New Year: Improved You! Elderfit Strength & Balance Classes

Chepstow Matters was pleased to catch up with Tom Scaife this month to find out more about the Elderfit strength and balance classes that are now taking place within the Palmer Centre on Friday mornings.

Elderfit was started by Tom and friend Gareth, who have worked together within the fitness industry for the past 18 years. Their aim is to improve the wellbeing of older people by offering fitness sessions which can be carried out by everyone. specifically designed using a variety of techniques to increase strength and balance to reduce the risk of falling. Exercises are adapted to individual's needs, to ensure that each participant feels the full benefits of the classes.

Elderfit also aims to strengthen upper body muscles, so that if a fall does happen you are more able to pull yourself back up. Creating independence is a key element to the classes, helping people re-discover their confidence and stability. The sessions also add a major social element to the week, bringing people together for the same reason. The majority of participants are between 40-90 years, but all ages and abilities are welcome.

Sessions are fun and rewarding and take place on a Friday morning at the Palmer Centre just off Chepstow High Street from 11:30am -12:15. Your first session is free and thereafter it is just £4 per session.

Tom told us: "Our classes are very different to others, using agility ladders, kettle bells, hurdles, suspension cables. It sounds a bit crazy but we have over 600 older people a week taking part across our venues, so they must enjoy it!"

Monmouth community unites for charity swimathon in memory of local teenager

The Monmouth community joined together as more than 500 people took the plunge in an uplifting swimathon in memory of a kind and caring teenage

Swimmers of all ages and abilities pushed themselves to the limit at the second annual Swim for Tom which this year has so far raised more than £12.000 for Cancer Research Wales. The main 12-hour event took place in the pool at Monmouth School for Girls on Sunday 12th January from 9am to 9pm.

Some swimmers, including Olympian Tom Haffield, completed lengths at other venues across the region which all contributed to the tally.

"The final count is 37,519 lengths or 938km or 937,975m or 583 miles by more than 500 swimmers at five different events," said Tom's dad, Tim Walker. "Swim for Tom is about competing with each other to reach a single goal and not against each other. Many people of all abilities pushed themselves to swim further than they had ever done before, including many beginners. It is pleasing that Swim for Tom is such a feel-good community event. "

Tom, from Devauden, near Chepstow, was a pupil at Monmouth School for Boys and a member of Monnow Swimming Club. He died unexpectedly and suddenly from leukaemia in June 2018. aged 13. Since Tom's death, his family – dad, Tim; mum, Debbie; and sisters Holly and Emily - have led efforts to raise more than £100,000 for a research fund, supported by his friends, and the community.

The inaugural Swim for Tom raised more than £25,000 for Cancer Research Wales 12 months ago, and the Tom Walker Cancer Wales PhD Studentship for Acute Myeloid Leukaemia Research was officially created last year and will be awarded in the next few weeks with the researcher starting in September.

Children at Monmouth Schools Pre-Prep and Nursery (middle photo, shown with Emily Walker, Katie Cameron and Holly Walker) got this year's Swim for Tom underway, chalking up almost 500 lengths on Friday afternoon. Members of Monnow Swimming Club, parents and friends then took part in their leg, notching up 4,070 lengths, with one swimmer, Rhys Williams, compiling 162 lengths in an hour! There was a remarkable atmosphere at the main event in Monmouth on Sunday – with an army of volunteers and helpers across the 12 hours making it such a memorable occasion. One of the highlights was achieved by Miss Lou Scott, who had flown in especially from her new home in Italy and swam for most of the day, amassing an outstanding 406 lengths.

Tim Walker (shown bottom photo with Adrian Whitehead) added: "A huge thank you to a magnificent team of helpers, to Haberdashers' Monmouth Schools and their staff, to Monnow Swimming Club, to all the lifequards, to all the swimmers, to everyone who donated money and to an army of cake bakers. We are also very grateful to Monmouth-based business, Mandarin Stone, for their generous hat sponsorship and to Dylan Allman, a 13-year-old pupil at Monmouth School for Boys, for creating the Swim for Tom website, which made the administration of this year's event so much easier."

