In these somewhat strange times, anything that can help to bring a little cheer into everyday life, is to be appreciated. We are trying to maintain the flowers around the village as best we can, and hope that vou have been able to enjoy, some of the flowers that have been blooming in the village over recent weeks.

### Summer displays

We have now replenished the plants in all our village planters with summer bedding, and the hanging baskets have arrived to complete the scene. Due to current Covid-19 constrictions, we have not been able to completely renew the displays but they will, nevertheless, help to brighten up the village.

### The work continues .....

Volunteers have tidied the gateway planter by the traffic lights and planted Verbena Bonariensis, kindly donated by a resident along with bedding Begonias for summer colour.

The Triangle flower bed has also been tidied: due to recent drought conditions the plants are struggling to survive, but with the kind support of the landlord of the Rising Sun, we watered the area and then scattered some wild flower seeds to create a bright display later this summer.

Recently we planted more wild flower plug plants in the Glebeland wild flower area and more wild flower seeds were also sown. This was to add variety to

the display and promote biodiversity. After a very dry spell they have received some welcome rain and are looking healthy and ready to put on a good display later in the year.

### Woodend border flourishes

Despite drought conditions, through careful care and management, the Woodend/Beesmoor border continues to thrive and is full of beautiful colourful flowers this June.

We would like to thank everyone for their support over the last few months, and in particular the kind, anonymous, donor of some Marigold plants left on the Beesmoor bed. These have now been planted and will soon be flowering.

### **Events postponed**

All our planned events (the plant sale and coffee morning, the flower festival and the coach trip) for the foreseeable future have been cancelled. Hopefully we will be able to organise something once things begin to return to normal. In the meantime, we hope you continue to enjoy the flowers around the village and that they help to cheer everyone up.

Could you help? It takes time, effort and funds to maintain the planting around the village benefiting the local community, the environment, and the wildlife. If you would like to help there are various wavs in which you can do so:

- Could you spare a few minutes regularly? We always need help to maintain the planters (and we always try to share the load and ask people to look after a planter near their home/business to minimise time and effort).

- We run various fund raising activities during the year (coffee mornings, plant sales) and we are always glad of help.

The event is vital to the school, it is the main PTFA fundraiser, making more than our summer or Christmas fayre. Previously, the money raised has gone towards play equipment, workshops, pantomimes, trips, children's Christmas parties. The PTFA focus on enrichment, and now it has never

been so important to have that extra help and support for the children when they return in September.

We were determined to stil go ahead with the 2020 race, even if we wouldn't be able to hold the event as we usually do due to the current restrictions. The virtual race offers so many benefits,

# **News from Frome Valley Growing Project**



Our aim here at Frome Valley Growing Project is to work as a community, for the community to provide affordable locally grown food for our members and other local residents

We are using Permaculture growing principles to increase biodiversity, reduce our dependency on oil based products and chemicals, and to utilise materials and products found around us that are reused or re-purposed.

People have been so generous in supporting us to get started, we have had donations of manure from Kendleshire Farm stables, local people have donated surplus seedlings and pots and a local tree surgeon is supplying us with wood chip.



We rent a beautiful acre plot in Winterbourne and the land owner is really supportive of our vision. Our members are local families who all come with their own valuable skills and ways of contributing to the project. We are still looking for a donation of a poly tunnel to extend our growing season and we are taking on new members and volunteers. As a response to the COVID-19 outbreak we have developed

a system so that we have been able to continue growing, and tending to our plants ensuring we are sticking to social distancing guidance.

# Winterbourne and Frome Valley Environment Group

Passionate about the environment and building a strong inclusive community

Winterbourne and Frome Valley Environment Group (WEG) as a group were fortunate enough to be able to organise structured group litter picks earlier this year, with the aim to run them monthly. Then Covid-19 struck, and with that lockdown, which meant the litter picks came to a halt, but we are now hoping to re-start them as soon as is possible.

During our March litter pick we managed to fill twenty five large bags of litter in just over one hour! This was tackling litter on our roads as well as open spaces.

During the lockdown we have encouraged local residents to use their daily exercise to litter pick, by working with South Gloucestershire Street Care, who have provided the equipment including both adult and children grabbers, bags and bag loops alongside gloves. These kits have been shared with local residents across

Winterbourne, Hambrook and Frampton Cotterell and we have had reports back of many bags being filled, ready for collection from South Gloucestershire Street Care.

