




## **Authors visit Meadowbrook Primary** with a message from Santa

From 9-11th December WADCA will be hosting a Christmas Show thanks to Winterbourne Musical Theatre.





## Let's Celebrate the Good News!

The other day I made a rare trip to the shops and found myself feeling very 'Scrooge' like when I saw the stores full of Christmas decorations, food and gifts. My heart sank as I felt inside myself saying: "After such a difficult year I just can't be bothered with Christmas!"

This feeling concerned me greatly, as in the past I have always been a great fan of Christmas. Was I becoming like Ebenezer Scrooge and thinking of Christmas as nothing more than 'bar humbug'?

However, God in His wonderful way has given me time to consider and reflect on the truly amazing meaning of Christmas that is open to us all. This has happened through my preparation of 'Christmas in a Box' – a brilliant resource for school children which has been developed by prayer spaces in schools. This resource encourages young people to consider each of the characters in the Christmas story and think about how they relate to our own situations and story. I thought I would share with you my reflections on one or two of the characters, and how those reflections have given me a deeper understanding of why it is important to celebrate the Christmas story (with or without the secular trappings of the season!).

The first character is Mary. A young unmarried girl, probably only about 14 years old, from a small relatively unknown place, the daughter of poor ordinary parents. And yet, God chooses her to give birth to Jesus the saviour of the world. We have heard the story so often that it is easy just to skim over the facts. But if we take time to think about them, God's choice of Mary is truly amazing and good news for us! However insignificant we may feel perhaps in our work, in school, in our family or even our friendship group, God sees huge potential in every single one of us, and will give us all that we need to fulfil His will if only we, like the young girl Mary, are prepared to say 'yes' to whatever God calls us to, or in Mary's words 'be it unto me according to thy will'. I still find it totally amazing that God is prepared to use somebody like me, 'warts and all' for his purposes. God's choice of Mary reminds us that in God's eyes we are all special, precious and honoured, even if we feel very ordinary or insignificant. God's unconditional acceptance of each one does indeed give us reason to celebrate

Secondly, let's think about the shepherds – if we just see them as depicted in glossy Christmas cards as handsome young men with cuddly lambs tucked under their arms, we totally fail to understand God's decision to include them in the story of the incarnation. In those days shepherds were very lowly members of society, often outcasts, looked upon by many as somewhat 'dodgy' characters, people to keep clear of. They would have lived for weeks on end out in

the countryside and so would be literally pretty smelly! And yet God chooses them to be the first to meet the baby Jesus, the saviour of the



world. In our society it tends to be those considered respectable members of our communities who are invited to meet celebrities. But God chooses these humble, dirty, outcast shepherds to be the first to meet the saviour of the world! How amazing, showing how God values and accepts us all - even those of us who may feel a bit on the edge, a bit of an outcast. Again, God sees the potential and the humility in the shepherds and invites them, as He does each of us to meet the Christ child. It is as if God is turning our proud world values upside down in order to show His valuing of all people, particularly the vulnerable and weak. Again, this is totally amazing not just for those shepherds but for us today and gives us the desire to celebrate God's trust in us all as we hear the Christmas story once more in 2021.

Finally of course we need to think about the baby Jesus, Emmanuel, God with us, king of kings! When we hear the word king we think of pomp and ceremony, thrones, crowns etc, and yet king Jesus, our saviour, is born in the most humble of circumstances to an unmarried mother (in those days an incredibly shameful situation) and laid in the feeding trough of animals, dark, dusty and dirty. Again we have heard the Christmas story so often that it is easy to miss the true meaning of His birth environment. God chooses the complete and absolute opposite to what society expects for the birth of a king. Why? So that whoever we are, whatever our circumstances, however much we have messed up. God offers this King Saviour to every single one of us if we ask. That offer is surely the best Christmas present ever!

So as we sing the Christmas carols once again, as we wrap the gifts and put them around the tree, as we gather with friends and family to celebrate and we see all the Christmas trappings in our shops, let's make sure we take time to reflect on this amazing event and how life transforming it is to each and every one of us.

A very happy Christ filled Christmas to you. We are all loved by God! That is worth celebrating!

