
Special mention to another colt to make his First team debut — Charlie Hill.



OvenGleamers Top Tips for Loving Your Cooker This New Year

- 1. Invest in a non-stick oven liner. They help to catch all of those annoying drips that stick to the bottom of your cooker, which later can become a burnt-on mess. Easy to wash or pop in the dishwasher.
- 2. Do not use harsh chemicals inside your cooker. Instead, try a safer homemade option using items found around your household. For an all-purpose cleaner and deodorizer, mix together 4 tablespoons baking soda with 1 litre warm water.
- 3. Get the wiping habit! Wipe away any spillages immediately with a damp cloth. Don't give the mess a chance to stay. I know this sounds easy and as hard as you try it is a chore, the oven can still be hot and some of the stuff just doesn't want to come off but stick with it. Get a microfibre cloth and use it wet with washing-up solution.
- 4. Cover your roast! You need to stop the grease spitting all over your lovely clean oven. To do this just put a lid on your roast tin or cover with foil or try a roasting bag. This way the inside of your oven and your grill (if its inside your oven) won't become completely coated in grease when you are cooking. This grease, if left in the oven, becomes burnt on carbon in the long term and is very difficult to get off.
- 5. Get a professional in to Gleam It! If you really can't get all the dirt and grime out of your oven yourself then maybe call and book someone that can. A newly cleaned cooker will be sparkling and clean and if you follow our other tips you will keep it clean, won't you?

Paul's Place continues to work with service users to help them improve their digital skills. "Now that we've established a device borrowing scheme, we will continue to help the first two individuals get to grips with their new device. There are more service users that could benefit from this service which is why we will continue to look at finding further funding."

"We have the knowledge and boosting digital skills is now integrated into our services. As well as existing members, new people joining can include digital skills as one of their goals." Says Communications Officer, Alex.

Tackling health inequalities

Paul's Place is working with South Gloucestershire Council Community Brightside Project to help address health inequalities by raising awareness and creating a valuable informational resource. "Sadly disabled people disproportionately face inequalities when it comes to their health and wellbeing and this has been highlighted by COVID-19 and the crisis that exists in health and social care. The work that we do with people is built on trust, built over a number of years and we see



it is part of our role to ensure health inequalities are noticed and addressed. We work with people to ensure that their voices are heard.." CEO Daniel shares.

Paul's Place aims to dedicate a section of their website to provide useful information and advice, as well as hosting talks in their day facility.

Research to create a service for young adults in the area

Paul's Place are putting together a piece of research to be able to improve their service for physically disabled adults aged 18-25 living in Bristol and South Gloucestershire. Starting with a webinar on 25th January, this is the start of a brilliant project to improve services for young disabled adults.



Climate Action in the Frome Valley

Winterbourne and Frome Valley Environmental Group (WEG) is a community action group in South Gloucestershire. We aim to think globally and act locally to fight climate breakdown.

The group was formed in April 2019 in response to the IPCC report on global warming of 1.5C. A small group of local residents were involved in urging South Gloucestershire Council to declare a Climate and Ecological Emergency - this went through and now all our local councils are working towards Net Zero 2030.

WEG became officially constituted in November 2019, with a committee of local residents. We now have over 300 group members and several active projects in the community. We welcome new members.

We form part of South Gloucestershire Council's Climate Emergency Community Engagement Forum. We are also an affiliated Friends of the Earth Climate Action Group.

Climate change has felt very close this year. We have seen disaster movie images from across Europe and the rest of the world – but this is not fantasy, it's an urgent reality. Freak flooding, raging wildfires, and deathly droughts - these are all happening with more frequency at 1.1C of global heating. The COP26 conference and international scientific reports this year (IPCC 2021 https://www. ipcc.ch/report/ar6/wg1/) confirm these changes are due to carbon and greenhouse gas emissions from human activities. While promising pacts were made between countries at COP26, we are still on course for much higher global temperature rises, beyond

I dread to think what this means for our old age and our children's future. We urgently need local and national government action to enable our communities to stop burning fossil fuels. Meanwhile, the WEG committee is working with Friends of the Earth as a Climate Action Group (https:// winterbourne-environmental.uk/project/communityclimate-action) to make progress regionally – please join us if you are keen to make a difference!



Make a difference in 2022! Start the New Year in a positive way. We can all make a difference in our own households. Here are some top tips to try:

- 1. Raise your voice. Write to your MP or Councillors. Ask what action they are really taking on the Climate Emergency. Join a local Climate Action Group like WEG to make changes locally. Support local protestors. Vote for Climate Action.
- 2. Use your spending. Switch to renewable energy providers. Switch your bank. Make fossil fuels unprofitable and uninsurable.
- Get active. Slow your life down so you can walk or cycle where you need to go. You will get fitter (I have!). You will be mentally healthier and kids will function better in school.
- Drive fossil fuels off the road. Take public transport when you can. Or switch to smaller electric cars (so much cleaner and smoother!).
- Move to a plant-based diet. Reduce your meat intake. Vegan may be best for the planet but it's not for everyone. So vegetarian or reduced meat helps too.

Buy less. Save and cherish what you have. There is no 'out' when we throw things away. Refuse single use plastic (made from fossil fuels). Reduce what you consume. Repair what you have. And recycle as a last resort.