Weigh to go Simon Orgee!

Slimmer shows people with diabetes CAN lose weight

Local resident Simon Orgee is celebrating after losing over 9 Stone in weight and no longer suffering from type 2 Diabetes.

Simon says "I was diagnosed with type 2 diabetes in 2004, and the doctor told me that I would need to take medication to manage it and that I also needed to control my weight to help. I was sent to see a Dietician at Chepstow Hospital. I didn't really listen and thought I could manage it all myself!" At that time I weighed 19 Stone 7lb.

"Being overweight impacted on so many aspects of my life, I was a pub landlord but the last thing I really wanted to do was be sociable. I was unable to do simple everyday tasks without feeling tired and out of breath. I always felt like I was lacking energy, I felt like I was on a slippery slope to gaining more and more weight and I didn't really see a way out!"

After a leaflet dropped on his doormat at the start of January 2017, Simon decided to join the new local Slimming World Group in Tutshill. He says "Walking through those doors was one of the hardest things I have ever done, I was embarrassed about my size and scared that I would be the only man there. I needn't have worried. Everyone was so friendly (there were other men there too!) and my Consultant Amanda made sure I felt comfortable. I stepped onto the scales to see 23 Stone and 7lb, confirming I had not been able to manage my weight by myself at all. Since then my fellow members have become real friends and I honestly don't think I could have done it without their support each week."

With support from his diabetes care team, Simon followed the Slimming World's Food Optimising eating plan and started cooking healthy meals from scratch

Today Simon has lost an incredible total of 9 Stone 3lbs and gone from 5XL to XL. He is also more active and has really been bitten by the walking bug.

"Thanks to the changes I've made, my health has improved dramatically. I no longer need to take any medication as the doctor says I show no symptoms of type 2 diabetes. I've got my life back and I couldn't be happier!"





Amanda Gibbon who runs the Tutshill Slimming World group, told us

"The changes we've seen in Simon are incredible. I hope his success will inspire other people in Tutshill and the Chepstow area. We look forward to meeting you and to helping you achieve YOUR slimmming goals".

DON NORRIS awarded a BEM - for over 50 years of Scouting!

It was an absolute pleasure to meet local Sedbury resident Don Norris this month, who has just been awarded a BEM in the New Year's Honours List for his service to Scouting. Don moved to the Chepstow area from Ebbw Vale back in 1962, moving for work with the local British Steelworks. As a father of 4, (2 sons and 2 daughters), he got involved in the local Scout group five years later. Unlike his sons (who both achieved their Chief Scout awards and attended world Jamboree) Don never left scouting and has been involved in the local Sedbury & Tidenham unit ever since - amassing over 50 years of voluntary service - and still counting!!

Don took over leadership of the local unit in the early 1970s before later becoming District Commissioner and then County Commissioner for Gwent. He has many happy memories of group activities and annual camps from Abergavenny to Ireland. "It's been wonderful over the years to be able to pass on and share my knowledge and to encourage the youths to achieve things that at first they didn't think they would be able to do; to see them progress and to learn how to cook and look after themselves on our camps."

Don's dedication to scouting invariably took him away from his own family on a regular basis, but he'd take his two daughters away on the camps too, along with his sons (and this in a time before girls were allowed to join scouting!) to give his wife Patricia a break. Pat has now sadly passed on but used to be a keen member of the local Chepstow Operatic Society - she supported Don's volunteering in Scouting from a distance "I'll support you but I don't sleep in tents!" being her standpoint.

Now in his early 80s, Don stepped away from the unit leadership some years ago but continues to hold several different roles in Scouting. He is now a member of the Fellowship and maintains his involvement of the local unit as a Trustee, as well as being on the Appointment Sub-Committee for leaders and helping with training. Along with other members of the Fellowship he also helps weekly to maintain the campsite at 'Botany Bay' in Tintern - the Gwent Area Activity Centre. He has been Campsite Liaison Officer here since 1998 and the Training Advisor since 1999. Don tells me that this little known but beautiful camping spot is available for members of scouting and their families of all ages to enjoy and is bookable through the scouting website.

