To honour the VE Day celebrations this year, the Frampton Cotterell and District Local History Society are producing a VE display, enjoy a taster of this on the centre pages.



### Community comes together to respond to Covid-19

We are living in unnerving times, as the repercussions of Covid-19 mean, at time of writing, things seem to be changing on a daily basis. As greater numbers of people find it necessary to self-isolate, this situation could be devastating for some people who do not have friends or family close by to support them.

Thankfully, I am pleased to report, it is not all doom and gloom, droves of local people have stepped up to work together to support our community in anyway they can.

There may well be further groups established than the ones featured in this article, but we are pleased to share information on a few vital support networks in our local area that are determined to do their best for local people.



## Facebook Page: COVID-19 Help, Support And Volunteering South Glos and Bristol

Natalie Harrison who set up this support group via Facebook told us, "I founded this group with my friend Matt Palmer. It originally stemmed from an idea to post on our local Facebook page that if anybody needed help with shopping whilst self isolating, just to let us know. We had a big response to that post and so matt messaged me and suggested we work together to set up a support page. Over 24 hours we had such a huge response (over 500 members at that time), we edited the group to include the surrounding areas. Over the coming days the group grew and grew to an astounding amount of members (over 4,000 on 19 March), people offering help, people asking for help, even people saying how they felt safer knowing there was help available.

We have been on BBC radio Bristol to let those know about us that may not have internet access. We are working around the clock and have a dedicated admin team (that I must give a shout out to they're totally invaluable to our team!) creating leaflets, teams for different areas and even offering posts with things like activities to do whilst in isolation. As a whole, the team are totally overwhelmed with the response and kindness of everybody on this page. It's something I can say I'm incredibly proud of and I'm certain I can speak for the whole team in saying that."

sites by repairing jewellery items, re-stitching the dropped hem, servicing the bike that has been in the shed for years and replacing the wire in the old lamp that you've been meaning to sort out for months. It is also assisting in combating loneliness. We seem to never run out of volunteers for baked goodies to go with our tea and coffee in our little pop-up café.

Our second event took place during the middle of storm Dennis, and yet remained very busy with people arriving much past closing time. The majority of the repairs are carried out on site and there is no request for payments, if you wish to donate what you think is appropriate then there is a donation box and this goes towards the next café event. Why not pop down and see us all at our next Share and Repair Café? At time of writing, this is planned to take place on Saturday 18 April, at All Saints Church Hall, Church Road, Winterbourne Down. The Frome Valley Climate Action schools group are working together to create a better environment all around, and this month Hambrook eco-school have invited a local beekeeper *Hives and Herbals* to make Beeswax wraps with them. Alvson gave a talk on how she looks after the hives, how the bees produce the honey and the children were keen to share their knowledge of bees with Alyson. The children then took their time to create their designs on pre-cut cloth and were very excited when Alyson described how they are made and the uses for which they would be useful. The wraps are taken off-site to be dipped into hot wax and allowed to dry before returning to the school a week later with instructions on how to look after them, the results where colourful.







A total of 44 wraps have been created meaning that if the wraps are used at least five times in one week, 220 pieces of single-use plastic is removed from the lunch pack and not going to landfill! Putting it into figures, it takes 25 years to break down one piece of cling film, so that's 5,500 years to break down that much plastic. We have groups from U11 through to U17 and also participate in the ECB All Stars programme, which provides an opportunity for children of 5-8 years old to enjoy the game in a very relaxed environment. A further programme called Dynamo

Our speaker was Melanie Tilev, the fundraising manager for Brain Tumour Research in the South West. She told us that the charity is a volunteer led organisation and was originally founded in 2009 by

patient's families. Melanie then shared some of the shocking statistics about brain tumours. They kill more children and adults under the age of 40 than any other cancer. Up to 40% of all cancers spread to the brain. Less than 2% of those diagnosed with brain tumour survive beyond five years. Despite this only 1% of the national spend on cancer research is allocated to this disease.

A Walk of Hope along the South Bristol Skyline is planned for September 26th. 4 members took part in this enjoyable event last year and raised money to support this cause.

We continue with donations for the Food Bank and were delighted with the fantastic collection of Easter eggs and other food items that were collected at this month's meeting.

#### Frampton Cotterell Computer Group Celebrating 20 years



ago, Frampton Cotterell Parish Council decided to set up a computer aroup in the newly opened Brockeridge Centre with the primary

aim of helping older people come to grips with home computers. At that time, less than 40% of UK households had a computer at home and even fewer had an Internet connection. Many people, particularly of an older generation, had never used a computer but were interested in finding out how to use one and in discovering the benefits they might offer in their daily life.

