The Very Real Cost of the Covid 19 pandemic

We hear from local independent funeral director Jo Hume at Ian Watts & Son: 'The true cost is the loss of so many precious people and the devastation it has caused, and continues to cause, to the families and friends of those who have lost their lives. So many too have suffered with the virus and are left with life changing health issues.'

'It has been devastating for families when we have had to explain to them, as we arrange funerals that only small numbers of mourners can attend. The lowest number was 5 but thankfully that has been increased now, and varies depending on the size of Crematorium Chapels and the rules of the various cemetery management.

'I think the saddest times have been when we have been repeatedly told that because no hospital visiting could take place, the next of kin had to rely on the wonderful NHS staff who often sit with a patient at the end of their lives to ensure that they are not alone. Can you imagine when couples have been married for over 60 years for example, one contracts the virus and the spouse can not visit and can not be with the other at the end? We have witnessed some truly heart-breaking situations.

'We have been offering the bereaved families the facility of webcasting funeral services from the Crematoriums so that those who could not attend due to the restrictions, could at least view and be part of the service from their own homes.'

'We are extremely grateful to all the Management and staff at the Crematoriums and Cemetery departments as it has been such a difficult time for them too. We will offer Memorial Services just as soon as we are able to safely have people gathered together in larger numbers but the safety of everyone is paramount. People tend to line the streets whilst adhering to social distancing to pay their respects as our funeral corteges travel through the various villages and towns and I think we will see this continuing for many months to come. Please stay safe and continue to follow the NHS and government guidance as we start to come out of lockdown'





Chepstow: Open for Business

update from Monmouthshire CC 24/6/20

We're making some temporary changes to make Chepstow safe for our communities to return and support our local shops and businesses. A fantastic marketing strategy has already started.

To maximise opportunities for social distancing, the High Street will be fully pedestrianised between 10am and 4pm, with no vehicle access. Vehicle access outside those hours is for deliveries only.

A pedestrian 'keep left' system will be promoted on the High Street, with a one way system at the Town Arch and a new diagonal crossing point provided to cross to Welsh Street.

Traffic calming measures on Station Road will ensure connectivity for pedestrians from the High Street to St Mary Street and will open up Beaufort Square.

Cycle stands will be provided at key areas such as Albion Square, White Lion Square, Beaufort Square, Bank Street and Welsh Street Car Park.



Chepstow Bridge will be closed to motor vehicles due to structural issues. This bridge will remain open for cyclists and pedestrians.

In Bulwark, we are seeking the private landowner's agreement to close off the private access roads fronting the shops, increasing space for social distancing. Shoppers are encouraged to use the free MCC car park at the Severn View Social Centre. Phase 2 comprises a 20mph zone with speed reduction measures at entrance points covering the whole of Chepstow except A466 and A48.

All of the changes are part of a trial. We will be seeking live feedback and we will tweak, add to, change or remove measures as appropriate. We will learn quickly and adapt as we go to improve based on feedback. If some of the changes are successful, we will consider making them permanent, following future consultation.

Chepstow Covid-19 Helping Group

Chepstow Covid-19 Helping Group was initiated by single mum Helen Child Villiers (photo right) in mid-March, as the pandemic started to affect us here in the UK.

The local community's response to the group has been phenomenal and, as we write, the group has grown to well over 3000 members, has taken well over 4,000 calls and carried out approaching 3.000 tasks for residents across Chepstow and the surrounding villages. It was fantastic to hear from Helen, who shared with us the following update on all the fantastic efforts being given by so many across our amazing community.

Helen: When I started the group, I had no idea that it would blow up like this at all. I thought it would be a few people taking Shepherd's Pies round to those who couldn't get out, maybe a bit of shopping here and there. Never could I have imagined it would be so big and I'm sorry for underestimating Chepstow!

It quickly became clear that I would need to protect the vulnerable people in our community, and those who are volunteering for us. So I started creating the volunteer registration form, and writing the procedures and policies.

I split the town into 15 teams, and then Transition Chepstow used Chepstow Town Council funds

to purchase and set up the phone numbers so we weren't disclosing personal numbers and, more importantly, more than one person could bear the load of call processing.

Transition Chepstow also secured funds from Chepstow Town Council to buy some of the branded High Visibility Jackets, and then Lucy Allen ordered 100 more when they ran out.

Lucy has been beyond amazing in terms of continuous support - both funds and paperwork. I can't thank her enough.

The support from MCC has been absolutely amazing. Not just in a practical sense but they've checked on my wellbeing too, and have helped with safequarding issues that have arisen, even two on a Sunday.

Chepstow Round Table donated £200 so we could buy enough card reader machines to take payments from those who had run out of cash or couldn't do online banking.

Chepstow Gold Touch gave us

£125 towards food for those in need who were

struggling.

Tidenham Parish Council gave us and the cost of running the card machines.

