A new ceramic plaque is to be installed by the Chepstow Society to mark the site of a forgotten medieval Priory.

The plaque (pictured right) will commemorate the Augustinian Priory of St Kingsmark – originally a Welsh prince and local saint named Cynfarch or Kynemark, whose 7th century church was in the area. This was some 400 years before the Normans built Chepstow Castle and the Priory that became St Mary's Church.

The plaque has been designed by local artist Keith Underwood, and made by ceramicist Ned Heywood. It will be installed at the top (north-west) end of the footpath leading from Kingsmark Lane down to St Kingsmark Avenue.



Old maps show that the path roughly follows the southern edge of the old parish of St Kynemark, which centred on the Priory and extended from Crossway Green to the site of The Mount on Welsh Street.

St Kynemark's Priory itself was founded before 1270, and functioned until Henry VIII's Dissolution of the Monasteries in 1534.

The Priory's stones were used in later farm buildings, and there is now nothing to be seen of it above ground. Excavations in the early 1960s – before the modern houses on Kingsmark Lane were built – uncovered evidence of three monastic ranges,

but no church.

The work to install the plaque and its small plinth will be carried out between now and Christmas, and it is hoped that there will be a formal unveiling in due course. Monmouthshire County Council has agreed that the installation work be carried out.

The Chepstow Society was formed in 1948 as a local history and civic society. The Society is actively engaged in efforts to improve local amenities, while safeguarding the heritage, character and charm of the town.

It is at the forefront in preserving the town's historic features of the town, and has been instrumental in placing many plaques around the town highlighting places of interest. It holds monthly meetings and talks in the Drill Hall in Chepstow, and welcomes new members.

Children of the Dell Pay Tribute to local war hero
Able Seaman William Charles Williams VC

It was wonderful to be invited along to the Dell Primary School on 11 November, where around 60 pupils in Year 6 were treated to a very special history lesson by local historian, Tim Ryan on William Charles Williams VC. Not only did they get to hear about the Able Seaman's bravery during WW1, but they were also able to meet his great, great niece, Emma Gudgeon and her father, Gordon Pidsley.

We then collectively walked down to the Memorial Gun, next to the town's Cenotaph, where the children joined in with the service led by Rev Philip Averay by reading poems and laying their wreaths, before the minute's silence. This special event was organised by the Dell's Julie Foster and Sue Kingdom of the Chepstow Chamber of Commerce.

It was over 100 years ago that William Williams' heroic action at the Gallipoli Landing not only won him the Victoria Cross but also a special place in Chepstow's heart. He is honoured by two public memorials, the German U-boat gun in Beaufort Square and a painting (below) in St Mary's Priory Church, as well as being listed on the town centre Cenotaph.

During the ill-fated Gallipoli landings on 25th April 1915, whilst under heavy gunfire from Turkish defenders which was taking our



men down in droves, Able Seaman William Williams and his Captain, Edwin Unwin stood chest deep in the water

for nearly an hour holding together a makeshift bridge enabling men to cross to shore. All the time, machine gun fire prevailed and eventually Williams was fatally hit. Unwin carried him back on board and Williams died in his arms.

Able Seaman William Charles Williams was the first ever naval posthumous award of the Victoria Cross, which his father received from the King at Buckingham Palace in 1916. Williams was one of five to receive the highest award for gallantry that day for their work in holding the line of lighters (which acted as the bridge), a sixth was won for rescuing wounded men from the water's edge. By 9am, when the action stopped, more than 1,000 men had been lost in the attempt to disembark.

On 8th January 1922, three war memorials were unveiled in Chepstow. As well as the Cenotaph (opposite right), the Gun (below) presented to the town by King George V was unveiled by Mrs Frances Smith, Williams' eldest sister (grandmother/great grandmother respectively to





living relatives Gordon and Emma), and Captain Unwin VC unveiled the painting of the landing of the SS River Clyde by Charles Dixon in honour of Williams, 'the bravest sailor he ever met' and 'the man above all others who deserved the VC at the landing'.

After the service the children briefly visited the Greenman Backpackers hostel (the former site of the British Legion). Owner of the backpackers Mick Lewis respects the building's former heritage by displaying photos of Chepstow's war heroes, including William

Williams. It was in front of this that the children presented Emma and Gordon with two gifts (photo above), a special commemorative





poppy brooch and a replica of the VC medal, as sadly the original medal was lost to the family a long time ago and, despite a fundraising attempt several years ago to find it and buy it back, it now resides in Lord Ashcroft's private collection.

"If you remember anything from today, let it be that these people died so that you can all live the lives you live today. It is important that you remember this so that in the future, when you are grown up and us older people are no longer here, YOU can be the ones to tell this to the new younger generation.

We must never forget." Gordon Pidsley

Last year for the Armistice centenary, scouting members across Monmouthshire embarked on events to commemorate the centenary of the end of WW1.

Across the county, 811 youth members from 6 year old beavers to 18 year old explorers and 206 uniformed adult leaders created by hand, a ceramic poppy, with each representing a Monmouthshire resident who had lost their life in conflict over the past 100 years. Each poppy was etched with the name of a fallen serviceman and the date they fell as a symbolic piece of art which demonstrates the human cost of war.

There was a district Scout Rememberence service held last November at Raglan Castle, where these poppies were a poignant focus and they have remained in circulation at significant venues throughout this past year, making their final journey to Tintern Abbey, in time for this year's Remembrance service. What a stunning backdrop Tintern Abbey proved to be!! The sun came streaming through and lit up the ceramic poppy display beautifully.