Don is so humble about his achievement and his daughter Jill and I had to tease the information for this article out of him (his awards cover the walls of his office). Don told me "It was a complete surprise to receive the letter

Don will be presented with his award by the Lord Lieutenant of the County in May and could also be invited to a Celebrated Garden Party at Buckingham Palace in May, if so it would not be the first time, having been invited before in 1995 and again in 2000 (see photo above with wife Patricia).

A very well deserved recognition, I am sure that many others in the community would wish to add their thanks to Don for his outstanding dedication to local Scouting.



In the Community: Great Turnout for First Litter Pick of the Year

24 people, including 5 children, turned out on Saturday 11th January for Keep Chepstow Tidy's first Community Litter Pick of the year.

The most energetic of the volunteers tackled the steep, wooded slopes below the Coast Path between Garden City and Bulwark, a difficult-to-access area where bottles, cans and food packaging blight the approach to Chepstow. It is now in much better shape for residents, visitors and wildlife to enjoy the woodland in the spring.

Other volunteers cleared the streets and open areas around Garden City. Altogether, volunteers collected a massive 14 bags of plastic and cans and 5 bags of glass for recycling, together with 14 bags of general waste.





Keep Chepstow Tidy co-ordinator Paul Gowen commented, "It's good to see so many people involved and many said how much they had enjoyed doing something positive to get rid of litter. Of course, nobody should be dropping litter but if we don't want to live surrounded by waste then we all have to take responsibility for dealing with it".

The next Community Litter Pick will be on Saturday 8th February in Beachley, meeting at 10 am at the Pavilion Road recycling area in Beachley.

Looking further ahead, Keep Chepstow Tidy - a
Transition Chepstow group - is looking for community
organisations and businesses to get involved in
the Keep Wales Tidy Spring Clean Cymru from
20 March to 13 April. Groups are encouraged to
undertake their own mini-litter picks. Keep Chepstow
Tidy can offer training, equipment and support.



Sir John ap Adam: **A Thirteenth Century Knight**

Bedams Court is a secluded farm in Old Sedbury which was once an important thirteenth century manor. The name stems from Sir John ap Adam, an Anglo-Welsh knight in the service of Roger Bigon, Earl of Norfolk and Earl Marshall, he who rebuilt the lower Bailey of Striguil (Chepstow) Castle as a palace and who also had built the new abbev church at Tintern.



Sir John's coat of arm appears in the medieval glass of St Mary and Peter at Tidenham and has often attracted the interest of visiting Americans with the surname of Adams. They often claim descent from Sir John and are sometimes descended from the second President of America, John Adams, Tidenham church Warden, David Burr, is working on a family tree to try and establish a direct link, an impossible task!

We were pleased to spend time with local artist, Keith Underwood (pictured above) of the Tidenham Historical Group this month. Keith has embarked on his own study of Sir John and is in the process of completing and publishing the fourth booklet in his 'Medieval Manuscript' series on the knight. He is also researching a more in depth and academic book.

Copies of this booklet and the three others in the series will be available at the Chepstow Bookshop (shop@chepstowbooks. co.uk). "William Marshal" and "Gazebo" (figures from the history of Usk Castle) are already available.

It has been pointed out that the text is not very easy to read. This was intentional as Keith tells me he wishes it to be read slowly and with unhurried care, as a medieval book would have been read at a time when the pace of life was certainly not as manic as it is today!

Medieval monks, like those at Tintern, were involved in the creation of books long before printing was invented. The recent television series of 'The Name of the Rose' tries to recreate that world. Parchment was produced by an abbey itself from animal skins, the bi products of the monks intensive agricultural industry. The Scriptorium was organised as a factory, a part of a monk's duty in manual labour. It was the illuminator or limner who first laid out the page with the assistance of the scribes. Sometimes a monk was skilled in both activities. The coloured and gilded letters were begun first, along with the illustrative panels, though the gilded areas were first raised by the infilling with gesso a liquid plaster. You can see in






the incomplete page that Keith is shown working on how the title letters are raised, part way through this process.