I get messages of thanks every day. I'm so grateful for them, but it's so important to remember that none of this would happen if it wasn't for the Admin Team, Area Coordinators, and Team Members. Each of them brings a unique skill set with them. The ID cards were designed by a volunteer, and have been printed between him and Jenni and Keith Brews of Affinity Events.

The gorgeous leaflets (see page 2) that were delivered to households were created, printed and delivered to the teams by Warren Bluck.

The community has responded to the call to action with aplomb. To say I am moved by the response of those volunteering is the greatest of understatements.

But most importantly, the knowledge of the security, reassurance and safety we are providing our local community with is beyond meaningful. Every single volunteer is changing the quality of life for those they are helping. I think the quote

highlighted opposite from Warren sums up exactly how big an impact we are having.

Everyone is helping us help Chepstow, whether that's helping the chemists with our delivery service, getting shopping for someone who's self isolating, someone who's lonely, or even someone who lives far away and wants us to help their elderly parent. Chepstow people really are pulling together when the chips are down and it's been a real privilege to facilitate and orchestrate that, I don't think I'll ever forget this, even if it has been a bit of a blur! 33

Thank you so much to everyone who has helped, donated and volunteered.

Helen also wanted to stress that as we come out of lockdown, the volunteers are continuing. Calls may have dropped but they are still there to help and they plan on continuing, with other community projects in the pipeline.

Thank you Helen for everything you have done to orchestrate all of the above - you are a real Community Champion.

International Handover over the Wye

On Tuesday 30th June 2020 the Presidency of Rotary Clubs throughout the world is changed since Presidents may only stand for one year. The geographic area of the Chepstow & District Rotary Club is divided by the River Wye and while the outgoing President lives in Beachley the incoming member lives in Chepstow. And there are social distancing rules too! It was therefore agreed that the handover of the Rotary regalia, the badge of office, should take place on the old Chepstow Bridge, spanning the Wye and joining the two nations.

In a howling gale the outgoing President, Commander Christopher Wilson, approached from the English/Gloucestershire bank and walked towards his relief, Mr Geoffrey Sumner, who approached from the Lower Chepstow/Welsh bank. On meeting near the centre, they waved to one another and then the regalia was transferred and with it



the responsibility for directing the Club for a further year. This Club, that was established in 1963, continues to support many community activities and charities whilst providing an excellent social programme for its members.

Commander Wilson reflected on this last challenging year. He explained that fundraising at the December Tintern Carol Service and other activities had enabled the Club to make donations of £1,550 in that past year, including those to Chepstow Guiding, the Toucan for Children appeal, a contribution following a local house fire and to the local Boys Brigade. They also gave a major donation to the Disaster Trust following the severe Bahamas Hurricane and continue to donate to both Caldicot and Chepstow foodbanks. They also ran a number of youth programmes and ran the Youth Speaks competition at Maisemore.

When Covid-19 struck and lockdown was enforced it curtailed the final 4 months of live activities. However, the Club was not defeated and continued its weekly meeting using the internet and ZOOM to keep the members informed and entertained. In spite of the difficulties the Club has recruited 3 new members, one of whom lives in Bristol. He stated that it had been a rewarding year and a privilege to serve the Club. He has also promised a garden party for the Club as something to look forward to once the rules permit.

The incoming President, Geoff Sumner, is well known in Chepstow circles through his long involvement with the Chepstow Society. Geoff explained that since current circumstances made regular face-to-face meetings impossible, he has generated two programmes of events for the coming year. One is an "E" programme with quizzes and talks between the regular Rotary business topics using ZOOM. The other is a more regular mix of meetings and social events to enjoy once the rules are relaxed further.

Geoff has been a member of Rotary for many, many years and so has great experience in organising and mobilising teams. He stated that he was determined to maintain both the effectiveness and the morale of the Club while it was in his stewardship during the coming 12 months.




Tutshill Scarecrow Trail 2020 "Children's Books & Stories Theme" Weds 19th August - Sat 5th September

Back to School: Transition

Contributor Louisa Tickner-Jenkins has worked in the early years sector for 30 years, and been a childminder for the last 14 years

One of the biggest changes on the horizon is children who will be starting school in September joining Reception. Not all children may have been able tto spend any time in their early years setting since lockdown startedin March and carers may be worrying that there child will not be adequately prepared for 'big school'. Primary schools will have a plan for settling in their new children and will contact families once they have a clearer idea of how schools will be opening in September. In the meantime there are things we can do at home.

Life story work is a great tool to help children make sense of what is going on in their world. One aspect of this is to make a book about it. The story is personalised to your child, a selection of photos and or drawings that illustrate the following:

Where we were prior to lockdown, for example, going to pre-school, older siblings to school, mum and dad to work.

What happened in lockdown, for example, everyone at home, then going back to pre-school, seeing family/friends again – socially distanced of course.

What's happening next, for example, starting school. The text can be personalised to your family and circumstances. Children can help make the books choosing photos and sticking them in, older children can help to write the 'story'. Read it a couple of times with your child and leave the book in an accessible place so they can initiate when they would like to read it. As the transition of school occurs you can add more photos to illustrate their journey.