A group of volunteers came together, purchased some desktop PCs with money obtained via community grants and started offering classes to help people who wanted to learn about using a home computer. In 2008, the group became independent of the Parish Council while still occupying a room at the Brockeridge Centre and maintaining a close working relationship with them.

Keith Powell who has been chairman of the group since it became independent said, "When we started, few people would have imagined we'd still be going 20 years later! We've seen many changes over the years, with fewer people now being completely new to computers and more wanting help with specific questions. Technology has also changed significantly with the introduction of tablets and smartphones as well as major changes to software such as Windows and MS Office. Our team of volunteers has adapted to these changes and we are still assisting people with a wide range of issues. These include: using the internet safely and

securely, dealing with digital photographs, keeping track of finances using spreadsheets, creating and managing email accounts and taking advantage of cloud computing services.

"People come to us from across South Gloucestershire and even further afield because of our unique approach. Some come for just a few sessions, others continue to attend for longer periods both for the intellectual stimulation and for the social interaction provided by learning as part of a group. Either way we aim to provide assistance in a relaxed, friendly environment with one helper for at most two learners."

At its peak the group ran six sessions per week for up to 9 people per session and more than 1,000 people have been helped since the group started. It is still going strong with around 30 people attending one of the four sessions held every week.

Since opening 25 years ago Paul's Place has supported hundreds of people and the demand remains as high as ever.

CEO. Daniel Cheesman said 'Sadly disabled people are often isolated and less likely to participate in cultural, leisure and sporting activities than nondisabled people, we exist to change this so that no-one is isolated. We work with disabled people to remove the barriers they face and change attitudes.' When asked about the rebrand Daniel said, 'Our new look gives us the opportunity to tell our story and the stories of those people at Paul's Place. We want to show others what we do and the difference we make to the lives of the people we support. Our ethos hasn't changed, we remain positive and funfilled and ensure that we are helping people to live life to the full.

At the launching of the new brand Paul's Place also announced their new Parton who is none other than Bristol home baker and Great British Bake Off contestant Briony May. Asked about her decision



to join the charity Briony said, 'After speaking at the Paul's Place **Grand Ball** last year I was so inspired by what the charity



wanted to be part of it. I was taken with how Paul's Place look beyond a disability and sees the person. I also love how Paul's Place supports people in achieving things that they have always wanted to'.

The refreshed brand is part of a new five-year strategy for Paul's Place that aims to reach and support more people and develop exciting new services that are led by physically disabled adults.

#### Bathing a problem? – we can help



## Going Batty over Bats at Centenary Field!

Frampton Cotterell Parish Council had six bat boxes installed at the Centenary Field on 19th February this year.

The bat boxes were handmade by the Frampton Cotterell community, at a Bat Box making workshop that took place last summer. The bat box making event was organised by Village Action and many of the boxes were kindly donated to the Parish Council. Whilst these boxes were being installed, Bristol Bat Rescue gave a talk all about bats and about their rescue charity.

Bristol Bat Rescue talked about all the different species of bats that may be present locally and how the bat boxes will help support them. Over twenty people braved the rainy British weather to see the boxes being installed in the trees, and to learn lots of interesting facts about bats.

Emily Wilson (who ran the session pictured above) from Bristol Bat Rescue reflected and said "Opportunities like this are crucial for inspiring the new generation and securing the future of bats."

Frampton Cotterell Parish Council recently had a wildlife survey done on the Centenary Field and will soon be implementing a new biodiversity management plan to help the local flora and fauna flourish. The six handmade bat boxes were successfully installed and will provide a place for the local bats to roost and help support local wildlife.

Daisy Finniear (Project Officer to Frampton Cotterell Parish Council) said: "I walked around the Centenary Field last year with my bat detector and recorded 4 different species in

the space of 15 minutes, so we know we have lots of bats around that will be very happy with their new boxes! Thank you to everyone that kindly donated their handmade boxes."

Bats are the only species of mammal that have evolved the ability to fly. They are nocturnal (awake at night) and contrary to popular belief, they are not blind. They use echolocation to find their way around and to catch their prev. They navigate by making ultrasonic sounds that bounce off objects.

There are eighteen different species of bat in the UK, all of which are protected species. There may be as many as fourteen species locally, including rare large species of bat such as the noctule.

During March and April, bats will begin to emerge from hibernation in search for food. If you keep an eye out at dawn or dusk, you may start noticing bats taking their first flights after sleeping through the long cold winter months. The smallest of the UK bat species, the Common Pipistrelle, can eat up to 3000 insects in one night! Bats are therefore fantastic at pest control and a vital part of the ecosystem.

