

### Funerals: Make sure you're not paying too much

The CMA (The Competition & Markets Authority) who check that businesses trade fairly have released figures showing that some funeral costs have more than doubled in 14 years – rising on average by 6% a year. This is way above the normal rate of inflation of approximately 2%. The CMA said, 'for a considerable

number of years the largest firms of funeral directors have implemented large annual prices increases.'

Jo Hume at Ian Watts & Son Independent Funeral Directors said, 'having to compare prices of funeral fees is probably one of the last things that a bereaved relative feels like doing, but we strongly encourage anyone to ask about costs and not to feel embarrassed or awkward about doing so.'

'We are passionate,' Jo added, 'about respect, care and dignity and about being transparent about prices. We don't have huge financial overheads like some larger funeral homes do and we will never charge unnecessary costs. It is important too, for those having to arrange a funeral to know what is included, sometimes other companies offer a fixed fee but when reading the small print there is very little included and additional items are then added later.'

Jo's business partner in Monmouthshire, Martin Watts, concluded, 'it is disgraceful that some families get overcharged at what is often the worst time of their lives.'

All the profits of the shop go to the Alzheimer's Society and Dementia UK and to date over £8,000 has been raised since the shop was set up over 2 years ago.

Kate Lewis, who runs her own Healthcare business, opened the shop and wanted to give something back to the community by offering respite to people who's loved ones have Alzheimer's or Dementia. Family members can leave their loved ones for a couple of hours with Toni (Shop Manager) and she runs worthwhile activities ie arts and crafts, knitting, Dementia jig-saw puzzles, newspapers going back to the 1940's and '50's. Also ladies can have a manicure or sometimes they may just want to sit and have a chat. This service is Free of Charge!



As Joy's also offers Teas and Coffees for just a donation, local care homes regularly bring their residents over for cuppa. Joy's has become a life line and drop in venue for anybody to pop in for a sit and a chat. Joy's was one of the first businesses to become a registered "safe" place with Monmouthshire County Council.

Toni is passionate about fundraising for Alzheimer's and Dementia as she lost her Mum to Dementia over 3 years ago and she is well aware of the sadness and frustration that family members feel when their loved ones are diagnosed with this illness.

"The feedback I get from family members is very overwhelming and I just wish there was a place like this when my Mum had Dementia.

"Recently one of the fundraising events at Joy's was the Alzheimer's Cupcake day where I baked

over 70 cupcakes and Laura, a local singer, offered to come in and sing to my customers which was a lovely event (photo ight)! I also held a Cream Tea event to mark the National Afternoon Tea week which was so popular that I sold out of scones each day! I also do the annual Macmillan Coffee morning which is always well attended" Photo right shows visitors from Castleford Nursing Home enjoying a cream tea.

# **Tŷ Croeso**

Chepstow Matters was pleased to be invited along to the community run Tŷ Croeso shop in Moor Street recently.

### History:

The shop was recently donated to the CIO (Charitable Incorporated Organisation) Friends of Welsh (Chepstow)/ Ffrindiau'r Gymraeg Cylch Cas-Gwent by Margaret Odyomo (née Jones) who describes herself as 'Forest of Dean Welsh' having been born and brought up in St Briavels. After college in Cardiff, Margaret went to Uganda as a VSO and loved it so much that she stayed for 11 years, teaching Biology and marrying Peter, a Ugandan. In 1974 she returned to the UK with her young son to help her mother care for her father who had Alzheimer's. After his death she was unable to return to Uganda because of the fighting in Idi Amin's regime. She therefore remained in the UK and taught Biology and Chemistry at a school in Gloucester until, semi-retired, she worked in the Forensic Lab in Chepstow, living in Tutshill.

On retirement Margaret had - for the first time - both time and opportunity to learn Welsh properly, enrolling in a class at Boverton House with tutors from Coleg Gwent. However her health began to decline (arthritis) and, needing to downsize, she did so with a vengeance, moving to a 1 bed flat in the heart of Chepstow above what is now Tŷ Croeso and, passionate about the Welsh language, she started a 'siop siarad' ('talking shop') in the shop for herself and other learners to converse and consolidate their learning. Over the years the shop morphed into what outwardly looked like a Welsh interest bookshop, run on a shoestring and trying to

support the Welsh language in any way it could. In 2010 Margaret received the Ysbrydoli! / Inspire! Award as Welsh Learner of the year. She passed her A Level in 2011. By this time the South Monmouthshire Welsh Society had formed in Chepstow.

In late 2016 as her health declined further, she moved to a groundfloor flat in Caldicot to be 'on the flat' but, still 'dwli ar y Gymraeg' (passionate about the Welsh language and culture), she gifted the 'siop siarad' premises to become Tŷ Croeso which, hopefully as it's name says, will be a house of Welcome for all interested in the Welsh language and culture.