Familiarity creates predictability, which can help children manage a transition. How often do we check on a map if we need to go somewhere new, or even make the journey a day or two before so we know where we are going especially if it's a work-related journey. These processes can help create a sense of ease and we can create that same sense of ease for children too. Think about practising putting on school uniform if your child is willing, or dress a teddy bear up in it. Take a walk on a regular basis that is the route you will take to get to school. Stand outside the school gates and talk about what happens in school – don't worry that you may not know the exact details, a broad overview of how the day runs will help your child to predict what will happen. Predictability helps to create a sense of ease.

Role play is a fantastic tool to explore new experiences. If your child will be taking a packed lunch role play lunch times, use their lunch box, set up teddy bears to be other children, role play register time making up a pretend register encouraging your child to listen carefully for their name. There are lots of well written story books too about starting school.

It's not just our younger children who will be going through transitions. There is a lot of uncertainty of how schools will be re-opening in September and potentially the school day could look a bit different. Settling primary school children back into school with an unfamiliar routine may present challenges for some children. It's really important to have an early open dialogue with your child's teacher. If children are not in school full time in September making a weekly chart using pictures and/or words to show which days are school days and which are home days can help children. A sticker or magnet can be moved each day so your child knows which day it is and what will be happening the next day. For children who are struggling to make sense of

how they are feeling, there is a resource called 'the jelly baby tree' – it's easy to find online. This resource provides a starting platform to explore how your day has been, how you would like to feel during the day and discusses what strategies your child can use to work towards their goal.



Some children will be making the transition to secondary school. This is a big step in a child's education and they often need as much transition support as when they started in Reception, just in a different way. A practice walk to school to work out the safest place to cross roads and which entrance they go in at the school can help.

Making a checklist of all the items they need on a daily basis to ensure nothing is forgotten can help create a sense of ease. Talking to your child about the learning opportunities there will be at secondary school that they may not have had at primary school, for example, fully equipped science labs, engineering rooms, the sports facilities. There can be quite a sense of loss for a child as they leave the safety net of primary school, where often they have been in the same class of students for many years. Given the choice some children would opt to stay at primary school: for others it's an exciting new adventure and one they are very ready for. A good friend of mine gave me a great piece of advice when my eldest daughter started secondary school, to 'expect a bumpy ride in Year 7': I was ready for the bumps and more able to deal with them. Remember that first day in a new job and how long it can take to settle in and feel really comfortable and confident, and then transfer those feelings to these transitions our children will be going through.

This is also applicable for young people starting college in September. Their safety net was secondary school – and now starting a new chapter possibly with no one else they know; it can be daunting.



Transitions can generate a number of feelings, emotions and behaviours. It's really important we name the feelings we see. There is nothing more frustrating than talking with a friend about something that has generated high feelings for yourself and the other person does not acknowledge those feelings and instead tries to distract you with something else. In my experience when a child is upset, if we name the feelings we see and validate those feelings the child recovers much quicker than if we try to distract them with something else. Once we name the feelings we can discuss strategies to manage those feeling and situations.







Chepstow Rocks!

We've been delighted to see the progress of Chepstow's own Rock Snake, as initiated by the Chepstow COvid19 Helping Group.

Helen Child Villiers who initiated the rock snake, told me "We wanted to give the people of Chepstow something that they can have ownership of that brings everyone together. Something so simple that would give a sense of excitement and enjoyment that the children can participate in and watch grow."

The rock snake or 'Snakey' as he has become affectionately known on facebook, is made up of rocks that individuals have painted and taken along to add to the snake. Unlike other common painted rock initiatives, the idea is not to take one away when you put yours down but to add them all together to let Snakey grow!

It's fantastic the support that 'Snakey' has garnered in the town with residents becoming very protective and also defensive on the occasion that rocks have mistakenly been taken (most have since been replaced) resulting in more signage to explain the idea.

Local schools and brownie groups, in particular St John's on the

Hill who have incorporated it into their art activities in both the school and nursery, have helped Snakey to grow and there has been a fantastic response from the general community. As of Monday 3rd August there were nearly 1300 painted rocks!

Lions helping you to save lives in your local community

In 2016 The Lions Club of Chepstow and Caldicot decided on a programme of funding for Public Access Defibrillators (PADs). Since then the club has assisted in the purchase of 30 PADs for use in the Chepstow and Caldicot area, and some of the outlying rural villages. See below for a full list of defibrillator locations in the area.

How does the program work?

The Lions Club pays £600 towards the cost of a PAD. The applicant then submits an application to the British Heart Foundation part-funding scheme for the balance. When approved, the applicant receives a defibrillator and a Call Push Rescue training kit containing an educational DVD and resuscitation training manakins, to allow the community to learn life-saving skills.

If requested, the Ambulance Service and the Community First Responders can attend a training session in your community. This would help build confidence should a person find themselves in a situation where they are required to use a defibrillator for the first time.


