to anyone who wishes to come and join the electric atmosphere that is ... The Supreme.



# **Tŷ Croeso**

Chepstow Matters was pleased to be invited along to the community run Tŷ Croeso shop in Moor Street for this edition.

## History:

The shop was recently donated to the CIO (Charitable Incorporated Organisation) Friends of Welsh (Chepstow)/ Ffrindiau'r Gymraeg Cylch Cas-Gwent by Margaret Odyomo (née Jones) who describes herself as 'Forest of Dean Welsh' having been born and brought up in St Briavels. After college in Cardiff, Margaret went to Uganda as a VSO and loved it so much that she stayed for 11 years, teaching Biology and marrying Peter, a Ugandan. In 1974 she returned to the UK with her young son to help her mother care for her father who had Alzheimer's. After his death she was unable to return to Uganda because of the fighting in Idi Amin's regime. She therefore remained in the UK and taught Biology and Chemistry at a school in Gloucester until, semi-retired, she worked in the Forensic Lab in Chepstow, living in Tutshill.

On retirement Margaret had - for the first time - both time and opportunity to learn Welsh properly, enrolling in a class at Boverton House with tutors from Coleg Gwent. However her health began to decline (arthritis) and, needing to downsize, she did so with a vengeance, moving to a 1 bed flat in the heart of Chepstow above what is now Tŷ Croeso and, passionate about the Welsh language, she started a 'siop siarad' ('talking shop') in the shop for herself and other learners to converse and consolidate their learning. Over the years the shop morphed into what outwardly looked like a Welsh interest

bookshop, run on a shoestring and trying to support the Welsh language in any way it could. In 2010 Margaret received the Ysbrydoli! / Inspire! Award as Welsh Learner of the year. She passed her A Level in 2011. By this time the South Monmouthshire Welsh Society had formed in Chepstow.

In late 2016 as her health declined further, she moved to a groundfloor flat in Caldicot to be 'on the flat' but, still 'dwli ar y Gymraeg' (passionate about the Welsh language and culture), she gifted the 'siop siarad' premises to become Tŷ Croeso which, hopefully as it's name says, will be a house of Welcome for all interested in the Welsh language and culture.

A group initiated from the Welsh Society in Chepstow, including Norman Chamberlain and Lynne Davies, drew together a CIO (Charitable Incorporated Organisation) to which Margaret very generously transferred ownership of the property. All of the trustees of the CIO are passionate about promoting the Welsh language in the locality, and the group includes both learners and fluent speakers of all ages, reflecting the fact that over 10% of Monmouthshire's residents are either fluent or learning Welsh.

Trustees Lynne, Norman and Andrea have been volunteering regularly to open the Centre. Lynne was born in Cardiff, and brought up bilingually. She moved back to Chepstow several years ago, having spent over 15 years working in England and France, so that her children could attend the Welsh-medium school Ysgol y Ffin in Caldicot. Norman was born locally but spent the majority of his life in England. He didn't learn Welsh until after retirement when he decided to book on a

course, inspired by both his grandparents having been Welsh speakers. "Norman now speaks better welsh than me!" joked Lynne. Similarly, Andrea has learnt Welsh as an adult, regaining the fluency that was her grandparents' birthright.

After some renovation and redecorating, the charity 'Ffrindiau'r Gymraeg Cylch Cas-Gwent' (Friends of the Welsh Language, Chepstow) opened earlier this year in May with a book night and open day, with over 50 people attending.

#### Future Plans:

Looking to the future, Tŷ Croeso has a programme of activities planned for 2019/20 including talks, book club meetings, welsh history sessions, a welsh language folk group, and a total beginners language course taught by Colleg Gwent starting on 16th September.

There is also a baby & toddler group starting in September as well as a Welsh Women's Institut group.

The team are keen to encourage local pupils to use the centre as a resource and pop in too to practice their Welsh or borrow books. There is a library scheme for books which costs just £6 a year for membership. From September, officers from organisations such as Menter laith and Cymraeg Byd Busnes will be able to work from Tŷ Croeso one day per week, to expand the use of Welsh in the community and in local schools.

The group are also looking to start taster language sessions on a Saturday for those not quite sure about starting on a whole course.

For those who are already reasonably fluent there will be the possibility of running some Welsh literature and language courses too.

The premises will be set up for language classes and will also be available to rent to other users when not in use, at very reasonable rates!

At present Tŷ Croeso is run entirely by volunteers, with the building only open to the public on Saturday (check our website for times), but the aim is to open more as support grows.

Everybody from the local area, villages and beyond (including Welsh speakers from Bristol and Thornbury who have already found their way to the shop) are very welcome to pop in and





say hello and have a cuppa - whether you are currently a welsh speaker or just interested to find out more.

# **How's Your Retirement Planning Coming Along?**

#### Keep apathy at bay

At age 55, you can withdraw 25% of a defined contribution pension tax-free, which means the scheme is 'crystallised'. You can keep the rest of the fund invested in an income draw down plan, buy an annuity, or cash in your entire pension, subject to tax; or a pick and mix approach of all three.

If you save into a workplace pension, your employer should make contributions alongside yours, providing a welcome boost to your pension.

