#### Cameron's Smile

Raising Awareness of Caring for a child with Rare and Complex Needs

Carla Golledge lives locally in Bradley Stoke and got in touch with Bradley Stoke Matters to share her story. She is a mum to three children, one of whom was born with a rare genetic condition called Norrie Disease.

Cameron was just 8 weeks old when he was diagnosed. Norrie disease usually only affects males and causes blindness and progressive hearing loss. Cameron is completely blind with no light perception whatsoever. He started to lose his hearing at the age of 3. He is non verbal, has global delays, autism. adhd, profound learning disabilities and a feeding tube. But his personallity shines through all of that, and the most important thing you will remember about Cameron is his smile.

Carla told us "It was really isolating when we first received his diagnosis, so that's when I turned to social media. I started writing a blog raising awareness of his condition and then connecting with other families in similiar circumstances. This is what gave me the idea to write a book: to help others on this journey feel less alone. Raising awareness of rare and complex needs and getting our story heard felt really therapeutic and helped me deal with a lot of the anxiety I face as my son's carer.

Play starts at 2pm on Monday afternoons and finishes at 4.30pm. Any further information or queries contact Gill on: 01454 773573.



# "All Creatures of our God and King, lift up your voice and with us sing, alleluia, alleluia!"

Dear Friends

The opening words of William Henry Draper's great hymn of praise for creation, reminds us that the created order includes everyone, every living creature on the face of the planet and in the depths of the seas. Our faith teaches us that we as human beings are 'stewards of creation', in partnership with the God of unconditional love, whose hands crafted through the amazingly evolutionary process, the wonders of the world which is our 'island home'.

On the 1st November, COP 26 (The 26th United Nations Climate Change Conference) takes place in Glasgow, which this year takes on even greater significance than ever, as we are reminded that the impacts of global warming and our inadvertent undermining of the creative process, threatens the very existence of our planet for future generations. Science constantly reminds us that the time to act is now and that the clock is ticking towards a point in time, that any future intervention by us might just be too late.

As a benefice we are holding a special service at St Michael's Winterbourne on Sunday 31st October, the eve of the conference, in which we will be praying for the leaders of our world; that they will lay aside selfish, materialistic and nationalistic desire and embrace a spirit of human unity and togetherness, to resourcefully and sacrificially address the crisis we face.

The other week when I preached about addressing the evils of poverty, I talked about 'the five goods' that we as Christians needed to live out in our lives to help address that challenge. I mentioned

then how these 'goods' also applied to other situations and challenges which we face. Dealing with climate change and the future of creation is clearly one such area of concern where relationship, partnership, creativity, compassion and joy (the five goods) have a significant role to play.

It is vital that world leaders and us embrace these goods, that we acknowledge that all of the created order, every living thing, is in an intricate relationship dependant on each other for survival. For example, no bees, no crops, no food, starvation! It was Einstein who said that humanity would survive for no more than four years if the world lost the wonder of the bee!

The COP summit gives us all a chance to work in partnership together, the strong supporting the weak, as we strive to address the threat of global warming. We have proved through the Covid pandemic, with the swift development of vaccines, how creative humans can be. We need to strive now to encourage this creativity as we seek to find alternative and economic ways of sustaining human life, with less dependence on the destructive effects of carbon fuels and their deadly omissions. For those of us who have become wealthy on the exploitation of the worlds resources, it is time for us to show real and meaningful compassion to those who have not. Finally, let us find together a true joy, whatever our faith or creed, to celebrate and cherish that what God has given us in his creation; a true gem of great worth, that is a precious gift to us all.

#### "Dear mother earth who day by day unfoldest blessings on our way, O praise him alleluia!"

If you share a real concern for the future of our planet and humanity, then please do come and join us at our service on the 31st October at **3.00pm** – for this is a critical moment for the human race and all creation, this is a true time for reflection and praver.

With an auction for the signed Bristol City T-shirt of the current squad ongoing, the amount raised sits at approx. £1,500!







#### 60 years of Change in the Coalfield 1961–2021 a talk by David Hardwick

Please remember - you are not alone - it's ok not to be ok - it's ok to talk about it.






#### Who Cares? by Sheila Lally

We were pleased to be contacted by local resident Sheila Lally who has lived in the area for nearly 40 years. She is married with three grown up children and four grandchildren, enjoying nothing more than getting together with family and friends for a catch up. She is a frequent user of the excellent leisure facilities in Bradley Stoke and Thornbury with with her grandchildren or attending aquafit classes.

With a background in nursing at both Frenchay and Southmead Hospitals during the course of her career, Sheila found she really enjoyed working on wards caring for older people. Many older people have such interesting stories based on their life experience and she enabled her to



Sheila has recently published a book Who Cares? which contains useful information designed to help those caring for older friends and relatives. Sheila told us: "I was inspired to write the book following my experience of caring for my mother in the last few years of her life. She passed away three years ago. Even though I had experience of caring for older people as a nurse and had worked in social care, I still found it difficult to get help and support for my mother as her condition deteriorated. My aim in writing the book was to provide a practical guide to caring for an older or vulnerable person and what help is available from the government, NHS and charities. It is a positive look at aging and discusses how older people can keep engaged within their communities and presents steps that can be taken to overcome loneliness and social isolation.

I come from a large Irish family with 7 siblings! Yet even with such a big family to support Mum, we often felt the pressure. So I know first hand how rewarding caring for a relative can be and how it can bring you closer together, but it can also be emotional draining. For this reason I have included a chapter in my book for how carers can take care of themselves and signposts them to available help"

Sheila recently retired from her latest position as a senior lecturer at UWE in community public health nursing ie school nurses and health visitors. She still does occasional work for the university but her time is mostly filled with caring for grandchildren and volunteering where she undertakes roles in a school to help with reading, in a local Rainbow group and as a befriender with AgeUK.