When dry they were painted with red bole, an earth colour on which the gold leaf shone. The leaf was then applied and then gilded. It was a highly expensive material, as was the lapis lazuli and vermilion reserved generally or the figure of the virgin Mary and other significant saints. The Abbey would have bee subsidised by rich patrons and the patrons for whom books were made. Only those with wealth could own such priceless volumes.


When a page was ready it was the scribes who added the text, a long an laborious process. Many colours came from locally sourced materials, but others came in from abroad. Ink was made with crushed oak galls and iron sulphate, both ingredients with the addition of gum Arabic. It made a good, black and permanent ink.

It is always a delight to spend time with Keith and see him at work at his home in Sedbury, his patience and craftsmanship in creating these booklets is amazing.





Whilst I was with Keith, he also showed me a book he was working on that was becoming his life's work, having started it when he was just 19 and revisting it in more recent years. It is a large memorial book in velvet binding remembering those local heros who fell in the 1st World War, dedicating a page to each name. The photos above and below in no way do it justice. It is a work of art, all produced in the same way as the manuscripts aforementioned.





A Horse's Head in the Frost

Artwork inspired by the Mari Lwyd tradition An exhibition at Chepstow Museum, Bridge Street, Chepstow NP16 5EZ. Runs until spring 2020, daily 11am-4pm (except Wednesdays)

In the dark winter streets and countryside of Wales the Mari Lwyd or Grey Mare. The stark white skull of a horse decorated with coloured ribbons, draped

with a long white gown, with jaws made to snap, is led from house to house. She comes from the Otherworld, a reminder that winter is a time to mark the process of life, death and rebirth, and evokes a time when horses symbolised power and fertility. She is led by a troupe wearing coloured ribbons and some with blackened faces, The Leader who holds the reins carrying a stick to knock on doors as they do their rounds, attempting to gain entry. But each visit is a battle of song and rhyme between those without and those within - the Mari Lwyd gains entry when her troupe win the competition and outdo the occupants. Her entry with snapping jaws heralds entertainment, music and hospitality, beer, and money. Their parting words were a blessing on the house.

The Mari Lwyd has become an inspiration for a whole host of artists intrigued and moved by her magic and mystery. The exhibition brings together artwork from artists throughout the UK and beyond whose work features the Mari Lwyd in some way or the mythic world from which she has emerged.

From 5 o'clock families gathered in front of the Anchor Inn, Tintern with their flaming torches held on high to light their way, while the smaller members carried their glowing light-sticks. Then, at 6 o'clock they walked slowly in column around the outside of the Abbey while the wonderful singing of the combined choir of Wyedean and St John's-on-the-Hill schools radiated from within and added to the ambience on a crisp evening. It is always most satisfying to see the faces of the young, and the not so young, reflected in the flames of the torches as the two columns entered the rear of this beautiful and historic building. Tintern Abbey is certainly an atmospheric location by day. But by night, in floodlight, with hundreds of flaming torches burning brightly and with the sound of carols sung by the choir, it became a positively magical place. Once all were within the Abbey the congregation sang together the most popular carols lead by the choir. The carols were interspersed with seasonal Bible readings while prayers were led by the Reverend Tony Jones.

The Club President, Commander Christopher Wilson, said that the event goes from strength to strength but, as the Club ages, new members are needed now to ensure the survival of this wonderful spectacle. He thanked the Wyedean & St John's choir, St John's Ambulance, CADW and the Monmouth Rotary Club for their great support that evening. This Torchlight Carol Service was a very special local event that has



launched the Chepstow area Christmas Season. Every member of the family will remember Tintern for a long time to come.

This year this event raised almost £5.000 for Rotary charities. The Club also runs programmes for global polio eradication, many youth competitions in our local schools such as Young Chef. The Big Garden Bird Watch at Pembroke Priary School

The staff and pupils at Pembroke Primary have had a great couple of weeks celebrating The Big Garden Bird Watch. Children have been involved in providing homes for nature, identifying birds, collecting data and sketching the birds identified within our school grounds.