- Buy local. Eat local food in season. Support local businesses – we will need thriving local communities to get through what is to come.
- Make space for wildlife. We are living through the sixth mass extinction. Never use pesticides. Leave areas of your garden wilder. Help local groups to conserve nature in public parks and spaces.
- Reduce or stop flying. There are so many awesome places accessible by train and car in the UK and Europe. The journey can be a part of the holiday.
- 10. Switch your heating and cooking. If you're renovating, opt for a heat pump and electric devices.

Push for these steps in your workplace. Lobby for action with our local councillors. Tell your friends. Be the change!

News from Frome Valley Growing Project

Well what a year! We are so grateful to all the volunteers and the donations we have received over the last twelve months. A big thank you to our local community who have been full of support and inspiration for our project. We are continuing to do what we can to reduce our carbon footprint by reusing and repurposing materials, growing food without chemical fertilisers and pesticides and of course planting LOTS of trees.

We now have regular groups of children and young people attending sessions at our field, learning more about working with the land to support biodiversity and grow food. We love hosting these groups and if you have a group who would be interested in accessing our services please do get in touch.

This autumn, our pumpkin patch was a great success and so too was our apple pressing harvest festival, next year we hope to host an even bigger event so people can bring along their apples and have them pressed into juice. We have been selling lots of our produce this year and still have some jars of spicy Green Tomato Chutney available (like adults Branson pickle!) so please send us a message if want to purchase some. We also have seeds for sale so keep an eye out on our Facebook page for those if you wish to purchase chemical free, locally grown, hand saved heritage vegetable and flower seeds.

As well as selling our produce we are giving some away too. We have begun working in partnership with Bristol Gleaning Network. This amazing team work with growers in the South West to harvest or collect surplus fruit and veg that would otherwise go to waste. This is then redistributed to charitable food projects who are supporting people experiencing food poverty. So far, since starting in September 2020 they have saved over 7 tonnes of produce!

We are looking for donations of plants to contribute towards our Food Forest area. This area of the site will be intentionally planted to mimic how a natural woodland grows, consisting of various layers and involving under-planting round trees and edges. The whole space will be full of biodiversity and plenty of edible, medicinal and other useful plants.

We are looking for donations of trees, shrubs and herbs to include; Perennials such as Rhubarb, Horseradish, Comfrey, Liquorice and Borage. Herbs such as Lemon Balm, Sorrel, Garlic chives, Mints, Lovage, Bay, Bergamot, Oregano and Chamomile. Trees such as Hazel and Elder. Berries such as Raspberries, Blackcurrants, Gooseberries, Strawberries etc.

Should 'auld' acquaintance be forgot, and never brought to mind - for the sake of 'auld land syne!'


Apart from the Scots among us, this song is traditionally sung at parties on New Year's Eve - to let the old year out, and welcome the new year in. With all its fresh opportunities and hopefully some good surprises that will bless us as we try to manage coronavirus and its effects. We pray fervently for the latter. Referring to Burns' poem there are lots of things to 'forget' amid the fear and loss that we have endured, particularly since the onset of the pandemic, yet acquaintances that have blessed us during that time.

As we enter 2022 it is the Epiphany season in the church calendar. With expectant joy of 2022, we look to the direction of the Magi (referred as Wise men or astrologers) in the next instalment of the nativity story, as they sought the promised Messiah. The Magi had travelled from eastern countries to find the new born king. An acquaintance definitely to be forgot was meeting King Herod, who felt threatened with news of a king that could replace him. His fear drove him to wicked acts of cruelty and sadly we hear of similar actions still acted out today.

These astrologers followed the star that led them to the Christ child and they wisely forgot their auld acquaintance with Herod. They travelled safely home, rejoicing from their successful journey to find the Christ child, to spread the good news (Jesus was probably a toddler by the time they found him!).

This last year has had times that many people will choose to forget. Coping with uncertainty has created deep fear, anxiety and depression resulting in various forms of behaviour. At Fromeside churches we are trying to support this by the resources on offer from our pastoral care, prayer support and financial giving to families in need.

We aim to keep looking at the positives learnt from the past dark times – in the hope set before us as people of faith. In response to the increase of stress, anxiety and loss of people known to us in the Fromeside community, we had to learn new skills. Some of you joined WhatsApp phone groups. Zoom and recorded online services, plus regular phone calls created new friendships. Along with the weekly phone in 'Time with God', a short prayer reflection for people who don't use WiFi, all these still continue. Some of our pastoral team trained as



mental health first aiders, and we continue to offer friendship and support where requested within our local schools. We are building stronger connections with our ecumenical partners from our new covenant agreement - so lots of new opportunities to look forward!

God is still with us, even if you feel his presence is distant with the uncertainty created by the pandemic. The wise men persevered under the stress of travelling long distances to find the promised Messiah - they didn't give up. God is still with us, however dark some days might feel, the Messiah can still be found in the friendly encounter. a cheerful smile, a simple prayer.

Let's not forget about this holy acquaintance, that offers love and inner strength through the power of prayer. We cannot allow it to be forgotten!

So, let's remember the good things of the last year. as we pray for expectant joy of the wise men finding the Messiah. As we enter the gate of the new year 2022, I invite you to join me in putting your hands into the hand of God, in trust of a brighter future, working together in unity and purpose. Amen.
