

New Year: Improved You! Elderfit Strength & Balance Classes

Chepstow Matters was pleased to catch up with Tom Scaife this month to find out more about the Elderfit strength and balance classes that are now taking place within the Palmer Centre on Friday mornings.

Elderfit was started by Tom and friend Gareth, who have worked together within the fitness industry for the past 18 years. Their aim is to improve the wellbeing of older people by offering fitness sessions which can be carried out by everyone, specifically designed using a variety of techniques to increase strength and balance to reduce the risk of falling. Exercises are adapted to individual's needs, to ensure that each participant feels the full benefits of the classes.

Elderfit also aims to strengthen upper body muscles, so that if a fall does happen you are more able to pull yourself back up. Creating independence is a key element to the classes, helping people re-discover their confidence and stability. The sessions also add a major social element to the week, bringing people together for the same reason. The majority of participants are between 40-90 years, but all ages and abilities are welcome.

Sessions are fun and rewarding and take place on a Friday morning at the Palmer Centre just off Chepstow High Street from 11:30am -12:15. Your first session is free and thereafter it is just £4 per session.

Tom told us: "Our classes are very different to others, using agility ladders, kettle bells, hurdles, suspension cables. It sounds a bit crazy but we have over 600 older people a week taking part across our venues, so they must enjoy it!"

Weigh to go Simon Orgee!

Slimmer shows people with diabetes CAN lose weight

Local resident Simon Orgee is celebrating after losing over 9 Stone in weight and no longer suffering from type 2 Diabetes.

Simon says "I was diagnosed with type 2 diabetes in 2004, and the doctor told me that I would need to take medication to manage it and that I also needed to control my weight to help. I was sent to see a Dietician at Chepstow Hospital. I didn't really listen and thought I could manage it all myself!" At that time I weighed 19 Stone 7lb.

"Being overweight impacted on so many aspects of my life, I was a pub landlord but the last thing I really wanted to do was be sociable. I was unable to do simple everyday tasks without feeling tired and out of breath. I always felt like I was lacking energy, I felt like I was on a slippery slope to gaining more and more weight and I didn't really see a way out!"

After a leaflet dropped on his doormat at the start of January 2017, Simon decided to join the new local Slimming World Group in Tutshill. He says "Walking through those doors was one of the hardest things I have ever done, I was embarrassed about my size and scared that I would be the only man there. I needn't have worried. Everyone was so friendly (there were other men there too!) and my Consultant Amanda made sure I felt comfortable. I stepped onto the scales to see 23 Stone and 7lb, confirming I had not been able to manage my weight by myself at all. Since then my fellow members have become real friends and I honestly don't think I could have done it without their support each week."

With support from his diabetes care team, Simon followed the Slimming World's Food Optimising eating plan and started cooking healthy meals from scratch

Today Simon has lost an incredible total of 9 Stone 3lbs and gone from 5XL to XL. He is also more active and has really been bitten by the walking bug.

"Thanks to the changes I've made, my health has improved dramatically. I no longer need to take any medication as the doctor says I show no symptoms of type 2 diabetes. I've got my life back and I couldn't be happier!"



Amanda Gibbon who runs the Tutshill Slimming World group, told us

"The changes we've seen in Simon are incredible. I hope his success will inspire other people in Tutshill and the Chepstow area. We look forward to meeting you and to helping you achieve YOUR slimmming goals".

Sir John ap Adam: **A Thirteenth Century Knight**

Bedams Court is a secluded farm in Old Sedbury which was once an important thirteenth century manor. The name stems from Sir John ap Adam, an Anglo-Welsh knight in the service of Roger Bigon, Earl of Norfolk and Earl Marshall, he who rebuilt the lower Bailey of Striguil (Chepstow) Castle as a palace and who also had built the new abbev church at Tintern.



Sir John's coat of arm appears in the medieval glass of St Mary and Peter at Tidenham and has often attracted the interest of visiting Americans with the surname of Adams. They often claim descent from Sir John and are sometimes descended from the second President of America. John Adams. Tidenham church Warden, David Burr, is working on a family tree to try and establish a direct link, an impossible task!

We were pleased to spend time with local artist, Keith Underwood (pictured above) of the Tidenham Historical Group this month. Keith has embarked on his own study of Sir John and is in the process of completing and publishing the fourth booklet in his 'Medieval Manuscript' series on the knight. He is also researching a more in depth and academic book.

Copies of this booklet and the three others in the series will be available at the Chepstow Bookshop (shop@chepstowbooks. co.uk). "William Marshal" and "Gazebo" (figures from the history of Usk Castle) are already available.