The Big Garden Bird Watch is a national initiative led by the RSPB to encourage people to watch and record the birds in a local green space to help the RSPB better understand how our feathered friends are doing.

We are fortunate to have wonderful grounds at Pembroke and the children thought carefully about the most suitable areas to sit and observe the birds using the RSPBs online counting tool. We then submitted our results providing a vital snapshot of the UK's winter birds so the RSPB can monitor trends and find out how our garden birds are doing.

Year Five have created their own database of birds. Much time was spent discussing the fields that we could populate for each species such as name, wingspan, length, clutch size, lifespan, diet, habit etc, images were also included.

The children have also decided to continue this topic as part of their home learning, showing their enjoyment of this topic.

It has been wonderful for children to identify the variety of birds that have appeared on our school grounds, with the common gulls definitely being

the most confident and very greedy and always showing up on our school yard after lunch.



New Look at the Burnt Barn Social Club, Bulwark

It was lovely to be invited along to the Burnt Barn Social Club in the New Year to see the end result of the new build and refurbishment works that took place during 2019. I met up with long-term Officer of the Club Bob Beckett who showed me around the fabulous new space.

"We felt the Club had gone as far as it could in its current size of premises" Bob explained "We had money in the bank which was earning next to nothing in interest so thought investing in the premises so that it could offer much more to the community was more worthwhile." With 100% support from the Committee, Club Secretary, Bob, and Chairman, Neville, set about planning the new space. Local club member John Morgan, a builder by trade, took on the 'Project Manager' role, organised the materials and brought in local labour to help with the initial build. Bob and Neville were responsible for the internals, and coming up with the theme of 'The Barn' aesthetic and carrying out as much of the works themselves as they could manage.

On discovering how costly buying in the envisioned furniture could be, old brewery barrels were sourced

directly from Scotland and then treated, trimmed up with the metal and internal lighting on site. Table tops were hand made for a truly rustic feel and hey presto some great looking tables! The light casings were made from old wheels and the lights over the pool tables and towards the dart boards were fashioned to look like upside down pig troughs! Add in some authentic stable props and the overall effect is really impressive. Of particular note is the internal steel railings (above right) and the blind across the window (above centre) which gives the farm yard view, catching vour eve as you enter through the new and improved Club entrance. Also new is the male, female and disabled toilet facilities which is another great improvement for the Club. There is a new, spacious darts area, much appreciated by the Men's and Ladies darts teams which play weekly at the Club, as well as the extended skittle alley which is also available for external hire to non members. Great idea for a work or club night out!

With Phase I of the refurbishment now completed, Bob is looking forward to continuing the effort through 2020 with the completion of the garden area and another new build project, the offices/function room being built in the car park.

Phase III is also planned, which will consist of an extension to the current main function hall enabling an additional 50+ seats so that larger weddings (120+) and social functions can be accommodated.

The Burnt Barn Social Club is a private members club, with membership just £10 per adult (£8 for seniors 65+). It is a busy club with active teams of Skittles, Darts and Pool and it's facilities are also available for external hire (see main advert opposite).








Chepstow RFC: Youth Update

Chepstow Youth play in the Dragons Youth League structure. The initial league competition runs from September to December. The Youth category combines 3 age groups: U17, U18 & U19 with ages ranging from 16 to 18 as at 31st August 2019.



Squad numbers were tight over the summer. however, with a scratch team they beat Tonyrefail in a pre-season friendly in late August. The league commenced 7th September with a home game against Croesyceiliog.

Chepstow led for the entire game but couldn't shake off a determined opposition. With a minute to go Chepstow were attacking on Croesyceiliog's 5 metre line. Somehow the ball was lost, and 30 seconds later a try was conceded followed by a touchline conversion successfully executed. Chepstow lost 26-27. The rugby gods were definitely not smiling that day.

That set a tone for the rest of September and early October. The next 2 league games (v Ebbw Vale & Risca) saw defeats by 7 points and 3 points respectively. There was also a loss in a friendly game v Llanishen. The only satisfaction was a WRU Bowl win away v St Josephs.