As bats begin to emerge from hibernation, you may come across one that has been injured. Bristol Bat Rescue can provide guidance if you find an injured bat www.bristolbatrescue.co.uk.

#### **News from Frampton Cotterell RFC**

1st Team - Thanks to the combined impact of Ciara, Dennis and Jorge, Frampton's 1st team didn't play a single match in February. Having not played for six weeks, Frampton were then tasked with playing three tricky matches in a week. It was somewhat unfortunate that the first match after this winter break was against runaway league leaders Chosen Hill. Frampton competed well for periods of the match, but they couldn't match their visitors' organisation and ability to score points when an opportunity presented itself.

This was followed by a mid-week away semi-final in the Bristol Combination Vase against Imperial. The match was played under floodlights at Bristol Harlequins ground in Brislington. Frampton were soundly defeated by a much heavier and more experienced side who were able to use the awful conditions to their advantage.

The third and last of these three matches was played against Cheltenham North in a home league fixture. North are one of the form teams in the league, and they blew Frampton away with a fine display of power and pace, with which the young Frampton side struggled to compete.

As a result of the ongoing coronavirus pandemic, the RFU have now suspended all rugby - both at a professional and at a community level until 14th April. This includes all matches and all training. In reality, this effectively means the end of the current season for all of those clubs not playing at a professional level. It will be interesting to see how promotion and relegation will be sorted out.

2nd Team - The 2nd team's fixtures have also been badly affected and no games were played in February. Their only recent fixture was a narrow 22-19 defeat away to local rivals Thornbury, on the first weekend of March. Currently the 2nd team lie in seventh place in their league, many of whose clubs' first teams play at a much higher level than that of Frampton.

3rd Team - As with both the 1st and 2nd teams, the weather has had a severe impact on the 3rd team's fixtures, with no league matches being played in February. The 3rds have managed to fit in a couple of friendly matches to keep their competitive and post-match juices flowing.

Colts Team - Somehow the Colts team have managed to buck the trend and have actually played some rugby! The Colts suffered a narrow defeat in a friendly match on the dark side away at Caerleon, but they did manage splendid away victories in the league at Nailsea and Backwell and latterly at Wellington.



The Frampton Cotterell and District Family History are in the process of producing a display as part of the local VE Day celebrations organised by Frampton Cotterell Parish Council. The display, which will be in the Brockeridge Centre for most of the month Mav. will include features and photographs on; local VE Day parties in May 1945, residents experiences of the war years, information on where German bombs landed locally, and commemoration of those from Frampton Cotterell and Coalpit Heath who died during the war.

What has emerged is that it wasn't only soldiers and sailors serving overseas who lost their lives during the conflict, but some closer to home. Local men did. of

course, die in a variety of theatres of war; one in the Battle of Normandy following the D-Day landings in June 1944, another in Burma at the Battle of Pinwe, and a third soldier killed in Sicily shortly after

September 1943. The great risk for seamen was the threat of attack by German submarines (U-Boats) and three local men in the Royal Navy went down with their ships; in the North Atlantic, off the coast of Africa and near the French mainland, having

been torpedoed by U-Boats. A merchant seaman from Coalpit Heath was lost when his vessel was sunk north of the Azores.

Airmen, too, died in varied circumstances: one during take-off, another on landing, whilst a third, serving with Bomber Command, died when his aircraft collided mid-air with a Luftwaffe night fighter over eastern France, during a bombing

Being in Blighty was, however, no guarantee of safety as illustrated by one Frampton Cotterell member of the Searchlight Regiment, who after returning from guard duty at Wookey Hole was

found drowned in a nearby swimming pool. Of the 52 civilians who were killed as the result of a German bombing raid on the 27th February 1941. on the Parnall's Aircraft Factory in Yate, three were from Coalpit Heath and Frampton Cotterell.



A local volunteer in the Home Guard was also killed that day. A Frampton Cotterell employee of Bristol Aeroplane Company was killed as a result of a German daylight bombing raid on the works at Filton on 25th September 1940.

Can you help? The Local History Society would like to hear from any family members of the 20 individuals who are commemorated on the war memorials in St Peter's and St Saviour's churchyards, as we would like to include some family details and, if possible, a photograph of each of those who lost their lives.

I am delighted to report that many of our local schools still organise large collections over Harvest and Easter, in fact, the foodbank told me out of all the schools across Bristol that generously make collections for the charity, it is the schools in the Bradley Stoke, Little Stoke Gifford and Winterbourne areas that donate the most.