Have you noticed that the litter around you has increased? There is certainly a noticeable amount of personal protective equipment (PPE) around, not only is this very bad for the local eco system, or further if it travels in the Frome Valley, but also has nasty consequences should these items be contaminated with Covid-19 and not disposed of correctly.

Between the end of February and mid-April this year, more than a billion items of personal protective equipment were given out in the UK alone. In a hospital it is disposed of as clinical waste but out in the public domain it appears to be littering our streets and woodlands, washing up on beaches across the world. Birds are getting entangled in them and none of which are recyclable, compostable, even the ones that claim to be unless they are within a specific composting environment which our compost caddies, riverbanks or streets are unable to provide.

In light of the latest update from the government we will be looking at getting back to the litter pick groups soon. If you are interested in attending please keep an eye out on our Facebook pages for future events https://www.facebook.com/ Winterbourneenvironmentalgroup/notifications/.

WEG are also working with Frome Valley Growing Project, which are a few families in Winterbourne that have come together with a shared belief in an ethical framework: earth care, people care, fair shares. The area (field) based in Winterbourne is working to create a sustainable space to grow food as a community, for the community using permaculture growing methods. (Read more on page 8).

The Frampton Cotterell and District Local History Society have started a 'Lockdown Album' of pictures on their Facebook page and they are asking for your help.

The album contains pictures of the local area taken during lockdown, but there are many streets, businesses and views which are not vet present in the collection

The idea is to create a 'snapshot in time' so that in future years, we can look back at the time of lockdown and remember what the villages looked like at that time.

"When researching the villages during World War 2 for the VE Day display, we noticed that we had relatively few pictures of the villages from that time - and how precious the few pictures that we did have were," says the Society's Facebook administrator,



# Supporting children through transitions

Hello my name is Louisa Tickner-Jenkins and I have worked in the early years sector for 30 years and I have been a childminder for the last 14 years.

As I write this we are nearing the end of June and some children will have started going back to school and younger children have started to go back to their early years setting. We are all experiencing transitions as we move through the easing of lockdown. Some people love change and thrive on variety, while others can find it a challenging time. Young children can struggle with change if they are not prepared for it, they bring a short amount of life experience to a new situation and that can make change overwhelming. Think about when you started a new job and how that feels. We as adults are able to articulate those feelings and share them with a friend and find reassurance; young children may be yet to develop all those skills.

One of the biggest changes on the horizon is children who will be starting school in September joining Reception. Some children may have been attending an early years setting prior to lockdown and are now able to go back there. If so speak to your child's key carer and find out what they are doing to support the children during this transition period. Primary schools will have a plan for settling in their new children and will contact families once they have a clearer idea of how schools will be opening in September. In the meantime there are things we can do at home.

Life story work is a great tool to help children make sense of what is going on in their world. One aspect of this is to make a book about it. The story is personalised to your child, a selection of photos and or drawings that illustrate the following;

- Where we were prior to lockdown, for example, going to pre-school, older siblings to school, mum and dad to work.
- What happened in lockdown, for example, everyone at home, then going back to preschool, seeing family/friends again – socially distanced of course.
- 3. What's happening next, for example, starting school. The text can be personalised to your family and circumstances. Children can help make the books choosing photos and sticking them in, older children can help to write the 'story'. Read it a couple of times with your child and leave the book in an accessible place so they can initiate when they would like to read it. As the transition of school occurs you can add more photos to illustrate their inturney.

Familiarity creates predictability, which can help children manage a transition. How often do we check on a map if we need to go somewhere new, or even make the journey a day or two before so we know where we are going especially if it's a workrelated journey. These processes can help create a sense of ease and we can create that same sense of ease for children too. Think about practising putting on school uniform if your child is willing, or dress a teddy bear up in it. Take a walk on a regular basis that is the route you will take to get to school. Stand outside the school gates and talk about what happens in school – don't worry that you may not know the exact details, a broad overview of how the day runs will help your child to predict what will happen. Predictability helps to create a sense of

Role play is a fantastic tool to explore new experiences. If your child will be taking a packed lunch role play lunch times, use their lunch box, set up teddy bears to be other children, role play register time making up a pretend register encouraging your child to listen carefully for their name. There are lots of well written story books too about starting school.