## Fruit & Nut Bark – a great gift to make for Christmas

#### Ingredients

75g cup walnuts 450g good white chocolate. finely chopped 75g dried cranberries 75g medium-diced dried apricot

#### **Directions**

- Preheat the oven to 180 degrees C.
- · Using a pencil, draw an 8-by-10-inch rectangle on a piece of parchment paper. Turn the parchment paper over so the pencil mark doesn't get onto the chocolate and place it on a sheet pan.
- · Place the walnuts in one layer on another sheet pan and bake for 8 minutes. Set aside to cool.
- · Place three quarters of the white chocolate in a heat-proof glass bowl and put it in the microwave on high for 30 seconds.
- · Stir the chocolate with a rubber spatula, return it to the microwave for
- · another 30 seconds, then stir again. Continue to heat and stir in 30-second intervals until the chocolate is just melted.

- · Immediately stir in the remaining chocolate and allow it to sit at room temperature, stirring often, until it's completely smooth. (If you need to heat it a little more, place it in the microwave for another 15 seconds.)
- Pour the melted chocolate onto the parchment paper and spread it lightly to fill the drawn rectangle.
- · Sprinkle the top evenly with the cooled walnuts, the cranberries, and apricots. Press the nuts and fruit lightly so they will set in the chocolate.
- · Set aside for at least 2 hours until firm or refrigerate for 20 minutes.
- Cut or break the bark in 16 pieces and serve at room temperature.

Great as Christmas presents – present in a small box or cellophane bag tied with a pretty ribbon. Enjoy!

## **Rotary Club Chipping** Sodbury donates £500 to Paul's Place at Home - a device borrowing scheme teaching disabled adults digital skills

Paul's Place at Home aims to provide service users with enhanced digital skills to help them become more independent. They are teaching service users how to use a new platform to talk online and start video calls with others supported by the charity. To support everyone means overcoming common barriers faced by many disabled adults like access to the right equipment.

During the lockdown, it was technology that enabled everyone to stay in touch with friends and loved ones. For some, they did not have the technical knowledge. money, or equipment to participate online.

So why are disabled adults often left behind?

"There was so much help and support for him at school but as soon as he became 25, all of that stopped." A Paul's Place carer shares about her son. This isn't an isolated case, for many the support suddenly stops, leaving many stranded and highly reliant on carers for every little task.

Paul's Place is working with individuals to teach them the necessary skills to participate online, focusing on modern accessibility features.

Communications Officer Alex, is working with Vicki from the charity Leonard Cheshire, hosting three series of sessions covering the use of smartphones, tablets and laptops. "Carers are already stretched thin providing all other aspects of support. Technology can be frustrating to use if you don't feel confident with it. Therefore, having someone like myself and Vicki who uses technology every day, we can show service users just the bits they need to know." Alex

There is however still a barrier for some. Technology comes at a cost, which not all families can afford. Not only that but understanding what the right equipment is for an individual's disability is also complex and no one wants to waste money on a device that might not be suitable. This is what Paul's Place borrowing scheme is solving.

The charity's borrowing scheme gives individuals 1-1 support on how to use a device, as well as the device itself. They can borrow a Paul's Place iPad for one year, to begin with, and in that time learn how to use it, as well see if it's right for them. This ensures they don't spend their limited funds on a



piece of technology that might not be suitable. By borrowing a device, it gives them time to save for their own device. Once the borrowing period is over. they can return the device to the next generation of service users.

It was an article in the Winterbourne and Frampton Matters paper that introduced the Rotary Club Chipping Sodbury to this project. "We are searching for funding to buy devices as part of the borrowing scheme. John reached out to me and I invited him to Paul's Place to meet the individuals needing a device. Seeing the positive impact this project has, he instantly wanted to help and put the proposal to the rest of the club," says Alex. We cannot thank him and the rest of the Rotary Club Chipping Sodbury for their kind donation enough. Thanks to their funding this scheme has now begun to create a positive impact on people's lives just as we hoped it would.

Paul's Place is still looking to fund further devices. This is just the start and there are others who could benefit from this device borrowing scheme. Thank vou to all who have helped make it happen. Your support is helping disabled adults live life to the full.