## You need more than a safety net

Although the full new State Pension has increased to £168.60 per week, not everyone will get this amount as it will depend on their contribution record. The state retirement age is set to increase too, so if you were born after 6 April 1978 you won't be entitled to receive your state pension until you're 68 years old.

# Gardening tips and advice from Chepstow Garden Centre

Autumn is the perfect time to tidy your garden before the cold weather. There are lots of simple iobs vou can do to help vour garden continue to look spectacular through winter and in to spring.

The first job is tidy your beds. Deadhead flowers, remove dead leaves, pull out collapsed stems and cut back your herbaceous perennials - this will neaten everything up and help it grow back healthy. Don't forget to remove weeds! You can also spread compost or manure over the soil to insulate plant roots.



Next, turn your attention to your

lawn. You will be slowing down on your mowing now, make sure to keep your lawn mower height set high to keep the grass slightly longer for winter, this will help it stay healthy. Grab an edging tool or knife to trim and edge your lawn, a pristine lawn line always looks fantastic.

Our favourite autumn job is planting bulbs. Daffodils, tulips, crocus and hyacinths are all popular

spring flowers you can plant now to enjoy vibrant colours in the spring. You can also plant summer bulbs like lilies, alliums and crocosmia.

# Our top tips for bulb planting:

- Plant most bulbs 2 to 3 times their depth. So, if you have a bulb which is 5cm tall, dig a hole 10-15cm and sit the bulb at the bottom.
- Certain bulbs prefer certain areas, daffodils like a sunny spot with well-drained soil, snowdrops like dappled light and moist soil It is always best to check.
- Layer bulbs in pots start with the largest bulbs at the bottom and work up. Choose bulbs which will flower in different months, so you have constant colour. Top with pansies to add colour in the winter.







# Exploring art history in Chepstow - a new course 'Masters of Art' begins in September

This autumn, a new series begins of the popular art appreciation classes run by Chepstow Museum. The 'Masters of Art' ten-week course takes us through the centuries from the medieval world of 1300 up to the 20th century, by exploring in-depth the work of one artist each week. But instead of focusing on the most obvious artists from a time period, among the painters covered will be some names you may know, but other you may not have encountered before. Each represents a particular era in the history of art, exemplifying the society of their times and the changing fashions in art and culture.

The course, led by well-known and popular local lecturer Eleanor Bird, will set each painter in the context of their contemporaries and of art historical developments.

Beginning with the golden altarpieces of Giovanni da Rimini, an artist whose pictures are as mysterious as his life story, to represent the 15th century instead of Leonardo or Michelangelo, the focus will be on Fra Bartolomeo whose richly coloured works bring Renaissance Italy alive. The course will also turn the spotlight onto several women artists and after moving round the Western world will finish with the Welsh artistic giant. Sir Kyffin Williams.

No prior knowledge of art history is needed and there is no homework. This is learning for enjoyment and pleasure. If you like looking at art and what to know more about understanding it, learning how to look deeper and appreciate the ideas and culture of the time, or if you just want to spend Monday afternoons looking at wonderful images of art in a relaxed and

friendly atmosphere, then give this course a try. If you've not been before there is the opportunity to have the first lecture on Monday 23rd September as a taster session. Lectures take place in the Drill Hall, Lower Church Street, Chepstow.





# Top tips for the school term ahead

Getting children ready for their first day back at school can come with lots of challenges. The retail sector's massive marketing campaigns, with shops full of 'back to school' merchandise, try to make us feel we have to buy everything new – but that's not necessarily the case. And the new school year challenges aren't just financial. Here are some tips to make preparing a little easier.

# Are new uniforms necessary?

There's an expectation that each child needs a new uniform, sports kit and school bag ready for the first day back. However, it pays to be realistic – does your child really need all new stuff? Could their shoes from last term be worn for a little longer? If money is tight it makes sense to make everything last that bit longer. Only buy new if needed!

If you do need to hit the shops, be firm with yourself and ask, 'What do the kids really need?' Cut your list down as much as possible and only buy what's absolutely necessary. Most supermarkets have basics such as polo shirts, trousers and dresses at budget prices. Keep an eye out for offers and any chances to get your hands on free or reduced cost uniform – some schools pass on donated uniform or there may be clothes swaps. Don't forget to check the charity shops too!

# Do you and your child know what to expect on the first day at school?

If your child is starting school for the first time in Reception or Year 1, it helps if you can discuss the routine with them so they know what to expect. You may find little ones get very tired as they adjust to a lot of changes. You could try arranging little treats for them such as their favourite food for lunch or tea so their first few days are associated with things they enjoy.

# What can you do to ease the move from primary to high school?

Children moving up from primary to secondary school may be nervous of such a big change. There are ways to help with this. Chat to your kids about their hopes and fears so you can understand and work towards some solutions. You could also talk about the positives of your



own school days, such as the fun of making new friends and learning new subjects.

This will be followed, as soon as funds are raised, with 21st century facilities. The 14th century building is important for our local heritage but now must be made "fit for purpose" for a new 21st generation, a place for future community use, as well as a continuing place of worship – and this is what the Friends of Tidenham Church are doing, with the support offered by local people.

Future events in 2019 include a Quiz Night on 19th October and a Christmas Tree Festival, again with an Opening Evening of music and readings on 19th December.