It's not just our younger children who will be going through transitions. There is a lot of uncertainty of how schools will be re-opening in September and potentially the school day could look a bit different. Settling primary school children back into school with an unfamiliar routine may present challenges for some children. It's really important to have an early open dialogue with your child's teacher. If children are not in school full time in September making a weekly chart using pictures and/or words to show which days are school days and which are home days can help children. A sticker or magnet can be moved each day so your child knows which day it is and what will be happening the next day. For children who are struggling to make sense of how they are feeling, there is a resource called 'the jelly baby tree' - it's easy to find online. This resource provides a starting platform to explore how your day has been, how you would like to feel during the day and discusses what strategies your child can use to work towards their goal.

Some children will be making the transition to secondary school. This is a big step in a child's education and they often need as much transition support as when they started in Reception, just in a different way. A practice walk to school to work out the safest place to cross roads and which entrance they go in at the school can help.



Making a checklist of all the items they need on a daily basis to ensure nothing is forgotten can help create a sense of ease. Talking to your child about the learning opportunities there will be at secondary school that they may not have had at primary school, for example, fully equipped science labs, engineering rooms, the sports facilities. There can be quite a sense of loss for a child as they leave the safety net of primary school, where often they have been in the same class of students for many years. Given the choice some children would opt to stay at primary school; for others it's an exciting new adventure and one they are very ready for. A good friend of mine gave me a great piece of advice when my eldest daughter started secondary school, to 'expect a bumpy ride in Year 7'; I was ready for the bumps and more able to deal with them. Remember that first day in a new job and how long it can take to settle in and feel really comfortable and confident, and then transfer those feelings to these transitions our children will be going through. This is also applicable for young people starting college in September. Their safety net was secondary school - and now starting a new chapter possibly with no one else they know; it can be daunting.

Transitions can generate a number of feelings, emotions and behaviours. It's really important we name the feelings we see. There is nothing more frustrating than talking with a friend about something that has generated high feelings for yourself and the other person does not acknowledge those feelings and instead tries to distract you with something else. In my experience when a child is upset, if we name the feelings we see and validate those feelings the child recovers much quicker than if we try to distract them with something else. Once we name the feelings we can discuss strategies to manage those feeling and situations.

For further reading, my aforementioned good friend has written in more detail about supporting young children through transitions, with a chapter on school. Due to be published in July, Supporting Young Children Through Change and Everyday Transitions: Practical Strategies for Practitioners and Parents can now be pre-ordered.







## Frampton Cotterell Computer Group Celebrating 20 years



ago, Frampton Cotterell Parish Council decided to set up a computer group in the newly opened Brockeridge Centre with the primary

aim of helping older people come to grips with home computers. At that time, less than 40% of UK households had a computer at home and even fewer had an Internet connection. Many people, particularly of an older generation, had never used a computer but were interested in finding out how to use one and in discovering the benefits they might offer in their daily life.

A group of volunteers came together, purchased some desktop PCs with money obtained via community grants and started offering classes to help people who wanted to learn about using a home computer. In 2008, the group became independent of the Parish Council while still occupying a room at the Brockeridge Centre and maintaining a close working relationship with them.

Keith Powell who has been chairman of the group since it became independent said, "When we started, few people would have imagined we'd still be going 20 years later! We've seen many changes over the years, with fewer people now being completely new to computers and more wanting help with specific questions. Technology has also changed significantly with the introduction of tablets and smartphones as well as major changes to software such as Windows and MS Office. Our team of volunteers has adapted to these changes and we are still assisting people with a wide range of issues. These include: using the internet safely and

securely, dealing with digital photographs, keeping track of finances using spreadsheets, creating and managing email accounts and taking advantage of cloud computing services.

"People come to us from across South Gloucestershire and even further afield because of our unique approach. Some come for just a few sessions, others continue to attend for longer periods both for the intellectual stimulation and for the social interaction provided by learning as part of a group. Either way we aim to provide assistance in a relaxed, friendly environment with one helper for at most two learners."

At its peak the group ran six sessions per week for up to 9 people per session and more than 1.000 people have been helped since the group started. It is still going strong with around 30 people attending one of the four sessions held every week.