A group initiated from the Welsh Society in Chepstow, including Norman Chamberlain and Lynne Davies, drew together a CIO (Charitable Incorporated Organisation) to which Margaret very generously transferred ownership of the property. All of the trustees of the CIO are passionate about promoting the Welsh language in the locality, and the group includes both learners and fluent speakers of all ages, reflecting the fact that over 10% of Monmouthshire's residents are either fluent or learning Welsh.

Trustees Lynne, Norman and Andrea have been volunteering regularly to open the Centre. Lynne was born in Cardiff, and brought up bilingually. She moved back to Chepstow several years ago, having spent over 15 years working in England and France, so that her children could attend the Welsh-medium school Ysgol y Ffin in Caldicot. Norman was born locally but spent the majority of his life in England. He didn't learn Welsh until after retirement when he decided to book on a course, inspired by both his grandparents having

been Welsh speakers. "Norman now speaks better welsh than me!" joked Lynne. Similarly, Andrea has learnt Welsh as an adult, regaining the fluency that was her grandparents' birthright.

After some renovation and redecorating, the charity 'Ffrindiau'r Gymraeg Cylch Cas-Gwent' (Friends of the Welsh Language, Chepstow) opened earlier this year in May with a book night and open day, with over 50 people attending.

### Future Plans:

Looking to the future, Tŷ Croeso has a programme of activities planned for 2019/20 including talks, book club meetings, welsh history sessions, a welsh language folk group, and a total beginners language course taught by Colleg Gwent starting on 16th September.

There is also a baby & toddler group starting in September as well as a Welsh Women's Institut group.

The team are keen to encourage local pupils to use the centre as a resource and pop in too to practice their Welsh or borrow books. There is a library scheme for books which costs just £6 a year for membership. From September, officers from organisations such as Menter laith and Cymraeg Byd Busnes will be able to work from Tŷ Croeso one day per week, to expand the use of Welsh in the community and in local schools.


The group are also looking to start taster language sessions on a Saturday for those not quite sure about starting on a whole course.

For those who are already reasonably fluent there will be the possibility of running some Welsh literature and language courses too.

The premises will be set up for language classes and will also be available to rent to other users when not in use, at very reasonable rates!

At present Tŷ Croeso is run entirely by volunteers, with the building only open to the public on Saturday (check our website for times), but the aim is to open more as support grows.

Everybody from the local area, villages and beyond (including Welsh speakers from Bristol and Thornbury who have already found their way to the shop) are very welcome to pop in and say hello and have a cuppa - whether you are





currently a welsh speaker or just interested to find out more.

## **How's Your Retirement Planning Coming Along?**

It may seem like light years away, but retirement will creep around faster than you expect. At age 55, you can withdraw 25% of a defined contribution pension tax-free, which means the scheme is 'crystallised'. You can keep the rest of the fund invested in an income draw down plan, buy an annuity, or cash in your entire pension, subject to tax; or a pick and mix approach of all three.

If you save into a workplace pension, your employer should make contributions alongside yours, providing a welcome boost to your pension.

### You need more than a safety net

Although the full new State Pension has increased to £168.60 per week, not everyone will get this amount as it will depend on their contribution record. The state retirement age is set to increase too, so if you were born after 6 April 1978 you won't be entitled to receive your state pension until you're 68 years old.



### Something for everyone





### **Derek's Gym Celebrates 50 Years in Chepstow!**

2019 see Derek's Gym & Fitness Centre celebrating 50 years of offering Chepstow locals support and guidance with general fitness and figure training, and specialising in instruction for strength training, in both amateur and professional bodybuilding. 'Chepstow Weight Lifting Club' was founded by Derek Platt, way back in 1969 and Derek has some very interesting tales of life in the gym over the years, which he fully admits has really taken over his life! Always interested in personal fitness and training, Derek moved to Chepstow from Essex in 1968 having spent 5 years training in physical fitness and teaching. Right from

the outset he wanted to set up his own gym and he started off taking weights to different venues such as the youth club in Bulwark, before setting up in his first permanent base in the old Museum Building, opposite the Castle, amongst other venues. Soon Derek was training around 60 individuals several times a week and, needing a bigger venue, Derek eventually took on the derelict Old Fire Station which he did up himself at his own expense in return for reduced rent from the council.

At this point the gym was renamed Derek's Gym & Fitness Centre, and training has carried on in this venue since 1982

Over the years Derek has successfully trained many top body builders who have gone on to win Mr / Miss Wales competitions (18 females winners and even more male winners!) Mr / Miss Europe and even on to Mr / Miss Universe competitions in America, South Africa or wherever the finals have been held. The gym has hosted the Mr/Miss Europe and Mr Universe in Newport and Derek has taken Welsh and English teams all over the world - subsidised by the gym. Derek organised many local competitions himself, many held at Chepstow Leisure Centre, which brought in much business and local stars to the town in years past. His first big show was held in Monmouth Rose Hall in 1969 - Mr / Miss Monmouthshire.