For the younger members of the association, the two World Wars are studied in history lessons, yet many have personal family connections with present day service personel, some of whom have lost their lives in conflicts since the Great War.

The Scouting association has a long standing connection to the British services, with their founder Robert Baden-Powell holding the rank of Major-General in the British army. Baden-Powell served in Indian and Africa between 1876 – 1910 and amongst other decorations for service, was invested as a Companion of the Order of the Bath (CB), which is the fourth most senior of the British Orders of Chivalry. At the age of fifty seven, Baden-Powel put himself at the disposal of the war office at the outbreak of WWI in 1914, but he was not given a command. There are thought to be rumours that this was due to Lord Kitchener saying at the time that "he could lay his hand on several competent"

divisional generals, but could not find anyone who could carry on the invaluable work of the Boy Scouts."

As the conclusion of this year long project comes to an end, the ceramic poppies will be going on sale for £15 each to finally rest with families and individuals across the County, in the hope that the sacrifice and human cost of conflict and war is made a present and personal reality, which will remain in the hearts of generations to come.

The public are invited to "pick their own" poppies directly from Tintern Abbey, where there is an honesty box in the Abbey Shop.

Exciting Learning at Pembroke Primary School

At Pembroke Primary we ensure that our learners are motivated and passionate to learn through exciting topics where pupils are part of the planning process. With a new and exciting topic every term for every year group, there is always lots of exciting learning taking place.

This term Year Four dived into the topic of Blue Abyss. It started with a trip to the Bristol Aquarium. The children had an incredible time seeing the beautiful sea creatures in the aquarium, especially the rays.

During a numeracy lesson involving measurements, the children measured the length of a humpback whale and drew it in chalk outside. They were shocked at how huge it was!

The children used Chrome Books to independently research a sea creature. They took notes and eventually created a leaflet to inform Year 3 all about their sea creature.





What we have found out:

"There are two species of elephant seals, Southern elephant seals and Northern elephant seals." - Alesha

"Bull sharks are one of the most dangerous species of sharks." - Kian

They also learnt about plastic pollution and created their own posters to raise awareness. Inspired by the sculptures of Angela Haseltine Pozzi, they created their own sea creature sculpture from recycled plastic

The children have also written a Haiku Poem about the sea.

"Down in the deep sea Strange fish lurk in the shadows Volcanos erupt".

Primary School Maths Challenge at St John's

Magor Primary School took 1st place at the annual Primary School Maths Challenge at St John's onthe-Hill School held in October. Severn Beach took 2nd place, followed by St John's on-the-Hill in 3rd place.

40 Year 6 pupils from eight primary schools (St John's on-the-Hill, Severn Beach Primary School, Rogiet Primary School, Offa's Mead Academy, Usk Primary, Kymin View Primary School, Magor Primary School and Blakeney Primary School) participated in the competition. The children competed in a number of rounds throughout the day, which tested the children's speed, strategic thinking and ability to work as a team.

Matt Allen, Head of Mathematics at St John's on-the-Hill, said: "The children showed a real talent for maths and had lots of fun. By encouraging the enjoyment of maths we can help children to develop skills in logical thinking, problem-solving and decision-making. It was wonderful to see so many children taking part and growing in confidence as they solved even complex maths problems."

The Cost Of A Comfortable Retirement

According to recent research*, people who wish to retire at the age of 65 with pension income (including a full State Pension) equivalent to the average UK annual salary of about £28,000, now need to accumulate a pension pot of nearly £450,000 in order to fund their retirement until they are 100 years old. The Office for National Statistics says increasing numbers will attain this age in the coming decades.

Start saving early


But better late than never

Employer contributions, along with favourable tax treatment and potential for investment growth mean that any pension contributions made in later life can still have a big impact on your standard of living in retirement.

Prioritise pension saving

While saving for retirement can seem to be a daunting task, the sooner you engage with the topic the better the chances of being able to afford the retirement you deserve. Although it may still seem to be a long way off, you can guarantee retirement will creep up much faster than you expect. And careful planning now will undoubtedly make a substantial difference to the amount of



money ultimately available for you to enjoy in retirement.



Carols by Torchlight in Tintern Abbey

On Saturday 7th December the Chepstow Rotary Club will stage its annual Torchlight Carol Service at Tintern Abbey. This most popular family event is always well supported and last year over 600 people attended.

From 5pm families will form a column in front of the Anchor Inn, Tintern holding their flaming torches on high to light their way, while the smaller members carry their glowing light-sticks. They will then walk slowly in column around the outside of the Abbey while the wonderful singing of the Wyedean choir radiates from within and adds to the ambience. It is always most satisfying to see the faces of the young, and not so young, reflected in the flames of the torches as they enter the rear of this beautiful and historic building. Tintern Abbey is certainly an atmospheric location by day. But by night, in floodlight, with hundreds of flaming torches burning brightly and with the sound of carols sung by the choir, it becomes a positively magical place. "Harry Potter has nothing on this!", said one young visitor. Once all are within the Abbey the congregation sings together the most popular carols lead by the Wyedean School Choir. The carols will be interspersed with seasonal Bible readings while prayers will be led by the Reverend Tony Jones.

This Torchlight Carol Service is a very special local event that launches the Chepstow Christmas Season. Every member of the family will remember Tintern for a long time to come and so the date 7th December should be marked in your diary now or visit www.chepstowrotary.co.uk for details. As always, entry is by personal programme that may be purchased on the night or, from the end of November, from the Tintern Abbey shop, or Miles Morgan travel agents in Chepstow High Street. 
"God With Us"