It was good to meet with the dedicated North Bristol foodbank team again, who are still working tirelessly for local families. foodbank Manager Matt Dobson took some time out to bring me up to date.

In 2018 the North Bristol foodbanks (Yate, Thornbury, Filton, Horfield, Lockleaze, Patchway, Mangotsfield and Southmead) fed 6,961 people (individuals helped not the number of food packages). In 2019, the same food banks fed 9,500 people, up a staggering 40% from 2018. These figures make tough reading.

A large part of this increase is due to the roll-out of Universal Credit, that sees people have a 5-week waiting period for benefits to come through when they apply or have a change in circumstance.

Matt told me that foodbanks do not want to exist! They will of course not leave people vulnerable who are in the midst of a crisis but a large part of what they do is campaigning to make much needed changes to our welfare state.

The Trussell Trust, who the foodbank is associated with, currently has a campaign Five Weeks Too Long that it would be great if you could support. It only takes a minute to sign up at - www.trusselltrust. ora/five-weeks-too-long.



Editor's note: My visit to North Bristol Foodbank took place before the craziness of Coronavirus had set in. Now, more than ever. we need to help to protect the vulnerable in our community. A huge amount of additional people will be suffering from loss of income and inevitably the demand on Foodbanks will go up, at a time when general supplies are being limited through panic buying and potential restocking delays.

Food donations are still extremely welcome, but if you are self-isolating and still wish to support the charity, you can make a monetary donation - no how matter small, it will be greatly appreciated.

The rise in living costs is another key contributor. Rent prices in Bristol and surrounding areas are through the roof. Matt told me that many families find that after paying their rent and fuel costs they only have £20 leftover to cover everything else.

The team is also seeing a sharp rise in people with mental health issues, so as well as offering food, they are working hard to help get them to the right people or organisations to support their overall

The foodbanks take time to talk with people about their individual circumstances and signpost them to the relevant advice centres etc. They currently work with 320 referral agencies.

I asked Matt if the rise in the use of the foodbanks had helped lift the stigma that can come with using these facilities? He told me that, although some press outlets report that 'of course people are going to want to take advantage of free food', that is not the case at all; many are still reluctant. He had met with a lady that week who had been given a food voucher three weeks previously; she had been back and forth in front of the doors of the foodbank but wasn't able to bring herself to go in. When she eventually did, she was relieved and pleased to be met with such a warm, considerate welcome.

Matt explained that people from any walk of life can find themselves in crisis and the foodbanks are here to offer help and support without any judgement.

"We are always so blown away by the support of our local community. We couldn't run foodbank without the people and business owners that live and work in our community. Not only is the physical support through food and financial donations invaluable, but the picture this shows our city of a community uniting together to support the most vulnerable is incredibly powerful"

The North Bristol Foodbank is thankful that they are currently well-covered with 200-300 volunteers that work across the outlets each week.

Matt told me that, although the work is incredibly challenging and the foodbanks are sorry that they have to exist, joy comes from the the incredible support that the community shows the project, it's a community behind a community.

It is with great regret that the Frampton Festival Committee have decided to cancel this year's Frampton Festival. Not because of the threat of Coronavirus, although had it gone ahead this may well have had an impact on the running of the festival. The committee have not taken the decision lightly but we have been unable to secure a venue for 2020.

As many of you will know, there is currently limited access into the Centenary Field due to a neighbouring wall collapsing and South Gloucestershire Council erecting safety barriers on the edge of the carriageway opposite the gated entrance to the allotments. This means that vehicles towing trailers (fairground rides, food outlets, stage etc.) do not now have sufficient room to turn into what is already a "tight corner". Even the Parish Council's grass cutting machinery can no longer drive in.

The festival committee have been working with Frampton Cotterell Parish Council and South Gloucestershire Council officers in an attempt to resolve the access issue, but because one of the solutions involved alterations to existing utilities, the timescale involved meant that this work could not be completed in time to facilitate the festival in July.

Numerous alternative venues have been explored in an attempt to run Frampton Festival 2020, but unfortunately The Park (or as some know Crossbow Fields) was already booked out for the date required. Other venues were approached.

We would like to thank the Frampton Cotterell Parish Councillors who have actively championed and continue to champion The Frampton Festival to ensure that the Festival, along with the joint Churches Service (held on the following Sunday morning) will return to its home in The Centenary Field ready for 2021.

There may not be a festival this year but the committee are continuing to plan towards putting on the event in twelve months' time, when the aim is to have all the usual attractions - and more - and once again the Beacon will be lit. Thank you to all that have attended The Frampton Festival in previous years and we look forward to seeing you all in 2021.