### **News from Winterbourne Medieval Barn**

### Heritage Open Days, 12th and 13th September



Winterbourne Medieval Barn is no stranger to epidemics! It was built in 1342, just a few years before 'The Black Death', also known as 'The Plaque', spread across Europe from central Asia, sweeping across England in 1348. Millions of people in Europe, Asia and North Africa

died from this disease between 1346 and 1353, and the sudden loss of a third of the population changed the social structure and future history of our country forever, leading to events like the Peasants' Revolt in 1381.

Covid-19 has hit the world with an unexpected force and disrupted our lives significantly, but thank goodness for our NHS and modern science and technology. We are beginning to see signs of 'life after the Covid crisis', including the hope of re-opening Winterbourne Medieval Barn in the coming months.

None of us have seen the outcome of the year-long closure for refurbishment work yet, but provided that Covid recovery rules allow it, the hope is to re-open for guided tours as part of the national Heritage Open Days weekend of 12th-13th September. Tours will take place hourly at 2pm. 3pm and 4pm each day and although there is no charge, they must be pre-booked.

So, be one of the first to have a guided tour of the newly renovated Barn which has seen so many changes over almost 700 years! Numbers will be strictly limited to enable safe social-distancing. Book a free place on Ticketsource via the Barn website from mid-August.

If you can't join us in person, we'll also be putting up lots of digital content over the weekend, including family activity ideas and audio stories from our volunteers.

We hope that a programme of talks and craft workshops will resume in October. Details will be posted on the Barn website and Facebook as soon as we are able to confirm that public events are allowed to restart. And additional digital content will also be available.



# Minister's Message

Dear Friends.

As I write this month's Minister's Message, we are in the process of reopening our churches of all denominations as the Covid-19 lockdown situation begins to see some relaxation. Ministers from the Fromeside Benefice churches have, for some time, taken the opportunity to conduct the morning and evening office in their respective churches several times per week, and since Monday 15th June you may have heard the local parish calling bell being wrung at different times to indicate that the office of morning or evening prayer is about to take place.

Further to this, the Fromeside Benefice Churches have begun to allow everyone to come into church for 'private prayer' since Monday 15th June. Each of our churches are opening for this on two occasions every week. For example, St Peter's Frampton Cotterell is open to all who wish to pray on a Thursday morning from 09:30 to 12:30 and on a Sunday afternoon from 14:30 to 17:30. For the times of opening for other churches within the Benefice (see opposite) and for churches of other denominations, please see their respective websites and notice boards.

Having been present at the St Peter's sessions and from talking to others, I know that my colleagues and I have had the privilege of welcoming a goodly number of individuals into church simply to pray. I believe that many of those who have taken the big step to re-engage with their local church building have found a real level of positive emotional release and comfort, simply from being with God in what many of us see as a holy and sacred space in which people have praved and connected with God for hundreds of years. I encourage all of you who haven't vet made the decision to give it a try. I'm sure that God would love you to join him.

Looking forward towards the future I was struck by the collect for the first Sunday of July, the 4th Sunday after Trinity, which is as follows:

O God, the protector of all who trust in you. without whom nothing is strong, nothing is holy: increase and multiply upon us your mercy: that with you as our ruler and guide we may so pass through all things temporal that we lose not our hold on things eternal; grant this, heavenly Father: for our Lord Jesus Christ's sake. who is alive and reigns with you. in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

Many of us have lost some level of trust in numerous things that we once felt very confident about, whether they be government, local organisations, other institutions. certain individuals or



even our cars, which having not moved for weeks, suddenly needed new batteries! (Not mine so far, but one never knows... because I have heard of manv.)

Throughout all we have passed through, and indeed all we still have yet to pass through, for me the timeless truth of the 4th Sunday of Trinity collect is simply that we understand that it is only our reliance upon God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, that will allow us to 'pass through all things temporal', whether they be Covid-19 or any other worldly thing which causes us pain or distress of any kind, by assisting us to maintain our individual hold on things eternal in the reality of God's true love for us as his children. No matter what is going on around us.

I wish everyone joy in their participation in the family of God in the coming weeks, and a wonderful summer break, in the assurance of God's love for us all.