It has been pointed out that the text is not very easy to read. This was intentional as Keith tells me he wishes it to be read slowly and with unhurried care, as a medieval book would have been read at a time when the pace of life was certainly not as manic as it is today!

Calligraphy and Illumination

Medieval monks, like those at Tintern, were involved in the creation of books long before printing was invented. The recent television series of 'The Name of the Rose' tries to recreate that world. Parchment was produced by an abbey itself from animal skins, the bi products of the monks intensive agricultural industry. The Scriptorium was organised as a factory, a part of a monk's duty in manual labour. It was the illuminator or limner who first laid out the page with the assistance of the scribes. Sometimes a monk was skilled in both activities. The coloured and gilded letters were begun first, along with the illustrative panels, though the gilded areas were first raised by the infilling with gesso a liquid plaster. You can see in





the incomplete page that Keith is shown working on how the title letters are raised, part way through this process.

When dry they were painted with red bole, an earth colour on which the gold leaf shone. The leaf was then applied and then gilded. It was a highly expensive material, as was the lapis lazuli and vermilion reserved generally or the figure of the virgin Mary and other significant saints. The Abbey would have bee subsidised by rich patrons and the patrons for whom books were made. Only those with wealth could own such priceless volumes.

When a page was ready it was the scribes who added the text, a long an laborious process. Many colours came from locally sourced materials, but others came in from abroad. Ink was made with crushed oak galls and iron sulphate, both ingredients with the addition of gum Arabic. It made a good, black and permanent ink.

It is always a delight to spend time with Keith and see him at work, his patience and craftsmanship in creating these booklets is amazing.





Whilst I was with Keith, he also showed me a book he was working on that was becoming his life's work, having started it when he was just 19 and revisting it in more recent years. It is a large memorial book in velvet binding remembering those local heros who fell in the 1st World War, dedicating a page to each name. The photos above and below in no way do it justice. It is a work of art, all produced in the same way as the manuscripts aforementioned.





A Horse's Head in the Frost

Artwork inspired by the Mari Lwyd tradition An exhibition at Chepstow Museum, Bridge Street, Chepstow NP16 5EZ. Runs until spring 2020, daily 11am-4pm (except Wednesdays)

In the dark winter streets and countryside of Wales the Mari Lwyd or Grey Mare. The stark white skull of a horse decorated with coloured ribbons, draped

with a long white gown, with jaws made to snap, is led from house to house. She comes from the Otherworld, a reminder that winter is a time to mark the process of life, death and rebirth, and evokes a time when horses symbolised power and fertility. She is led by a troupe wearing coloured ribbons and some with blackened faces, The Leader who holds the reins carrying a stick to knock on doors as they do their rounds, attempting to gain entry. But each visit is a battle of song and rhyme between those without and those within - the Mari Lwyd gains entry when her troupe win the competition and outdo the occupants. Her entry with snapping jaws heralds entertainment, music and hospitality, beer, and money. Their parting words were a blessing on the house.

The Mari Lwyd has become an inspiration for a whole host of artists intrigued and moved by her magic and mystery. The exhibition brings together artwork from artists throughout the UK and beyond whose work features the Mari Lwyd in some way or the mythic world from which she has emerged.




Report by Club President, Commander Christopher Wilson

Indeed, it shows that an individual who begins saving at 25 years of age needs to invest around £235 a month to accumulate a suitably sized retirement fund. However, a delay of ten years sees this figure rise to £428; while someone who only begins saving at the age of 45 would need to put aside £859 a month to attain a pension pot of the required size. These projections are based on a defined contribution scheme entering a drawdown pension arrangement on retirement. Another option at retirement is to buy an annuity that provides an income for life regardless of age at death.

But better late than never

Although in an ideal world it is certainly best to start saving for retirement at the earliest opportunity, other financial commitments can inevitably make this difficult. And it's important to remember it's never too late to save for retirement.

Employer contributions, along with favourable tax treatment and potential for investment growth mean that any pension contributions made in later life can still have a big impact on your standard of living in retirement.



Chepstow RFC Mini and Junior Section

Chepstow RFC has one of the largest Mini and Junior sections, in Gwent, with over 200 girls and boys aged from 6 to 16.

All children take part in training, matches and tournaments both in the local area and internationally, well we are on the border!

We are proud to be one of the few clubs in the area to have teams in all age groups.

Under 6's - This age group is aimed at children who are in Year 1. No match games are played in this age group, but we teach the basics of passing, catching and tagging. This helps build confidence in order to progress to Tag Rugby. We train on a Sunday at 9am for 45 minutes.