So, it was a difficult start and morale could have easily suffered. However, everyone could see that the team had potential. Under the leadership of the captain Ed Phelps and vice-captain Sam Cole the boys dug in and really turned it around. The missing ingredient was self-belief.

Subsequently, the results transformed. Tredegar Ironsides were beaten comfortably. Next up were the runaway league leaders, away y Bargoed. Something clicked that day and Chepstow cut loose, winning 34-8. The scoreline did not flatter the game, it could have been more.

The boys started to realise how good they were and that there was nothing to fear. The final game

of October, home against a high flying Bedwas in torrential rain, saw the team grind out an 11-0 victory. In the space of 3 weeks the entire complexion of the season had switched.

To keep the momentum, November started with a friendly against Tredegar and another win. Then the 2nd round of the WRU bowl against a very successful Tonmawr side. This was the highest standard game of the season to date with both sides playing with very high intensity. Tonmawr were leading for much of the game but the Chepstow team had had enough of losing tight games earlier in the season. They were relentless and scored in the final play to win 24-17 and progress to the 3rd round.

The following 2 Saturdays the boys were back in league action and delivered convincing wins v Caerleon (55-5 and away at Caldicot (33-0). There was real momentum now. Squad numbers were also growing, with a number of new and returning players joining the team.

November closed out with a friendly against Pill Harriers, a higher league team, away from home and an opportunity to let the new boys get involved. This led to a close-run loss (7-19) but with plenty of lessons learnt and some very valuable experience of higher league rugby.

December started with round 3 of the WRU Bowl. Drawn against Risca, who had defeated Chepstow 8-5 only 2 months earlier, there was plenty of motivation. The amount of progression made by the boys was on full display that day, as they romped home with a 33-10 victory. Progressing to the guarter finals of the national competition.

The final action before Christmas was away from home against league contenders, Penallta. By now Chepstow were also challenging at the top of the table, a lot rested on this result. In the most physical encounter of the season, Chepstow ran out 5-0 winners. That capped a fantastic league

run of turning 3 straight defeats into 6 straight wins. The final league table shows Chepstow sitting proudly at the top of the table.

This means that Chepstow have been promoted into a higher league.

League games commenced 18th January, with Chepstow due to travel to Senghenydd (as we went to print on this ediiton).

After a well-earned rest over Christmas. preparation to be able to compete at this higher standard got underway early. Chepstow hosted Croesyceiliog on 4th Jan, again it was a good barometer for the progression of the team, and they ran out 52-0 winners with the game being stopped earlier due to reaching the 50 point margin with 15 mins still to play. This put the narrow and painful loss earlier in the season, well behind them.

As a further test, a friendly was taken against a highly rated Kenfig Hill team that included a number of Ospreys youth players and significant coaching resources. Away from home and in difficult conditions, the boys put in their best performance of the season. It was 0-0 at halftime in a very intense, physical battle. Chepstow broke the deadlock 15 minutes into the 2nd half with 2 quick tries. Kenfig Hill responded and threw everything they had at the visitors but to no avail. Chepstow prevailing 10-0.

Up to 11th January, the team have now played an unbelievable 18 games, winning 13 and losing 5. They have won 11 of their last 12



games and been unbeaten in league and cup since 5th October. Numbers continue to grow, as does morale. Stiffer tests lie ahead. including a quarter final clash away at Porth Harlequins. The team are also in action in the Gwent District Cup and Dragons Cup.

Long-time foreign friends Alcorcon RFC visit at the end of March for their

tour. The following weekend the boys go on their own tour, a full 28 players will be travelling to Marbella 3rd-6th April.

Fundraising is well underway with the team hosting a successful Christmas lunch in December, complete with a comedian. The next event is 29th February with another high-profile event. Dinner, live music, guest speaker Tom Shanklin and an auction.

The club and coaches are really proud at how the boys have transformed a very difficult start to the season into such a success story. On and off the field the boys have matured immensely and are a credit to themselves and the club they represent. Tough challenges lie ahead but the boys are ready and excited to see what else they can achieve.....