Derek used to compete himself in earlier years and won body building titles in the 1970s (inset photo). As an international judge himself for over 30 years, Derek's Gym attracted visitors from across the world to come to Chepstow in years gone by.



Derek is keen to point out that the gym isn't all about body building though. "It's a nice place to train, using basic exercises and weights to build strength, resulting in increased weight loss and a toned physique. I have helped many girls feel better about themselves

through figure training. There is no quick fix, it takes a lot of hard work and good old fashioned training. I am vehemently against the use of steroids and the like and you won't find anything like that in my gym."

We spoke to gym member Terry Wyatt who has been training with Derek for several years and is currently aiming at the Senior over-50s Mr Wales competition next year, closely followed by the Mr UK. "Derek's is a good gym - it's a clean, healthy gym, there are no steroids or anything here, it is all natural - you have to earn your physique the hard way! Derek is a great trainer - he helps everyone". Terry's son Ross also trains at Derek's and competes in the power lifting.

I also had the pleasure of chatting to June, who was the very first female member of the gym when it opened at the fire station back in 1982! Now in her mid-60s June still likes to work out at least once a week in the gym. "I've got arthritis and hip problems (awaiting a second hip replacement), but weight bearing exercise is good for me and exercising revitalises me. I've never been into bodybuilding, just in keeping toned up. Derek's is local to me and very reasonably priced compared to other gyms."

### Weekday mornings, Mon, Wed, Fri there is a regular over 60s group who train at the gym.

Derek moved to Tutshill 10 years ago where he lives with his wife Joy, who helps and supports him run the gym. For the 32 years prior to this move, Derek was the caretaker of Chepstow Comp and Leisure Centre and lived on site. Now in his 70s, Derek still works out - "You feel a lot better after a workout! I love the gym and the people I have met along the way, many of whom I am still in contact with. The black and white photo dates back to our earliest days at the youth club and I still see two or three of them. The gym was never to make money, all money has always been ploughed back into the gym and its equipment, and on supporting the competitions - it was never going to make me a millionaire, but I've loved it!"

Everyone is welcome at Derek's Gym - use of the gym is fully flexible, you can pay per session at  $\mathfrak{L}3.50$ , or this reduces to  $\mathfrak{L}2.50$  if you join as a member for just  $\mathfrak{L}15$  annually. There are also options for unlimited use - 3 months for  $\mathfrak{L}45$ , or  $\mathfrak{L}80$  for 6 months. The gym is open from 10am - 1pm on Monday, Wednesday, Friday and Sunday and 5-9pm Monday through Thursday, and 5-8pm on a Friday.





### **Your Autumn and Winter Garden – Tips from Chepstow Garden Centre**

October is a wonderful time of year. The leaves are turning an assortment of beautiful colours and the days are getting cool and crisp. Nature looks beautiful right now and your garden can be just as stunning.

Autumn flowering plants can be added to your borders, hanging baskets and containers to make your garden colourful. Pansies, violas and cyclamen are all great for striking floral displays. Late flowering perennials include Sedums, Asters and Japanese Anemones – perfect for filling out your garden with colour and interest.

Autumn is also the ideal time to plant hedges, trees and shrubs. Whether you need to move them within your garden or if you would like new plants, now is the time to get them. This allows the plants to establish themselves before spring and summer, so you will have fantastic displays. So if you have always wanted that fruit tree or ornamental shrub, you have the perfect excuse to invest in your garden!

Your pruning skills will be used a lot at this time of year. There are a number of plants which will need to be cut back, including climbing and rambling roses or perennials which have started to die back. Evergreen plants will also need some care, this will be their final trim of the year. Taking time to get them looking great now will make sure they look perfect all winter.

Don't forget to stock up on garden fleece. Once the frosts start, you can cover your younger or less hardy plants with fleece overnight to help protect them from the cold weather. Fleece will also protect plants from wind and hail, and is a must have in your garden over the cooler winter months.

Lastly, think about your garden next year. If you would like to help our pollinators next year you should be sowing your wildflower seeds now. Sow them directly in to the ground before it freezes ready for stunning displays the bees and butterflies will appreciate next year.

Looking ahead to winter, you may be thinking about wreaths for your door. A live wreath is a great way to make the most of the plants already in your garden. You can make stunning Autumnal wreaths, which then can be changed in to Christmas wreaths.

Wreaths can contain all sorts of plants, from traditional evergreen foliage and holly berries to sedums and fresh herbs! The lovely thing about a homemade wreath is you can customise it to your style.

It is best for a wreath to be cool and not in direct sunlight, this will help the longevity of the cut plants. Mist the front and back of the wreath with water every 2-3 days to help the cut stems have water to drink. A live wreath should last 2-3 weeks inside, and longer if it is cool outdoors. You can even make it ahead of time and keep in the fridge or garage ready to display!


# Chepstow Chamber launches Welsh version of new map and town trails brochure

### Christmas is creeping up on us!

### Making a list saves money