Under 7's - Under 7's tag rugby is a noncontact, fast-moving game that is suitable for girls and boys to play together. It is a safe, non-contact nature, combined with the fun and liveliness of the sport. Training Wednesday at 6pm, games on Sunday Mornings.

Under 8's - In the words of Huw aged 7 %, 'My favourite thing about playing for Chepstow RFC is I get to play with my friends and fall over in the mud, and after games I get to have some more play time with them. Over the last two years it's been hard learning new skills but it has been exciting and very fun the team is absolutely amazing, the is really nice too especially the

Under 9's - It's a big step up from under 8's tag rugby, which is fast and free flowing, to under 9's first contact. The coaches, who have all been on WRU led training courses, have been teaching the children how to make a tackle and bring their



opponent down. These training sessions teach the children the safe way to tackle, fall and present the ball, whilst having fun with games and challenges to further encourage them. Training sessions on a Tuesday night enable the children to play some great rugby on a Sunday. Although we don't score games at this age, as the emphasis is on taking part and having fun just playing rugby, the games have been very close in tries scored.

Under 10's - A great start to the 2019/20 season has seen the U10 squad increase its numbers to over 20 players who regularly turn out each week. Of those we have 6 players who were new to rugby this season and 3 have been called up to Newport Schools U11 District squad.

Under 11's - The team is made up of children from both sides of the border and from several different local schools. So, it's testament to the hard work, commitment and friendly nature of the players that such a talented, united and welcoming squad has started to emerge. We are playing our final year of early stage 12 a side contact rugby with slight variations on the full 15 a side game to aid positive and safe development. For example, five-man scrums, one player competing in the ruck and uncontested four-man line outs. Currently, we are enjoying a successful start to the season,



remaining undefeated up to this point with nine wins from nine!

Under 12's - The team has gone from strength to strength over the years, both in terms of squad numbers as well as in their skill and ability. Whilst many have been involved since u7, we have been fortunate to welcome newcomers to the game each year. This year has seen them step up to the full 15 game on a full size pitch...testing their fitness, teamwork and ability to move the ball!

Under 13's - the Under 13's are a small but tightly-knit squad of players who have made significant progress so far this season. We have played a number of highly competitive matches and the boys are showing real progress as they adapt to full scrums and jumping at the line-out. We would love to see new players join our squad. so any Year 8 students would be made very welcome.

Under 14's - Under 14's rugby is the start of the build up ready for youth and senior rugby. All the skills that have been learned and practiced over the mini and early junior years including fully contested scrums and for the first time. line outs as well, all coming together in one glorious game. Under 15's - The new season for Chepstow RFC's under 15s has been a mixed bag. A comfortable win against Risca was followed by narrow losses to Croesyceiliog and Thornbury and a defeat to a strong Abergavenny team. We have had a mixed bag of results, which goes with the mixed bag of boys playing at this age group. 

A new ceramic plaque is installed by the Chepstow Society to mark the site of a forgotten medieval Priory.

The plaque (pictured right) will commemorate the Augustinian Priory of St Kingsmark – originally a Welsh prince and local saint named Cynfarch or Kynemark, whose 7th century church was in the area. This was some 400 years before the Normans built Chepstow Castle and the Priory that became St Mary's Church.

The plaque has been designed by local artist Keith Underwood, and made by ceramicist Ned Heywood. It will be installed at the top (northwest) end of the footpath leading from Kingsmark Lane down to St Kingsmark Avenue.

Old maps show that the path roughly follows the southern edge of the old parish of St Kynemark, which centred on the Priory and extended from Crossway Green to the site of The Mount on Welsh Street.

St Kynemark's Priory itself was founded before 1270, and functioned until Henry VIII's Dissolution of the Monasteries in 1534.

The Priory's stones were used in later farm buildings, and there is now nothing to be seen of it above ground. Excavations in the early 1960s – before the modern houses on Kingsmark Lane were built – uncovered evidence of three monastic ranges, but no church.

The work to install the plaque and its small plinth will be carried out between now and Christmas, and it is hoped that there will be a formal unveiling in due course. Monmouthshire County Council has agreed that the installation work be carried out

The Chepstow Society was formed in 1948 as a local history and civic society. The Society is actively engaged in efforts to improve local amenities, while safeguarding the heritage, character and charm of the town.

It is at the forefront in preserving the town's historic features of the town, and has been instrumental in placing many plaques around the town highlighting places of interest. It holds monthly meetings and talks in the Drill Hall in Chepstow, and welcomes new members.


